- 1. That that portion of the Waterworks District of the Tyers and Glengarry Waterworks Trust comprised within the boundaries of the Tyers Reticulation Area described in Portion II. of the Order in Council dated the 18th day of August, 1959, shall be and become an "Urban District." for the purposes of and within the meaning of the said Acts, and shall be known as Tyers Urban District.
- 2. That that portion of the Waterworks District of the Tyers and Glengarry Waterworks Trust comprised within the boundaries of the Glengarry Reticulation Area described in Portion IV. of the Order in Council dated the 18th day of August, 1959, shall be and become an "Urban District" for the purposes of and within the meaning of the said Acts and shall be known as Glengarry Urban District.

PRESCRIPTION OF TREATMENT OF SCHOOL OR SNAPPER SHARK OR GUMMY SHARK WHETHER TAKEN IN VICTORIA OR ELSEWHERE PRIOR TO BEING LANDED IN VICTORIA.

#### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I THE Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Fisheries Act and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this my Proclamation prescribe the treatment of School or Snapper Shark or Gummy Shark whether taken in Victoria or elsewhere prior to being landed in Victoria for consigning, selling, marketing, storing or distributing as follows:—

Any School or Snapper Shark or Gummy Shark brought from any fishing grounds by sea shall be landed at a port in Victoria as a carcass.

Note.—For the purpose of this Proclamation "carcass" shall mean the body of a shark with the fifth gill slit showing and with the tail attached.

WHEREAS by an Act of Parliament of the State of Victoria passed in the ninth year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II. intituted City of Melbourne Underground Railway Construction Act 1960 (No. 6652) it is amongst other things enacted that for the purpose of repaying to the Government of Victoria two-fifths of the capital cost of the railway authorized by this Act there shall in the case of each owner of land situated within the boundaries described in the Second Schedule to the Act be charged levied and collected by the Commissioner of Land Tax and paid into the Consolidated Revenue for each and every year commencing with the year which follows next after a date to be fixed by Proclamation of the Governor in Council published in the Government Gazette a special duty of land tax upon land situated as aforesaid for every pound of the net annual value thereof as computed by the Council of the appropriate municipality under the Local Government Act 1958 at such rates as the Governor in Council from time to time by Order published in the Government Gazette declares to be necessary or sufficient to provide for such repayment to be made in full by annual payments during the period of fifty-three years commencing on the date fixed as aforesaid.

Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the State, do by this my Proclamation fix Tuesday the first day of January, One thousand nine hundred and sixty-three, as the date from which the special duty of land tax and special rate as aforesaid shall be charged levied and collected. collected.





ACT NO. 391.—SECOND SCHEDULE.

A STATEMENT of Trusts having been submitted by the head or authorized representative of the denomination of the Church of England under the provisions of the "Act to provide for the Abolition of State Aid to Religion," for allowance by the Lieutenant-Governor, the same was allowed by him on the sixth day of June, 1962, and the following is the form in which such statement of trusts has been allowed:—

#### STATEMENT OF TRUSTS.

Description of Land.—1 acre 2 roods, being allotment 8, section 3, Township of Penshurst, Parish of Boramboram, County of Villiers: Commencing at the north-western angle of allotment 7, section 3; bounded thence by that allotment bearing 180 deg. 0 min. 500 links; by Ritchiestreet bearing 270 deg. 0 min. 300 links; by Burchettstreet bearing 0 deg. 0 min. 500 links; and thence by Cobb-street bearing 90 deg. 0 min. 300 links to the point of commencement.

Name of Trustee.—The Ballarat Diocesan Trustees, of Cathedral Building, Dana-street, Ballarat.

Powers of Disposition.—To permit and suffer so much of the land as shall not be disposed of under the powers hereinafter specified to be used for the purposes for which it was promised or temporarily reserved from sale by the Crown. To let, lease, sell, mortgage or exchange if concurred in by the said Head or Authorized Representative for the time being, the said land or any portion thereof or any buildings thereon on such terms and conditions as shall be specified by such Head or Representative.

Purposes to which Proceeds or Disposition are to be Applied.—Moneys obtained from sale, leases, mortgages or exchanges to be paid to the Bishop to be dealt with for Church of England purposes as shall be directed by the said Trustees, but to be subject nevertheless to the payment or deduction therefrom of all costs, charges and expenses incurred by the Trustees or for which it shall be liable in respect of the trust estate.

#### MELBOURNE HARBOR TRUST COMMISSIONERS.

#### REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the *Melbourne Harbor Trust Act* 1958, the Melbourne Harbor Trust Commissioners make the following Regulations:—

- 1. The Regulations made by the Commissioners on the 8th August, 1956, approved by the Governor in Council on the 4th September, 1956, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 17th September, 1956, and any amendments thereto, are hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Regulations".
- 2. The Principal Regulations are amended by deleting Regulation 28 thereof and substituting therefor the following new Regulation 28:—
  - "28. Signals to be used by vessels navigating the Victoria Dock and River and Williamstown Channel:—
    - (a) The Master of a vessel proceeding from the Victoria Dock to the River shall, when abreast of the east end of No. 3 Shed, give a prolonged blast on the whistle of not less than six seconds' duration, to be repeated when abreast of the centre of No. 1 Shed
    - (b) If such vessel shall have another vessel or vessels in tow, the Master shall give three blasts in succession, viz., one prolonged blast as above, followed by two short blasts, the short blasts to be of one second duration, with an interval of one second between each blast.
    - (c) The Master of a vessel moored on either side of the Dock to the westward of the east end of No. 3 Shed, shall give the signals immediately upon leaving the berth, to be repeated when abreast of No. 1 Shed.
    - (d) The Master of a vessel proceeding down the River, upon hearing a warning signal given from a vessel proceeding down the Dock, shall reply by a prolonged blast on the whistle of not less than six seconds' duration, and, if towing one or more vessels, shall also give the two additional short blasts, as above, but not otherwise.
    - (e) The above sound signals must be given in all cases, and at all times, day or night, at the points stated, but they may be repeated at any point as often as the circumstances may demand.
    - (f) The Master of a vessel proceeding either up or down the River to a berth in any of the areas hereinafter mentioned shall, when the vessel enters the River or when she leaves her berth as the case may be, hoist at the fore and keep flying until the vessel has berthed in the said area, the following flag signals:—
      - 'A' when proceeding to Appleton Dock Berths.
      - 'M' when proceeding to Newport, Yarraville or Footscray Berths.
      - 'N' when proceeding to North Wharf Berths.
      - 'S' when proceeding to South Wharf Berths.
      - 'V' when proceeding to Victoria Dock Berths.

These flag signals shall be hoisted and kept flying on the towing vessel when lighters or barges are being towed, and, whenever a vessel other than a lighter or barge is being towed, these flag signals shall be hoisted and kept flying on the vessel being towed.

- (g) The Master of an outward bound vessel the draught of which is 30 feet or over proposing to enter and navigate within the limits of the dredged channel between Fawkner Beacon and the River shall before leaving the River or a Williamstown Berth as the case may be hoist at the fore the flag signal 'D' and keep the same flying until the vessel has cleared Fawkner Beacon.
- (h) The Master of any approaching vessel shall, upon sighting, a vessel flying the flag signal 'D' proceed with special care and caution and navigate in such manner as to avoid any occasion for the vessel flying such flag signal to take evasive action.
- (i) On vessels not having a foremast, a temporary pole or staff on which to show the flag may be used.
- (j) This Regulation shall not apply to vessels of less than 20 tons gross tonnage.
- (k) The Master or Pilot of an inward bound vessel, the draught of which is 30 feet or over, shall before entering the limits of the dredged channel between Fawkner Beacon and the River

inquire and obtain from Signal Station, Breakwater Pier, information as to the movements of any outward bound vessels navigating or proceeding to navigate within the limits of the said dredged channel."







#### REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by sub-section (1) of section 100 of the Forests Act 1958 and all other powers thereunto enabling, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby make the Regulations as follows (that is to say):—

- 1. These Regulations may be cited as the Forest (Diseases of Trees) Regulations 1962 and shall come into operation upon publication in the *Government Gazette*.
- 2. The Forest Diseases Regulations 1962, made on the twenty-third day of January, 1962, are hereby revoked.
- 3. In these Regulations, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—
  - "Dead pine tree" means any tree of any species of the genus *Pinus* on which no living foliage is visible.
  - "Occupier" of land means any person or body of persons corporate or unincorporate in occupation or possession or having the control or management of land; and includes any joint occupier and any agent of an occupier.
  - "Owner" of land includes-
    - (a) any person or body of persons corporate or unincorporate holding or occupying land under any lease or licence from the Crown or deriving title from under or through any such person;
    - (b) a mortgagee of land in possession thereof;
    - (c) any joint owner and any agent of an owner.
  - "Specified area" means those areas within the boundaries of the Counties of Bourke, Buln Buln, Evelyn, Mornington and Tanjil.
- 4. Where any trees or timber on any land are found to be affected by any disease within the meaning of the Act, the Commission may by notice in writing direct the owner or occupier of such land to remove, treat or dispose of all diseased trees or timber thereon within the period and in the manner specified in such notice.
- 5. In order to eradicate any disease of trees or to prevent or to eradicate any disease in timber, any forest officer or any person authorized by the Commission in writing either generally or in any particular case together with such assistance as such forest officer or person considers necessary may—
  - (a) fell, cut, remove, burn or otherwise dispose of any trees or timber whether such trees or timber are diseased or not;
  - (b) treat any diseased trees or timber; and
  - (c) take any steps and execute any works which the Commission directs to eradicate any disease of trees or to prevent and to eradicate any disease in timber.

Before any forest officer or authorized person exercises any powers under the above provision, the Commission shall by notice in writing inform the owner or occupier of the land concerned of its intention to carry out such works.

- 6. The Commission may issue an order in writing prohibiting the removal of trees or timber from any land in respect of which there has been issued a notice pursuant to clauses 3 or 4 of these Regulations. No person shall remove or cause to be removed any trees or timber from any such land unless so authorized by the Commission or directed by the Commission.
- 7. The Commission may amend, vary or revoke any order issued pursuant to clause  $\, 6 \,$  hereof.
- 8. (i) Every owner or occupier of land within the specified area shall, not later than the 31st day of July, 1962, fell and completely destroy or cause to be felled and completely destroyed all dead pine trees on all such land owned or occupied by him.

- (ii) The destruction required by paragraph (i) of this clause shall be carried out by burning all parts of the trunk and limbs of the dead pine trees.
- (iii) No person shall remove or cause or permit to be removed from the land owned or occupied by him the whole or any part of any dead pine tree felled in accordance with paragraph (i) of this clause.
- 9. (i) Where, after the thirty-first day of July, 1962, any pine tree on any land within the specified area becomes a dead pine tree, the owner or occupier of the land shall, within 30 days, fell and completely destroy or cause to be felled and completely destroyed such dead pine tree.
- (ii) The destruction required by paragraph (i) of this clause shall be carried out by burning all parts of the trunk and limbs of the dead pine tree.
- (iii) No person shall, without the authority in writing of a forest officer, remove or cause or permit to be removed from the land owned or occupied by him the whole or any part of any dead pine tree felled by him in accordance with paragraph (i) of this clause.
- 10. Any forest officer or any person authorized by the Commission in writing either generally or in any particular case, subject to the Act, enter any land for the purposes of searching for any disease or any insect or any diseased trees, or to ascertain whether any order or any notice or any other provision of these Regulations has been complied with or observed.
- 11. Any person who neglects or fails to comply with the requirements of any notice or order under these Regulations, or to carry out within the time prescribed by clauses 8 and 9 of these Regulations any works required by these Regulations shall be guilty of an offence and for every such offence be liable on conviction to a penalty of not more than One hundred pounds.

- 3. In Part B of the Second Schedule, for the words "posted any ballot paper" there shall be substituted the words "lodged any postal ballot paper".
- 4. In paragraph (g) of Part C of the Second Schedule, for the words "post the ballot paper or cause it to be posted" there shall be substituted the words "post or deliver the ballot paper or cause it to be posted or delivered".
- 5. In paragraph (a) of clause (2) of the note to the Third Schedule the words "through the post" shall be repealed.

#### REGULATIONS FOR THE SELECTION AND REMUNERATION OF ASSESSORS FOR COURTS OF MARINE INQUIRY.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Marine Act 1958, and all other powers thereunto enabling, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulations, that is to say:

#### Short Title.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the "Marine (Selection and Remuneration of Assessors) Regulation 1962".

Classes of Persons Eligible for Appointment as Assessors for Courts of Marine Inquiry.

- 2. Assessors for Courts of Marine Inquiry shall be divided into the following four classes, and no person shall be considered eligible for appointment as one of such assessors who does not possess such qualifications as would permit of his being placed in one of such classes:---
  - Class 1.-Masters possessing a foreign-going master's certificate of competency who have served five years in command of a ship or
  - Class 2.—Engineers possessing a first class British Ministry of Transport certificate of competency or other marine engineering equivalent who have served five years as a certificated engineer in a ship or ships.
  - Class 3.—Port Phillip Pilots holding unrestricted licences or masters holding exemption certificates within the meaning of the Marine Act 1958, qualifying the holders to act within Port Phillip as pilots unrestricted as to the channels for navigation.
  - Class 4.—Persons with scientific qualifications of such nature as would qualify them to investigate scientific questions relating to the conduct of navigation or the build or management of ships.

#### Tenure of Office.

3. Persons appointed as assessors shall hold office from the date specified in their respective appointments until the 30th day of June next following such date so specified.

#### Board to Prepare List.

4. The Marine Board shall during the month of June in each year, prepare a list of persons not exceeding twenty, and not less than ten in number, who, in its opinion, are eligible for appointment as assessors and, in selecting the persons whose names are to be placed on such list, shall ensure that the number eligible for appointment as members of each of the aforesaid classes of assessors shall be as nearly equal as may be practicable.

#### Forwarding of List to Minister.

5. The list referred to in paragraph 4 above shall be forwarded to the Minister for submission to the Governor in Council, not later than the 14th day of June, for the purpose of selecting therefrom persons for appointment as assessors.

#### $Extraordinary\ Vacancies.$

6. If any vacancy occurs in the number of assessors, the Marine Board shall submit to the Minister names of eligible persons, not exceeding four and if possible not less than two in number, to fill the vacancy in accordance with these regulations.

#### Remuneration of Assessors.

7. Every assessor for a Court of Marine Inquiry shall for every day or portion of a day during which he is engaged on such Court or is in attendance waiting to perform his duties as assessor shall be paid the sum of Seven guineas.

ORDER APPROVING THE MAKING OF A BY-PASS IN THE CITY OF DANDENONG.

### WHEREAS:

- I. Section 114 of the *Country Roads Act* 1958 (herein called "the Act") provides (*inter alia*) in—
  - (a) sub-section (1) thereof that the powers conferred upon municipal councils by Division fourteen of Part XIX. of the Local Government Act 1958 shall so far as applicable be conferred upon the Country Roads Board (herein called "the Country Roads Board (herein called "the Board") so far as relates to the declaration of the alignment the widening and opening up of by-pass roads and that the provisions of the said Division shall with certain modifications
  - extend and apply accordingly; and
    (b) sub-section (2) thereof that no by-pass road shall
    be widened or opened up pursuant to the said section unless the Governor in Council has by Order published in the Government Gazette approved such widening or opening up.
- II. Section 101 of the Act provides (inter alia) that for the purposes of Part VII. of the Act sections nineteen to twenty-one of the Act shall so far as applicable and with such adaptations as are necessary extend and apply with respect to by-pass roads.

#### III. The Board has-

- (a) in exercise of the powers conferred upon it by the said section 114 and for the purpose of opening up a by-pass road in the City of Dandenong under the name "Scoresby By-pass Road" by resolution dated the 11th day of December, 1961, fixed alignments for each side of the said road;

  (b) in accordance with the provisions of section 19
- (b) in accordance with the provisions of section 19 of the Act caused to be prepared a map plan and estimate showing-
  - (i) the points between which and the lands on and through which the said road is proposed to be made; and

#### (ii) the cost of acquiring the land.

IV. The Governor in Council is satisfied that there are funds legally available for acquiring the said land; Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria with the advice of the Executive Council thereof by this Order approves, for the purposes of section 20 (as applied by the said section 101) and of section 114 of the Act, the acquisition of the said land (being the land described in the Schedule hereto) and the making of the read road.







IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act* 1958 and of any and every other power it thereunto enabling, the Mayor, Councillors and Citizens of the City of Northcote order as follows:-

- 1. In this By-law, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter

  - "Board" means the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works,
    "Council" means the Council of the City of Northcote.
    "Property" includes any land upon which a house or
  - other building is erected.
    "Sewer" means a sewer laid by the Board.
    "Sewage" includes sullage.
- 2. (1) The owner of every property in respect of which a general notice has been given by the Board under section 160 (1) of the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works Act 1958, shall—
  - (a) make provision to have the sewage carried off from such property by the sewer laid by the Board, and
  - (b) provide such proper water closet or water closets and such drains, appliances, apparatus and con-nexions with such sewer as may be prescribed by Regulations of the Board,

within six months or such further time as the Council may allow from the date of the coming into operation of this By-law where such a general notice has been given prior to the said date or within six months or such further time as aforesaid from the date of any such general notice given after the coming into operation of this By-law as the case may be.

- (2) All such sewerage works and the provision of all such water closet or water closets, drains, appliances, apparatus and connexions with a sewer shall be carried out, fitted and laid in accordance with Regulations prescribed by the Board.
- (3) Any owner as aforesaid desirous of an extension of time beyond the said period of six months shall—
  - (a) make application in writing to the Council, and
  - (b) in his application give-

    - (i) his full name and address,
      (ii) particulars of the property concerned,
      (iii) the reasons why he requires an extension,
    - and
    - (iv) any other relevant information.
- 3. Any owner to whom this By-law applies who fails 3. Any owner to whom this By-law applies who lails to provide for the sewage from his property to be carried off by a sewer and to provide such water closet or water closets, drains, appliances, apparatus or connexions as may be prescribed by the Regulations of the Board and cause the same to be connected to a sewer within the said period of six months or such further time as may be allowed by the Council, shall be guilty of an offence proved this Bullow. against this By-law.
