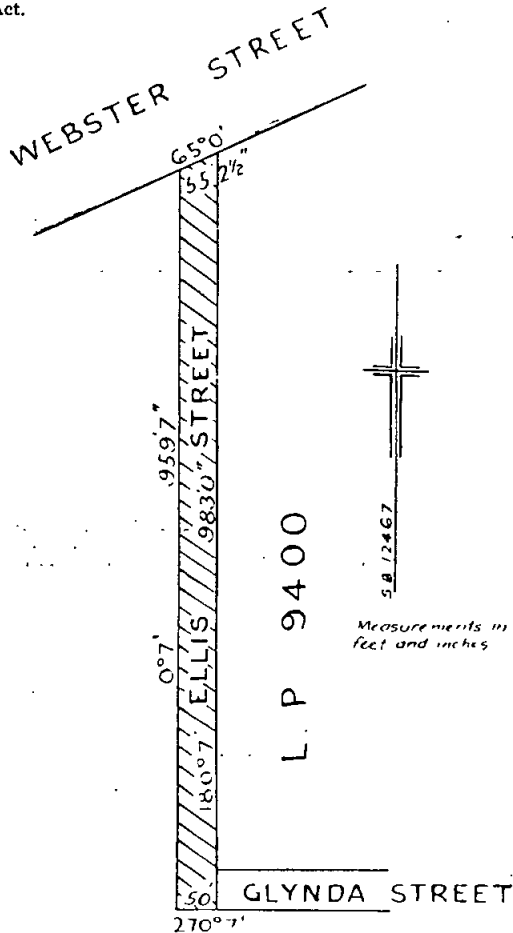
PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1958* (as amended), section 519, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon request of the Council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to proclaim any land reserved, used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force:

And, whereas the Council of the City of Dandenong has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been used for a street within the said City, be so declared to be a public highway:

Now, therefore, I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare that all that piece of land shown as a road on lodged plan of subdivision No. 9400, being the street known as Ellis-street, Dandenong, indicated by hatching on the diagram hereunder, shall be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act.

Now therefore, I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this my Proclamation fix Wednesday, the first day of August, One thousand nine hundred and sixty-two, as the day upon which the *Subordinate Legislation Act 1962* (No. 6886) shall come into operation.

PROCLAMATION OF STATES AND TERRITORIES FOR THE PURPOSES OF DIVISION 5 OF PART IV. OF THE COMPANIES ACT 1961.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS sub-section (1) of section 76 of the *Companies Act 1961* provides *inter alia*, that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation, proclaim a State or Territory of the Commonwealth to be a proclaimed State or Territory for the purposes of Division 5 of Part IV. of the *Companies Act 1961*:

And whereas the States of New South Wales, Queensland, Western Australia and the Australian Capital Territory in which the law relating to interests other than shares, debentures, &c., are similar to the law in force in Victoria:

Now, therefore, I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, by this, my Proclamation, do hereby declare the State of New South Wales, the State of Queensland, the State of Western Australia and the Australian Capital Territory to be proclaimed States for the purposes of the said Division 5 of Part IV. of the *Companies Act 1961*.

GENERAL NOTICE TO TREAT FOR LAND IN A RECLAMATION AREA AT KENSINGTON.

MELBOURNE HARBOR TRUST COMMISSIONERS.

IN pursuance of the *Melbourne Harbor Trust Act 1958*, the Melbourne Harbor Trust Commissioners make the following Regulations:—

1. The Regulations made by the Commissioners on 8th August, 1956, approved by the Governor in Council on 4th September, 1956, and published in the *Government Gazette* on 17th September, 1956, and any amendments thereto, are hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Regulations".

2. Regulation No. 302 of the Principal Regulations is amended by deleting the first, second and third paragraphs and the marginal note, and by substituting therefor the following:—

"The Master, Owner or Agent of a vessel occupying No. 26 South Wharf, No. 30 South Wharf or 'D' Berth Appleton Dock, at each of which berths additional wharf storage space is provided, shall, unless otherwise agreed upon, pay to the Commissioners for the right to place goods on such storage space the following charges:—

For the first day on which the vessel is so berthed at No. 26 South Wharf or No. 30 South Wharf, the sum of £16 if any cargo is unshipped or to be unshipped, and the sum of £3 if no cargo is unshipped or to be unshipped, and for each subsequent quarter of a day on which the vessel is so berthed the sum of 15s. irrespective as to whether or not any cargo is unshipped or to be unshipped.

For the first day on which the vessel is so berthed at 'D' Berth Appleton Dock, the sum of £24 if any cargo is unshipped or to be unshipped, and the sum of £4.10s. if no cargo is unshipped or to be unshipped, and for each subsequent quarter of a day on which the vessel is so berthed the sum of £1.2s. 6d. irrespective as to whether or not any cargo is unshipped or to be unshipped."

3. Regulation No. 316 of the Principal Regulations is amended by deleting the whole of the Schedule of Charges and by substituting therefor the following Schedule:—

The charge for water supplied by measure shall be payable, on demand, at the office of the Trust.

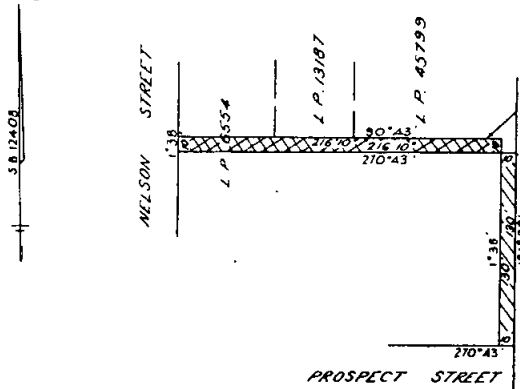

Inspection of Register.

2. (1) The register of unclaimed moneys kept by a company or firm, pursuant to sub-section (1) of section 11 of the Part of the Act, shall be open for inspection at all times during which that company or firm is open for business.

Inspection of Copies Lodged with Registrar.

(2) The copy of the entries in that register lodged with the Registrar, pursuant to sub-section (4) of section 11 of the Part of the Act, shall be open for inspection at the Treasury in Melbourne at all times during which the Treasury is open for business.

Form and Dimensions of Statement Accompanying Unclaimed Moneys Paid to Receiver of Revenue.

3. The statement accompanying unclaimed moneys paid to the receiver of revenue, pursuant to section 12 of the Part of the Act, shall be in the form set forth in the First Schedule to these Regulations and be made on good quality ledger paper in size 10½ inches by 13½ inches. Printed forms for this purpose may be purchased from the Government Printer.

Declaration of Secrecy.

4. (1) The declaration of secrecy required to be made by the Registrar or any person authorized by him before making inspections, pursuant to section 13 of the Part of the Act shall be in the form set forth in the Second Schedule to these Regulations.

Times for Making Inspections.

(2) Any such inspection may be made at any time during which the relevant company or firm is open for business.

Treasurer May Require Proof of Identity, &c., of Person Claiming Unclaimed Moneys.

5. The Treasurer may require any person claiming unclaimed moneys paid to the Treasury, pursuant to the Part of the Act, to produce such proof as the Treasurer may deem necessary to establish the identity of the claimant and his right to the money so claimed.

TEACHING SERVICE (TEACHERS TRIBUNAL) REGULATIONS.

AMENDMENT No. 33.

THE Teachers Tribunal, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Teaching Service Act 1958*, hereby amends Regulation 1 of the Teaching Service (Teachers Tribunal) Regulations in the manner following, that is to say:—

REGULATION 1.

Rescind clause 10 and substitute therefor the following clause:—

10. The following shall be the scale of commuted reimbursements to cover personal expenses of District Inspectors and others using their own or Government-owned motor cars on official business:—

(a) District Inspectors.

A By-law of the City of Hamilton made under sections 198 and 228 of the *Local Government Act 1958* and numbered 91 for—

- (a) Prohibiting on from and after a date specified herein, the erection or placing against or in front of any house or building abutting upon any public footway in any street or part thereof specified in the By-law of any veranda over or across such footway unless such veranda is supported by cantilevers, brackets or projecting supports, and not otherwise; and
- (b) requiring the pulling down and removal before a date specified herein of all verandas before the first-mentioned date erected or placed against or in front of any house or building abutting upon any such public footway which verandas are upon over or across such footway and are supported otherwise than by cantilevers, brackets or projecting support.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts and every other power it thereunto enabling the Mayor, Councillors and Citizens of the City of Hamilton order as follows:—

1. By-law No. 80 to the extent to which it adopts paragraphs 2, 3 and 6 under heading (1) ("Porticoes, Projections, &c.") of Part 1 of the Fifteenth Schedule of the *Local Government Act 1958* is hereby repealed.

2. On and from after the 1st day of July, 1962, no veranda shall be erected or placed against or in front of any house or building abutting upon any public footway in any street or part thereof in the City of Hamilton or over or across such footway unless such veranda is supported by cantilevers, brackets or projecting supports and not otherwise.

3. The owner of any veranda which is now or before the 1st day of July, 1962, shall have been erected or placed against or in front of any house or building abutting upon any public footway of any street in the City of Hamilton which veranda is upon, over or across such footway and is supported otherwise than by cantilevers, brackets or projecting supports, shall pull down and remove such verandas before the 30th day of June, 1977.

4. Every person shall for wilful act or default, contrary to any provision of this By-law, be guilty of an offence, and be liable for every such offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence to a penalty of not more than Two pounds for each day on which an offence against the By-law is continued after a conviction or order by any court.

5. This By-law shall have force and apply throughout the whole of the municipal district of the City of Hamilton.

"Council" means the Council of the City of Springvale;

"Private Street" has the same meaning as in the *Local Government Act 1958*.

2. No person shall leave standing or permit or suffer to be left standing any caravan on any street or road for a period exceeding 24 hours.

3. No person shall place or permit or suffer to be placed any caravan on any private property (other than for the purpose of sale, or hire for use other than on such private property, or the storing or parking of the same) without the consent in writing of the Council.

4. (1) No person shall occupy any caravan placed on any private property without the consent in writing of the Council.

(2) Every person applying for such consent shall make application in writing to the Council and supply such information as the Council may reasonably require.

(3) The Council may grant or refuse its consent to the application as it sees fit.

(4) If the Council gives its consent then the permit to issue as a result shall be—

- (a) for a period not exceeding one month; and
- (b) absolutely conditional upon proper sanitation facilities to the satisfaction of the Health Inspector to the Council being at all times available for the use of the occupant.

(5) In the event of such sanitation facilities at any time ceasing to be so available then any permit granted under sub-clause (1) hereof shall be immediately cancelled on service on the holder of such permit of a notice under the signature of the Health Inspector that such facilities have ceased to be available.

5. Any person guilty of a wilful act or default contrary to this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of not less than £5 or more than £20 and to a further penalty of not more than £5 for each day of which such offence is continued after a conviction or order is made by any Court.

6. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the City of Springvale except such areas as are registered with the Council as camping areas under the provisions of section 221 of the *Health Act 1958*.

A By-law of the Shire of Lowan made under the provisions of the *Local Government Acts*, and numbered 61, for regulating the management, use and conduct of the Nhill Municipal Swimming Baths situated in Davis Park, Nhill.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Acts* and of any and every power it thereunto enabling, the President, Councillors and Ratepayers of the Shire of Lowan order as follows:—

1. By-law of the Shire of Lowan, made under the provisions of sections 197 and 604 of the *Local Government Act* 1915, and numbered 29, for—(a) the management of the Public Baths and swimming pool situated in the Citizens Park, Nhill, and all buildings, furniture, fittings, appliances and other property and effects used in connexion therewith, (b) preventing damage thereto and preserving good order and decency therein, (c) fixing the hours during which the same shall be available to the public and the amounts to be charged for admission thereto (d) imposing penalties for breach of such By-law is hereby repealed.

2. The baths shall be open to the public during such periods and such hours as the Council shall by resolution determine.

3. The Council or Committee of Management approved by the Council may at any time and from time to time close the baths or any part thereof for such period or periods as may be deemed necessary for the purpose of cleansing, repairing, rebuilding or reconstructing the same or for any other like purposes.

4. The attendant in charge of the baths may refuse admission thereto to any person.

5. No person shall enter the baths unless an attendant or authorized person is present.

6. Every person using the swimming baths shall wear a suitable bathing costume and the Committee or its authorized officer shall be the sole judge of the suitability of any costume.

7. No person shall dress or undress or remove any part of his or her bathing costume in any part of the baths open to public view or in or upon any part of the premises except places specifically reserved for such purpose.

8. No person shall expectorate on the concourse of the baths, on any lawns or in the dressing-rooms, compartments, passages or entrances thereto or in the vicinity of the kiosk, on the walls or on any sealed surface within the baths enclosure.

9. No person shall spit, spout water or blow his or her nose in any of the pools.

10. No person shall roll or throw stones or other articles into any of the pools.

11. No person shall loiter, misconduct himself or herself or commit a nuisance in the baths or bring rubbish filth or other offensive matter into the baths or deposit any rubbish therein, or leave therein any tins, bottles, broken glass, orange or other peel, papers, cast-off clothes or other litter except in receptacles provided for such purpose.

12. No person shall interfere with the use and enjoyment of the baths by any other person, and any person so acting or otherwise behaving in an unseemly or improper manner shall immediately leave the baths when requested so to do by the attendant in charge. Only one person shall stand on or dive from any diving board at the one time and no person other than the attendant in charge shall prevent any other person from using any diving board. No one shall use any diving board if the attendant in charge deems it dangerous for any such board to be used, and advises the person concerned either verbally or by a notice suitably displayed in the vicinity of such diving board or boards.

13. No person shall engage in boisterous or rough play or conduct within the baths enclosure.

14. Beach balls, motor tubes or other inflated rubber or plastic articles are not permitted in the main pool, except by permission of the attendant in charge. Toddlers may be permitted by the attendant in charge to take rubber toys in to the wading pool. Water polo may only be practised or played at times and by teams approved by the Committee of Management. No other ball games of any kind shall be permitted in the pools or the pool surrounds.

15. No person shall obstruct, hinder or interfere with the attendant in charge or any person employed at the baths or any officer of the Council or Committee of Management or duty lifesaver or approved swimming instructor in the performance of his or her duty thereat.

16. No person over the age of six years shall use the wading pool.

17. No person shall smoke within 10 feet of any pool in the premises.

18. No person shall at any time bring or introduce into the baths, or any part thereof, spirituous or other intoxicating liquors.

19. No person shall enter or remain in the baths whilst in a state of intoxication.

20. No person shall at any time while being in or upon the baths use indecent offensive or abusive language or behave in an indecent or offensive manner.

21. No person shall occupy the shower baths for an unreasonable time or enter any shower or water closet occupied by another person.

22. No person shall bring into or cause or allow any dog or other animal under his or her control to remain in the baths.

23. No person shall bring any bicycle into the baths enclosure.

24. No person shall use the baths whilst in an unclean condition or is suffering from any cutaneous, infectious or contagious disease and any such person shall retire from the baths upon being requested so to do by the attendant in charge at the baths.

25. No person shall enter the pool before first washing himself or herself in the shower bath and every bather after using the latrines or water closets shall wash under the showers without costume before entering or re-entering the pool.

26. No person unless authorized by the attendant in charge shall climb or attempt to climb over, into or upon or remain on or upon any fixture, fence, roof, building or structure.

27. No person shall use or interfere with any rope, raft, lifebuoy, or life-saving appliance or apparatus in the premises except in case of accident and danger occurring to a bather rendering their use necessary.

28. No person shall use any soap or other substance or preparation in any place or manner in the baths whereby any water in any pool may become discoloured or rendered turbid or unfit for the use of bathers. Approved soap is permitted for use in showers and at hand basins only.

29. No person shall damage deface or remove any placard or notice board within the baths.

30. No person shall foul or pollute the water in any of the pools or the shower baths, or wilfully or improperly soil or defile any towel or bathing costume or any shower, wall, closet or urinal, or any bath-room, dressing-room, compartment or any part of the baths or any furniture or article therein.

31. No person shall at any time carelessly or negligently break injure or interfere with any lock, tap or fitting used in connexion with the baths nor carelessly, negligently or wilfully damage or injure any furniture or fitting towel or any other article that may be in or upon the baths, or write upon or deface the walls or partitions or any other part of the baths.

32. No boy or girl under the age of six years who is unable to swim shall use the main pool without the permission of the attendant in charge unless accompanied by an adult or other person approved by the attendant in charge and no adult non-swimmer will enter the pool beyond his or her depth.

33. No child under the age of six years shall be permitted to enter the baths unless in the opinion of the attendant in charge such child is in the care of a responsible person.

34. No person other than a child under the age of four years under the care of a responsible person shall enter or use any dressing-room, shower or convenience or passages leading thereto which have been appointed or appropriated for the use of persons of the opposite sex.

35. No unauthorized person shall enter the plant room, its enclosure or any storeroom within the baths enclosure.

36. No person shall hawk or sell or offer for sale in the baths any goods or articles or services without having first obtained permission in writing from the Council or the Committee of Management.

37. Any person hiring any article from an attendant at the baths shall return the same to the attendant in charge prior to leaving the premises.

38. Neither the Council, the Committee of Management nor their officers or employees shall be responsible for any article lost by or stolen from any person admitted to the baths.

39. Any person finding any article in the baths shall immediately thereafter deliver same to the attendant in charge who shall thereupon register a description of same and all particulars relating thereto in a book to be kept for that purpose and upon any person losing such article giving satisfactory proof of loss the attendant in charge shall deliver the same to such last-mentioned person after entering the names and address of that person in the same book and obtaining therein his or her signature therefor.

40. Every person not being the holder of a seasonal or monthly ticket shall before entering the baths pay to the person authorized for that purpose the price fixed from time to time for admission to the baths.

41. No seasonal or monthly ticket shall be transferable and any holder of such a ticket who allows any other person to use the same shall immediately forfeit such ticket and all moneys paid thereon and the rights and privileges given by such ticket.

42. The attendant in charge or other person duly authorized by the Committee of Management may charge every person entering the baths the proper fees as set out hereunder or as shall be varied or determined by Resolution of Council from time to time.

CHARGES.

From the 1st day of November in each year to the 30th day of April in the following year or such other period as the Council may from time to time determine the Schedule of Charges as set out hereunder shall apply:—

Single Admission—

Adult Bathers—1s.

Children (under 15 years) and full-time students under 21 years—6d.

Adult Spectators—6d.

Season Tickets—

Adults—£2.

PRESENT.

His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria.

Mr. Porter | Mr. Thompson.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Business Names Act 1962*, and all other powers in that behalf him thereunto enabling, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulations:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Business Names Regulations, 1962. Citation.
2. These Regulations shall come into operation on the commencement of the *Business Names Act 1962*. Commencement.
3. (1) The Regulations made pursuant to the provisions of section 19 of the *Business Names Act 1928*, section 4 of the *Registrar-General's Fees Act 1956* and the provisions of section 19 of the *Business Names Act 1958*, are hereby repealed. Repeal and savings. G.G. 4.8.1931. G.G. 14.11.1956. G.G. 9.9.1959.
- (2) The repeal effected by sub-regulation (1) of this regulation does not—
 - (a) affect the operation before the coming into operation of these regulations of any of the regulations so repealed;
 - (b) alter the past or future effect of the doing, suffering or omission of anything before the coming into operation of these Regulations;
 - (c) affect any registration, statement, particulars, certificate, cancellation, correction or decision made, filed, granted or issued under or by virtue of any of the Regulations so repealed;
 - (d) affect any estate, right, title, interest, privilege, power, duty, obligation, liability, charge or penalty created, acquired, accrued, exercisable, incurred or imposed by or under, or liable to be imposed under, any of the Regulations so repealed;
 - (e) affect any notice, order or direction, or any proceeding, matter, or thing presented, made, held, given, published, declared or done under any of the Regulations so repealed; or

(f) affect any legal or other proceeding commenced before or after the coming into operation of these Regulations in respect of any of the matters or things mentioned in paragraphs (a) to (e) of this sub-regulation.

(3) All matters and things mentioned in sub-regulation (2) of this Regulation, to the extent that they were respectively in force immediately before the coming into operation of these Regulations, are preserved and continued, and declared to be of the same force and effect as if these Regulations had been in force when they were respectively done, suffered, omitted, made, filed, granted, issued, created, acquired, incurred, imposed, presented, held, given, published, declared or accrued or become exercisable, or liable to be imposed, and they respectively had been done, suffered, omitted, made, filed, granted, issued, created, acquired, incurred, imposed, presented, held, given, published, declared, or had accrued, or become exercisable, or liable to be imposed, under these Regulations.

Definition. 4. In these Regulations, "the Act" means the *Business Names Act* 1962.

Forms. 5. (1) Subject to these Regulations, where a provision of the Act is specified in the first column of the First Schedule to these Regulations, the form set out in the Second Schedule to these Regulations the number of which is specified in the third column of the First Schedule opposite to that provision is prescribed as the form to be used for the purposes of that provision in relation to the matter or thing described in the second column of the First Schedule opposite to that provision.

(2) Strict compliance with the forms contained in the Second Schedule to these Regulations is not necessary, and substantial compliance is sufficient.

Particulars prescribed by forms. 6. Where a form prescribed by these Regulations requires completion by the insertion of particulars or other matters referred to in the form, those particulars or other matters are prescribed as the particulars or other matters required under the provision of the Act for the purposes for which the form is prescribed.

Directions in forms. 7. A form prescribed by these Regulations and containing any directions for its completion shall be completed in accordance with such directions.

General requirements for documents lodged with Registrar. 8. A document to be lodged for registration with the Registrar in pursuance of the Act or these Regulations shall comply with the following requirements:—

- (a) The document shall be on paper of medium weight and good quality and of foolscap folio size;
- (b) the document shall be printed, typewritten or handwritten and shall be clearly legible;
- (c) the document shall not be a carbon copy;
- (d) when the document comprises two or more sheets, the sheets shall be bound together securely; and
- (e) the document shall be folded lengthwise and, as so folded, shall have endorsed on the outside—
 - (i) on the upper left-hand corner the registered number (if any) allotted by the Registrar to the business name to which the document relates;
 - (ii) the business name to which the document relates;
 - (iii) the title of the document being the same as the heading to the form;
 - (iv) the name, address and telephone number of the solicitor or other person by, or on whose behalf, the document is lodged; and
 - (v) the following words:—
 - "Lodged in the office of the Registrar of Companies on
 - Assistant Registrar of Companies."

9. An application under section 9 (1) of the Act for the consent of the Minister to the registration of a business name shall be lodged with the Registrar.

10. The fees set out in the Third Schedule to these Regulations shall be paid to the Registrar for the several matters referred to in such Schedule.
