PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1958* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1958*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6), shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1958* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Class 6 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1958* aforesaid, to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

MELBOURNE CRICKET GROUND.

AMENDMENT OF REGULATION.

WHEREAS by section 9 of the *Melbourne Cricket Ground Act 1933* the trustees appointed thereunder have power from time to time, with the approval of the Governor in Council, to make Regulations as therein provided, and with like approval to repeal or amend such Regulations: And whereas the said Act provides that the Regulations relating to the Metropolitan Cricket Ground in force immediately before the commencement of the said Act shall be deemed to have been made pursuant to the said Act and shall remain in force until repealed under the said Act: And whereas Regulations relating to the Melbourne Cricket Ground have been made from time to time both before and after the commencement of the said Act: And whereas it is in the opinion of the trustees, the Honorable Henry Stephen Bailey, Honorable Henry Edward Bolte, Honorable Arthur Augustus Calwell, Honorable Gilbert Lawrence Chandler, Honorable Patrick Leslie Coleman, Honorable Leslie William Galvin, Honorable Thomas Hayes, Honorable Patrick John Kennelly, Francis Harold Klenner, Stanley Radcliffe Lewis, Q.C., Sir Kenneth George Luke, Frank Livesey Mauger, Right Honorable Robert Gordon Menzies, Edward Leonard Moran, Honorable John Gladstone Black McDonald, Honorable Arthur Gordon Rylah, John Arnold Seitz, and Honorable Keith Hector Turnbull necessary and expedient to amend one of such Regulations:

Now therefore, we, the undersigned, a statutory majority of the said trustees for the time being of the land described in the Fifth Schedule to the principal Act as enlarged, pursuant to the provisions of the *Melbourne Cricket Ground Act 1951*, numbered 5614, together with all improvements thereon, do by virtue of all the powers thereunto us enabling hereby amend Regulation No. 20 and substitute therefor the following:—

REGULATION 20.

The maximum scale of fees which shall be charged and collected by the trustees for admission to the Second and Fourth Divisions of the Reserve on such days as it may be set apart for cricket matches or football matches, or any other outdoor game or sports or amusements, shall (in addition to any tax payable under any law other than the said Act on or in respect of such fees or admissions) be as follows:—

- (a) For admission of every person to the Second Division on any such day such a sum as the trustees may from time to time determine not exceeding Ten shillings (10s.).

- (b) For a reserved seat or reserved accommodation in the Second Division and the booking thereof on any such day such additional sum as the trustees may from time to time determine not exceeding Five shillings (5s.).
- (c) For admission of every person to the Fourth Division on any such day such a sum as the trustees may from time to time determine not exceeding Six shillings (6s.).
- (d) For a reserved seat or reserved accommodation in the Fourth Division and the booking thereof on any such day such additional sum as the trustees may from time to time determine not exceeding Four shillings (4s.).

RULES OF THE NATIONAL FITNESS COUNCIL OF VICTORIA.

THE National Fitness Council of Victoria, under the powers conferred by the *National Fitness Council of Victoria Act 1960* (No. 6713), hereby makes the following rules:—

Annual Meeting.

1. The Annual Meeting of the Council shall be held in the month of October of each year.

Business Year.

2. The financial year of the Council shall commence on 1st July of each year and shall end on 30th June of the following year.

Meetings of Council.

3. Ordinary meetings of the Council shall be held in alternate months at the office of the National Fitness Council on such dates and at such times as the Council may from time to time determine.

Notice of Meeting.

4. The Chief Executive Officer shall arrange that notice of all meetings of the Council and of Committees (stating the time and place thereof, and any special business to be considered) be sent to members. Notice shall be deemed to have been duly given if posted to the registered address of a member in time to reach such address in the ordinary course of post at the required time prior to the date of such meeting.

Quorum.

5. Should a quorum not be present within fifteen minutes of the stated time of commencement, the meeting shall lapse and any business shall be deferred until next meeting.

Agenda.

6. Subject to any motion of the particular meeting, the following shall be the order of the agenda of a Council meeting:—

- (a) Opening of Meeting by Chairman.
- (b) Apologies.
- (c) Confirmation of Minutes.
- (d) Business Arising from Minutes.
- (e) Notices of Motion.
- (f) Correspondence.
- (g) Reports of Committees.
- (h) Other Business.
- (i) Date of Next Meeting.
- (j) Closure.

Committees.

7. (a) There shall be the following Committees appointed by the Council at its Annual Meeting:—Executive; Finance; Training; Camps.

(b) The Finance Committee shall, subject to the direction of the National Fitness Council, scrutinize all accounts and make such recommendations to the Council or the Executive thereon as it thinks fit as to the payment thereof. It shall also receive from such other Committees appointed by the Council or Executive all proposals for the expenditure of moneys, and shall, after consideration of such proposals, make such recommendation as it deems fit to the Executive and/or Council. The Finance Committee shall once each year examine the records relating to the assets of the Council and shall ensure that such assets are adequately covered by insurance. The Finance Committee shall once each year review the salary paid to the members of the staff of the Council and shall subsequently make such recommendations as it deems fit regarding increments and the like to the Executive Committee or the Council. The Finance Committee shall once in each year prepare a budget of receipts and expenditure for submission to the Executive and/or Council. The Finance Committee shall carry out such other duties as the Executive Committee or Council shall allot to it from time to time.

(c) The Training Committee shall, subject to the direction of the National Fitness Council, be responsible for all matters concerning the training programme of the Council including staff training, the various National Fitness Courses and allied activities, and the conduct of the National Fitness Council Training Centre. The Training Committee shall carry out such other duties as may be allotted to it from time to time by the Council and/or its Executive Committee. The Chairman of the Training Committee shall report regularly to the Council and the Executive Committee on the activities and recommendations of the Training Committee.

(d) The Camps Committee shall, subject to the direction of the National Fitness Council, be responsible for the maintenance and development of camps owned or leased by the Council and shall from time to time submit such proposals as it deems fit regarding expansions or improvements thereto to the Executive

or Council. The Camps Committee shall scrutinize all applications for the hire of the camps and shall allocate such dates as it deems fit to such applicants as may be approved. The Camps Committee shall be responsible for the compiling and maintenance of a camp register and advise the Council on all matters pertaining to camping.

8. (a) Nominations for Committees shall be lodged at the Council office addressed to the Chief Executive Officer and clearly marked "Nomination for Office" before noon of the 10th day prior to the day of the Council meeting at which Committees are to be appointed. Nomination forms shall be signed by the nominator and by the person nominated (indicating willingness to stand). Retiring members of all Committees shall be deemed to have been nominated and to have accepted nomination, unless by the closing time herein provided they notify the Chief Executive Officer to the contrary.

(b) Nominations of members for Committees shall be set out in the notice convening the Council meeting at which such Committees are to be appointed. In the event of the number of nominations received by the time appointed in paragraph (a) hereof being less than the number of persons to be elected, further nominations may be received at the Council meeting at which the Committee elections are to take place.

(c) The Chairman, or failing him, the member appointed by the Committee shall report to each meeting of the Council or the Executive Committee.

(d) Paragraph 6 shall apply to Committees, so far as applicable.

Notices of Motion.

9. No resolution which involves any change in the previously resolved policy of the Council shall be considered by the Council unless notice thereof has been given to members in the notice convening the meeting at which it is to be considered.

Voting.

10. Unless otherwise decided, voting shall be on a show of hands, except in the case of election of Committees which shall be by ballot.

Debating Procedure.

11. (a) Any member proposing a motion shall have the right to address the meeting in support of such motion and shall be entitled to speak a second time before the debate is closed.

(b) A member seconding a motion shall be entitled to reserve the right to address the meeting on the motion later in the debate.

(c) No person (other than the mover of the motion) shall speak a second time on the motion, except by way of personal explanation, or with the express leave of the Chairman.

Address of Members.

12. Each member shall give to the Chief Executive Officer an address for service of notices which shall be kept in a special register and shall be deemed to be that member's registered address.

Annual Report and Balance-sheet.

13. (a) The Chief Executive Officer shall prepare and submit to the Executive Committee at a meeting to be held in July of each year a draft of the general report in respect of the last preceding financial year of the proceedings of that Committee and of the affairs of the Council together with a draft account of the receipts and expenditure and of the funds, investments and properties of the Council and a draft balance-sheet.

(b) The Chief Executive Officer shall prepare and submit to a meeting to be held in July of each year of each committee other than the Executive Committee, a draft of the general report in respect of the last preceding financial year of the proceedings of that Committee together with such recommendations as that Committee deems desirable relating to the matters committed to that Committee by or under the Act.

Seal.

14. (a) There shall be a seal of the Council which shall be in the following form:—

LEGAL SEAL.

(b) The seal of the Council shall be kept in safe custody in the office of the Council and shall be attached to any document only on the resolution of the Council or of the Executive Committee.

(c) The seal may be affixed only in the presence of the Chief Executive Officer of the Council and two other members of the Executive Committee.

Signature of Cheques.

15. Cheques on the Council's account shall be signed by two signatories who shall be—

- (a) Any two members of the Finance Committee,
or
(b) Any member of the Finance Committee and either the Chief Executive Officer or the Assistant Secretary.

- (a) in exercise of the powers conferred upon it by the said section 114 and for the purpose of opening up a by-pass road in the City of Dandenong under the name "Dingley By-pass Road" by Resolution dated the eleventh day of December, 1961, fixed an alignment for each side of the said road;

In the case of milk being sold on the premises only or being distributed by hand or vehicle where less than four vehicles are employed—£2 per annum.

In the case of milk being distributed by vehicle where four or more vehicles are employed—£5 per annum.

(b) In any other Municipal District or Milk Area—

In the case of milk being sold on the premises only or being distributed by hand or vehicle where less than four vehicles are employed—£1 per annum.

In the case of milk being distributed by vehicle where four or more vehicles are employed—2 per annum.

1. A fee of £3 3s. for each meeting of the Board attended provided that no member shall be entitled to be paid a fee in respect of more than one meeting on any one day.

2. (a) Travelling expenses when outside a radius of 15 miles from his usual residence at the daily rate of £2 12s. which is fixed to cover the expense of three meals a day and lodging when the member is necessarily absent from his residence over night. The reimbursement in respect of each meal and of bed shall be one-fourth of the daily rate but shall not be allowed unless the member commences travelling earlier than or is absent later than the time or times respectively prescribed hereunder, viz.:—

				<i>Time of Leaving.</i>	<i>Time of Returning.</i>
Breakfast	7 a.m.	8.30 a.m.
Lunch	12 noon	2 p.m.
Tea	6 p.m.	7 p.m.

Provided that when the actual and necessary expenses incurred by any member exceed the rates prescribed above, such increased reimbursement may be granted as the Minister shall determine.

(b) Where a member leaves his residence and returns on the same day he shall be entitled to receive:—

(i) 5s. 6d. for breakfast, where he is required to leave before 7 a.m. and is unable to return until after 9.30 a.m.

(ii) 5s. 6d. for lunch, where he is required to leave before 12 noon, is unable to return until after 3 p.m., and is absent for a period of at least seven hours.

(iii) 9s. for tea, where he is required to leave before 5 p.m. and is unable to return until after 7 p.m.

3. An allowance at the mileage rates set out hereunder where a member is required to use his own motor car:—

For cars of 17 h.p. and over, 8.7 pence a mile.
