

- (3) Where the Chief Inspector of Stock is satisfied that in any permitted institution Shope Fibroma Virus vaccine is being or has been used on any rabbit other than for the purpose of research he may cancel the permission so granted.



REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF CROWN LAND FOR RECREATION PURPOSES IN THE BOROUGH OF BENALLA.

WHEREAS by section 218 of the Land Act 1958 power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the Land Acts for any purpose whatsoever, and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the power conferred as aforesald, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land in the Borough of Benalla, temporarily reserved by Orders in Council on the 6th October 1873 and the 28th September, 1915, as a site for a Recreation Reserve. The land referred to above shall for the purposes of these Regulations be divided into two sections referred to hereafter as the "Gardens" and the "Reserve". WHEREAS by section 218 of the Land Act 1958 power is

These Regulations are made in lieu of those made by the Board on the 2nd July, 1957, which are hereby

- 1. These Regulations are divided into Parts as follows:-

 - Part I.—Care, Protection and Management of the section of the Recreation Reserve known as the "Gardens"—Clauses 3 to 28.

 Part II.—Care, Protection and Management of the section of the Recreation Reserve known as the "Reserve"—Clauses 29 to 35.
- 2. In these Regulations, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter
 - "Gardens" means the section of the Recreation
 Reserve known as the "Gardens" and bounded
 by the Hume Highway, the west bank of the
 Broken River and the west boundary of the
 Recreation Reserve.

 "Reserve" means all the land in the Recreation
 Reserve with the exception of that included in the
 "Cardons"
 - " Gardens "
 - "Committee of Management" shall mean the Council
 - of the Municipality of the Borough of Benalla.

 "Velucle" includes every conveyance capable of being propelled, pushed or drawn by human, animal, mechanical, electrical or other power and includes a motor car as defined in the Motor Car Act 1958 but expressly excluding perambulators.

PART I.—CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "GARDENS".

- 3. The Gardens shall be open to the public at all times free of charge, except on such occasions (not exceeding 24 in any one year upon which days a charge for admisson is made) as the Gardens or any portion thereof may be set apart for football, cricket, basket-ball, tennis or other game, fête, sport or amusement, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding 7s. 6d. may be taken and charged for the admission of every adult to the Gardens and for admission to any Grandstand a further sum of 2s. 6d. for every adult.
- 4. The Committee of Management may set apart portions of the Gardens for the purpose of football, cricket, tennis, basket-ball or other game, fête, sport or amuse-ment, or as a pleasure ground or place of public resort or recreation.
- 5. Except with the written permission of the Committee of Management previously had and obtained no person shall at any time play or practice at football, cricket, tennis, basket-ball or other game or sport or conduct any fête or other form of amusement in the Gardens, and such permission shall be granted upon such terms and conditions as the Committee of Management may deem to be consistent with these Regulations. The Committee of Management may refuse to grant permission for the use of the "Gardens".
- 6. No person shall cross or trespass on the playing ground in the Gardens during any cricket or football match, basket-ball, game, sport or amusement or during practice at football, cricket, basket-ball, game, sport or amusement when such crossing or trespassing would be injurious to or be an undue interference with the progress of the aforesaid, football, cricket, basket-ball, game, sport or amusement.
- 7. No person shall climb, jump or get upon, on or over or under any fence or gates of the Gardens, or cut or in any way remove or damage any of such fences or gates, or any buildings, seats, equipment, trees, shrubs or flowers in the Gardens, or stick bills or advertisements or writings on any such fences, gates, buildings, seats, equipment or trees, or light a fire in the Gardens, or dig or remove any turf or soil, or enter any plots of young

trees or shrubs, or walk on or over any flower beds, or remove or damage any flowers or commit any nuisance or damage or destroy any property or thing in the Gardens.

- 8. No person shall throw or deposit or leave any glass, filth, rubbish, junk, or waste material of any kind or cause any glass, filth, rubbish, refuse, junk, or waste material of any kind to fall or to be thrown or deposited upon or left in the Gardens, or in or upon any buildings or structures in the Gardens.
- 9. Persons using the Gardens, buildings or structures therein for any purpose shall prior to leaving them, collect and remove, or cause to be collected and removed, all waste material, scraps, bottles, glass, or litter of any kind brought or made by them, and any person who fails or refuses to collect and remove or cause to be collected and removed all waste material scraps bottles glass or and removed all waste material, scraps, bottles, glass or litter of any kind brought or left by them shall pay to the Committee of Management the cost of removing same and such cost may be recovered by the Committee of Management before a court of petty sessions.
- 10. No person shall carry or discharge any firearms in the Gardens or snare, trap, catch or destroy or interfere in any way with any birds therein, or throw or discharge any stone or other missile to the damage, danger or annoyance of any person in the Gardens.

 11. No person in a state of intoxication shall enter or
- remain in the Gardens, and except with the written con-sent of the Committee of Management no person shall consume, or bring, or cause to be brought any intoxicating liquor in or upon the Gardens for the purpose of con-
- 12. No person in the Gardens or in or on any buildings or structures therein shall behave in a noisy or disorderly manner, or create or take part in any disturbance, or commit any act of indecency or offend against decency in dress, language, or conduct.
- 13. No person shall sell or offer for sale in the Gardens any article of food or drink or any other commodity or operate any money-making amusement or erect any tent, booth, stand, building or other structure without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management.
- No person shall make any wager for money or play any unlawful game in the Gardens.
- 15. No person shall, in the Gardens, wilfully obstruct, disturb, interrupt or annoy any other person in the proper use of the Gardens or wilfully obstruct, disturb, interrupt or annoy any employee of the Committee of Management, in the proper execution of his duty or work.
- 16. No person or organization shall assemble in the Gardens for picnics, or for the purpose of public worship, preaching or public speaking of any kind, or meetings of a like character, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management. The Committee of Management may refuse to grant permission.
- 17. No person shall camp or park a caravan or motor car in the Gardens.
- 18. No person shall give out or distribute any handbills, placards, notices, advertisements, books, pamphlets, or papers in the Gardens without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management or litter same by scattering or throwing down handbills, placards, notices, advertisements, books, pamphlets or papers.
- 19. No person shall ride, drive or lead or cause to be ridden, driven or led any horse on, over or through the Gardens without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management.
- 20. No person shall bring into the Gardens any dog unless controlled by a leash.
- 21. No person shall put in the Gardens any cattle, sheep, or other animal, and the Committee of Management or any employee thereof shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle, sheep or other animal found therein, and the owner of such cattle, sheep or other animal shall be liable to the penalties provided in these Poculations in these Regulations.
- 22. No person shall drive a vehicle in, over or through the Gardens except such vehicles as are being used by the employees of the Committee of Management in their duties as such or by persons having obtained the consent of the Committee of Management, in writing, to play or practice football, cricket, tennis, basket-ball, or any other game or sport or to conduct any fête or amusement, using a vehicle in connexion therewith.
- In this clause "drive" means to drive, propel, push or draw a vehicle.
- 23. No person shall remove, displace, or disfigure any board, plate or tablet, or any support, fastening or fitting used or constructed for the exhibition of any regulation

24. When in the opinion of the Committee of Manage-24. When in the opinion of the Committee of Management it is desirable or necessary that the use of any swing, slide, wheel, fitting, fixture or appliance erected, placed or provided in the Gardens shall be restricted to certain persons, a notice shall be posted in the vicinity indicating for whose use any such swing, slide, wheel, fitting, fixture or appliance is or are intended and no person or persons other than those indicated shall use or interfere with any such swing, slide, wheel, fitting, fixture or appliance. or appliance.

25. Nothing in Part I. of these Regulations shall prevent the Committee of Management closing the Gardens or any part thereof and excluding the public therefrom whenever it shall be necessary for the purpose of carrying out repairs, alterations, re-conditioning of turf, or for any other purpose as the Committee of Management may think fit.

26. No person shall spit or expectorate in or on the Gardens or in or on any building or structure therein.

27. Any person wilfully offending against any of the Regulations in Part I. may, in addition to any penalty to which he may be liable, be removed from the Gardens by a member of the Police Force or an employee of the Committee of Management, and any person so removed shall not again enter the Gardens during the day he is so removed. he is so removed.

28. No person shall aid, abet counsel or procure any 28. No person shall aid, abet counsel or procure any other person in doing any act or thing which is a breach of these Regulations or which may not be in these Regulations specifically mentioned and which may tend to the injury or disfigurement of the Gardens or any part thereof or any building therein or interfere with the use or enjoyment thereof by the public.

PART II.—CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE.

29. The Reserve shall be open to the public at all times except on such days and at such times as the Committee of Management may deem it necessary to exclude the public therefrom.

30. No person shall damage or destroy any gates, fences, so. No person shall dallage of destroy any gates, lentes, seats or trees in the Reserve or deposit or leave any glass, papers, filth, building material, refuse, junk or waste material of any kind in the Reserve. The Committee of Management may grant permission for the depositing of clean soil or earth in holes or depressions in the Reserve.

31. No person shall discharge or carry any firearms in the Reserve, or light a fire, or camp, or park a caravan

32. No person shall put in the Reserve any sheep, goats, or pigs; cows may be put in the Reserve with the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. Any person obtaining permission to graze cows in the Reserve shall pay agistment at the rate of 2s. per week for the first cow, and 2s. 6d. per week for each additional cow.

33. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless controlled by a leash. The Committee of Management may, in writing, grant exceptions from the provisions of this section when it thinks fit.

34. No person shall conduct any entertainment or play of the person snail conduct any entertainment or play or practice cricket, football, golf or other game or sport, or conduct a fête or amusement in the Reserve or shall offer for sale in the Reserve any goods without first obtaining the written permission of the Committee of Management.

The Committee of Management may grant such permission subject to such terms and conditions as it may deem consistent with these Regulations or may refuse such permission

 (c) "Site" shall have the same meaning as in Clause 815 of the said Regulations.

 - (1) to remove or lop trees, shrubs or hedges growing or being on private property so situate which are not removed or lopped as required by or under any By-law made under sub-paragraph (b) hereof:
 - (2) to reduce in height any portion of fence which is not reduced in height as required by or under any By-law made under sub-paragraph (c) hereof.
