By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions of section 153 of the *Land Act 1958, I*, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare the unalienated Crown lands mentioned in the subjoined Schedule, to be available for settlement under improvement purchase leases.

Vegetation and Vine Diseases Act 1958 (No. 6407).

DECLARING A PROCLAIMED AREA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 25 of the *Vegetation and Vine Diseases Act 1958 (No. 6407)*, it is provided that, where the Governor in Council is of opinion that it is necessary to protect the fruit industry against the introduction or spread of the insects of the family *Trypetidae* (commonly known as fruit flies), he may by Proclamation declare any portion of Victoria specified therein to be a proclaimed area, and prohibit the planting on any land in the proclaimed area of any plant or vegetable specified, and prohibit the removal from any property within the prescribed area to any other property within the area and from any place outside the prescribed area to any place outside the area of any fruit or vegetable and require occupiers and owners of land in the proclaimed area to take such action for the eradication or prevention of the spread of fruit fly as is specified in the Proclamation: Now therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, being of opinion that it is necessary to protect the fruit industry of Victoria against the introduction or spread of the insects of the family *Trypetidae* (commonly known as fruit flies) and by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation hereby—

1. Declare that portion of Victoria—

Within the Township of Maffra in the Parishes of Maffra, Bundalaguah, and Wa-De-Lock in the County of Tanjil to be a proclaimed area.

2. Prohibit the removal from any place within the proclaimed area to any other place within the area or to any place outside the area of any fruit or vegetable or any case or package which has contained any fruit or vegetable unless such removal is made on the instruction of an Inspector.

3. Require occupiers and owners of land, not being a commercial orchard, in the proclaimed area to—

(a) Apply to all trees and plants of the following kinds:—

Apples, apricots, brambles and other berry fruits, cape gooseberries, cherries, citrus fruits, cucumbers, egg fruit, figs, gooseberries, grapes, guavas, loquats, medlars, nectarines, passion fruit, peaches, pears, peppers, persimmons, plums, prunes, quinces, rock melons, sweet melons, tomatoes and all other trees and plants which have edible fruits,

one of the following treatments:—

(i) Thoroughly spray with an efficient garden spray pump the whole of the foliage with a solution containing two thousand (2,000) parts of Dichloro - diphenyl - trichloroethane (D.D.T.) to one million (1,000,000) parts of water (0.2 per cent.) at intervals of not more than twenty-one (21) days commencing at the time fruit on such trees and plants has set and continuing until one (1) month after it has been harvested, or

(ii) Apply by spraying or by splashing the required quantity of solution on the foliage of trees and plants by any suitable method such as with a large paint brush dipped in an open container or from a bottle with a perforated stopper at intervals not longer than seven (7) days commencing at the time the fruit has set and continuing until one (1) month after it has been harvested to the foliage on at least three (3) different parts of each tree and to the foliage of all plants a solution consisting of two (2) ounces of tartar emetic and two and one-half (2½) pounds of white sugar in four (4) gallons of water, or a solution consisting of two (2) ounces of sodium fluosilicate and two and

one-half (2½) pounds of white sugar in four (4) gallons of water at the rate of ten (10) fluid ounces per tree and ten (10) fluid ounces per two hundred (200) square feet of planted area of such plants.

(b) Pick up from the said land before noon each day all fallen fruits of the kinds specified in paragraph 3 (a) above, and dispose of all such fruits as prescribed in paragraph 4 (c) below.

4. Require occupiers and owners of land in the proclaimed area to take action as and when directed by a notice served on such occupier or owner by an Inspector and within the time specified in such notice—

(a) To remove all plants of—

Tomato (*Lycopersicum* sp.),
Pepper (*Capsicum* sp.),
Egg Plant (*Solanum melongena*).
Ornamental Solanum (*Solanum* sp.),
Rock Melon (*Cucumis* sp.),
Sweet Melon (*Cucumis* sp.),
Cucumber (*Cucumis* sp.),
Cape Gooseberry (*Physalis edulis*),
Brambles (except cultivated varieties),
Box Thorn, provided that where box thorn is grown as a hedge along a boundary or dividing fence the occupier or owner may continue to so grow it on the following conditions:—

(i) Cut back the hedge forthwith and periodically as necessary to retain it within a height not exceeding six (6) feet from the ground level and a width not exceeding two (2) feet.

(ii) That when such a hedge has been cut back to within the foregoing dimensions, he shall thoroughly spray it forthwith to cover all parts of the plants forming the hedge with a solution containing Two thousand (2,000) parts of two-four Dichloro-phenoxy-acetic acid (2-4D), or one of its derivatives to One million (1,000,000) parts of water (0.2 per cent.) and he shall spray it thereafter as often as is necessary to prevent the plants from forming fruit,

and refrain from planting such plants while this Proclamation remains in force.

(b) To remove from all trees and plants growing upon the said land and to pick up from the said land all of the following fruits and/or vegetables:—

Apples, apricots, brambles and other berry fruits, cape gooseberries, cherries, citrus fruits, cucumbers, egg fruit, figs, gooseberries, grapes, guavas, loquats, medlars, nectarines, passion fruit, peaches, pears, peppers, persimmons, plums, prunes, quinces, rock melons, sweet melons, tomatoes and all edible fruits of all trees and plants, including all such fruits and vegetables which shall form on such trees and plants after the service of the said notice during such time as this Proclamation remains in force.

(c) To dispose of all such fruits and/or vegetables by boiling for fifteen (15) minutes, or burning them so as to destroy all eggs and larvæ of the fruit fly or burying them under a depth of soil at least three (3) feet after having applied to the upper layer of such buried fruit or vegetables D.D.T. at the rate of not less than one-half ounce per square yard in the form of a spray containing not less than 0.2 per cent. of the pure para isomer of D.D.T. or in the form of a dust containing not less than 2 per cent. of the pure para isomer of D.D.T. or by otherwise treating them as an Inspector may direct, in such a manner as to kill all eggs, larvæ and pupæ of fruit flies.

(d) To spray all trees and plants growing on the said land with a solution containing Two thousand (2,000) parts of Dichloro-diphenyl-trichloroethane (D.D.T.) to one million parts of water (0.2 per cent.) or in the case of a commercial orchard equipped with a power spraying plant approved by an Inspector, with a solution containing one thousand (1,000) parts

of D.D.T. to one million parts of water (0.1 per cent.), at intervals not exceeding twenty-one (21) days during the period specified in such notice, and/or with such other solution as is specified in the said notice and at times specified therein.

(e) To treat the soil beneath and around trees suspected by an inspector to be infested or to have been infested with fruit fly by applying uniformly to the surface of an area or areas marked by an Inspector a dust containing 1 per cent. of the pure gamma isomer of Benzene hexachloride at the rate of not less than two (2) ounces per square yard, and/or by giving such other treatment as is specified in the said notice.

(f) To reduce, if necessary, all tall growing trees and plants covered by this Proclamation, except when grown as a commercial orchard or plantation, to a height which will permit them to be stripped of fruit and/or sprayed to the satisfaction of an Inspector.

5. Require occupiers and owners of land in the proclaimed area to give access to such land at all times to an Inspector with or without assistants for the purpose of inspection and/or applying on such properties any spray material and/or for the purpose of removing any fruit or vegetables or prohibited plant, and/or performing such other acts which in the opinion of an Inspector are necessary for the eradication or prevention of the spread of fruit flies.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 3 of the *Forests Act 1958* it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* declare any period to be a prohibited period in respect of the fire-protected area (other than a State forest or national park), and, without affecting the generality of the foregoing, may from time to time by Proclamation so published declare different prohibited periods in respect of different parts of the fire-protected area (other than a State forest or national park).

And whereas by the said section it is further enacted that any Proclamation so published may subsequently be revoked, amended or varied by the Governor in Council by Proclamation so published:

And whereas by Proclamations issued on the 14th and 21st November, 1961, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 15th and 22nd November, 1961, respectively, a prohibited period expiring on the 15th April, 1962, was proclaimed in respect of portion of the fire-protected area (other than State forests or national parks); including the areas specified in the Schedule hereto:

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Forests Act*, do by this my Proclamation vary the aforesaid Proclamations by proclaiming that the prohibited period in respect of the parts of the fire-protected area (other than a State forest or national park) situated in such municipalities as are specified in the Schedule hereto shall end at midnight between the 4th and 5th days of April, 1962.

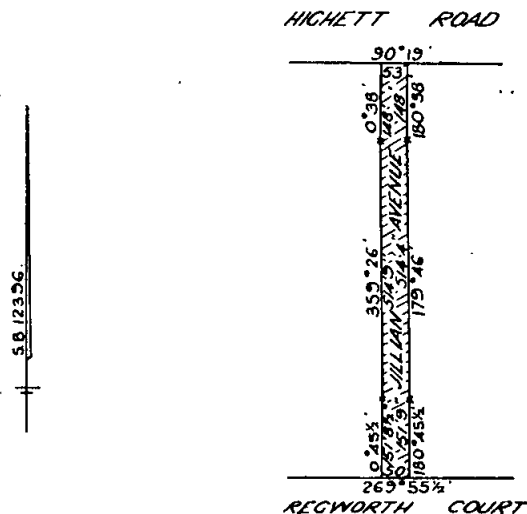
PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act* 1958, as amended, section 519, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon request of the Council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette* to proclaim any land reserved, used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force:

And, whereas the Council of the City of Moorabbin requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been used for a street within the said City, be so declared to be a public highway:

Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare that all that piece of land shown as a road on lodged plans of subdivision Nos. 25539 and 30633, being the street known as Jillian-avenue indicated by hatching on the diagram hereunder, shall be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act.

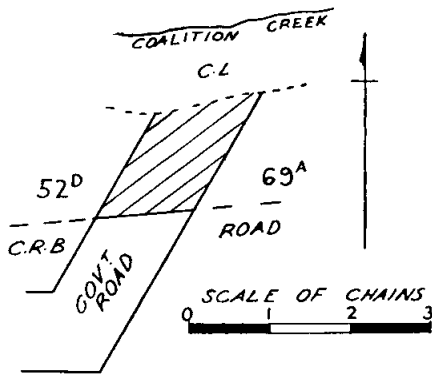

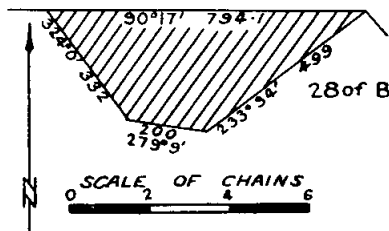

“ (b) in respect of No Standing signs on any highway which is a by-pass road under the *Country Roads Act 1958*, the Country Roads Board; and

(c) in every other respect—

(i) the authority legally responsible for the care and management of the highway; or

(ii) if the Country Roads Board is so responsible—the municipal council in whose municipal district the highway in question is situated.”

(c) In paragraph (a) of sub-regulation (17) after the words “school crossing lines” there shall be inserted the words “post for supporting a flag or barrier near a school crossing.”

(d) In sub-regulation (32) after the words “consists of” there shall be inserted the words “a white rectangular sign inscribed in black with the words ‘Speed Limit’ followed by numerals or which consists of.”

(e) For sub-regulation (35) there shall be inserted the following sub-regulation—

“ (35) ‘School Crossing’ means that portion of a carriageway which lies between a pair of approximately parallel lines marked across or partly across a carriageway and near which—

(a) a red flag or red fabric sign bearing the word ‘Children Crossing’ in white letters is displayed; or

(b) a red flag or red fabric sign as aforesaid is displayed and a barrier or pole bearing a red sign with the word ‘Stop’ in white letters inscribed thereon is turned or held across or partly across the carriageway—and where the lines are marked only partly across the carriageway includes that portion of the carriageway which lies between the prolongation of the lines.”

(f) In sub-regulation (36) after the word “intersection” wherever occurring there shall be inserted the words “School Crossing.”

2. In sub-paragraph (ii) of paragraph (c) of sub-regulation (2) of Regulation 401 after the word “red” where last occurring there shall be added the expression “whether or not the colour green is displayed with those words.”

3. For sub-regulation (3) of Regulation 601 there shall be substituted the following sub-regulation—

“ (3) Except as otherwise provided in sub-regulation (2) of this Regulation, Regulation 402 (7) and Regulation 603 when two vehicles have entered an intersection from separate carriageways or are approaching an intersection on separate carriageways and there is danger of collision the driver who has the other vehicle on his right shall yield the right of way.”

4. For sub-regulations (2) and (3) of Regulation 705 there shall be substituted the following sub-regulations—

“(2) A driver approaching a school crossing shall stop his vehicle before reaching the crossing—

- (a) if any pedestrian is on the crossing; or

and shall not permit any portion of his vehicle to enter upon the crossing while any pedestrian is upon the crossing or while any barrier or pole is so turned or held.

(3) Where there is a stop line on the approach side of a School Crossing, any stop made pursuant to this Regulation shall be made before reaching and as near as practicable to the stop line.

(4) A driver shall not overtake and pass any vehicle headed in the same direction which pursuant to this Regulation is stopped on the approach side of or upon a school crossing.”

5. For paragraph (a) and (b) of sub-regulation (1) of Regulation 1103 there shall be substituted the following paragraphs—

- “(a) in the case of a highway on which traffic is permitted to move in both directions, parallel to and with the left wheels as close as practicable to the left boundary of the carriageway;
- (b) in the case of a highway on which traffic is permitted to move in one direction only, parallel to and as close as practicable to either boundary of the carriageway.”

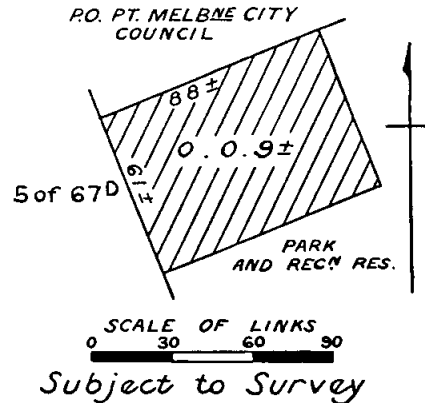

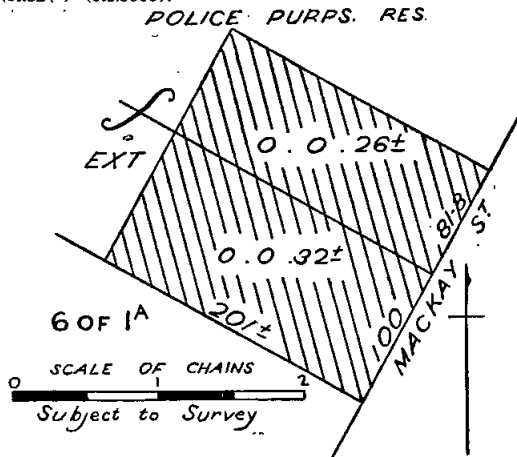

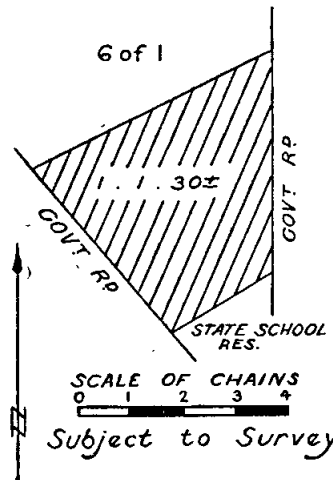

- (b) providing that, in the event of failure of any owner or occupier of any property or premises to comply with the requirements of this By-law, the Council may cause measures to be taken to destroy such Argentine ants at the expense of the owner or occupier and recover the cost thereof as a civil debt recoverable summarily.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Chelsea order as follows:—

1. In this By-law, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—

- “Argentine ants” means the specie of ants known by the entomological name of *Iridomyrmex humilis* Mayr.
- “Council” means the Council of the City of Chelsea.
- “Health Inspector” means any person appointed by the Council to carry out the duties of a health inspector.

2. (a) Every owner or occupier of property or premises shall keep such property or premises free of Argentine ants.

(b) If the Health Inspector finds or believes that Argentine ants exist in or about any property or premises, he may give notice to the owner or occupier thereof to forthwith effectively destroy such Argentine ants.

(c) Any owner or occupier so notified who, within seven days after service of the notice, has not effectively destroyed all Argentine ants in or about his property or premises shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.

3. If after three days from the date of the service of any notice under clause 2 (b) hereof on any owner or occupier of any property or premises, such owner or occupier has not complied with the requirements thereof, the Council may—

- (i) Cause measures to be taken to effectively destroy any Argentine ants existing in or about any such property or premises at the expense of the owner or occupier thereof; and

(ii) Recover the cost thereof as a civil debt recoverable summarily.

4. Every person guilty of a wilful breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of not less than Five pounds or more than Twenty pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence to a penalty of not more than Five pounds for each day on which an offence against this By-law is continued after a conviction or order by any Court.
