## Soil Conservation and Land Utilization Act 1958.

EPPALOCK WATER SUPPLY CATCHMENT PROCLAIMED 20th JULY, 1960, "VICTORIA GOVERNMENT GAZETTE", No. 71.

NOTICE OF DETERMINATION OF LAND-USE IN PART OF EPPALOCK CATCHMENT, PLAN No. 1123.

Pursuant to Section 22 of the "Soil Conservation and Land Utilization Act 1958" (No. 6372).

IN pursuance of the provisions of section 23, sub-section 1, of the Soil Conservation and Land Utilization Act 1958 (No. 6372), the Soil Conservation Authority has determined land-use for all that area of land in the Parish of Newham within the Eppalock catchment delineated and distinctively marked on plan No. 1123, the original of which is lodged at the head office of the Soil Conservation Authority. All land within this area shall be used in accordance with the provisions of the particular category of land-use to which each area has been assigned.

The provisions of each of the land-use categories determined for this area are set out hereunder:-

Land to be permanently used for forest purposes where forestry operations may be carried out under the supervision and control of the Forests Commission acting as agent for the Authority and where no subdivision for residential purposes shall be permitted.

Land which may be used for forest purposes, but which, if approved by the Authority, may be developed for grazing or agricultural purposes or, if warranted, for residential purposes, subject to conditions imposed according to the particular circumstances, such conditions to include—


- (a) the degree of clearing permissible;
- (b) the specification of those areas where timber shall be retained;
- (c) the specification of those areas where subdivision for residential purposes would be permitted.

Land which may be used for grazing or agricultural purposes, but where, if warranted, subdivision for residential purposes will be considered subject to conditions approved by the Soil Conservation Authority.

Land within a minimum of 1 chain or such greater distance as the Authority may require from specified streams, springs, offtakes or storages, on which land-use shall be subject to conditions imposed by the Soil Conservation Authority, but in no circumstances shall permission be given for—

- (a) cropping, and
- (b) erection of buildings.

Land reserved for roads and other public purposes on which any changes from the existing nature and conditions shall be made only after consultation with the Authority.

#### BY-LAW No. 125.

A By-law of the City of Camberwell made under Part XXXV. of the Local Government Act 1958 and numbered 125 for the purpose of repealing By-laws Nos. 65, 106 and 114, and for imposing, collecting and receiving charges or entrance fees for clubs, associations, or persons using or entering in or upon any lands purchased or rented or otherwise provided by or granted or given by any person to the Council of the Municipality of the City of Camberwell for the providing of pleasure grounds or places of public resort or public recreation and also for regulating the conduct of persons using or being upon or in any such grounds or places.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act* 1958, the Mayor, Councillors and Citizens of the City of Camberwell order as follows:—

## Repeal.

By-laws Nos. 65, 106 and 114 made by the City of Camberwell under the *Local Government Acts* 1928 and 1958 are hereby repealed.

#### Operation.

This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Municipal District of the City of Camberwell, and shall come into operation and have effect immediately upon its publication in the Victoria Government Gazette.

#### Definitions.

"Council" means the Council of the City of Camberwell.

"Management Committee" means an Honorary Committee elected in accordance with rules applying to the constitution of Committees of Management of pleasure grounds or places of public resort or public recreation as laid down by the Council from time to time.

The definition "Lands" without limiting the generality hereof includes any building or other structure erected in on or over the soil.

- 1. The Council may from time to time appoint local Management Committees to manage such lands as have been or at any future time shall be purchased or rented or otherwise provided by or granted or given by any person to the Council for the providing of pleasure grounds or places of public resort or public recreation, and may prescribe Rules and Regulations for the appointment of such Committees and the manner in which such management shall be carried out.
- 2. The Council shall have power to hold entertainments, performances, sports meetings, cricket or football matches or other forms of sport on any of such lands and to make a charge for admission thereto.
- 3. No charge or fee for admision shall exceed Two shillings for each adult person and One shilling for each child under the age of fourteen years unless the Council has previously authorized a higher charge.
- 4. No person except members of the Council or of the Management Committee, the Town Clerk, the City Engineer, and employees of the Council or Management Committee on duty shall enter any portion of such lands when a charge is made for admission thereto without first paying the fee charged unless otherwise authorized by the Council or Management Committee.
- 5. No person unless he be guilty of an offence under this By-law shall be required to leave during any such entertainment or sports after he has paid for admission until he has been tendered the amount of the admission fee paid by him.
- 6. All such lands shall be open to the public free of charge except on such days and at such hours as the Council shall appoint or when a charge is made for admission under the authority of the Council.
- admission under the authority of the Council.

  7. (i) No person shall interfere with or break or damage any of the trees, plants, or shrubs or pluck any flowers or walk on the beds or borders or climb, jump, or get upon or over any of the fences or gates or cut or in any way damage any of the fences, gates, seats, or other structures, or post bills or advertisements on any of the fences, gates, seats, or other structures or roll or throw stones or other missiles, or leave therein any bottles, broken glass, paper, fruit skins or peel, or any refuse or rubbish whatsoever except in the receptacles provided, or spit or expectorate upon any of the paths or structures, or remove, displace, or damage any notice board within any of such lands.

  (ii) No person shall damage any building or not bills.
- (ii) No person shall damage any building or post bills or advertisements on or in any building or leave therein any bottles, broken glass, paper, fruit skins or peel or any refuse or rubbish whatsoever except in the receptacles provided nor spit or expectorate in any building or damage any notice board within any building.
- 8. No person shall carry firearms in or through such lands or shoot, snare or destroy any birds therein except by the authority of the Council.
- 9. No person shall without permission of the Council, play, practice or engage in any game or sport within such lands on a Sunday.
- 10. No person shall engage in cricket, football, bowls, tennis, lacrosse, or any like games in any of such lands without the authority of the Council or Management Committee and then only on payment of any fees or charges that may be prescribed from time to time.
- 11. No motor car, truck, motor scooter, motor bicycle, bicycle, scooter, cart or any other vehicle whether propelled by mechanical, human or animal power shall be driven or ridden on any footpath or on any or through any such land except any areas set aside for the parking of vehicles without the authority of the proper officer of the Council having first been obtained,

- 12. No person shall play any unlawful game or make any wager for money or carry on any form of gambling or by any unseemly conduct or otherwise interfere with the comfort and enjoyment of other persons within such lands.
- 13. No person shall interfere with or in any way hinder or interrupt any employees of the Council or Management Committee engaged in any of such lands.
- 14. No person shall sell or offer for sale within any of such lands any articles of food or drink or any other commodity or operate any money-making amusement or make any collection of money for any purpose without the written permission of the Council or Management Committee.
- 15. No person shall behave in a disorderly manner or create or take part in any disturbance or use indecent or abusive language or commit any nuisance or in any way offend against decency as regards dress, language or conduct in any of such lands.
- 16. No person except employees of the Council or of the Management Committee shall enter any plots in any of such lands which may be enclosed for plantation of trees or shrubs.
- 17. No person other than players or officials or competitors at any sports gathering duly authorized as aforesaid, shall enter or remain within or upon the playing arena in such lands during the progress of any cricket, football, tennis, bowls, or lacrosse match, or sports gathering, nor interrupt nor interfere with any employee of the Council or Management Committee in the proper execution of his duty or work.
- 18. No person shall cross or trespass on the playing ground during any cricket, football, tennis, bowls or lacrosse match or sports gathering in such lands when such crossing or trespassing would cause undue interference with the progress of a match or sports gathering.
- 19. No person shall remain in any of such lands at any time when lawfully directed by any policy officer or officer or employee of the Council to leave the same.
- 20. (i) No person shall put in any of the said lands any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, or other animals without the permission of the Council or Management Committee, and any animals found so trespassing on any such lands may be seized by the proper officer of the Council, and the owner proceeded against for such trespass.
- (ii) No horses, cattle, sheep, goats or other animals shall be driven or ridden on any footpath or in or through any such land without authority of the proper officer of the Council having first been obtained.
- 21. No person shall bring or have any dog in any of such lands unless such dog is controlled by a chain or cord
- 22. No person shall park or leave any motor car or other vehicle in any of such lands excepting at such places and at such times as are provided for that purpose by the Council and the Council may make a charge not exceeding Two shillings a day or part of a day for every motor car or other vehicle so parked or left.

23. No person shall dig or remove any sand, gravel, soil, or other material from any of such lands unless authorized in writing by the Council so to do.

- 24. Where any area in such lands has been set apart as a children's playground and swings and other appliances have been provided, the following rules shall apply—
  - (a) No person above the age of fourteen years shall enter upon or remain on such area or use any of the swings or other appliances therein, provided, however, that this condition shall not apply to parents or other persons in charge of children who shall be at liberty to enter or remain on such area to watch over children who are in their charge.
  - (b) The swings or other appliances erected in such area shall not be used by any child or children for a longer period than five minutes consecutively if any other child or children is or are waiting to use them.
  - (c) Every person being lawfully on such area shall obey the directions of any officer of the Council or of any police officer or any member of the Management Committee in respect of his or her conduct therein.
  - (d) The Council and/or Management Committee shall not be responsible for any accident occurring on any portion of such area or arising from the use of any of the swings or other appliances therein.

- (e) Children's playgrounds shall not be open for use after the hour of sunset.
- 25. No person or persons without the written permission of the Council and a permit to sell, supply or consume liquor issued pursuant to the Licensing Act, shall—
  - (a) bring into or consume in any such lands,
  - (b) supply to any person or persons in any such lands,
  - (c) have in his or her possession or under his or her control in any such lands,

any alcoholic liquor.

- 26. None of the powers conferred on the Management Committee of any recreation reserve by the constitution and rules of such Management Committee shall be exercised in the event of the Council having passed a Resolution forbidding the exercise of such powers or any of them
- 27. Penalties—Every person who is guilty of any wilful act or default contrary to any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20).

County Court Act 1958. RULES OF COURT.

WE, a majority of the Judges for the time being of the County Court, in exercise of the powers vested in us by section 78 of the County Court Act 1958 do hereby amend the County Court Rules 1930 as follows and have fixed the following scale of fees costs and expenses to be paid to counsel practitioners and witnesses.

- 1. For paragraph (d) of Rule 2 of Order LI. there shall be substituted the following paragraph:-
  - (d) Subject to the provisions of these rules, all costs taxed by the Registrar shall be taxed as follows:-
    - (i) As to all business done on or after the fifteenth day of November, 1962 according to the Schedule hereto of Scale of Costs.
      - (ii) As to all business done on or after the first day of July, 1957, and before the fifteenth day of November, 1962, according to the Schedule of Scale of Costs which came into force on the sixth day of May, 1953, with the addition thereto of fifty per centum on all allowances set forth in that scale, (other than for Counsel's fees and other disbursements and payments).
      - (iii) As to all business done on or after the sixth day of May, 1953, but before the first day of July, 1957, according to the Schedule of Scale of Costs which came into force on the sixth day of May, 1953.
- 2. After paragraph (b) of Rule 15 of Order LI. there shall be inserted the following paragraphs:--
  - (c) Where the amount recovered or sought to be recovered or the value of the property in litigation regulating the scale of costs exceeds £2,500, then notwithstanding anything contained in the rules or in the scale of costs the fees to be allowed to counsel (including if the Judge thinks fit more than one counsel) shall be such fees as the Judge shall certify.
  - (d) Where in such case the Judge certifies for more than one counsel all reasonable and necessary attendances and copies additional to those which would have been necessary had only one counsel been employed shall be allowed.
- 3. For the Schedule of Scale of Costs at the end of the said Rules, there shall be substituted the Schedule of Scale of Costs annexed thereto.

- 3. Upon application for exemption being made, in writing, by any water user in the Marysville Waterworks Trust District to the Trust, the Trust if it thinks fit may grant a written exemption to any such water user from the operation of this By-law in whole or in part and for such period and upon such terms and conditions as the Trust may see fit to impose or the Trust may refuse to grant such application without giving any reason for such refusal.
- 4. This By-law shall have effect throughout the whole of the Marysville Waterworks Trust District.
- 5. Every person guilty of an offence against this Bylaw shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Fifty pounds and in the case of a continuing offence a further penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "ANZAC MEMORIAL PARK", WARRACKNABEAL.

WHEREAS by section 218 of the Land Act 1958 power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the Land Acts for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works in pursuance of the power conferred aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land in the Township of Warracknabeal temporarily reserved by Order in Council dated the 7th September, 1903, as a site for Public Recreation and known as "Anzac Memorial Park", Warracknabeal, (hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve").

The Reserve has been placed under control of a Committee of Management with power and authority to enforce these Regulations.

#### REGULATIONS.

- 1. The Regulations made by the Board in respect of the Reserve on the 9th July, 1937, are hereby rescinded.
- 2. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football

matches, fêtes, tennis, sports, shows, gymkhanas, or hollday amusements, on any of which occasions the fees provided hereinafter may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult.

- 3. For admission of each adult on such days as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, shows, gymkhanas, tennis or holiday amusements, a sum not exceeding 5s. (five shillings).
- 4. No person shall be allowed to cart any material through or within the Reserve, nor shall any loaded dray, cart, or wagon be driven through or within the Reserve without the permission of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- 5. No person, unless authorized by the Committee of Management, shall drive or ride any animal with or without vehicles, upon that part of the Reserve used for athletic or racing purposes or games.
- 6. No person, not being a player or official, shall trespass on the playing arena or racing track during the progress of any football or cricket match, tennis, or any sports gathering or race-meeting, nor wilfully obstruct or interrupt or in any way interfere with any servant of the Committee of Management in the proper execution of his work or duty.
- 7. The Committee of Management may let the Reserve on such terms and conditions as it may deem reasonable and consistent with these Regulations, but the maximum fee shall not exceed the sum of £50 per day for each function.
- 8. The Committee of Management may set apart any portion of the Reserve for the purpose of any lawful game, gymkhana, or sports, and from time to time grant to any club or association of clubs, upon such terms and conditions as the Committee of Management may determine, the use of the grounds so set apart.
- 9. The Committee of Management may from time to time select portions of the Reserve for the parking of cars, and vehicles, and for the tethering of horses, and no cars, vehicles, or horses shall be parked or tethered in any portions of the Reserve other than in the portions set apart for the purposes. A charge of Two shillings per day may be made for the admission of any vehicle to the Reserve, on such days on which a charge for admission is being made, as provided by clause 2 of these Regulations.
- 10. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted thereon without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- 11. No person shall climb or jump through over or under the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, cut names on or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles therein.
- 12. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained, provided always that the money received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
- 13. No persons shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any buildings, or any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- 14. No person shall behave in a disorderly manner, or create or take part in any disturbance, or use indecent or abusive language or commit any nuisance, or in any way offend against decency in the Reserve, or the buildings or structures therein, and any person found in a state of intoxication or othewise offending against this Regulation, shall be liable to be forthwith removed from the Reserve, notwithstanding that such person shall have a ticket for admission thereto, and shall be liable to the penalty hereinafter provided.
- 15. No person shall remain in the Reserve at any time when lawfully directed by any officer or employee of the Committee of Management to leave the same.
- 16. No club, association, or person shall hold or take part in any game of golf, or any games of any description, entertainment, performance, show, or ceremony in any part of the Reserve without the written authority of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- 17. No club or association of any kind having for its object physical recreation, or any members or member of any club or association, nor any other person shall play,

practise, train or engage in any game of sport or athletic exercise within the Reserve without the permission of the Committee of Management, in writing, first obtained, unless any such person is at the time of playing a member of any club which is duly authorized to play in the Reserve at such time. Provided that any person not otherwise offending against these Regulations may enter on the Reserve and play golf thereon, on paying to the club or association for the time being leasing the Reserve or the Committee of Management, a green fee of Two shillings and sixpence per day, or part thereof, or of Five shillings per week.

- 18. No person shall carry firearms in or through the Reserve, or shoot, snare or destroy any birds or animals therein, or take, injure or destroy any bird's egg, either in the Reserve or in or on any water therein, or bathe in any such water, unless by the authority of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- 19. No person shall sell or offer for sale within the Reserve any article of food or drink or other commodity or operate any money making amusement without the written permission of the Committee of Management.
- 20. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.
- 21. No person shall carry on the trade, business, or calling of a bookmaker except in or on such portions of the Reserve as may be set apart for that purpose and then only when he shall have complied with the conditions imposed by the Committee of Management, viz.:—That he shall be duly registered as a bookmaker and pay to the Committee of Management such fee as the Committee of Management may determine. That during the time that he shall be in or upon the Reserve carrying on his trade, business, or calling of a bookmaker he shall wear a ticket to be supplied to him by the Committee of Management which shall be visible to the public and shall have thereon his name.
- 22. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection or enclosure on the occasions of any fêtes, sports, race-meetings, or holiday amusements, may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure and such Committee, in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein during occupancy or hiring and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations, and by any order given by the Committee of Management.
- 23. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

- 5. No person shall keep or cause or permit to be kept on any property more than two (2) turkeys, ducks or geese.
- 6. No person shall allow, cause, permit, or suffer poultry to wander, either at large or under control, in or upon any street, road, vacant land, or watercourse within the Borough.
- 7. No person shall keep in any fowl-house a number of fowls greater than the number produced by dividing the area in square feet of such fowl-house by four.
- 8. No person shall keep, cause, permit or allow to be kept on any property, more than twenty (20) fowls, without the written permission of the Council being first obtained, and such permission shall only be granted if the Council has satisfied itself that the accommodation provided for the housing and yarding of such fowls is adequate and is not likely to be offensive or injurious to health health.

Every fowl-house or battery cage, if immobile, shall be rendered rat-proof by placing galvanised iron, jointed brickwork, cement sheeting, or concrete around the outer foundations to a depth of at least 18 inches below the surface level of the floor, and all walls shall be constructed of approved rat-proof materials.
- 12. No person shall keep or store, or cause or permit to be kept or stored on any property where poultry are kept, any food for consumption by poultry, unless such food is kept or stored in rat-proof receptacles.
- 13. The owner, occupier, or person in charge of any property on which poultry are kept, shall cause the fowlhouse, immobile battery cage, mobile battery cage, and any attached fowl-run or yard, to be thoroughly cleansed from time to time, as often as may be necessary, or at the direction of the Council, and shall keep the same in a clean, wholesome, and sanitary condition at all times, with particular regard to drainage.
- 14. Poultry droppings, litter, and refuse shall be removed from the premises from time to time, or at the direction of the Council, so as not to cause a nuisance or conditions likely to be offensive.
- 15. Any person guilty of contravention of any provisions of this By-law shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds, and, in the case of any offence continuing after such conviction, to a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds, but so that the total of such penalties shall not exceed One hundred pounds.
