PROCLAMATION

PROCLAMATION

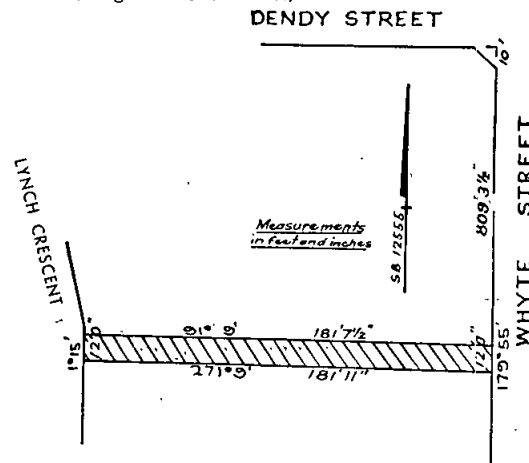
By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1958*, as amended, section 519, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon request of the Council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to proclaim any land reserved, used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley or right-of-way or any street, road, lane, or passage made or laid out or proposed to be made or laid out on any land of which a plan delineating that street, road, lane or passage has been lodged with the

Registrar of Titles pursuant to sub-section (11) of section 569 of the said Act to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force:

And whereas the Council of the City of Brighton has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been used for a street within the said City, be so declared to be a public highway:

Now, therefore, I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare that all that piece of land being a right-of-way between Lynch-crescent and Whyte-street, Brighton, shown hatched on the plan hereunder, shall be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act.

DJERRIWARRH RESERVOIR WATER SUPPLY CATCHMENT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State and in pursuance of the provisions contained in section 22 of the *Soil Conservation and Land Utilization Act 1958* (No. 6372), do by this Proclamation define the water supply catchment area to be known as the Djerriwarrah Reservoir Water Supply Catchment.

Commencing at the western end of the Djerriwarrah Dam site on the Djerriwarrah Creek, in Crown allotment 1, section XXII, Parish of Merrimu and following the watershed of the Djerriwarrah Creek upstream from the dam site, north-westerly across the north-eastern corner of the said allotment to the road reserve on the boundary between the Parishes of Merrimu and Colmadai; thence generally northerly in the Parish of Colmadai through Crown allotments 21L, 21E¹ and the State Forest to Mt. Sugarloaf; thence in a generally north-easterly direction through the said parish into the Parish of Bullengarook; thence turning northerly, north-easterly and south-easterly through the State Forest in the said parish into Crown allotment 5, section A; thence northerly through Crown allotments 4, 3, section A, into the Parish of Gisborne; thence continuing in the said parish through Crown allotments 3, 2, and 1, section L; thence north-easterly through Crown allotments 13, 14, 12 and 12A, section M,

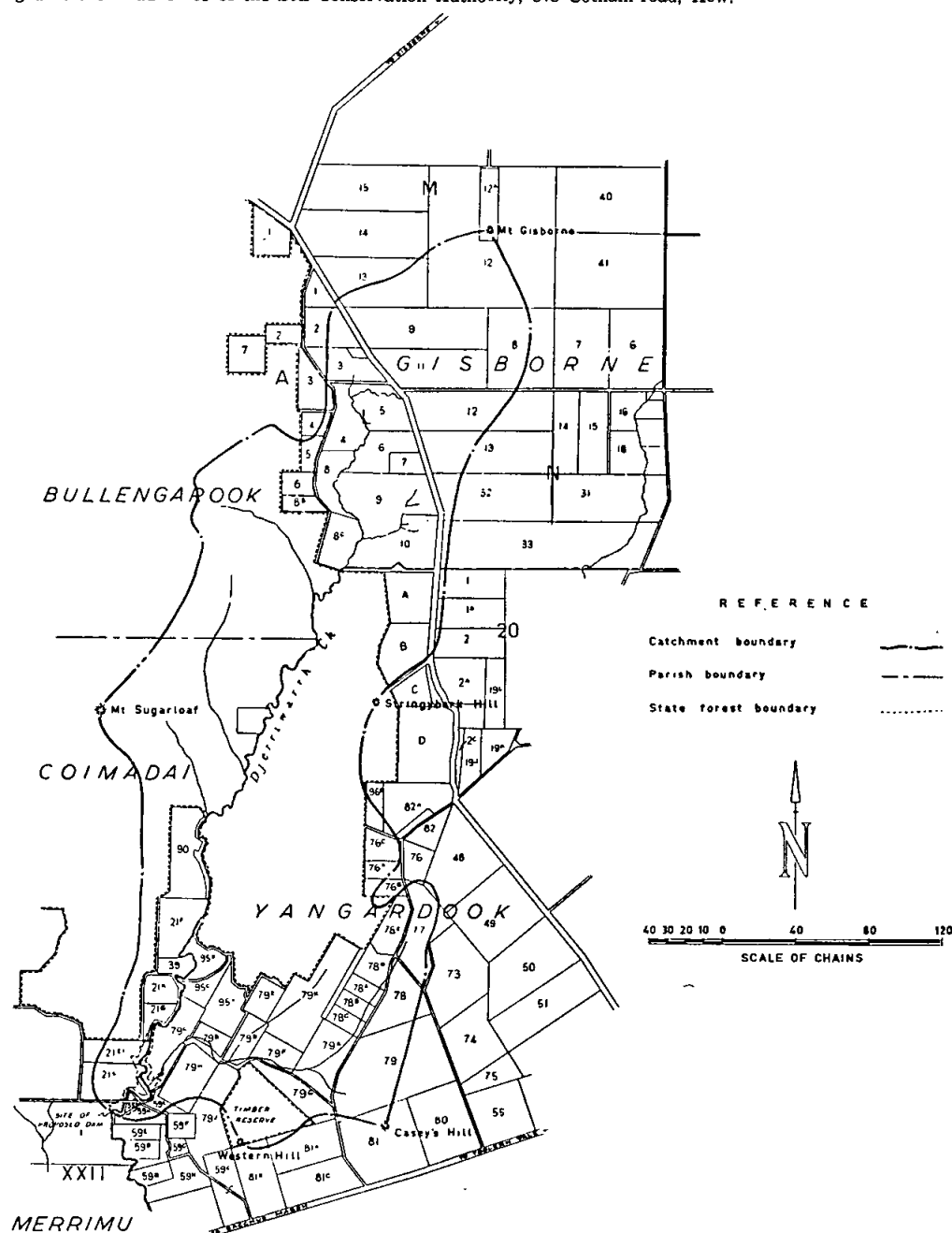

PORTION OF THE HUME WEIR.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the *Fisheries Act 1958* and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this my Proclamation revoke the Proclamation made the thirty-first day of March, 1930, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the second day of April, 1930, respecting the prohibition of all fishing in or the taking of fish from that portion of the Hume Reservoir within a radius of approximately one mile upstream from the Hume Weir.

FISHING IN CERTAIN WATERS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Fisheries Act 1958* and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this my Proclamation vary the Proclamation made the nineteenth day of October, 1954, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the twenty-seventh day of October, 1954, as amended from time to time, relating to the prohibition of fishing in certain waters by inserting after the words set after "Goulburn River" in Section "B" of such Proclamation the words "but not including that portion of the Delatite Arm of the Eildon Reservoir from Brack Bridge on the Monkey Gully-Gough's Corner road downstream to a point distant approximately 2½ miles from such bridge in which water fishing is prohibited during the whole year".

*Fisheries Act 1958.*PROHIBITION OF ALL FISHING IN PORTION OF THE
DELATITE ARM OF THE EILDON RESERVOIR
DURING THE WHOLE YEAR.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the *Fisheries Act*

1958 and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this my Proclamation prohibit during the whole of each year all fishing in or the taking of fish from that portion of the Delatite Arm of the Eildon Reservoir from Brack Bridge on the Monkey Gully-Gough's Corner-road westerly or downstream to a point distant approximately 2½ miles from such bridge.

Note.—As a guide to anglers and others a post will be erected on each bank in line with the 2½-mile point to denote the closure boundary, but the absence or invisibility of one or both posts will not relieve any person from compliance with the provisions of the Proclamation.

Country Fire Authority Act 1958.

SUMMER PERIOD IN RESPECT OF SPECIFIED PARTS OF THE COUNTRY AREA OF VICTORIA.

WHEREAS by section 4 of the *Country Fire Authority Act 1958* it is enacted that the Chief Secretary of Victoria, after consultation with the Minister of Forests, may from time to time by Declaration published in the *Government Gazette* declare any period to be the summer period in respect of the country area of Victoria, or any specified part or parts thereof, and, without affecting the generality of the foregoing, may declare different periods to be the summer period in respect of different parts of the said country area:

And whereas the Chief Secretary and the Minister of Forests have consulted accordingly:

Now therefore I, the Chief Secretary of Victoria, do hereby declare the period commencing at midnight on the seventh day of December, 1962, and ending at midnight on the thirtieth day of April, 1963, to be the summer period in respect of the parts hereinafter specified of the country area of Victoria, that is to say:—

The Second Fire Control Region, comprising the municipal districts of the City of Bendigo, the Borough of Eaglehawk, and those portions of the Shires of Marong and Strathfieldsaye not included in the Twenty-first Fire Control Region;

the Tenth Fire Control Region, comprising the municipal districts of the City of Sale, the Borough of Traralgon, and the Shires of Alberton, Avon, Maffra, Morwell, Rosedale and Traralgon;

the Seventeenth Fire Control Region, comprising the municipal districts of the City of Horsham and the Shires of Arapiles, Dimboola, Dunnmunkle, Kaniva, Kowree, Lowan, Warracknabeal and Wimmera;

the Nineteenth Fire Control Region, comprising the municipal districts of the Town of St. Arnaud and the Shires of Bet Bet, Kara Kara and Korong; those portions of the Sixth Fire Control Region, comprised by the municipal district of the Shire of Otway, excepting those portions of the Sixth Fire Control Region within the municipal district of the Shire of Otway comprising of the land under the control of the Rural Finance and Settlement Commission which the Governor in Council has consented to being used for settlement under the *Land Settlement Act 1959* and being all such land situated—

(a) in the Parishes of Wirridjil and Waarre, and
(b) in such portions of the Parish of Latrobe as lie—

(i) to the east of the Old Princetown-road, and
(ii) to the east of the Old Princetown-road and within three (3) miles from that road.

those portions of the Ninth Fire Control Region comprised by the Borough of Moe and the Yallourn Works Area, pursuant to the *State Electricity Commission Act 1958*;

those portions of the Fourteenth Fire Control Region comprised by the municipal districts of the Shires of Bacchus Marsh, Bulla and Melton, and those portions of the municipal districts of the Cities of Broadmeadows, Keilor and Sunshine not included in the Metropolitan Fire District;

those portions of the Sixteenth Fire Control Region comprised by the municipal districts of the Town of Stawell and the Shire of Stawell;

those portions of the Twentieth Fire Control Region comprised by the municipal district of the Shire of Rochester;

those portions of the Twenty-first Fire Control Region comprised by the municipal districts of the Shires of East Loddon, Huntly and Maldon, and those portions of the Shires of Marong and Strathfieldsaye not included in the Second Fire Control Region;

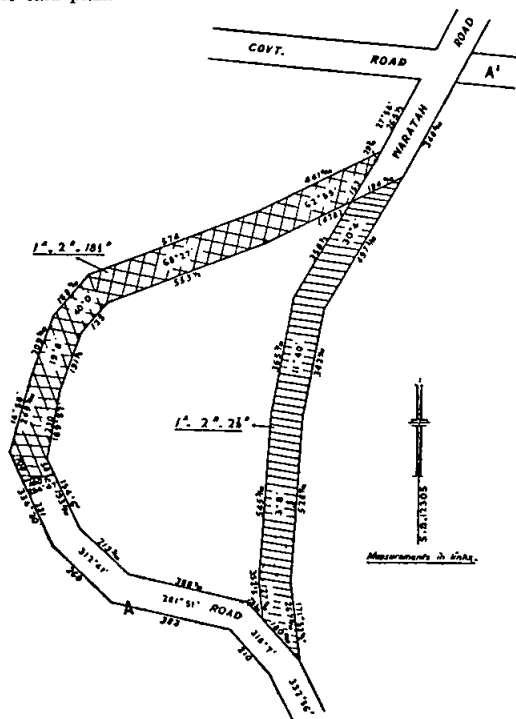

1. After the coming into operation of this Interim Development Order no person shall except in accordance with the provisions of a permit issued by the Responsible Authority—

- (a) use or develop any land within the area included in the Schedule.
- (b) without restricting the generality of the preceding paragraph use any land within the area included in the Schedule on which at the date of the coming into operation of this Interim Development Order any building or

In this paragraph the word "shop" includes any premises where goods are kept exposed or offered for sale by retail, and a cafe, a restaurant, a library, a pharmacy and any premises where the services of hairdressing or chiropody or other similar services to the public are provided.

- (c) erect, construct or carry out any buildings or works on any land within the area in the Schedule which land at the date of coming into operation of this Order is vacant or which subsequent to the coming into operation of this Interim Development Order becomes vacant or on which any buildings or works are demolished or destroyed so as to render them unusable.

2. Any application for a permit to use or develop any land or to erect, construct or carry out any buildings or works, shall be accompanied by a sketch plan or copy of Certificate of Title of the land and a description of the proposed use or development, and type and construction of any buildings or works proposed to be erected, constructed or carried out and such other particulars relating to the application as the Responsible Authority may require.

3. This Interim Development Order shall not prevent the continuance of the use of any land or buildings for the purposes for which such land or buildings were lawfully used immediately before the coming into operation of this Order.

4. Schedule (technical description of the land affected):—

All that piece of land commencing at the south-east corner of the intersection of Spencer-street and Dudley-street, bounded thence by the southern side of Dudley-street and its prolongation bearing north-easterly to the east side of Peel-street; thence by the east side of Peel-street bearing north to Victoria-street; thence by the south side of Victoria-street bearing east to Spring-street; thence by the western side of Spring-street and its prolongation bearing south-easterly to the northern bank of the Yarra River; thence by the northern bank of the Yarra River bearing north-westerly, westerly and south-westerly to Spencer-street and; thence by the eastern side of Spencer-street bearing north-westerly to the commencing point.

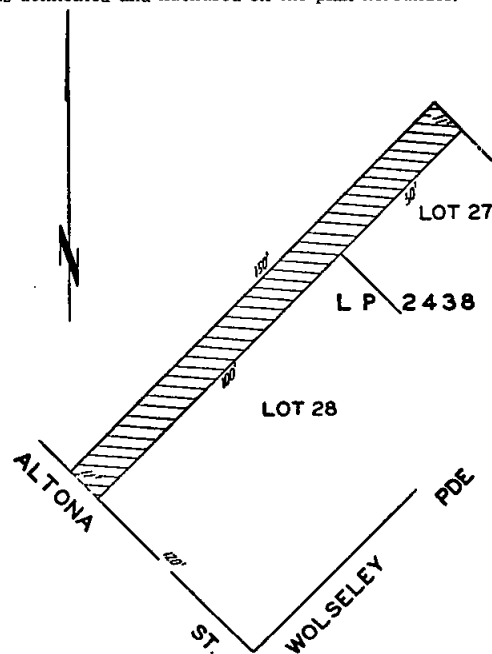

CHELSEA SEWERAGE AUTHORITY.—SEWERAGE DISTRICT PROCLAIMED AND AUTHORITY CONSTITUTED.

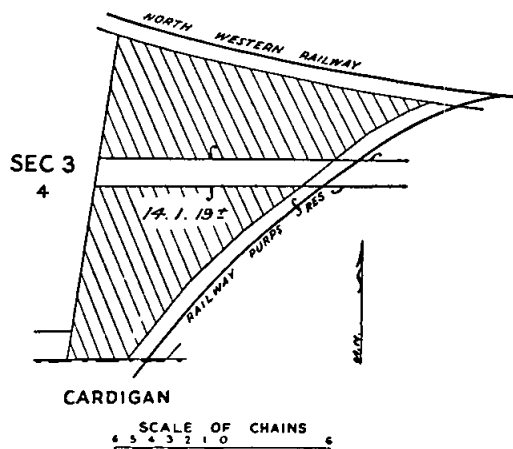

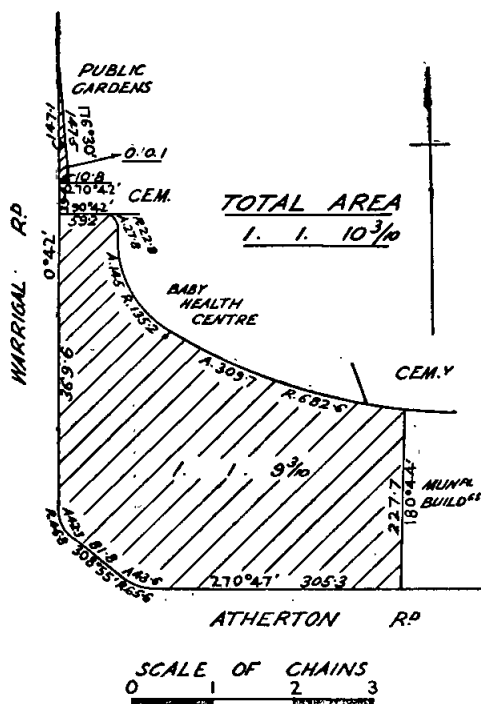

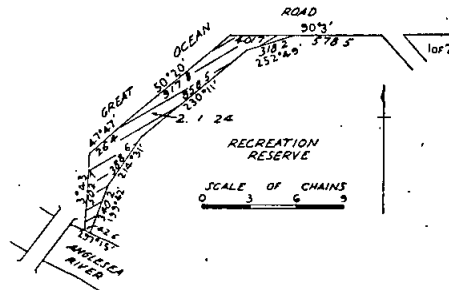

WHEREAS by section 218 of the *Land Act 1958* power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the Land Acts for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works in pursuance of the power conferred aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land in the Township of Maffra, temporarily reserved by Order in Council dated the 31st January, 1962, as a site for Public purposes, and known as "Mafeking Hill Reserve", Maffra, and hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve".

The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management hereinafter referred to as "the Committee".

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public all day and all night, free of charge.

2. No person who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct shall enter or remain in the Reserve.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor light fires therein without the written consent of the Committee.

4. No person shall climb on or jump over the seats or the buildings in the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on or in any way damage such seats or buildings.

5. No person shall leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish in the Reserve, except in the receptacles provided therein for that purpose.

6. No person shall throw stones or any other missiles in the Reserve.

7. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle or horses without first obtaining permission, in writing of the Committee.

8. The Committee shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing in the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle.

For the purposes of this clause "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the *Pounds Act 1958*.

9. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord.

10. No person shall camp in the Reserve, or erect therein any dwelling, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

11. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

12. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.

13. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasion of any fêtes, sports or amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee may at any time determine by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee, in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations, and by any order given by the Committee.

14. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees, shrubs, or flowers.

15. No person shall drive a vehicle in or through the Reserve or park a vehicle except by permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

16. No person shall engage in cricket, football, tennis or any other like game, nor shall any band perform in the Reserve, without the permission, in writing of the Committee.

17. No person shall hawk or offer for sale in the Reserve any goods or articles of any description without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

18. No person shall remove or displace any board, plate, or tablet, or any support, fastening, or fitting used or constructed, or adapted to be used for the exhibition of any regulation or notice, and fixed or set up by the Committee.

19. No person shall at any time ride or drive into or through the Reserve any horse or cattle without first obtaining the permission, in writing, of the Committee.

20. No person shall affix, print, post, paint, or cut or mark any advertisement, sign, picture, bill, placard, notice, words, letters, or figures to or upon any tree, building, barrier, railing, seat, structure, erection, flagging, or path in the Reserve, without the consent of the Committee.

21. No person shall, in the Reserve, erect any post, rail, fence, pole, tent, booth, stand, building, or structure, without the consent of the Committee.

22. No person shall be on the Reserve in a state of intoxication, or behave in a disorderly manner, or create or take part in any disturbance therein, or obstruct any servant of the Committee, or use insulting words or gestures, or otherwise misbehave.

23. No person shall, in the Reserve, wilfully obstruct, disturb, interrupt, or annoy any other person in the proper use of the Reserve, or in any part thereof, or wilfully obstruct or interrupt any servant of the Committee in the proper execution of his duty or work.

24. No male person, other than a boy under the age of four (4) years shall enter or use any place, room, or building set apart for the use of females, and no female shall enter or use any place, room, or building set apart for the use of males.

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 218 of the *Land Act 1958*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist therefrom, may be forthwith apprehended by such Bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.
