

DIRECTION BY ATTORNEY-GENERAL.

WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of section 22 of the Companies Act 1961 it is provided that except with the consent of the Minister a company shall not be registered by a name or a name of a kind that the Minister has directed the Registrar not to accept for registration. Now therefore I, Arthur Gordon Rylah, Attorney-General, direct the Registrar of Companies not to accept for registration without the consent of the Attorney-General any of the names mentioned hereunder:—:

- 1. Names suggesting connexion with members of the Royal family or Royal patronage, e.g., names which include the words "Royal", "King", "Queen", or "Crown"
- 2. Names suggesting connexion with the Crown, the Commonwealth of Nations, the Government of the Commonwealth of Australia or of a State or of any other part of the Queen's dominions, possessions or territories, e.g., names which include the words "Commonwealth", "Federal", "State", "Empire", "Imperial" or "National".
- 3. Names suggesting connexion with the government of a foreign country or with the United Nations.
- Names suggesting connexion with a government department, authority or instrumentality or a municipal or other local authority.
- 5. Names containing the following words or any words of like import:-
 - "Trust", "Trustee", "Chamber of Commerce", "Chamber of Manufacturers", "Chartered", "Stock Exchange", "Guarantee", "Co-operative", "Building Society", "Starr Bowkett", "Bank", "Banker", "Banking", "Savings".
- 6. Names suggesting connexion with ex-servicemen's organizations or that its members are totally or partially incapacitated, e.g., names which include the words "Anzac", "Ex-servicemen", "Returned Soldier", "Blind", or "Blinded".
- Names that are misleading as to the nature, objects or purpose of the company or in any other manner.
- 8. Names that are blasphemous or likely to be offensive to members of the public.
- 9. Names that are likely to be confused with or mistaken for the name of an existing company, foreign company, registered association, firm, co-operative society, co-operative housing society or friendly society or a business name.
- 10. Names that are likely to be confused with or mistaken for the name reserved by or on behalf of a company, a foreign company, a proposed company, or a company which it is proposed to register as a foreign company.

Attention is directed to the following additional restrictions on the use of names:—

- 1. International Organizations Privileges and Immunities Act 1958-1960, section 4, provides that except with the consent in writing of the Minister for the time being administering that Act a person shall not assume or use in connexion with any trade, business, calling or profession the name, official seal or emblem of the United Nations or of any other prescribed international organization.
- 2. Protection of Word "Anzac" Regulations (Statutory Rules 1921, No. 2 and No. 216, Statutory Rules 1959, No. 29), provide that no person shall, without the authority of the Governor-General or of a Minister of State, assume or use the word "Anzac" or any word resembling the word "Anzac" in connexion with any trade, business, calling or profession or in connexion with any entertainment or any lottery or art union.
- 3. Defence (Prohibited Words and Letters) Regulations (Statutory Rules 1957; No. 15); prohibit the use in connexion with a trade, business, calling or profession or by an organization or body of persons of the words and letters set out therein without the consent in writing of the Minister for the time being administering the Defence Act.

RULES OF THE COUNCIL OF LEGAL EDUCATION.

RULES RELATING TO THE QUALIFICATION AND ADMISSION OF CANDIDATES.

The 6th day of June, 1962.

I N pursuance of the authority in this behalf conferred upon the Council of Legal Education by the Legal Profession Practice Act 1958, the said Council hereby alters its Rules made the 13th day of December, 1957, and amended the 12th day of November, 1958, the 22nd day of August, 1960, the 16th day of December, 1960, the 27th day of November, 1961, the 19th day of December, 1961, and the 21st day of March, 1962, as follows:—

- 1. By inserting in the initial paragraph of the Rules after the words and figures "Part II.—The Board of Examiners, rr. 5-8" the words and figures "Part IIa.—Legal Education Committee, rr. 8a-8c".
 - 2. By inserting after Part II. of the Rules the following provisions:-

"PART IIA .-- LEGAL EDUCATION COMMITTEE.

- 8. (A) There shall be a Legal Education Committee which, on behalf of the Council and subject to its directions, shall have authority:—
 - (a) to prescribe the scope and content and to approve of and supervise the conducting of courses of tuition for Victorian candidates seeking to qualify for admission by taking the course for articled clerks or as managing clerks in the manner provided for in Rules 17A and 18A;
 - (b) to nominate lecturers and tutors for appointment by any institution providing approved courses of tuition for such candidates;
 - (c) to hold or approve of the holding by any institution of examinations for the purposes of Rules 17A and 18A to appoint or approve the appointment of examiners for any such examinations and to direct how, when and where such examinations shall be held and to determine the standards to be applied thereat;
 - (d) to determine the eligibility of any person to seek to qualify for admission in the manner provided for in Rules 17a and 18a and to exercise in relation to persons seeking to qualify under those Rules the powers exercisable by the Board of Examiners under Rule 46 in relation to other persons;
 - (e) to perform such other functions as are assigned to it under these
- 8. (B) (1) The Legal Education Committee shall consist of two Judges of the Supreme Court appointed by the Chief Justice, the person for the time being holding the office of Solicitor-General, a person appointed by the Faculty, a person appointed by the Council of the Institute, and a person appointed by the Victorian Bar Council.
- (2) Each of the powers to appoint conferred by the preceding subrule shall carry with it a power to remove and a power to fill any vacancy whether arising from a removal or otherwise.
- 8 (c) (1) The senior in point of judicial service of the Judges who are members of the Legal Education Committee shall be the Chairman thereof.
- (2) Meetings of the Legal Education Committee may be convened by or with the authority of the Chairman or any two members thereof by notice, in writing, to the members specifying the time and place of the meeting.
- (3) The Chairman, or in his absence an acting chairman appointed by the members present from their number, shall preside at meetings of the Legal Education Committee.
 - (4) Three shall form the quorum for the transaction of business.
- (5) The Legal Education Committee may adjourn its meetings from time to time as it finds convenient and for the purpose of adjourning a meeting it shall not be necessary that a quorum be present.
- (6) All questions shall be decided by a majority of those present at the meeting and the Chairman or acting chairman, as the case may be, shall have a casting as well as a deliberative vote.
- (7) The Secretary for the time being of the Board of Examiners shall be secretary of the Legal Education Committee."
- 3. By substituting for the word "Board" wherever appearing in Rules 17a and 17a and 18a and 24a the words "Legal Education Committee".

DANGEROUS DRUGS REGULATIONS 1962.

BY virtue of the powers in that behalf conferred by the Poisons Act 1958 (No. 6336), His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and on the recommendation of the Pharmacy Board of Victoria, doth make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

- 1. (1) These Regulations may be cited as the Dangerous Drugs Regulations 1962 and shall come into operation on the 1st September, 1962.
- (2) In these Regulations the Dangerous Drugs Regulations 1930 are called the Principal Regulations.
- 2. The proviso to sub-regulation (3) of Regulation 31 of the Principal Regulations shall be amended as follows:—
 - (a) For sub-paragraph (ii) of paragraph (b) there shall be substituted the following sub-paragraph:—
 - "(ii) a preparation intended and sold specifically for intramammary infusion in the treatment of bovine mastitis and consisting of either—

penicillin with or without streptomycin and conforming as to dosage and colouring to the provisions of Regulation 31A; or streptomycin—

packed in a container bearing a label containing in prominent letters the words—

'For veterinary use only—not intended for use by human beings. Wear rubber gloves when applying. This preparation must not be used after the expiry date shown hereon'—

and a statement by the manufacturer or packer of the date of manufacture and date of expiry; and "

- (b) For paragraph (c) there shall be substituted the following paragraph:—
 - "(c) that a person holding a licence to sell poisonous substances may in the unopened original container as supplied by the manufacturer without prescription sell specifically for intramammary infusion in the treatment of bovine mastitis a preparation of penicillin conforming as to dosage and colouring to the provisions of Regulation 31A and bearing a label in which are prominently inscribed the words and statement set out in sub-paragraph (ii) of paragraph (b) of this proviso."
- 3. After Regulation 31 of the Principal Regulations there shall be inserted the following Regulation:— $\,$
 - "31a. No person shall sell by wholesale or retail any preparation containing penicillin prepared for bovine intramammary infusion—
 - (a) which contains more than 100,000 international units of penicillin per dose; and
 - (b) unless such preparation contains a marker of Brilliant Blue FCF to a concentration of 0.125 grammes per 100,000 international units of penicillin."
- 4. In Regulation 32 of the Principal Regulations for the words "the last preceding Regulation" there shall be substituted the expression "Regulations 31 and 31a".

REGULATIONS FOR ENCOURAGING AND PROMOTING THE USE OF COAL BRIQUETTES.

PURSUANT to the powers in that behalf conferred by sections 16, 110 and 111 of the State Electricity Commission Act 1958, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council of that State, doth hereby on the recommendation of the State Electricity Commission of Victoria make the following Regulations for or with respect to promoting and encouraging the use of coal briquettes, that is to sav:—

- 1. These Regulations may be cited as Coal Briquette (Use) Regulations 1962 and shall come into force on the day on which they are published in the Government Gazette.
- 2. In any city, town or borough where the supply of coal briquettes to any premises may in the opinion of the Commission cause undue interference with traffic generally or otherwise cause undesirable annoyance to the public, the Commission may establish plant for the generation of heat by coal briquettes and convey or transmit the heat to those premises and supply it there by air, water, steam, oil or other suitable medium and for the purposes of this Regulation may exercise the powers conferred by section 106 of the State Electricity Commission Act as though the medium so used were a product of brown coal.







The Reserve has been-placed under the control of a Committee of Management: (hereinafter referred to as the "Committee "), with: full power and authority to enforce these Regulations. Regulations.

REGULATIONS.

- 11. No person shall interfere with, move, damage or destroy any shrub, tree, plant, grass, flowers, or any property, or enter-on any flower bed or borders, or light fires within the Reserve.
- 2. No persons shall throw stones or missiles of any kind within the Reserve.
- 3. No person shall climb on any portion of any building, balustrade, or property in the Reserve, or jump over any fence or hedge thereon.
- 4.3 No person; shall=affix or interfere with any placard, bill, notice or marking of any kind on any building, structure, tree, constructed surface, or anything within the Reserve.
- 5. No person shalk enter or travel over the Reserve with or on any motor car, motor cycle, bicycle, or other vehicle, except on such portions thereof provided for wheeled traffic, and the driver of such motor car, motor cycle, bicycle, or other vehicle shall be guided and directed, and shall abide by any notice, post, or sign, marking for ibarrier guide which has been marked or erected for the purpose of traffic guidance, control or direction. direction.
- 6. No person shall drive a motor car, motor cycle, bicycle, or other vehicle within the Reserve recklessly, or at a speed or in a manner dangerous to the public, or likely, to cause any idamage to anything within the Reserve.
- 7. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or seats, or any wall, structure, or property within the Reserve.

48.1 No person in a state of intoxication, or who is disorderly, or is not decorously dressed shall enter or remain in the Reserve, and no person shall commit therein any nuisance or any indecent or offensive act.

' 9.' No person shall remain; within the Reserve, or on any property therein; when lawfully directed to leave the same by any bailiff of Crown lands, or member of the Police-Force, or authorized officer of the Committee.

c14. No persons shall bring in or vallow ito remain in the *Reserve cany thorse, 'cow, asheep, apiguor goat, tand' any such animal found wandering, therein shall be liable to be impounded or destroyed.

15. No person shall makegor cause to be made any violent outcry, noise; disturbance, or sound, or shall play "upon any musical or noisy instrument, or sing within the Reserve, without the authority, in swriting, of the committee.—(Rs.8053.)

"4...No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle; horses, ...sheep, goats, pigs on other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained: Provided, always, that the maintenance and improvement of shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land, and Works.

75. The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing in the Reserve; and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve: (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating

'to' the 'impounding 'of cattle. "For 'the purposes of this "clause," Cattle" 'shall mean cattle as interpréted by section 3 of the Pounds Act 1928.

6. No person shall drive or bring any carriage or vehicle of whatsoever nature into the Reserve without the permission in writing, of the Committee of Management first had and obtained.

Ten pounds, by way of guarantee for due care in the removal of stone, earth, marl, or gravel aforesaid, and for due payment of the fees for removal of such earth, stone, marl and gravel. Allifees collected by the Committee of Management under or by virtue of this paragraph shall be paid by the said Committee into the Consolidated Revenue of the State of Victoria, and a certified return thereof furnished too the Roard of Lande and Worksat the end of each half-year. (a) No person shall erect in the Reserve any dwelling, booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, and no person shall make alterations or additions to existing structures, without the permission in writing of the Committee be first obtained, and then only after plans and specifications have been submitted to and approved by the said Committee, and subject to the payment of such fees for licence as the Committee may from time to time appoint, such fees not to exceed Twenty pounds (£20) for any dwelling, and to be payable in advance on the first day of January each year for the ensuing twelve months.
- (b) Licensees of sites must not sublet their sites or any erection thereon without the consent of the Committee be first obtained and then only subject to such special conditions as the said Committee deem fair to impose.
- (c) In the event of the transfer of the site, the said transfer must be approved by the Committee before being finalized, and the said Committee may make a nominal charge for the registration of such transfer.
- (d) No person after having obtained the permission in writing of the Committee shall use or cause or permit to be used any bathing-box, boathouse, or other erection for residential purposes.
- 8. No assemblies or meetings for fêtes, galas, or concerts, or for the purposes of public worship or preaching or public speaking or meetings of a like character, regattas or carnivals shall take place upon the Reserve without permission, in writing, of the Committee be first obtained.
- 9. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve, and any person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosures and Reserve.
- be liable to expulsion from the enclosures and Reserve.

 10. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection or enclosure on the occasions of any fêtes, sports or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee may at any time determine, not exceeding Twenty-five pounds (£25), by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee in its absolute discretion may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection or enclosure or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee.

 11. No person, except labourers and workmen employed
- 11. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations or young trees or shrubs.
- 12. No person shall bring or place any motor car, motor cycle, trailer, boat or other vehicle in or upon the Reserve except in or upon such portions thereof as shall from time to time be set apart by the Committee as parking areas.
- 13. All persons using such parking areas for the accommodation of any motor car, motor cycle, cycle, cart, trailer, boat or other vehicle shall pay such fees as shall be from time to time fixed by the Committee but the maximum fee therefor shall not exceed the sum of Two shillings (2s.) per day, and such persons using the parking areas shall park in the prescribed areas and it shall be an offence for any person to park in such a manner as to obstruct the entry to any ramp or turning area.
- 14. No fires shall be lighted or material burned upon the Reserve other than in approved fire-places unless by express permission in writing of the Committee.
- 15. No person shall discharge any gun, pistol, rifle, airgun, or any firearms in or upon the Reserve except by permission of the Committee.
- 16. No person shall deposit or cause to be deposited any paper, bottles, fruit skins, food or other litter or refuse in or upon the Reserve, except in receptacles provided upon the Reserve for that purpose by the Committee.
- 17. No person shall break any glass of any kind upon the Reserve or leave thereon any substance likely to cause injury to another.

- 18. (a) No person shall moor, service or repair any boat in or upon the Reserve for a period in excess of thirty days without the permission in writing of the Committee being first obtained.
- (b) Water craft left, wrecked or marooned on the Reserve may be removed by the Committee, and the cost of such removal shall be borne by the owner.
- 19. No person shall engage or take part in any motor vehicle or other vehicle racing upon the Reserve; and it shall be an offence for any person to ride or use any motor vehicle or other vehicle on the Reserve in any way or manner that may endanger the safety of or cause bodily harm to any person.
- 20. No person shall use any boat ramp, appliance or convenience which has been installed on the reserve for public use at a fee (not exceeding Five shillings) unless such fee is paid.
- 21. All persons using any boat ramps on the reserve shall use any equipment such as motor vehicle, trailer or boat in such a manner as not to damage the ramp or approach to and from the ramp.
- 22. The granting, withdrawal, renewal or allowance of the transfer of any permit or the subletting of any site or structure shall at all times be at the absolute discretion of the Committee.
- 23. The Committee shall have full power to order the removal from the Reserve of any bathing-box, boathouse, shed or any other building, structure, or booth which has been placed, erected or established without its consent or which has not been properly erected or properly painted, or which in its opinion has not been satisfactorily maintained or kept in repair, or in respect of which the term of permission for the use of the site has expired or the permission to use the site for a building or buildings has expired.

If the owner of any bathing-box, boathouse, shed or any other building, structure or booth erected on any site on the Reserve neglects to pay to the Committee the fee payable in respect thereof, or fails to comply with conditions specified by the Committee in relation to up-keep and maintenance of such bathing-box, boathouse, building, structure or booth then and in any such case it shall be lawful for the Committee in such manner as it thinks fit to remove and/or dispose of such bathing-box, boathouse, shed or other buildings, structure or booth, and to recover from the proceeds of such disposal the arrears of rent and the costs and expenses of such removal or disposal.
- 25. No person shall neglect or refuse to remove any bathing-box, boathouse, shed or other buildings, structure or booth erected or placed by him on any site in or on the Reserve within fourteen (14) days after the Committee has sent by registered post to his last-known address, a notice requiring such person to remove such bathing-box, boathouse, shed or other building, structure, erection or booth. Such notice may be signed by either the Chairman or Secretary for the time being of the said Committee.

In the event of any such neglect or refusal as mentioned in Regulation 25 hereof continuing after the expiration of the said fourteen (14) days, the Committee may pull down and/or remove and/or dispose of such bathing-box, boathouse, shed or other building, structure, or booth and recover the costs and expenses of such pulling down, removal or disposal from the person so neglecting or refusing to remove the same but without prejudice to proceedings by way of information for breach of these Regulations being taken against such person so neglecting or refusing.—(Rs.8130.)
