## ACTS OF PARLIAMENT.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in Her Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of the said State, the titles whereof are hereunder set forth, that is to say:—

- No. 6868. An Act to authorize the Construction of a Line of Railway from Tottenham to Brooklyn.
- No. 6869. An Act to authorize the Leasing of Portion of certain Land in the Parish of Kerang permanently reserved as the Site for a Racecourse, Public Recreation and Show Yards.
- No. 6870. An Act to amend Section Sixty-five of the *Forests Act 1958*.

- No. 6873. An Act to amend Section Ninety-six of the *Housing Act 1958*.
- No. 6874. An Act to amend the Law relating to the Payment of Interest on Judgments.
- No. 6875. An Act to amend Division Fifteen of Part Five of, and the Thirteenth and Fourteenth Schedules to, *The Constitution Act Amendment Act 1958*.
- No. 6876. An Act to amend the *Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works Act 1958*.
- No. 6877. An Act to provide for the Control and Regulation of the Artificial Breeding of Stock.
- No. 6878. An Act to amend Section One hundred and forty-two of the *Health Act 1958* and Part VII. of the *Police Offences Act 1958* in relation to Tattooing.

- No. 6883. An Act to amend Section Two hundred and eighty-one of the *Health Act 1958*.

AREA OF LAND COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1958* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1958*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6), shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1958* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Class 6 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1958* aforesaid, to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

APPRENTICESHIP COMMISSION OF VICTORIA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS section 13 of the *Apprenticeship Act 1958* provides, *inter alia*, that after the Minister has taken into consideration any recommendation made by the Apprenticeship Commission the Governor in Council for

the purposes of the said Act may from time to time by Proclamation proclaim any trades to be apprenticeship trades:

And whereas the Apprenticeship Commission, having notified in the manner prescribed by the said Act its intention to recommend that the trade of cooking in hospitals in which three or more adults are permanently employed in the kitchen, as carried on in the metropolitan district, be so proclaimed, and having received no representations by or on behalf of employers or employees in the said trade, has recommended to the Minister that the said trade be so proclaimed:

And whereas the Minister has taken the said recommendation into consideration:

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation proclaim the trade of cooking in hospitals in which three or more adults are permanently employed in the kitchen, as carried on in the metropolitan district, to be an apprenticeship trade.

#### RULES OF THE SUPREME COURT.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Supreme Court Act 1958* and all other powers hereunto enabling, Chapter I. of the Rules of the Supreme Court is hereby amended as on and from the 15th May, 1962, by substituting for Rule 9A of Order LXV. the following Rule:—

"9A. (1) The total in any bill of costs of the fees as prescribed by Rule 9 of this Order (as distinct from payments) shall, in respect of business done in any cause, matter, or proceeding in the Supreme Court after the 15th day of May, 1962, be increased by 100 per cent., and any such increase shall be allowed upon any taxation of costs in respect of any such business, as well between party and party as between solicitor and client and in taxations under or pursuant to the *Supreme Court Act 1958*.

(2) Paragraph (1) of this Rule shall not—

- (a) apply to the remuneration prescribed by or under section eighty-three of the *Supreme Court Act 1958*; or
- (b) affect the question whether a bill of costs when taxed is or is not less by one-sixth part than the bill delivered, sent, or left; or
- (c) affect the power to direct payment of a sum, in lieu of costs, under Order LXV., Rule 23, or the power to allow a fixed sum for costs under Order LXV., Rule 27 (38), or a gross sum under Order LXV., Rule 27 (38A).

(3) Paragraphs (1) and (2) of this Rule shall apply to all references to arbitration, and to all business done in any criminal proceeding, and so far as applicable thereto to all business done in any divorce or matrimonial cause.

(4) The provisions contained in Rule 9A of Order LXV. of Chapter I. of these Rules immediately before the coming into operation of this Rule shall in relation to business done before the coming into operation of this Rule have the same operation and effect as they would have had if this Rule had not been made in substitution therefor.

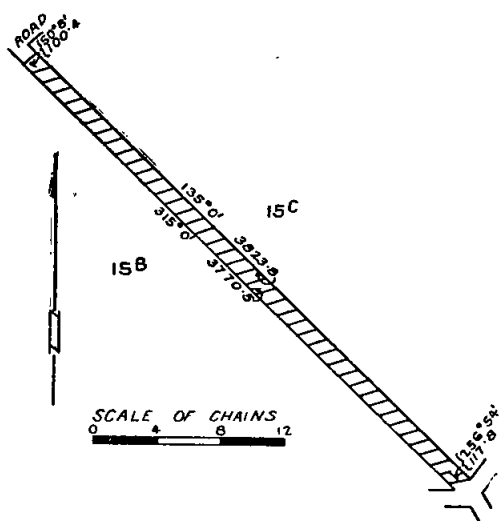

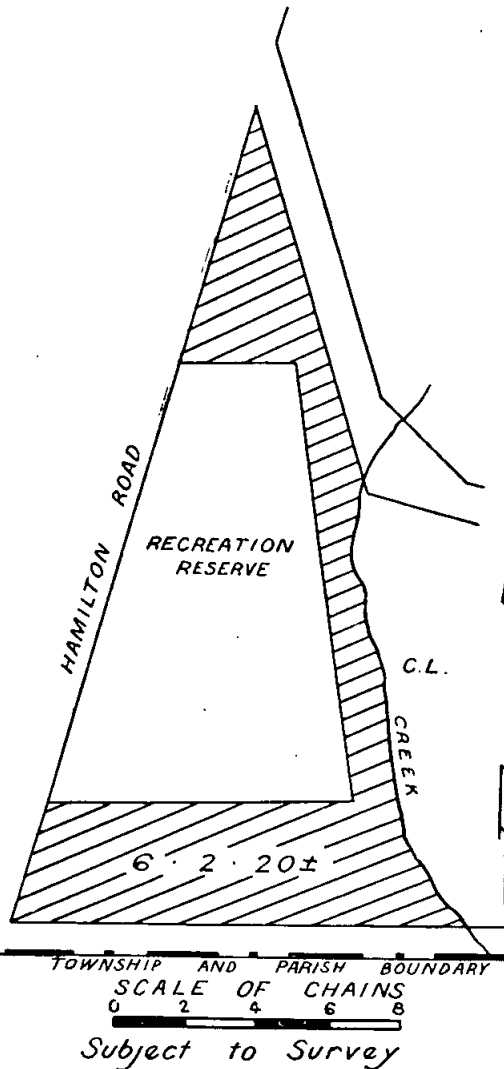

## REGULATIONS.

**H**IS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of the powers contained in the *Land Act 1958* and all other powers hereunto enabling doth hereby make the following amendments to the Regulations under the *Land Act 1928* made on the fifth day of August, 1930, to take effect as on and from the first day of June, 1962.

For Schedules 39 and 40 (Chapter X—Sales by Auction) of the said Regulations there shall be substituted the following Schedules :—

## SCHEDULE 39.

## CONDITIONS OF SALE.

1. The land hereinafter described shall be put up for sale at the prices respectively stated and annexed to the description thereof, and the bidder of that sum, or the highest bidder above it, shall be declared the purchaser, provided he shall immediately pay down a deposit of at least twelve and a half per centum of the amount of the purchase money, and pay also the charge for survey, and sign a description hereunto annexed of the lot of which he shall become the purchaser, thereby binding himself to the observance of the above and the following conditions, and of any special conditions shown in the description of such lot.

2. Immediately after the bidding on each lot is concluded, and before another lot is put up, the name of the purchaser shall be entered in the list of the descriptions of the lots annexed to these conditions, and the purchaser shall be required to affix his signature to the description of the lot so purchased by him. If previous to such signature any question or dispute as to the last and best bidder shall arise between the sellers and bidders, or amongst the bidders themselves, the lot in question shall be put up again. Subsequent to such signature no dispute whatever shall be admitted, nor shall any alteration of name or transfer from the actual purchaser to another person be allowed. No bid made after the fall of the auctioneer's hammer shall be received. In cases of question or dispute the decision of the officer conducting the sale on behalf of the Government shall be final and conclusive. In cases where a person purchases as an agent, he must, in addition to signing his own name, add the expression "as agent for" and then insert the name of his principal.

3. A person who has affixed his signature to the description of any lot shall be held to have previously obtained all necessary information, and shall not be entitled to allege ignorance or any other cause for non-fulfilment of each and every obligation incumbent upon the purchaser by these conditions.

4. Unless otherwise expressly stated, the purchaser shall be entitled to possession as from the time of sale by auction, and shall thenceforth for the purposes of any Acts relating to local government or public health, or dividing fences, or sewerage, or water supply, or vermin destruction, or noxious weeds, be deemed and taken to be the owner thereof.

5. The residue of the purchase money shall be paid in equal instalments, in accordance with the scale set out hereunder, on the last day of each successive period of six months from this date, or be, if the purchaser choose, payable at any earlier time or times, and such residue of the purchase money shall bear interest at the rate of Five pounds per centum per annum, to be computed with respect to each instalment for the period which has elapsed between the time of sale and the time of the payment of such instalment; and on failure of the payment of any instalment with interest at the time at which the same becomes due, the deposit and instalment or instalments and interest already paid may on the written direction of the Minister be forfeited, and the contract shall become *ipso facto* void upon the forfeiture of any instalment or instalments and interest. If the purchaser pays the residue of the price within thirty days after the time of the sale no interest shall be payable thereon.

6. The appropriate Grant fee and Assurance fund contribution shall be paid with the final payment of purchase money.

7. All offers, sales and grants relative to these lands shall be effected in reference to the departmental plans, and the land will be sold as more or less. No claim for compensation as to any alleged deficiency in the area shall be entertained. Where any lot is described as "subject to survey" the Crown reserves the right to make modifications to the boundaries of the land sold, and also the right to insert in the Crown grant any easement conditions disclosed by survey to be necessary.

8. Where in the description of any lot an amount has been specified as valuation of improvements (which amount may include a valuation for fixtures or timber) the purchaser shall take the improvements at that valuation and shall pay or cause to be paid in full at the sale the amount of such valuation, which shall be in addition to the purchase price payable for that lot. Provided that where, in any such description, the amount specified as valuation of improvements is followed by the name or names of any person or persons, and if the purchaser is either the person solely so named or if he lodges an acquittance from all or the other persons so named, then payment of such valuation may be dispensed with.

9. Where in the description of any lot it is specified that a stated period is allowed for removal of improvements, the purchaser shall permit the removal of those improvements within that period by the person entitled to remove the same.

10. A Crown grant in accordance with the provisions of the *Land Act 1958* and conveying the surface and down to a depth of fifty feet below the surface shall be completed and issued as soon as practicable after payment in full of the purchase money and interest thereon (if any), and the prescribed fee for the preparation of the Crown grant together with the contribution to the assurance fund, and will be delivered to the grantee by the Registrar of Titles on production of the receipt for the prescribed fees.

11. All gold, silver, uranium, thorium, minerals and petroleum, together with the necessary power to work and win the same, are in accordance with the *Mines Act 1958* and *Petroleum Act 1958* reserved to the Crown.

12. It shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, at any time within thirty (30) days from the date of sale, to annul the sale of any lot or lots, and to repay to the purchaser the amount of his purchase money (or so much thereof as shall have been paid by him), without interest, cost or damages of any description, in full satisfaction of all claims and demands whatsoever by such purchaser, and the publication of a notice in the *Government Gazette* to the effect that the Governor in Council has as aforesaid annulled any such sale shall be conclusive evidence that such sale has been completely and effectually annulled.

13. The Governor in Council may, if he thinks fit, register the transfer of the interest of any purchaser of an allotment sold by public auction prior to the final payment of the purchase money being made. The fee for such registration shall be One pound.

14. If the officer acting on behalf of the Government shall find reason to believe that any lot will not obtain its just value, or shall otherwise think fit to withdraw the same from the sale, he shall have full power to do so at any time previous to its being actually sold.

- (b) Whether, if Saturday was not so excluded, it would be practicable for bank staffs to be rostered for duty on Saturday, and if so, what would be the estimated cost to the banks of such rostering.
- (c) Whether Saturday could be so excluded without undue prejudice to bank customers and the interests of the general public.
- (d) Whether Saturday could be so excluded without undue prejudicial affect on the volume of retail sales.
- (e) Whether, if Saturday was so excluded, suitable alternative facilities could be provided for transacting banking business on Saturdays in metropolitan and/or country areas.
- (f) Whether, if Saturday was so excluded, the exclusion should operate throughout the whole of Victoria or in some or what parts thereof.
- (g) Whether, if Saturday was so excluded, the exclusion should apply to all banks or to some and what banks or types thereof only.
- (h) Whether, if Saturday was so excluded, any and what additional banking facilities including later hours of banking should be made available by banks generally or some and what types thereof on some other day or days which are business days for banking purposes.
- (i) Whether the exclusion of Saturday as a business day for banking purposes would be likely to react in undue absenteeism of employees in industry (other than banking) from work on other working days during the week.

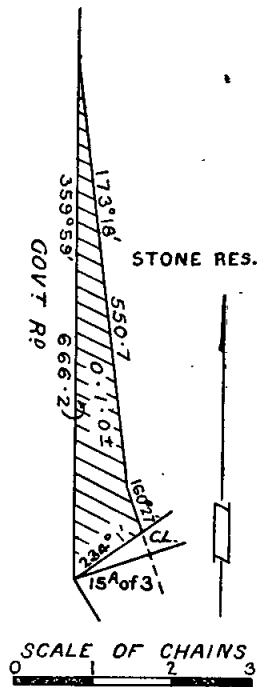

Teaching Service Act 1958.

TEACHING SERVICE (TEACHERS TRIBUNAL) REGULATIONS.

AMENDMENT No. 28.

THE Teachers Tribunal, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Teaching Service Act 1958*, hereby amends Regulation 4 of the Teaching Service (Teachers Tribunal) Regulations in the manner following, that is to say:—

REGULATION 4.

1. In clause 2, for the expression "certifies in the case of any applicant that there are satisfactory reasons for the transfer", substitute the expression "certifies to the Tribunal that there are satisfactory reasons for the transfer and the Tribunal approves".

2. Rescind clause 3 and substitute therefor the following new clause:—

"3. In the Secondary Schools Division and in the Technical Schools Division unless the Committee of Classifiers certifies to the Tribunal that there are satisfactory reasons for the transfer and the Tribunal approves, an applicant shall not be transferred to a vacancy without having served—

- (a) three years in his position in the fourth class or the third class;
- (b) three years in his position as Assistant in classes above the third class outside the metropolitan area and outside Ballarat, Bendigo and Geelong;
- (c) five years in his position in classes above the third class for transfers within the metropolitan area or within Ballarat, Bendigo or Geelong and for all transfers of Principals, Vice-Principals, Head Masters and Head Mistresses;

or

three years in his position in classes above the third class when he is transferring to a position of higher responsibility, provided that a teacher appointed to a position above the third class from the 1st January, 1961, or the 1st January, 1962, shall be eligible for transfer to a position of higher responsibility from the beginning of 1963 or 1964.

For the purposes of this Regulation, the metropolitan area is defined as the area bounded by a line which passes through and includes the following places:—

Laverton, Deer Park, Digger's Rest, Somerton, South Morang, Diamond Creek, Research, Warrandyte, Croydon, Fern Tree Gully, Dandenong and Carrum."

Separate prices for ordinary funerals and for funerals under clause 6 of the conditions of contract must be stated (a) for adults, (b) for children above five years and under fourteen years of age, and (c) for children five years and under, including stillborn—one sum is to be stated for each, including interment, conveyance, and all other charges.

#### CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The services are to be performed upon an order signed by a member of the Police Force. Under the *Cemeteries Act 1958* (No. 6217), cemetery fees are not payable in the cases of poor persons buried upon an order signed by a Justice, and in such cases the contractor's account for the burial will be correspondingly reduced.

2. No claim will be allowed under this contract for any burial respecting which the Contractor receives or arranges for any payment whatever from the relatives or friends of the deceased; but in the event of friends or relatives desiring to have the deceased buried in private ground, while availing themselves of the Government funeral, they must, in such case, pay all the cemetery charges.

3. The funerals are to be of the most economical description consistent with propriety. A plain hearse for an adult, and a covered, plain, suitable four-wheeled vehicle for a child under five years of age, to be provided.

4. The body shall be taken direct to the Necropolis, or to the New Melbourne Cemetery, as the case may be. Not more than one body shall be carried in the hearse or vehicle at a time. No body shall be retained on the premises of the Contractor. Any infringement of this condition will subject the Contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £10, as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount shall be deducted as in clause 15.

5. Coffins for funerals must be waterproof and sufficiently long, deep, wide, and substantial to bear the corpse and permit it to lie extended at full length, and must be made of 1-in. white pine timber covered with black cloth, and fastened down with screws, and pitched in the seams to prevent leakage. The Contractor shall provide 2 inches of sawdust for the bottom of the coffin; a small block of wood to keep the head of the deceased in position, and sufficient white calico to cover the body. Coffins to be properly lowered into the graves, and the graves filled up again.

6. In cases of burials of bodies which are, in the opinion of the Department ordering the burial, of a distinctly offensive character, such as of persons drowned and long in the water or such as are in a state of putrefaction from any other cause, or persons who have died from an infectious disease, such bodies shall, on certification of the officer ordering the burial that such precaution is necessary, be placed for burial in zinc-lined coffins, of timber 1 inch in thickness, hermetically sealed by soldering the lids of same, such coffins to be provided by the Contractor.

7. Bodies of deceased persons, with the exception of those provided for under clause 2, must be conveyed to the Necropolis, Springvale, for burial should the death of such person take place in any sub-district south of the River Yarra, including burials of bodies from the Melbourne City Mortuary, and to the New Melbourne Cemetery, Fawkner, should the death take place in any sub-district north of the River Yarra, excepting bodies buried from the Melbourne City Mortuary. Burials in the Williamstown-Footscray sub-districts shall be made in the Williamstown or Footscray Cemeteries, as the police may direct, excepting bodies buried from the Melbourne City Mortuary.

*Provided, however, that the Tender Board may, on application by the Contractor and subject to such conditions as it may determine, authorize the burial of bodies in a cemetery other than those specified.*

8. The graves to be dug of the proper depth, and in conformity with the Necropolis and respective Cemeteries Regulations.

9. In the event of the Contractor failing to attend punctually to any order, the work will be otherwise performed, and the extra expense incurred, if any, will be charged to the Contractor or deducted from the contract security money.

10. When burials are required to take place on Sunday, or, in the case of any Mental Hospital, burials on the same day as the inquest, no delay must take place in complying therewith, and any additional fees charged by the Necropolis or cemetery authorities will be repaid to the Contractor.

11. The attendance of a minister of the denomination named in the order for the burial must, if practicable, be provided. If for any burial such minister is not available the burial service is to be conducted by the resident chaplain deputed by the denomination, and in cases where no such deputy is appointed by the denomination, or where the religious denomination of the deceased is unknown, the services are to be performed by the resident chaplains alternatively, and the Contractor must inform the police of the hour when the funeral service will take place, so that the friends of the deceased may attend at the cemetery if they wish. The order for burial shall be produced at the cemetery when the Contractor gives instructions for interment. The Contractor must pay the Minister's fee for reading the burial service should it be claimed.

12. Should the religious belief, however, of the deceased preclude the burial being carried out in conformity with the above clause as regards the attendance of the officiating clergyman, the friends of the deceased shall, if practicable, be notified by the police with respect to the service. In the case of foreigners, the Consul of the country to which he is reputed to belong shall also be notified by the Police Department of his decease, in which case, when practicable, the Consul may provide for such service as he may consider necessary.

13. *Under no circumstances will the Contractor be permitted to use any undue or improper influence with the friends of relatives of, or any other person connected or associated with, the deceased person for the purpose of obtaining any concession or privilege whatsoever in regard to the funeral of such person. Any infringement of this condition will, on report of the Tender Board, subject the Contractor to the immediate cancellation of his contract, the forfeiture of the security money, and such other penalties as the Treasurer may direct; the decision of the Board as to whether any breach of this condition has taken place to be final and conclusive.*

14. The account is to be rendered monthly to the officer ordering the service for payment by the Treasury, Melbourne.

15. A refusal to execute orders, impropriety, neglect, or delay in conducting the funerals or any infringement of clause 11, will subject the Contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £50, as the said Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted from the Contractor's account or from the security money. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, impropriety, neglect, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith, and forfeit the whole or any of the security money.

5. Bodies to be removed to the Melbourne City Mortuary shall be placed by the Contractor before removal in shell coffins, zinc-lined and water-tight, securely closed, and shall be conveyed in suitable covered four-wheeled vehicles. The contractor shall send two men for the purpose of removing the body to the vehicle, and from the vehicle to the Melbourne City Mortuary.

6. Every practicable precaution must be taken in order to prevent offensiveness from decomposition, but in no case of removal must any disinfectant be used without the authority of the medical officer performing the post-mortem examination.

7. 11. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government.

12. The contract shall not be considered broken, infringed or vitiated by the Government performing the service or arranging for the carrying out of the same otherwise than by the contractor in the event of urgency or emergency.

A By-law of the Shire of Kowree, made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1958* and section 93 of the *Health Act 1958*, and numbered 34.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the above-mentioned Acts, the President, Councillors and Ratepayers of the Shire of Kowree order as follows:—

1. No person shall deposit or leave any refuse or rubbish on streets roads lanes or passages other than in authorized bins or tips.

2. No person shall deposit or leave any refuse or rubbish on any land other than a rubbish tip established by the said Shire.

3. The owner or occupier of any land on which any refuse or rubbish (other than refuse or rubbish the removal of which the Council of the Shire of Kowree has undertaken or contracted for under section 48 of the *Health Act 1958*) is deposited or left on receiving written notice from such Council under the hand of its Shire Secretary (or such other officer of the municipality who may for the time being be acting on behalf of the Shire Secretary) requiring such owner or occupier to remove or effectively destroy any such refuse or rubbish shall comply with any such notice within seven days after receipt thereof.

4. No person shall do or suffer to be done any of the following matters at any refuse tip or incinerator under the control of the Council of the Shire of Kowree:—

- (a) Trespass on any part of such land.
- (b) Obstruct disturb interrupt or annoy any person lawfully using such area.
- (c) Neglect or refuse to obey the lawful directions of the Council's Engineer or other officer or employee in charge of any such area.
- (d) Deposit or leave any rubbish refuse waste or any other material which in the opinion of the Council's Engineer or other officer in charge of such area is liable to ignite spontaneously or if ignited to cause smoke or fumes of a nature dangerous to the public provided that this prohibition shall apply for only such period of the year as the Council or its Engineer or other officer in charge of any such area shall determine.
- (e) Bring deposit or leave any refuse or rubbish obtained from any place outside the municipal district of the Shire of Kowree without the written authority of the Shire Secretary of the said Shire.
- (f) Light any fire in any part of the tip.
- (g) Interfere with the surface of the tip or with any materials deposited or about to be deposited at the tip.
- (h) Disfigure damage destroy or interfere with any notice board fence building appliance machine tree gate or other equipment at the tip.

5. No person in or upon any road street footway or public place within the municipal district of the Shire of Kowree shall drive any vehicle laden with rubbish or refuse which may drop or be blown about unless such vehicle is provided with adequate sides and where necessary enclosed to the satisfaction of the Council.

Any person guilty of a contravention of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds and in the case of any offence continuing after such conviction to a further daily penalty of not more than One pound but so that the total of such penalties shall not exceed One hundred pounds.
