AREA OF LAND COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1958* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1958*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6), shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1958* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 6 and 7 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1958* aforesaid, to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

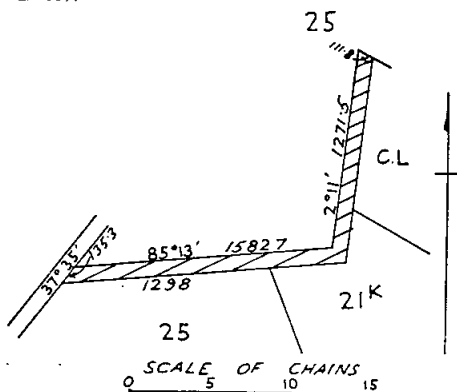

LAKES ENTRANCE WATERWORKS TRUST.

By-Law No. 3.

THE Lakes Entrance Waterworks Trust in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Acts doth hereby make the By-law following for its Waterworks District:—

1. The terms used in this By-law shall have the same definitions as those given in By-law No. 2 of the Lakes Entrance Waterworks Trust.
2. That part of any service pipe (including any bend elbow or other fitting) which is between the Main Pipe and the meter or where no meter is fixed between the Main Pipe and the building line of the street shall be of copper with brass fittings.
3. Copper piping shall comply with the Specification of the Australian Standards Association No. B. 158—1961 "Copper Tubes for Water, Gas and Sanitation" and shall be of the following diameters and dimensions:—

5. This By-law shall apply whether or not any cattle so driven or allowed to graze or wander shall be under the control or in charge of any person or persons.
6. Any person guilty of a contravention of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding Fifty pounds.

This By-law shall apply to and have effect throughout the whole of the municipal district of the Shire of Wannon.

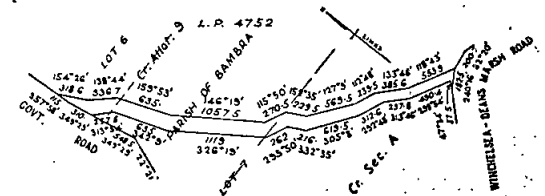



All land within this area shall be used in accordance with the provisions of the particular category of land-use to which each area has been assigned.


The provisions of each of the land-use categories determined for this area are set out hereunder:—

 Land to be permanently used for forest purposes where forestry operations may be carried out under the supervision and control of the Forests Commission acting as agent for the Authority and where no subdivision for residential purposes shall be permitted.


 Land which may be used for forest purposes, but which, if approved by the Authority, may be developed for grazing or agricultural purposes or, if warranted, for residential purposes, subject to conditions imposed according to the particular circumstances, such conditions to include—

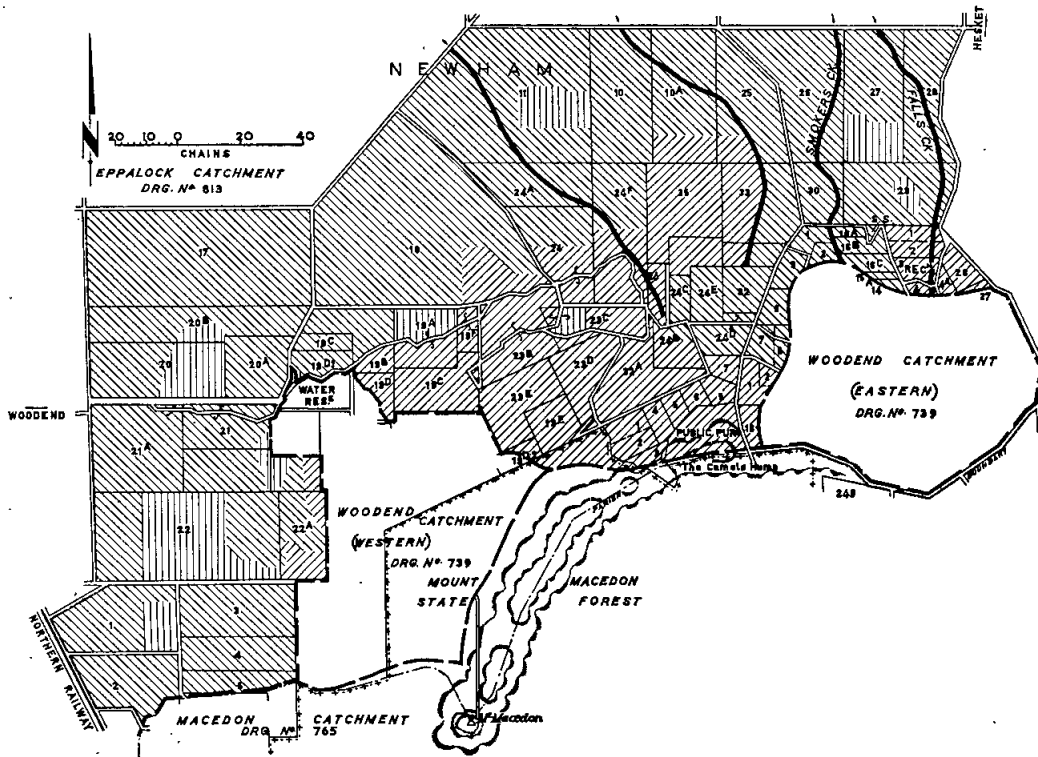
- (a) the degree of clearing permissible;
- (b) the specification of those areas where timber shall be retained;
- (c) the specification of those areas where subdivision for residential purposes would be permitted.

 Land which may be used for grazing or agricultural purposes, but where, if warranted, subdivision for residential purposes will be considered subject to conditions approved by the Soil Conservation Authority.

 Land within a minimum of 1 chain or such greater distance as the Authority may require from specified streams, springs, oftakes or storages, on which land-use shall be subject to conditions imposed by the Soil Conservation Authority, but in no circumstances shall permission be given for—

- (a) cropping, and
- (b) erection of buildings.

 Land reserved for roads and other public purposes on which any changes from the existing nature and conditions shall be made only after consultation with the Authority.

- (1) In respect of all lands in the First drainage Rating Division (being the lands against which the number 1 is shown in the column designated "Rating Division—Drainage Rate" (hereinafter called the "said column") incorporated in the Register of Lands for the appropriate Irrigation District sealed by the Commissioner), a Drainage Rate of the amount in the pound shown in column 1 of the said Schedule of the unimproved capital value of all such lands.

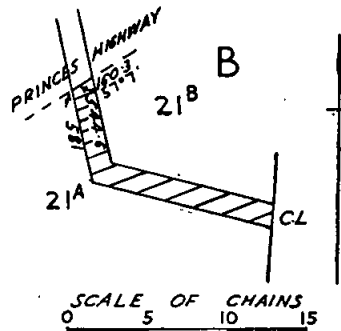

ORDER APPROVING THE MAKING OF A BY-PASS IN THE SHIRE OF CRANBOURNE.

II. Section 101 of the Act provides (*inter alia*) that for the purposes of Part VII. of the Act sections 19 to 21 of the Act shall so far as applicable and with such adaptations as are necessary extend and apply with respect to by-pass roads.

III. The Board has—

- (a) in exercise of the powers conferred upon it by the said section 114 and for the purpose of opening up a by-pass road in the Shire of Cranbourne under the name "Dingley By-pass road" by Resolution dated the twenty-first day of August, 1961, fixed alignments for each side of the said road;
- (b) in accordance with the provisions of section 19 of the Act caused to be prepared a map, plan and estimate showing—
- (i) the points between which and the lands on and through which the said road is proposed to be made; and
- (ii) the cost of acquiring the land.

GEMBROOK, COCKATOO, AND EMERALD WATERWORKS TRUST CONSTITUTED.

UNDER the powers conferred by the Water Acts and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby approve of the application of the Councillors of the Shires of Fern Tree Gully and Berwick for the constitution of a Waterworks Trust, subject to the provisions of the said Acts, to construct, manage and maintain the works for the supply of water to the Townships of Gembrook, Cockatoo and Emerald, and doth hereby order and appoint as follows:—

1. That the name of the Trust shall be Gembrook, Cockatoo and Emerald Waterworks Trust.
2. That the Commissioners of the Trust shall comprise three members to be elected by the Fern Tree Gully Shire Council, and three members elected by the Berwick Shire Council, together with one other person appointed by the Governor in Council.
3. That the estimated cost of carrying out the proposed waterworks shall be Two hundred and fifty thousand pounds (£250,000).
4. That the principal works to be constructed or carried out by the Trust shall consist of an offtake weir, approximately 18 miles of main pipeline, two service basins, and the reticulation of the Townships of Gembrook, Cockatoo, and Emerald.
5. That the limits of the land within which the said Waterworks Trust shall have authority shall be those within the following boundaries:—

Portion 1.—Site of Catchment Area.

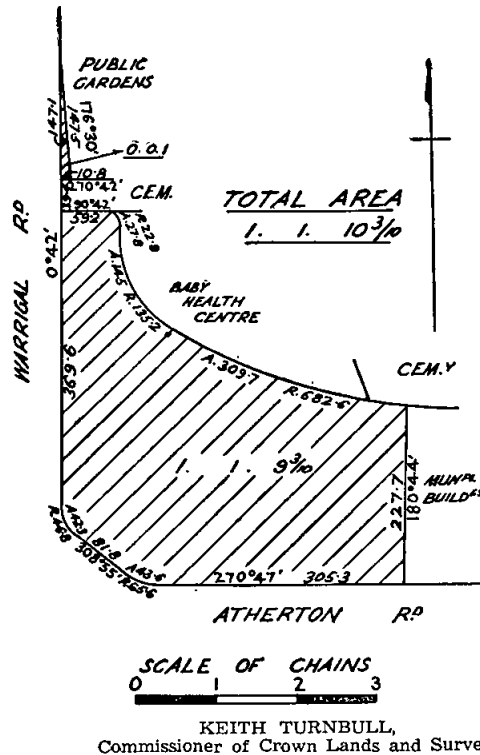

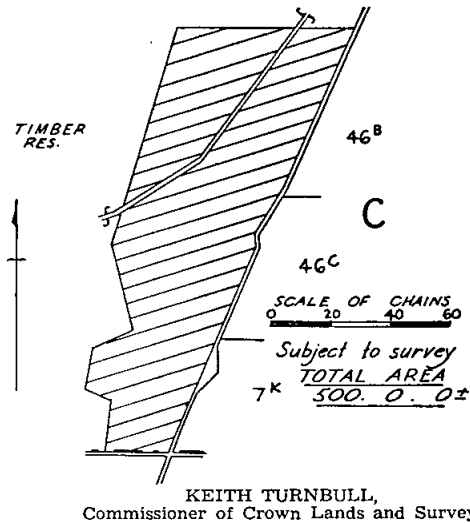

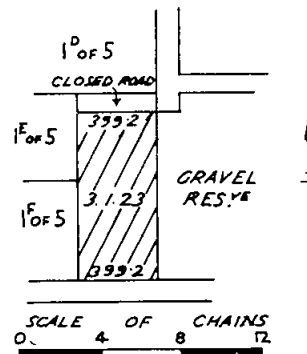

A By-law of the City of Camberwell made under Part XXXV. of the *Local Government Act 1958* and numbered 125 for the purpose of repealing By-laws Nos. 65, 106 and 114, and for imposing, collecting and receiving charges or entrance fees for clubs, associations, or persons using or entering in or upon any lands purchased or rented or otherwise provided by or granted or given by any person to the Council of the Municipality of the City of Camberwell for the providing of pleasure grounds or places of public resort or public recreation and also for regulating the conduct of persons using or being upon or in any such grounds or places.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1958*, the Mayor, Councillors and Citizens of the City of Camberwell order as follows:—

Repeal.

By-laws Nos. 65, 106 and 114 made by the City of Camberwell under the *Local Government Acts 1928* and 1958 are hereby repealed.

Operation.

This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Municipal District of the City of Camberwell, and shall come into operation and have effect immediately upon its publication in the *Victoria Government Gazette*.

Definitions.

"Council" means the Council of the City of Camberwell.

"Management Committee" means an Honorary Committee elected in accordance with rules applying to the constitution of Committees of Management of pleasure grounds or places of public resort or public recreation as laid down by the Council from time to time.

The definition "Lands" without limiting the generality hereof includes any building or other structure erected in on or over the soil.

The Council may from time to time appoint local Management Committees to manage such lands as have been or at any future time shall be purchased or rented or otherwise provided by or granted or given by any person to the Council for the providing of pleasure grounds or places of public resort or public recreation, and may prescribe Rules and Regulations for the appointment of such Committees and the manner in which such management shall be carried out.

2. The Council shall have power to hold entertainments, performances, sports meetings, cricket or football matches or other forms of sport on any of such lands and to make a charge for admission thereto.

3. No charge or fee for admission shall exceed Two shillings for each adult person and One shilling for each child under the age of fourteen years unless the Council has previously authorized a higher charge.

4. No person except members of the Council or of the Management Committee, the Town Clerk, the City Engineer, and employees of the Council or Management Committee on duty shall enter any portion of such lands when a charge is made for admission thereto without first paying the fee charged unless otherwise authorized by the Council or Management Committee.

5. No person unless he be guilty of an offence under this By-law shall be required to leave during any such entertainment or sports after he has paid for admission until he has been tendered the amount of the admission fee paid by him.

6. All such lands shall be open to the public free of charge except on such days and at such hours as the Council shall appoint or when a charge is made for admission under the authority of the Council.

7. (i) No person shall interfere with or break or damage any of the trees, plants, or shrubs or pluck any flowers or walk on the beds or borders or climb, jump, or get upon or over any of the fences or gates or cut or in any way damage any of the fences, gates, seats, or other structures, or post bills or advertisements on any of the fences, gates, seats, or other structures or roll or throw stones or other missiles, or leave therein any bottles, broken glass, paper, fruit skins or peel, or any refuse or rubbish whatsoever except in the receptacles provided, or spit or expectorate upon any of the paths or structures, or remove, displace, or damage any notice board within any of such lands.

(ii) No person shall damage any building or post, bills or advertisements on or in any building or leave therein any bottles, broken glass, paper, fruit skins or peel or any refuse or rubbish whatsoever except in the receptacles provided nor spit or expectorate in any building or damage any notice board within any building.

8. No person shall carry firearms in or through such lands or shoot, snare or destroy any birds therein except by the authority of the Council.

9. No person shall without permission of the Council, play, practice or engage in any game or sport within such lands on a Sunday.

10. No person shall engage in cricket, football, bowls, tennis, lacrosse, or any like games in any of such lands without the authority of the Council or Management Committee and then only on payment of any fees or charges that may be prescribed from time to time.

11. No motor car, truck, motor scooter, motor bicycle, bicycle, scooter, cart or any other vehicle whether propelled by mechanical, human or animal power shall be driven or ridden on any footpath or on any or through any such land except any areas set aside for the parking of vehicles without the authority of the proper officer of the Council having first been obtained.

12. No person shall play any unlawful game or make any wager for money or carry on any form of gambling or by any unseemly conduct or otherwise interfere with the comfort and enjoyment of other persons within such lands.

13. No person shall interfere with or in any way hinder or interrupt any employees of the Council or Management Committee engaged in any of such lands.

14. No person shall sell or offer for sale within any of such lands any articles of food or drink or any other commodity or operate any money-making amusement or make any collection of money for any purpose without the written permission of the Council or Management Committee.

15. No person shall behave in a disorderly manner or create or take part in any disturbance or use indecent or abusive language or commit any nuisance or in any way offend against decency as regards dress, language or conduct in any of such lands.

16. No person except employees of the Council or of the Management Committee shall enter any plots in any of such lands which may be enclosed for plantation of trees or shrubs.

17. No person other than players or officials or competitors at any sports gathering duly authorized as aforesaid, shall enter or remain within or upon the playing arena in such lands during the progress of any cricket, football, tennis, bowls, or lacrosse match, or sports gathering, nor interrupt nor interfere with any employee of the Council or Management Committee in the proper execution of his duty or work.

18. No person shall cross or trespass on the playing ground during any cricket, football, tennis, bowls or lacrosse match or sports gathering in such lands when such crossing or trespassing would cause undue interference with the progress of a match or sports gathering.

19. No person shall remain in any of such lands at any time when lawfully directed by any policy officer or officer or employee of the Council to leave the same.

20. (i) No person shall put in any of the said lands any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, or other animals without the permission of the Council or Management Committee, and any animals found so trespassing on any such lands may be seized by the proper officer of the Council, and the owner proceeded against for such trespass.

(ii) No horses, cattle, sheep, goats or other animals shall be driven or ridden on any footpath or in or through any such land without authority of the proper officer of the Council having first been obtained.

21. No person shall bring or have any dog in any of such lands unless such dog is controlled by a chain or cord.

22. No person shall park or leave any motor car or other vehicle in any of such lands excepting at such places and at such times as are provided for that purpose by the Council and the Council may make a charge not exceeding Two shillings a day or part of a day for every motor car or other vehicle so parked or left.

23. No person shall dig or remove any sand, gravel, soil, or other material from any of such lands unless authorized in writing by the Council so to do.

24. Where any area in such lands has been set apart as a children's playground and swings and other appliances have been provided, the following rules shall apply—

- (a) No person above the age of fourteen years shall enter upon or remain on such area or use any of the swings or other appliances therein, provided, however, that this condition shall not apply to parents or other persons in charge of children who shall be at liberty to enter or remain on such area to watch over children who are in their charge.
- (b) The swings or other appliances erected in such area shall not be used by any child or children for a longer period than five minutes consecutively if any other child or children is or are waiting to use them.
- (c) Every person being lawfully on such area shall obey the directions of any officer of the Council or of any police officer or any member of the Management Committee in respect of his or her conduct therein.
- (d) The Council and/or Management Committee shall not be responsible for any accident occurring on any portion of such area or arising from the use of any of the swings or other appliances therein.

(e) Children's playgrounds shall not be open for use after the hour of sunset.

25. No person or persons without the written permission of the Council and a permit to sell, supply or consume liquor issued pursuant to the Licensing Act, shall—

- (a) bring into or consume in any such lands,
- (b) supply to any person or persons in any such lands,
- (c) have in his or her possession or under his or her control in any such lands,

any alcoholic liquor.

26. None of the powers conferred on the Management Committee of any recreation reserve by the constitution and rules of such Management Committee shall be exercised in the event of the Council having passed a Resolution forbidding the exercise of such powers or any of them.

27. Penalties—Every person who is guilty of any wilful act or default contrary to any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20).

A By-law of the City of Melbourne, made under Part VII, Division 1, of the *Local Government Act 1958* and numbered 430 to amend and add to By-law No. 418.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by Part VII, Division 1, of the *Local Government Act 1958* and every other Act or power enabling it in that behalf, the Council of the City of Melbourne doth order as follows:—

1. Clause 14 of By-law No. 418 shall be repealed and the following clause substituted therefor, viz.:-

"14. (1) No person shall deposit or leave any refuse or rubbish on any street, road, lane or passage in the City.

(2) No person shall, without the consent, in writing, of the City Engineer in that behalf deposit or leave any refuse or rubbish on any land in the City.

(3) Every person who by any wilful act or default contravenes either of the provisions of this clause shall be liable on conviction to a penalty of not more than One hundred pounds."

2. By-law No. 418 shall be further amended by inserting after clause 15 the following new clause, viz.:-

"15A. Any land in the City which the Council by notice, in writing, to the owner or occupier has declared to be unsightly or destructive of the amenity of the neighbourhood shall within a period stated in the notice, not being less than 60 days, be enclosed with a sufficient fence of iron, timber, brick or other suitable material approved by the building surveyor to a height of 6 feet at the least and in such manner as to conceal the land from the view of passers-by."

3. After sub-clause (2) of clause 24, there shall be added the following sub-clauses:—

"(3) No person shall place or leave on any street or footway any placard, board or other thing by way of advertisement.

(4) No person shall on any street or footway carry or cause to be otherwise displayed for the primary purpose of advertising any placard, board or other thing."

4. In clause 29 the word "of" where secondly appearing shall be repealed.

5. In clause 37 after the words "any veranda" there shall be added the words "or upon any shop front or any outside wall abutting any street or public place."

6. (a) After clause 27 the following new clause shall be added:—

"27A. Unless otherwise expressly provided no person shall obstruct any street or footway by standing or loitering therein or thereon whether for the purpose of selling or offering for sale any goods or otherwise."

(b) In clause 28 the words and figures "clauses 25, 26 and 27" shall be repealed and the following words and figures substituted therefor, viz.:-

"Clauses 25, 26, 27 and 27A."
