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








Parish of Yalimba East, County of Villiers, being the road indicated by hachure on plan hereunder.—(Y.76(*) (D.33714).



Country Fire Authority Act 1958.

VARIATION OF SUMMER PERIOD IN RESPECT OF SPECIFIED PARTS OF THE COUNTRY AREA OF VICTORIA.

WHEREAS by section 4 of the Country Fire Authority
Act 1958 it is enacted that the Chief Secretary of
Victoria, after consultation with the Minister of Forests,
may from time to time by declaration published in the
Government Gazette declare any period to be the summer
period in respect of the country area of Victoria, or any
specified part or parts thereof and, without affecting the
generality of the foregoing, may declare different periods
to be the summer period in respect of different parts of
the said country area:

And whereas by the said sub-section it is further enacted that any declaration so published may be revoked, amended, or varied by a subsequent declaration so published:

And whereas by declarations issued on the tenth day of November, 1961, the seventeenth day of November, 1961, the twenty-eighth day of November, 1961, the fourth day of December, 1961, and the twelfth day of December, 1961, and published in the Government Gazette of the fifteenth day of November, 1961, the twenty-second day of November, 1961, the twenty-ninth day of November, 1961, the eighth day of December, 1961, and the thirteenth day of December, 1961, respectively, different summer periods expiring on the fifteenth day of April, 1962, were declared in respect of different parts of the country area of Victoria, including the parts of the said country area specified in the Schedule hereto:

And whereas it is deemed expedient that the aforesaid declarations should be varied in the manner hereinafter described:

Now therefore I, Arthur Gordon Rylah, Chief Secretary of Victoria, do by this my declaration vary the aforesaid declarations by declaring that the summer period in respect of the parts of the country area of Victoria specified in the Schedule hereto shall end at midnight on the sixteenth day of March, 1962.

SCHEDULE.

- The Second Fire Control Region, comprising the municipal districts of the City of Bendigo, the Borough of Eaglehawk, and those portions of the Shires of Marong and Strathfieldsaye not included in the Twenty-first Fire Control Region;
- the Ninth Fire Control Region, comprising the municipal districts of the Borough of Moe, the Shires of Buln Buln, Korumburra, Mirboo, Narracan, South Gippsland, Warragul, and Woorayl, and the Yallourn Works Area, as defined pursuant to the State Electricity Commission Act 1958;

- the Tenth Fire Control Region, comprising the municipal districts of the City of Sale, the Borough of Traralgon, and the Shires of Alberton, Avon, Maffra, Morwell, Rosedale and Traralgon;
- those portions of the Eleventh Fire Control Region, comprised by the municipal districts of the Shires of Beirnsdale, Orbost and Tambo;
- those portions of the Seventeenth Fire Control Region, comprised by the municipal districts of the City of Horsham, the Shires of Dimboola, Dummunkle, Kaniva, Lowan and Warracknabeal, and those portions of the Shires of Arapiles and Wimmera respectively which lie in a northerly direction from the under-mentioned boundaries, that is to say:—
 - (a) Shire of Arapiles.—Commencing at the intersection of the Rifle Butts-road with the McKenzie River; thence generally westerly and north-westerly along the aforementioned road and the Clear Lake-Tooen-Duffholme road to its intersection with the western boundary of the municipal district.
 - the municipal district.

 (b) Shire of Wimmera.—Commencing at the intersection of the Wimmera River with the Rocklands-Lubeck Channel on the eastern boundary of the municipal district; thence generally in a westerly and south-westerly direction along the aforementioned channel to its intersection with the McKenzie River on the western boundary of the municipal district; contract of the Nineteenth Fire Control Region.
- those portions of the Nineteenth Fire Control Region, comprised by the municipal district of the Shire of Bet Bet;
- those portions of the Twenty-first Fire Control Region, comprised by the municipal districts of the Town of Castlemaine, the Shires of Maldon and Metcalfe, and those portions of the Shire of Strathfieldsaye not included in the Second Fire Control Region:
- and those portions of the Twenty-third Fire Control Region, comprised by the Shires of Rutherglen and Yarrawonga, and those portions of the Shire of Wangaratta defined in the First Schedule to this declaration.

First Schedule.

Commencing at a point on the eastern or right-hand bank of the Ovens River at its junction with the south side of the Murray Valley Highway on frontage abutting allotment Nos. 1 and A1, Parish of Boorhaman; thence easterly bounded by the southern side of Murray Valley Highway to the north-east corner of allotment 5 of said parish; thence southerly elong eastern boundary of allotments 5a; thence crossing Government-road easterly; thence bearing easterly along northern boundary of allotments 8a, 8b, 9a and 9 to north-east corner of allotment 9; thence easterly across Government-road to the eastern boundary of Parish of Boorhaman; thence southerly along eastern side of Boundary-road with Rutherglen Shire to the south-west corner of allotment 32 of said Parish of Boorhaman; thence easterly along northern side of Boundary-road with Rutherglen Shire to the south-eastern corner of allotment No. 47, Parish of Boorhaman; thence easterly along northern side of Boundary-road with Rutherglen Shire to the south-eastern corner of allotment No. 47, Parish of Boorhaman; thence easterly along the northern side of Boundary-road to south-east corner of allotment 2a, Parish of Bontherambo; thence easterly along the northern side of Boundary-road to south-east corner of allotment 26A of said Parish of Chiltern West at the western boundary of allotment B6, section XI. of said Parish of Chiltern West at the western boundary of the north-eastern Railway Reserve in a south-ment E, section XI., Parish of Chiltern West; thence following the north-eastern boundary of the north-eastern Railway Reserve in a south-westerly direction through the Parish of Chiltern West, Bontherambo, Carraragarmungee, and Wangaratta North to its junction with the north-eastern bank of the Ovens River to the point of commencement.

WHEREAS by sub-section (2) of section 50 of the Forests Act 1958 (No. 6254), the Governor in Council is enabled to make Rules and Regulations in regard to the care, protection and management of any land forming part of any reserved forest such land being a place of natural beauty or interest, or a health resort, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering in or upon such land, or any specified part or parts thereof, and by such Rules and Regulations to extend and apply for the purpose of such section, and the Rules and Regulations thereunder, the provisions of sub-sections (2), (3), (4) and (5) of section 219 and section 222 of the Land Act 1958 (No. 6284), with such alterations, substitutions, additions, omissions and modifications as are necessary or expedient for the purposes of carrying out the objects of this section: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Rules and Regulations in respect of the land forming portion of the Reserved Forest in the Parishes of Telbit West and Fumina North. Counties of Tanjil and Buln Buln, comprising 2,450 acres more or less as shown by red border on plan A over 60/8 on file of correspondence No. 60/1244 in the Forests Department:-

RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "MOUNT BAW BAW ALPINE RESORT". HEREINAFTER REFERRED TO AS "THE RESORT".

- 1. For the purpose of these Regulations-
 - "Commission" means the Forests Commission of Victoria.
- "Committee" means the Committee of Management duly appointed under the Forests Act to control and manage the Resort.
- "Duly authorized person" means any person specially authorized, in writing, by the Committee to enforce any or all of these Regulations.
- "Licensee" means and person, club or organization to whom a permissive occupancy licence has been issued by the Commission.
- 2. No person who, in the opinion of any forest officer or member of the Committee or duly authorized person, has offender against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct shall remain on the Resort after having been requested or ordered by such officer or member or duly authorized person to leave.
- 3. No person shall light or maintain any fire within the Resort, except in accordance with the provisions of the Forests Acts and Regulations.
- 4. No person shall within the Resort carry or use firearms of any description.
 - 5. No person shall-
 - (a) set any trap, or snare, or shoot, poison, hook or otherwise destroy or interfere with or take away any bird or animal (excepting hares, rabbits, wild dogs or wombats) or any skin, egg, feathers or nest;
 - (b) bring into the Resort any dog without the permission, in writing, of a duly authorized person;
 - (c) deposit or cause to be deposited waste paper, bottles, broken glass or any other litter on any part of the Resort, except in receptacles provided for that purpose by the Committee;
 - (d) intentionally break any glass bottle or other container within the Resort;

- (e) commit a nuisance in any part of the Resort or in any building in the Resort,
- 6. No person shall-
 - (a) without being the holder of a licence for the purpose, remove, cut or in any way damage any trees (whether dead or alive) or any shrubs, ferns, plants, leaves or flowers within the Resort;
 - (b) bring into the Resort any seed or portion of any plant or plant any tree without the permission, in writing, of the Committee.
- 7. No person (other than an officer or employee of the Commission or a duly authorized person) shall enter any plot enclosed for plantation of young trees, shrubs or flowers, or for the protection of the young native species naturally grown, or remove therefrom any plant, bark, fruit, seed, leaves or flowers.
- - (a) application in due form has been made, plans and specifications of the proposed structure submitted and the appropriate fees paid to the Committee;
 - (b) written approval of the Committee has been obtained for such plans and specifications;
 - (c) such body or person is a licensee within the meaning of these Regulations; and
 - (d) subject to the foregoing, construction is strictly in accordance with such approved plans and specifications and is restricted to the terms and conditions of the licence.
- 9. Any requirements of the Committee relating to water supply, drainage, sanitation, garbage or other condition of occupation of the site and directed, in writing, either generally or specifically to any licensee, shall be fulfilled by such licensee within the period if any stated in such direction.
- 10. (a) No garbage shall be deposited anywhere on the Resort, except in the garbage pits provided.
 - (b) All tins shall be flattened.
- (c) All empty bottles shall be removed from lodge sites and placed at collection points as defined by the Committee.
 - 11. No person shall-
 - (a) mark, write on, deface or in any way damage any buildings, posts, fences, railings, pillars or other structure or property or natural objects within the Resort;
 - (b) affix any bill or sign to any tree or structure within or around the Resort without the permission, in writing, of the Committee being first obtained.
- 12. No licensee shall create or permit any nuisance within the building erected on any land the subject of his licence or permit such building to be used in a disorderly manner through the consumption of liquor or otherwise.
- 13. No person shall offer for sale in the Resort any article without the permission to do so being first obtained from the Committee. Such written permission shall be produced at any time on demand to a duly authorized person.
- 14. (a) No person shall reside or camp within the Resort unless such person is properly accommodated in a building erected in accordance with the provisions of these Regulations except in an area that may be set aside for the purpose by the Committee and for such period that the Committee may determine.
- (b) Whenever the officer in charge of the forest district considers it desirable for fire protection purposes

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or for the safety of any person, he may direct any person to leave the Resort and any person so directed shall thereupon promptly leave the Resort.

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15. No person shall park any motor car within the Resort, excepting at such places as are set apart by the Committee for that purpose and subject to payment of the prescribed fees.

16. (a) When so directed by notice, in writing, from the Committee or a forest officer, any licensee shall provide and maintain hard standings within his licenced area and means of access thereto for motor vehicles and such hard standings and means of access shall be of the nature specified and be provided within the time required by such notice by such notice.

(b) At any time when so directed by the Committee or a forest officer, no person shall drive or operate any self-propelled vehicle within the Resort, except on a surfaced road or on hard standings, but this Regulation shall not refer to tracked vehicles operating on a snow-covered surface. covered surface.

17. The Commission may fix and collect from licensees, such annual fees or other charges for the purpose of improvement, development and maintenance of the Resort as may be deemed necessary upon recommendation of the Committee from time to time.

For the purpose of these Regulations the provision of sub-sections (4) and (5) of section 219 and the paragraphs (a), (b), (c), (e) and (f) of sub-section (1) of section 222 of the Land Act 1958, are extended and applied with such alterations, substitutions, additions, omissions and modifications that the said sub-sections (4) and (5) of section 219 and the said paragraphs (a), (b), (c) and (e) and (f) of sub-section (1) of section 222 shall read as follows:

TRANSPORT CONSOLIDATED REGULATIONS 1960.—AMENDMENTS TO REGULATIONS.

N pursuance of the powers conferred by the Commercial Goods Vehicles Act 1958 (Part I.) and all other powers in that behalf him enabling, His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby amend the Transport Consolidated Regulations 1960, by adding additional provisions to take effect on and from the first day of June, 1962, viz.:-

- (1) In Regulation 4 of Part I, there shall be inserted the following definition after the definition of " Touring Omnibus":—
 - "'Tow Truck' in Parts IV. and VI. means a licensed tow truck unless the contrary meaning is expressed."
 - (2) The following additional Regulations shall be added to Part IV .:-

Drivers' Certificates-Possession and Production.

- (9) (a). A tow truck shall not be driven by any person while not in possession of a certificate issued by the Board authorizing such person to drive such a vehicle.
- (b) The holder of a driver's certificate to drive a tow truck shall produce such certificate for examination forthwith if requested by an Inspector to do so and, whether or not so requested, to the owner, driver or person in charge of any motor car to whom an offer to lift and carry or tow such motor car is made.

Conditions of Operation of Tow Trucks.

- (10) (a) At all times while a tow truck is on a public highway there shall be carried therein a securely bound book of "Authority to Tow" forms numbered consecutively in duplicate in the form or to the effect of Form 5 of Part VIII. of these Regulations.
- (b) "Authority to Tow" forms shall be used consecutively in order of serial number for the purposes prescribed in this Regulation.
- (11) Subject to the provisions of Regulation 12 of this Part no driver of a tow truck shall, except where the owner of a motor car has given prior authority for the removal of that motor car and that driver while in transit to the location from which such operation is to commence is in possession of a completed." Authority to Tow" form signed by that owner in respect of that motor car, commence to lift and carry or tow any motor car unless he has entered on an "Authority to Tow" form—
 - (i) the name and address of the owner of the tow truck where such name and address is not reprinted on the form:

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- (ii) his own name as driver of the tow truck and the number of his driver's certificate to drive a tow truck;
- (iii) the registered number of the tow truck;
- (iv) the name and address of the owner of the motor car to be lifted and carried or towed and the make and registered number of that motor car;
- (v) the date and the time at which the "Authority to Tow" form is entered and the places from and to which he intends to remove that motor car

and thereafter has obtained on that form from the owner or driver or from an adult person claiming to be in charge of that motor car his signature as authority to remove that vehicle together with a description of his interest in that vehicle, and has delivered the duplicate of the completed form to that signatory.

- (12) (a) Where through the absence or incapacity of the owner or driver or any adult person claiming to be in charge of such motor car, authority to move that vehicle cannot be obtained pursuant to Regulation 11 of this Part the driver of a tow truck may remove that vehicle to the nearest place of safe custody available to him after he has—
 - (i) entered on an "Authority to Tow" form the information required thereon including the name and address of the owner of the motor car, if ascertainable; and
 - (ii) obtained in writing on that form the authority of a member of the Police Force to remove that vehicle together with the name, number and rank and Station to which that member is attached and the reason for giving such authorization.
- (b) Where on any public highway a motor car has been so damaged as to be incapable of being driven and because of its location is a traffic hazard the driver of a tow truck may where it is impossible for him to obtain authority for removal pursuant to Regulation 11 of this Part and Sub-regulation (a) of this regulation, and after he has entered on an "Authority to Tow" form all the information required thereon including the name and address of the owner of that motor car if ascertainable, move that motor car from the location of the hazard, but shall not remove it from the scene of the accident until he has obtained such authority pursuant to that regulation and sub-regulation.
- (c) Where the driver of any tow truck has moved any motor car pursuant to an authority given under sub-regulations (a) or (b) of this regulation, the duplicate copy of the "Authority to Tow" form shall be delivered to the Board at its head office in Melbourne within 72 hours of the time of removal of such motor car.
- (d) The original of each "Authority to Tow" form shall be retained by the owner of such tow truck for a period of twelve months at the address recorded on the licence applicable to such tow truck and shall be produced on request to an Inspector of the Board.
 - (13) The owner and the driver of any tow truck-
 - (a) which is on any public highway without a book of "Authority to.Tow" forms as prescribed being carried therein;
 - (b) in respect of which "Authority to Tow" forms are used other than as prescribed herein or the duplicates of which are not delivered as prescribed;
 - (c) in respect of which all the information required has not been entered on "Authority to Tow" form before the commencement of lifting and carrying or towing any motor car; or
 - (d) which has been used to lift and carry or tow any motor car under the authority of paragraph (b) of Regulation 12 of this Part before the driver thereof has satisfied himself of the necessity for immediate removal and recorded such necessity on the relevant "Authority to Tow" form

shall severally be guilty of an offence against these Regulations.

Special Provisions.

- (14) Any person who-
 - (a) coerces or attempts to coerce, or induces or attempts to induce by trick or pretence, any person to sign an "Authority to Tow" form,
 - (b) intimidates or attempts to intimidate by threat or force, prevents or attempts to prevent or obstructs the owner or the driver of any tow truck or any other person from complying with the provisions of these Regulations

shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations.

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- (15) It shall be deemed to be a breach of the conditions of a licence issued with respect to a tow truck if the owner of such tow truck or any person employed by him or acting on his behalf fails to comply with the provisions of the Wireless Telegraphy Act of the Commonwealth of Australia or Regulations made thereunder.
- (16) No owner or driver of a tow truck or person other than the driver employed by the owner of a tow truck in connexion with the operating of that tow truck shall-
 - (a) move or attempt to move any motor car otherwise than in accordance with the Regulations contained in this Part;
 - (b) commit any misconduct or misbehaviour whereby a breach of the peace may be occasioned or provoked;
 - (c) create undue noise or disturbance; or
 - (d) use any abusive, obscene or blasphemous language, or utter or make any threatening or insulting word or gesture.
- (17) No driver of a tow truck which is fitted with any flashing warning light pursuant to these Regulations shall, except when that tow truck is stationary at the scene of an accident, cause or permit that light to be alight or operative.
- (18) No driver of a tow truck shall lift and carry or tow any motor car so damaged as to be incapable of being towed on any two wheels otherwise than on a car ambulance of the type generally or specifically approved by the Board.
- (3) The following additional Regulations shall be added in Part VI. of Division III,:-

DIVISION III.—VEHICLES LICENSED TO OPERATE AS TOW TRUCKS. j 1 .

Cranes-Specification, Location, &c.

(47) Every tow truck shall be fitted with a crane with a maximum safe working load of not less than 3 tons which is located and mounted on such vehicle in the manner generally or specifically directed by the Board and which complies with and is maintained in accordance with the provisions of Part III. of the Lifts and Cranes Act and any Regulations made thereunder. Provided that the Board may for such period as it may deem necessary or expedient permit the continued use of a crane with a safe working load of less than 3 tons in cases where such crane was fitted to a vehicle licensed before the first day of April 1962.

Vehicle Capacity and Wheel Equipment.

- (48) Every tow truck shall-
- (a) have a load capacity of not less than 25 hundredweights, and,
- (b) be fitted with dual wheels on the rear axle on both the near-side and the off-side.

Provided that the Board may for such period as it may deem necessary. or expedient permit the use of any vehicle with a lesser load capacity and/or not so fitted with dual wheels.

Driver's Seat.

(49) The driver's seat shall be so constructed that no person may occupy any portion of the seat on the right-hand or off-side of the driver.

Spacer Bars and Chains.

(50) Every tow truck shall be equipped with suitable spacer bars and \cdot safety chains to enable the towing of any motor car on a public highway in a safe manner.

Lights-Working and Warning.

- : (51) Every tow truck shall be-
 - (i) equipped with suitable fully adjustable lights so mounted that during the hours of darkness the coupling of the tow truck to any motor car to be lifted and carried or towed may be safely effected, and,
 - (ii) fitted with a flashing warning light of a type required under the provisions of the Motor Car Act or any Regulation made thereunder or approved by the Chief Commissioner of Police for use at the scene of any accident.

Portable Warning Devices. .

(52) Every tow truck shall be equipped with not less than three portable warning devices of the type prescribed in the Motor Car Regulations.

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Provision of Brooms, &c.

(53) Every tow truck shall be equipped with a broom and such other equipment as is necessary for the driver thereof to comply with the provisions of the Road Traffic Regulations.

Fire Extinguisher.

- : (54) Every tow truck shall be fitted with a fire extinguisher with a capacity of not less than 1 gallon of a type approved by and maintained to the satisfaction of the Board.
