WHEREAS by an Act of Parliament of the State of Victoria passed in the tenth year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II., intituled the Motor Boating Act 1961 (No. 6832), it is amongst other things enacted that Part II. of the Motor Boating Act 1961 (No. 6832) shall not apply to any class or type of boat specified in any Proclamation made by the Governor in Council and published in the Government Gazette as exempted for the time being from compliance with the provisions of that Part which Proclamation the Governor in Council may at any time in the like manner revoke amend or vary: amend or vary:

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation exempt from registration as provided by the said Part II. of the Motor Boating Act

Any boat being in the possession, custody or control of a builder of boats for sale, such builder being a member of the Boat Builders' Association, or a dealer in boats being a member of the National Marine Association, whilst such boat is being bona fide tested or demonstrated for the purpose of sale and is identified by name plates bearing the name of such builder or dealer on each side of the hull of such boat.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation of the Governor in Coun-WHEREAS by a Proclamation of the Governor in Council issued on the 16th day of November, 1954, and published in the Government Gazette of the 17th day of November, 1954, for the purposes of the Country Fire Authority Act 1944, certain parts of the country area of Victoria were proclaimed as fire control regions; and certain parts of such fire control regions were proclaimed to be urban fire districts; and the remainder (if any) of such fire control regions (being the area not included in any urban fire district) was proclaimed to be a rural district:

And whereas by section 16 of the Country Fire Authority Act 1958 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time, after consideration of a report submitted by the Country Fire Authority by Proclamation published in the Government Country ment Gazette-

- (1) create any new urban fire district; and
- (2) amend or alter the boundaries of rural fire districts within any region:

And whereas the Country Fire Authority has submitted a report that it is necessary to create a new urban fire district within the Twenty-fourth Fire Control Region:

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, after consideration of the said report of the Country Fire Authority, and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Country Fire Authority Act, do by this my Proclama-

- (1) Create the area described in the Schedule hereto a new urban fire district within the Twenty-fourth Fire Control Region.
- (2) Alter the boundaries of the rural fire district within the Twenty-fourth Fire Control Region by the excision therefrom of the area described in the Schedule hereto.

A By-law of the Shire of Korumburra, made under the Health Act 1958, and numbered 48, for the purpose of regulating the collection, removal and disposal of household refuse.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the Health Act 1958, and of any other power thereunto enabling them in that behalf the Council of the Shire of Korumburra in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors and Ratepayers of the said Shire for the purpose of carrying the said Act into operation within their jurisdiction, make the following By-law that is to say.

- 1. By-law No. 13 of the Shire of Poowong and Jeetho (now the Shire of Korumburra) is hereby repealed.
- 2. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its approval by the Governor in Council and immediately after its publication in the Government Gazette.
- 3. This By-law shall apply and have operation throughout the township of Korumburra and unless exempted by the Council shall apply to every house, building and premises therein.
- 4. In this By-law unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter—"proprietor" means the proprietor of any premises and includes the owner, the occupier or any person having the management or control thereof. "Refuse" includes all waste (except sewage and manure) produced or accumulated in or about any house, building or premises.
- 5. The proprietor of every house, building or premises shall provide, keep and maintain upon his premises at all times a properly constructed receptacle in which he shall from time to time cause to be deposited all refuse produced or accumulated in or about such house, building or premises.
- 6. Such receptacle shall be constructed of galvanized iron of not less than 24 gauge or other approved material, in such a manner as to prevent any absorption by any

part of such receptacle of any offensive matter which may be deposited therein or any escape by leakage or otherwise of any part of contents of such receptacle.

- 7. Each receptacle shall have a capacity of not more than three cubic feet and shall be strongly constructed and provided with properly attached side lifting handles to make it capable of being easily and conveniently carried
- 8. Such receptacle shall be provided with a suitable close fitting lid with a flange overlapping the top of such receptacle, and shall be constantly covered (except when refuse is being deposited therein or discharged therefrom) and a sufficient quantity of some efficient deodorant shall be from time to time introduced therein when necessary, to keep such refuse in an inoffensive condition.
- 9. No person shall place, or cause, or permit to be placed any slops or liquid waste in such receptacle nor shall he deposit any moist refuse in such receptacle unless such moist refuse has been previously strained and effectually wrapped in waste paper.
- 10. The proprietor shall cause such receptacle to be kept at all times in good order and sweet condition and shall coat the inside of such receptacle with tar or other suitable substance when deemed necessary by the Council.
- 11. The proprietor shall cause at such hours and on such days as may be appointed by the Council for the removal of refuse, such receptacle to be deposited close to the street, lane, right-of-way or passage on which such house, building or premises abut in order that the contents of such receptacle may be conveniently removed by the contractor or person authorised or employed in that behalf by the Council.
- 12. The contractor or person authorised or employed by the Council for the removal of such refuse shall be responsible for the complete emptying (without spilling any of the contents) of such receptacle or receptacles directly into a vehicle provided for its reception at such hours and on such days as may be appointed by the Council. Such contractor or person shall be responsible for the replacement of such receptacle upside down with the lid alongside, at or near the place where it was placed by the proprietor and shall also close the gate or gates of the premises from which such receptacle is taken. premises from which such receptacle is taken.
- 13. The contractor or person authorized or employed by the Council for the removal of such refuse shall at least once a week or at such greater frequency as may be necessary, collect and remove such refuse in a suitable covered vehicle in such a manner as not to cause nuisance, danger to health or offensiveness.
- 14. Such vehicle shall be provided with a cover and kept covered except when refuse is being put into or discharged from such vehicle.
- 15. Such vehicle shall as far as practicable be rendered watertight by means of an impervious lining or by painting the inside thereof with tar or other suitable and effective means.
- 16. The contractor or person authorised or employed by the Council for the removal of such refuse, shall cause all vehicles used for the reception and removal of such refuse to be properly constructed, kept clean and thoroughly disinfected with approved disinfectant and maintained in a proper state of repair.
- 17. If any refuse is authorised to be deposited or disposed of in or on any land, hole, quarry or indenture, such refuse shall be deposited in a regular and orderly manner as directed by the Council or in accordance with signs on the site of such land, hole, quarry or indenture. At the conclusion of each days depositing or at such time thereafter as may be convenient the contractor or the person or persons authorised or employed by the Council shall bind the surface with clean earth, lime or other approved material so as not to create any nuisance. approved material so as not to create any nuisance.
- 18. If any person or persons commit a breach of this By-law he or they shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty of not more than £20, and in the case of a continuing offence a further daily penalty of not more than £5.

 (iii) Head of swine
 - (b) For examining and branding any carcass of meat derived from any—
 - (i) Bull, cow, calf, (other than a bobby calf), heifer, ox or steer ... (ii) Bobby calf, goat, kid lamb or sheep
 - (iii) Swine ... (c) For any certificate as to examination made by a meat inspector

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In this By-law a bobby calf means any calf not more than six weeks old.

The said fee shall be paid by the proprietor of any abattoir carried on in the meat area of the Council, and shall be paid by the proprietor thereof to the Shire Secretary of the Shire of Korumburra at least once in every month and the amount of such payment shall correspond with and be accompanied by a voucher from the meat inspector."

A By-law of the Shire of Morwell, and numbered 49, for the provision, use and control of receptacles for the deposit and collection of rubbish or refuse, pursuant to the Health Act.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Health Act and every other power and authority enabling them in this behalf, the Council of the Shire of Morwell, in the name of the President, Councillors and Ratepayers of the Shire of Morwell, do hereby make a By-law, and do hereby order and direct as follows:—

- 1. That By-law No. 14 of the Shire of Morwell be and is hereby repealed.
- No person shall allow or permit any rubbish or refuse of any sort to be in or upon or about his premises except as hereinafter provided.
- 3. The occupier of every shop, house, building, flat or other residential unit (hereinafter referred to as "premises") shall provide, keep and maintain at all times upon his premises a receptacle properly constructed and in accordance with the requirements of this By-lew with the requirements of this By-lew in which he shall from time to time deposit, or cause to be denosited rubbish or refuse produced or accumulated be deposited, rubbish or refuse produced or accumulated in or about such premises.

- 4. The maximum volume of rubbish or refuse which will be removed at any one clearance of such shall not exceed three (3) cubic feet.
- 5. Receptacles for collection of rubbish and refuse shall not exceed three (3) cubic-feet and shall not be less than one and one-fifth (1à) cubic-feet, and shall be so constructed of galvanized iron of not less than 24 gauge or other approved materials as to be capable of being easily carried by one man. Such receptacles shall be provided with a tight fitting lid and two side handles.
- 6. No person shall place or cause to be placed in any receptacle the contents of any vacuum cleaner, ashes or any other rubbish or refuse whatsoever which is likely to be or become offensive unless the same is wrapped effectively in paper before being placed in such receptacle.
- 7. No person shall place or permit to be placed any slops or liquid waste in any receptacle, nor place therein any moist rubbish or refuse unless such moist rubbish or refuse has been previously strained and effectively wrapped in paper.
- 8. No person shall place or permit to be placed any briquette dust or ashes in any receptacle unless the briquette dust or ashes are cold or have been effectively quenched with water in such quantity as to reduce the briquette dust to a stiff dry paste and such stiff dry paste or cold ash shall be effectively wrapped in paper.
- or cold ash shall be effectively wrapped in paper.

 9. The occupier of any premises shall keep or cause to be kept every receptacle upon or about such premises or used in connexion therewith constantly covered with a tight fitting lid with a flange overlapping the top of such receptacle (except when rubbish or refuse is being deposited therein or discharged therefrom) and from time to time deodorized in such a manner as to keep such receptacle or any rubbish or refuse therein in an inoffensive condition and in a condition not to attract or harbour rodents or other vermin. harbour rodents or other vermin.
- 10. The occupier of any premises shall cause every receptacle upon or about same or used in connexion therewith to be kept at all times in good order and clean condition and in proper repair, and shall, after being requested in writing by an officer of the Council, take such steps as are necessary to cause such receptacle to be restored to good order and clean condition and in proper repair within the time stated in such written request.
- 11. The occupier of any premises shall at such hours and 11. The occupier of any premises shall at such hours and on such days as may be appointed by the Council for the removal of rubbish and refuse cause all rubbish and refuse in or upon or about such premises to be placed in a properly constructed receptacle and cause such receptacle to be placed in a convenient position close to the entrance of such premises, or in such other place as is approved in writing by an officer of the Council, and from which the contents may be conveniently discharged or removed by the person or persons authorized by the Council.
 - 12. In this By-law-

"Council" means the Council of the Shire of

Morwell.

"Occupier" means and shall include the proprietor of any premises, and also the owner, the occupier. or any persons apparently having the management or control thereof;

"Receptacle" means a receptacle for rubbish and/or

13. Any persons who commit a breach of this By-law shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds, and, in the case of a continuing offence, a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds.

14. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the planning area of the Town of Morwell.

 - (a) prescribing the conditions on which animals may be received into or supplied or removed from the abattoirs therein situate;
 - (b) fixing the rates of fees or dues payable to the Council of the said Shire under Part XV. of the Health Act 1958;
 - (c) the feeding, watering, and tending and the pre-venting of cruelty to and the overcrowding of animals in the said abattoirs;
 - (d) prescribing the times for selling and for slaughtering animals and for the selling of carcasses or meat at the said abattoirs; and
 - (e) stopping temporarily the manufacture of and the sale of small goods in the circumstances in which danger to the consumer is apprehended owing to uncleanliness or to the presence of infection on or about the premises where such manufacture or sale is carried on.

IN exercise of the powers conferred by the Health Act 1958, and of every and any other power it thereunto enabling, the President, Councillors and Ratepayers of the Shire of Woorayl, hereby order as follows:—

- 1. By-law No. 39 is hereby repealed.
- 2. In this By-law-
 - "The Council" means the Council of the Shire of Woorayl.

"The Meat Inspector" means the meat inspector appointed and/or provided by the Council for inspection and supervision of any abattoir in the meat area.

- "The Meat Area" means the whole of the Municipal District of the Shire of Woorayl.
- 3. This By-law shall apply to the meat area as defined in clause 2 hereof and such area shall, as to the enforcement of the Meat Supervision Regulations therein, be under the direction of the meat inspector.
- 4. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its approval by the Governor in Council and immediately after its publication in the Government Gazette.
- 5. The times for slaughtering animals in the meat area shall be between the hours 6 o'clock a.m. and 5 o'clock p.m. on Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Thursdays and Fridays in each week. No animal shall be slaughtered at Public Abattoirs in the meat area on Saturdays, Sundays, or gazetted public holidays, unless the consent, in writing, of the meat inspector, or Shire Secretary or other Shire Officer appointed for that purpose to whom at least twenty-four hours' notice of intention to slaughter on those days must be given. on those days must be given.
- 6. No animal shall be slaughtered before it has been examined on the hoof in the meat area by the meat inspector on the days and within the times set out in clause 5 hereof.
- 7. No animal visibly known to be affected by any contagious or infectious disease shall be received into any abattoir in the meat area except with the express permission of the meat inspector.
- 8. No persons shall remove or permit to be removed from any abattoir in the meat area any carcass or part of a carcass of any animal slaughtered thereat until the same has been examined by the meat inspector and passed by him as fit for human food and branded by him with the regulation brand or rendered unfit for human consumption in the manner prescribed by the Meat consumption in the manner prescribed by the Meat Supervision Regulations.
- 9. In no case shall the carcass of any sheep be removed from any abattoir in the meat area with the head
- 10. The fees payable to the Council for examining and branding carcasses, parts of carcasses, or meat, by or under the direction of the meat inspector, shall be as follows:-
 - (a) For examining any-1. Bull, cow, calf (other than a bobby-calf), heifer, ox or steer ...
 2. Bobby-calf, goat, kid, lamb or sheep
 3. Head of Swine ... 2 6 0

- (b) For examining and branding any carcass of or meat delivered from any—
 - Bull, cow, calf (other than a bobbycalf), heifer, ox or steer
 Bobby-calf, goat, kid, lamb or sheep 3. Swine
- (c) For any certificate as to examination made by the meat inspector ...

In this By-law "Bobby-calf" means a calf not more than six weeks old.

The said fee shall be paid by the proprietor of any abattoir carried on in the meat area to the Council, and shall be paid by the proprietor thereof to the Shire Secretary, of the Shire of Korumburra, as Secretary of the Meat Inspection Group, at the office of the Shire of Korumburra, at least once in every month, and the amount of each payment shall correspond with and be accompanied by a voucher from the meat inspector.

- 11. The proprietor of any abattoir in the meat area shall not, nor shall any person having the management or control of any animal or animals in the abattoir—
 - (a) Suffer any cruelty to take place towards any animal at any time in the abattoir;
 - (b) Suffer animals to be overcrowded in the abattoir.

2. Other matter.

(a) All other matter duly certified by a responsible officer for publication should be lodged with the Gazette Officer not later than half-past Ten a.m. on Tuesday.

(b) Lengthy or involved notices should be forwarded several days before publication.

(c) Proofs, which will be supplied only when specifically requested, or at the direction of the *Gazette* Officer, should be returned promptly to avoid delay in publication.

(d) No additions or amendments to matter for publication will be accepted by telephone.

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
