PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

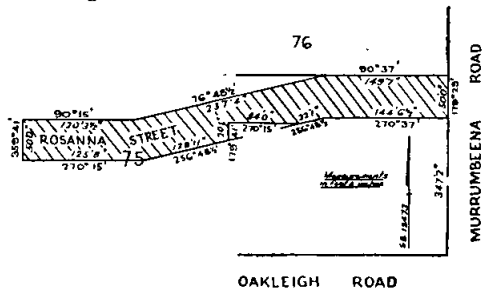
WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1958*, as amended, section 519, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, at any time, and from time to time, upon request of the Council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to proclaim any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley or right-of-way, or any street, road, lane or passage made or laid out or proposed to be made or laid out on any land of which a plan delineating that street, road, lane or passage

has been lodged with the Registrar of Titles, pursuant to sub-section (II.) of section 569 of the said Act to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force.

And, whereas the Council of the City of Caulfield has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, portion of which has been acquired by the said Council for a street and portion of which is a street proposed to be made or laid out on land of which a plan delineating the said street has been lodged with the Registrar of Titles, pursuant to sub-section (II.) of section 569 of the *Local Government Act 1958*, as amended.

Now, therefore, I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do

by this Proclamation declare that all that piece of land known as Rosanna-street, Caulfield, indicated by hatching on the plan hereunder, shall be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act.

BY virtue of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1958 (No. 6270)*, I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, on the recommendation of the Commission of Public Health and by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation rescind all the previous Proclamations relating to meat supervision fees made under sub-section (2) of section 317 of the *Health Act 1958*, and in accordance with the powers conferred by section 317 of the said Act, I now specify

in the attached Schedule the maximum fees and dues which may be prescribed by By-laws of a Council for certain services at abattoirs and meat inspection depots.

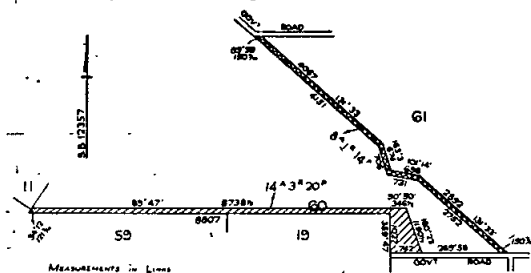

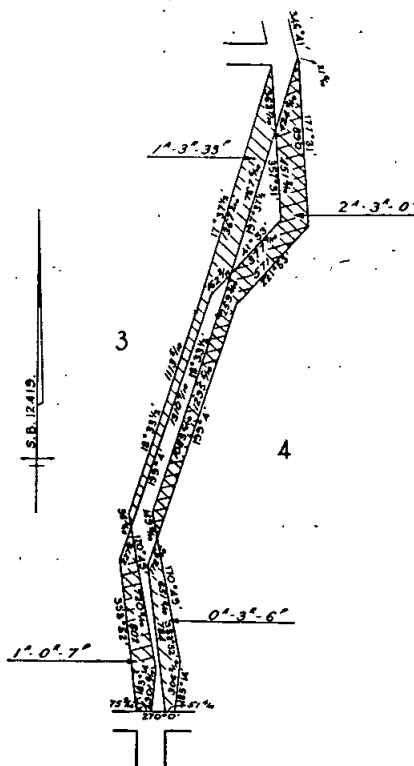

REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of section 36 of the *Melbourne Harbor Trust Act* 1958 (No. 6312), the Melbourne Harbor Trust Commissioners make the following Regulations:—

1. The Regulations made on the 10th day of October, 1956, approved by the Governor in Council on the 15th day of January, 1957, entitled "the Melbourne Harbor Trust Superannuation Regulations" and any amendments thereto are in these Regulations referred to as "the Principal Regulations".

"13A. (1) Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in any other part of these regulations any person being at the 24th day of November, 1961, an employee or contributor may, irrespective of the number of units of pension for which he has been contributing, by lodging with the Commissioners an appropriate notice within ninety days from the said date irrevocably elect either—

(a) to contribute in respect of a number of units of pension being not less than two units nor more than four units; or

(b) to cease to contribute in respect of any unit of pension.

(2) Where any employee or contributor has so elected the total amount of contributions paid by him or deducted from his wages or salary in respect of all those units of pension for which by reason of such election he is no longer required to contribute shall be refunded to him without interest out of the Account.

(3) Any person not being an employee or contributor who on or after the 24th day of November, 1961, shall have completed three years' (or in special cases approved by the Commissioners, six calendar months') continuous regular employment in the service and was at the time of commencement of such employment under the age of fifty-seven years may either lodge with the Commissioners notice in the form set out in the Third Schedule and thereby irrevocably elect to become a contributor in respect of either—

(a) not less than two nor more than four units of pension; or

(b) such a number of units of pension as is provided for by clause 13 of these Regulations;

or alternatively may by lodging with the Commissioners a notice in the form set out in the Fourth Schedule hereto irrevocably elect not to contribute in respect of any unit of pension.

(4) Any employee or contributor or any person not being an employee or contributor who after becoming entitled to make an election under sub-clause (1) or (3) of this clause has by notice lodged with the Commissioners pursuant to the said sub-clauses elected to either

(a) contribute for not less than two nor more than four units of pension; or

(b) cease to contribute; or

(c) not to contribute

is hereby irrevocably bound by such election, and any person not being an employee or contributor who after becoming entitled to make an election under sub-clause (3) of this clause fails to make such election within three calendar months of becoming so entitled shall be deemed to have irrevocably elected not to contribute in respect of any unit of pension.

(5) Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in any other part of these Regulations where any employee, contributor, or person has pursuant to sub-clauses (1) or (3) of this clause made an election to contribute in respect of not less than two nor more than four units of pension—

(a) such employee, contributor, or person shall not at any later time whilst he remains in the service be required or be eligible to contribute in respect of more than four units of pension; and

(b) if such employee, contributor, or person has elected to contribute in respect of less than four units of pension he may at any later time elect to contribute in respect of an additional unit or units but so that the total number of units shall not exceed four."

4. Regulation 47 of the Principal Regulations shall be deleted and the following Regulation substituted therefor:—

“47. (1) An employee who has performed at least three years' continuous regular employment in the service and who has applied in accordance with these Regulations to become a contributor but who has been excluded by the Commissioners under the powers conferred by clause 8 of these Regulations shall on retirement, retrenchment or discharge be entitled to a retiring gratuity of one of the amounts set out in sub-clause (2) of this clause provided that no such employee who retires or is retrenched or discharged under the maximum age for retirement shall be entitled to the said retiring gratuity unless—

- (a) he has completed five years' continuous regular employment in the service after the date of such exclusion; and
- (b) he either retires after reaching the age of sixty years but before reaching the age of sixty-five years or retires at any age (with the consent of the Commissioners and after examination by the Commissioners' medical officers) because of ill-health or physical or mental incapacity or is retrenched or discharged at any age.

(2) For the purposes of sub-clause (1) hereof the retiring gratuity of an employee excluded by the Commissioners shall be—

- (a) in the case of an excluded employee who has completed less than ten years' continuous regular employment in the service as an adult of the age of twenty-one years or more a sum equal to the lesser of either one week's wages at the rate lastly received by him for each year of continuous regular employment in the service whether or not the employee was under the age of twenty-one years at the commencement of the said years of service or £22 10s. for each such year of service as aforesaid;
- (b) in the case of an excluded employee who has completed ten or more years of continuous regular employment in the service as an adult of the age of twenty-one years or more a sum (irrespective of the weekly wage rate lastly received by such employee) equal to £22 10s. for each year of continuous regular employment in the service whether or not the employee was under the age of twenty-one years at the commencement of the said years of service;
- (c) in the case of an excluded employee who on the 24th day of November, One thousand nine hundred and sixty-one, was then earning a weekly wage of more than £22 10s., a sum equal to one week's wages at the rate received by him as at the said date for every year of continuous regular employment in the service whether or not the employee was under the age of twenty-one years at the commencement of the said years of service.

(3) Any person who has or has been deemed to have elected in accordance with these Regulations not to contribute in respect of any unit of pension upon retirement from the service on or after reaching the maximum age for retirement or at any age (with the consent of the Commissioners and after examination by the Commissioners' medical officers) because of ill health or physical or mental incapacity or where the Commissioners in their absolute discretion allow on retrenchment or discharge after having performed at least ten years' continuous regular employment in the service as an adult of the age of twenty-one years or more is entitled to a gratuity equal to £22 10s. for each complete year of continuous regular employment in the service as an adult of the age of twenty-one years or more provided that any service performed by any such person after the maximum age for retirement shall not be included in calculating any entitlement as aforesaid.

(4) In the event of the death of any person who would on retirement, retrenchment, or discharge, be entitled to receive a gratuity under sub-clauses (1) or (3) of this clause a sum equivalent to the amount of such gratuity shall be paid to the widow, if any, of such deceased person, and if he leaves no widow surviving him but leaves children under the age of sixteen years dependent upon him at the time of his death, then the said sum shall be paid to the guardian of such children to be used for their support and education.

(5) All payments under this section shall be made out of the Melbourne Harbor Trust Fund and shall be borne wholly by the Commissioners.”

5. The Third Schedule to the Principal Regulations shall be deleted and the following Schedules substituted therefor:—

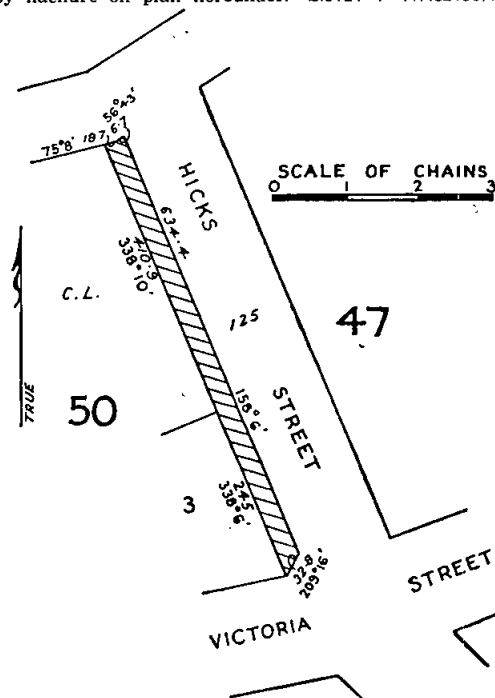

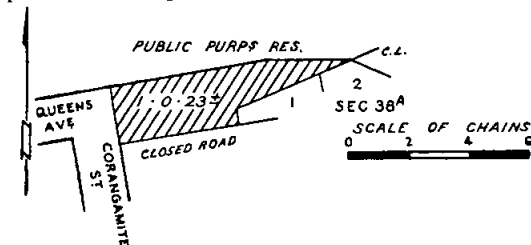

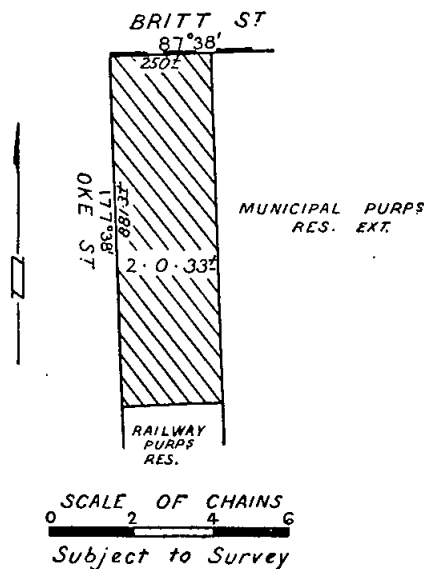

A By-law of the Shire of Hastings, made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1958* and numbered 3, authorizing the placing on roads, in situations approved by the municipal engineer (subject, in the case of State highways, main roads, and tourist roads, to the further approval of the Country Roads Board) of stands or platforms for milk and cream cans, and prescribing the nature and regulating the use of such stands and platforms.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1958*, and every other power it thereunto enabling the President, Councillors and Rate-payers of the Shire of Hastings order as follows:—

1. In the interpretation of this By-law—

"Council" means Council of the Shire of Hastings.

"Person" includes corporation.

"Road" means any street or road within the municipal district of the Shire of Hastings.

"Formation" means that portion of the road prepared for the use of traffic and includes the pavement of the road.

Words importing the singular shall be deemed to include the plural.

2. The Council may authorize the owner or occupier of person acting on behalf of the owner or occupier of any property and who is engaged in dairy farming and the production of milk or cream to erect a stand or platform on any road to facilities the collection of such milk or cream. No person other than the owner or occupier or person acting on behalf of the owner or occupier so authorized shall erect or commence to erect any such stand or platform.

3. Every such stand or platform shall conform in nature to the following requirements:—

Nature of Construction.

Any stand or platform placed on a road, in pursuance of this By-law shall be soundly and neatly constructed and finished in a proper and workman-like manner to the satisfaction of the Shire Engineer. The external surfaces of the end walls and outer faces of all posts of every such stand or platform shall be painted white, and such external surfaces shall be kept painted white.

Drains and/or culverts shall be constructed around or under the stands in such positions as shall be directed by the Shire Engineer. Such drains and/or culverts shall be maintained in a clean and serviceable condition to the satisfaction of the Shire Engineer or any deputy appointed by him to give directions on this matter.

4. Every such owner or occupier or person acting on behalf of the owner or occupier prior to erection of any such stand or platform shall make written application to the Council for permission to do so in the form contained in the Schedule hereto and shall not erect or commence to erect any such stand or platform without the written consent of the Council and where the stand or platform is to be erected on any State highway, main road or tourist road without the further written consent of the Country Roads Board.

5. Every such owner or occupier or person acting on behalf of the owner or occupier when making application to the Council for permission to erect a stand or platform shall submit a sketch plan showing the location of the proposed stand or platform with regard to the formation and road boundaries and the direction of course of travel to be made in collecting milk and cream therefrom.

6. Every such owner or occupier or person acting on behalf of the owner or occupier who is granted permission to erect such stand or platform shall—

- (a) erect the same of sound materials approved by the Shire Engineer and in a workman-like manner;
- (b) erect the same in such position approved by the Engineer as will ensure that when cream or milk is being collected therefrom the collecting vehicle will not obstruct other traffic using the road and shall be wholly off the road formation;
- (c) construct and maintain at his own expense such gravel or other tracks from the edge of the formation of the road to the stand or platform as the Engineer may order and shall
- (d) forthwith remove any stand or platform when ordered so to do by the Council,

7. On receipt of such application the Council shall refer the same to its engineer, and if satisfied that the proposed stand or platform conforms to the specifications hereinbefore contained, the Council, by its authorized officer, shall issue a permit authorizing the placing of the same upon the road, in a situation approved by the engineer, provided however, that if such road shall be a State highway, main road, tourist road, such authority shall be subject to the further approval of the Country Roads Board.

8. No person to whom a permit has been issued as aforesaid to place a stand or platform upon a road shall erect the same otherwise than in accordance with the terms of such permit and the provisions of this By-law.

9. No person shall use or cause to be used any stand or platform upon a road, in pursuance of a permit issued under this By-law for any purpose other than that of holding, loading or unloading of milk and/or cream cans.

10. Any person who erects or causes to be erected a stand or platform in pursuance of a permit issued under this By-law, or by whom or for whose benefit such stand or platform is currently used or maintained shall at all times maintain such stand or platform in a proper state of repair, both as to construction and painting, and the Council may at any time give written notice to such person requiring him to effect such repairs as may be deemed necessary by the Council's engineer or any deputy appointed by him to give directions in this matter.

11. Any person who, having erected a stand or platform in pursuance of a permit issued under the provisions of this By-law, or by whom or for whose benefit such stand or platform is currently used or maintained, fails to comply with the terms of any notice served on him under the foregoing provisions shall be guilty of an offence.

12. Every owner or occupier or person acting on behalf of the owner or occupier in respect of whose property any stand or platform has been erected prior to the coming into operation of this By-law and without the permission of the Council shall within three months from the commencement hereof, supply to the Council with details of the location and construction thereof, and shall if deemed necessary by the Council's Engineer or other authorized Officer bring such stand or platform up to the standard laid down in this By-law or demolish and remove such stand or platform.

13. Any person who shall wilfully offend against or commit any breach of this By-law shall be liable for every offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds, and if such offence is a continuing one, to a further penalty not exceeding One pound per day for each day such offence is continued after a conviction or order by any court.
