
PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS by the Local Government Act 1958, as amended, section 519, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon request of the Council of any municipality, by notice in the Government Gazette, to proclaim any land reserved, used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley or right-of-way or any street, road, lane or passage made or laid out or proposed to be made or laid out on any land of which a plan delineating that street, road, lane or passage has been lodged with the Registrar of Titles pursuant to subsection (11) of section 569 of the said Act to be a public highway and that such land shall thereupon and thence forth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force:

SUMMER PERIOD IN RESPECT OF SPECIFIED PARTS OF THE COUNTRY AREA OF VICTORIA.

- (b) No person shall use or cause to be used any premises or any part of any premises so that there emanates therefrom any noise materially interfering with the reasonable comfort (having regard to the time at which such noise is made or caused to be made) of any person in any adjacent premises or in any adjacent street or road.
- .(c) The owner or occupier of any land or premises permitting any person on such land or premises to contravene the provisions of this clause shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.
- 4. Any wilful contravention of the foregoing clauses by act or omission shall be an offence against this By-law.
- 5. Every person guilty of an offence against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence to a penalty of Five pounds for each day on which the offence against this By-law is continued after a conviction or order by any court.
