NOTICE OF INTENTION TO VARY A PROCLAMATION PROHIBITING FISHING IN CERTAIN WATERS.

IT is hereby notified for general information that it is intended, after the expiration of one month from the date of publication of this notice in the *Government Gazette* to move His Excellency the Governor in Council to make a Proclamation varying the Proclamation made on the nineteenth day of October, 1954, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the twenty-seventh day of October, 1954, as amended from time to time, relating to the prohibition of fishing in certain waters, as follows:—

1. In section "B"—

- (a) After the words "Back Creek and its tributaries" in the words set opposite "Bunyiip River (including Main Drain)" there shall be inserted the words "nor Ararat Creek above or upstream from the bridge over such creek on the Princes Highway".
- (b) For the words "Riversdale Bridge at Alexandra" in the words set opposite "Goulburn River" there shall be substituted the words "bridge over such river on the Hume Highway at Seymour".
- (c) After the word "Laharum" in the words set opposite "Mackenzie River" there shall be inserted the words "but not including Wartook Reservoir".

(d) After the words—

"Tarwin River above or upstream from the bridge over such river on the South Gippsland Highway"

there shall be inserted the following words—

"Tullaroop or above or upstream from its Deep Creek junction with the Loddon River".

- (e) In the "Reservoirs" column after the word "Harcourt" there shall be added the word "Konongwootong".
- (f) In the "Dams and Lagoons" column there shall be inserted—
- (i) "Hepburn or Anderson's Lagoon", and
- (ii) "Russel's Dam".
- (g) In the "Lakes" column after the word "Kerford" there shall be added the words "Learmonth, but not including Morton's Cutting which is closed to all fishing during the whole year".
- (h) In the "Lakes" column the word "Pine" is hereby deleted.

2. In section "C" the following words are hereby deleted:—

- (i) "Hepburn or Anderson's Lagoon"
- (ii) "Konongwootong Reservoir"
- (iii) "Lake Learmonth but not including Morton's Cutting which is closed to all fishing during the whole year"
- (iv) "Russel's Dam"
- (v) "Tullaroop or Deep Creek above or upstream from its junction with the Loddon River".

THE MELBOURNE HARBOR TRUST COMMISSIONERS.

REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the *Melbourne Harbor Trust Act 1958*, the Melbourne Harbor Trust Commissioners make the following Regulations:—

1. The Regulations made by the Commissioners on the 8th August, 1956, approved by the Governor in Council on 4th September, 1956, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 17th September, 1956, and any amendment thereto, are hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Regulations".

2. Regulation 145 of the Principal Regulations is hereby repealed and the following Regulation 145 substituted therefor:—

145. (1) Any goods received by the Commissioners into any store or upon any land owned by, in the possession of, or under the control of the Commissioners within the Port or elsewhere either at the request of the owner of the goods or some other person having possession thereof or because they have been removed by the Commissioners or the Harbor Master in accordance with Regulations 143, 143A or 144 from a wharf or any area of land which by Resolution of the Commissioners is annexed to a wharf shall be stored therein or thereon at the risk of the owner and the owner or any person making the request as aforesaid shall pay to the Commissioners—

(a) in respect of any goods so received by the Commissioners ex rail trucks into their No. 13 Store situate at Dudley-street, West Melbourne:—

(i) For receiving and delivering the said goods—the sum of Five shillings per quarter ton; and

(ii) for the storage of the said goods—the sum of Four pence halfpenny per quarter ton for the first week and for every subsequent week the sum of Four pence halfpenny per quarter ton additional to the amount per quarter ton payable for the week, immediately preceding, that is to say, Nine pence per quarter ton for the second week and One shilling one penny halfpenny per quarter ton for the third week and so on.

(b) In respect of any other goods so received by the Commissioners:—

(i) For receiving and delivering the said goods—the sum of Four shillings per quarter ton; and

(ii) for the storage of the said goods—the sum of Four pence per quarter ton for the first week and for every subsequent week the sum of Four pence per quarter ton additional to the amount per quarter ton payable for the week immediately preceding, that is to say Eight pence per quarter ton for the second week, One shilling per quarter ton for the third week and so on.

(2) For the purposes of this Regulation a fraction of one-quarter ton shall be deemed one-quarter ton.

(3) If in the opinion of the Commissioners the circumstances of any such storage of goods warrant a reduction of the said charges, then the Commissioners may, if they think fit, on the application of the owner, grant a refund of such part of the storage fees paid under the Regulation as exceeds the rate of Four pence per quarter ton per week or Four pence halfpenny per quarter ton per week as the case may be. The Commissioners may require a statutory declaration verifying the facts of the case by such person or persons as they shall think proper.

Legal Profession Practice Act 1958.

SOLICITORS (AUDIT AND PRACTISING CERTIFICATES) RULES.

PURSUANT to section 88 of the *Legal Profession Practice Act 1958* and all other provisions in that behalf enabling, the Council of the Law Institute of Victoria doth hereby make the following Rules of the Institute (that is to say):—

1. These Rules may be cited as the Solicitors (Audit and Practising Certificates) Rules 1962 and shall be read and construed with the Solicitors (Audit and Practising Certificates) Rules 1960 and all other Rules amending the same, all of which Rules and these Rules may be cited as the Solicitors (Audit and Practising Certificates) Rules.

2. These Rules shall come into operation on their publication in the *Victoria Government Gazette*.

3. Rule 39 is amended—

(a) by adding at the end of paragraph (f) the words “ where the draft, postal note, money order or cheque is properly dealt with by the solicitor otherwise than by payment to his trust bank account or the trust bank account of the firm of which he is member;” and

(b) by adding at the end of the rule the following paragraph:—

“(h) moneys received by the solicitor by way of interest, dividends or the like from any company whose shares, stock, notes or debentures are listed on any Stock Exchange in Australia.”.

4. Rule 40 is amended by substituting the word and letters “ (g) and (h) ” for the word and letter “ and (g) ”.

5. (a) Rule 46 is amended by substituting in paragraph (b) the words and figures “ the sum of £10 ” for the words and figures “ the sum of £7 10s.”.

(b) The amendment effected by this Rule shall relate to all applications for practising certificates for a period commencing on or after the 1st day of January, 1963, and the provisions of Rule 46 in force immediately prior to the commencement of these Rules shall nevertheless continue in operation in relation to any application for a practising certificate for a period which will expire on the 31st day of December, 1962.

MOTOR CAR TRIALS OF SPEED AT EASTERN BEACH, GEELONG.

- (2) that onlookers be confined to the lawns above the wall on the south side of the footpath on the south side of the boulevard and that where the wall terminates at the intersection of Bellerine-street the line of the wall be continued with barricades across Bellerine-street to Transvaal-square;
- (3) that an adequate number of bales of straw be placed in front of the barricades at the intersection of Bellerine-street and also along the roadway at the eastern boundary of Transvaal-square where Ritchie-boulevard joins Victoria-terrace;
- (4) that officials be placed at frequent intervals on the north side of Ritchie-boulevard at the "pits" at the intersection of Bellerine-street and at the "run-off" in Victoria-terrace;
- (5) that the western limit of the "run-off" be protected with bales of straw;
- (6) that the officer in charge of police in attendance is satisfied that such highway is in a satisfactory condition for racing purposes and that adequate arrangements have been made for the safety of the public.

REGULATIONS.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Police Regulation Act 1958*, doth hereby further amend the Police Regulations 1957, as follows (that is to say):—

1. For Regulation 94A there shall be substituted the following regulation:—

"94A. Every member of the Force (including a Junior Police Trainee) who, with the consent of the Chief Commissioner of Police, is undertaking a special training course at the University of Melbourne or some other institution or in the case of a Junior Police Trainee other approved courses of study shall as a condition of tenure of such course and together with a surety enter into an agreement in the form of or to the effect of the form of agreement in the Twenty-fourth Schedule or Twenty-fifth Schedule (as the case may be)."
2. In Part XIII., after the heading "Transfers", there shall be inserted the following regulation:—

"251. In this Part, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—

'Government quarters' means living quarters which are owned or leased by the Crown, are part of or adjacent to a Police Station and which for the greater security and continuous operation of a Station are required by the Chief Commissioner to be occupied by a member for the performance of his duties on a station.

'Government premises' means living accommodation, other than Government quarters, which is owned or leased by the Crown for use by a member of the Force appointed to a particular vacancy in a District, Division or Sub-District and which, in the opinion of the Chief Commissioner, the member selected or nominated for transfer to fill that particular vacancy should occupy in order to discharge his duties efficiently."
3. Regulations 251, 252, 253, 254, 255, 256 and 257 shall be renumbered 252, 253 (1), 254 (1), 255, 256, 257 and 258 respectively.
4. After sub-regulation (1) of Regulation 253 there shall be inserted the following sub-regulations:—

"(2) Where Government quarters are advertised as available for occupation by the member selected or nominated to fill an advertised vacancy, such appointment will be conditional on the member entering into occupation of such quarters.

(3) Where Government premises are available for occupation by the member selected or nominated for transfer to fill an advertised vacancy,

such transfer shall, if the Chief Commissioner so directs, involve occupation of such premises by the member who shall pay the rental for such premises as is fixed by the Police Classification Board."

5. Regulation 254 shall be amended as follows:—

(a) At the end of sub-regulation (2) there shall be added the following words:—

"Where Government quarters or Government premises are available for occupation by a member appointed to the vacancy a statement to that effect shall be included in the advertisement."

(b) In paragraph (c) of sub-regulation (3) after the words "Government quarters" there shall be inserted the words "or Government premises".

6. After the Twenty-fourth Schedule there shall be added the Twenty-fifth Schedule.

Whereas the Chief Commissioner of Police has consented to the trainee undertaking a special training course or other approved course of study:

And whereas the trainee and the surety have requested the Minister—

(a) to pay on behalf of the trainee the tuition fees charged in respect of the trainee by the _____ during the period of such course;

(b) to continue to pay to the trainee whilst he is undergoing such course the salary applicable to him as a Junior Police Trainee—

both of which the Minister has agreed to do.

Now these presents witness that in consideration of the premises the trainee and the surety do hereby for themselves and their respective executors and administrators and also as separate covenants each of them doth hereby for himself his executors and administrators covenant with the Minister in the manner following, that is to say:—

1. That the trainee will apply himself diligently to the course of study provided and will not relinquish or discontinue such course without the consent, in writing, of the Minister first had and obtained, and will for a period (hereinafter called "the period") of three years from the date of completion by him of the course remain in the said Victoria Police Force and perform such duties as may be assigned to him under and in pursuance of any Act or Regulation for the time being in force relating to the Police Force. Provided that in computing the said period any leave of absence (other than for annual recreation leave) granted to the trainee at any time or times after the commencement of such period shall not be reckoned as part thereof.

2. That in the event of—

(a) the termination of the services of the trainee by any cause whatever other than death or physical or mental incapacity to perform his duties—

(i) at any time during the period of the course; or

(ii) after the completion of the course but before the expiration of the period;

(b) the failure of the trainee to make satisfactory progress in the course by reason of his own misconduct or neglect or from causes lying within his own powers (and the Minister shall be the sole judge as to whether or not a failure due to any such cause has occurred); or

(c) any relinquishment or discontinuance of the course by the trainee without the consent of the Minister—the trainee and the surety or one of them will forthwith on demand pay or cause to be paid to the Minister—

(1) an amount equal to the total amount of—

(i) the salary and allowances paid to the trainee whilst he was undergoing the course; and

(ii) the tuition fees paid on behalf of the trainee to the _____; or

(2) the sum of Two hundred and fifty pounds, whichever sum is the lesser: Provided that in the event of the termination of the services of the trainee after the completion of the course but before the expiration of the period aforesaid, the total amount payable to the Minister under this clause may with the approval of the Minister be proportionately reduced in consideration of each completed period of three months' service as a trainee or a member of the Victoria Police Force served after the completion of the course: Provided further that in calculating the amount of the salary and allowances paid to the trainee whilst undergoing the course there shall not be taken into account any payments made to him in respect of any period or periods during which he performed duties as a member of the Police Force.

3. That the liability of the surety his executors or administrators hereunder shall not be in any way released or discharged by reason of any time or other indulgence which the Minister may in his absolute discretion grant to the trainee whereby the time or mode of payment by the trainee of the whole or any portion of the moneys referred to in clause 2 of the Agreement may be extended or altered.

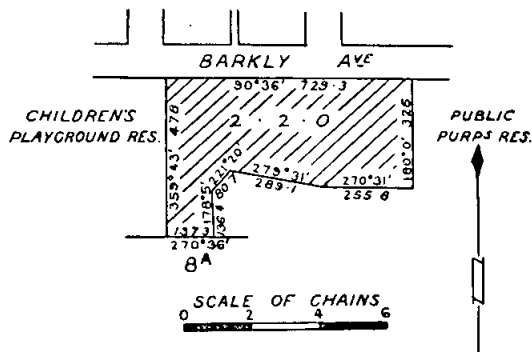

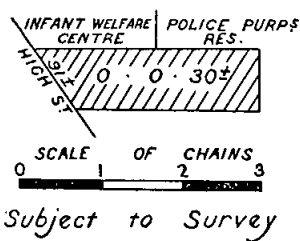

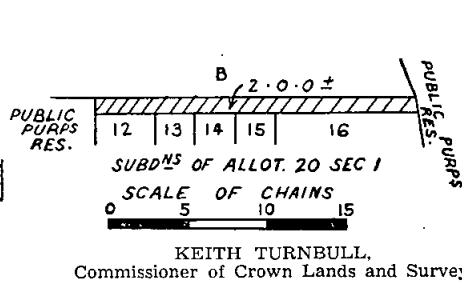

Any such notice may be signed by the Town Clerk or any other duly authorized officer of the municipality.

If any such owner or occupier shall within the time limited by such notice fail to comply with the requirements thereof the Council may take such measures as may be reasonably necessary to destroy such noxious weeds at the expense of such owner or occupier and may recover the cost thereof from such owner or occupier as a civil debt recoverable summarily.

3. In this By-law, the words "noxious weeds" shall mean and include the following weeds, which weeds are hereby declared to be noxious weeds:—

(a) The owners or occupiers of houses or buildings shall on the gate or gate-post or in such other conspicuous position as the Council determines mark such houses or buildings with such numbers and names for the purpose of distinguishing the same as the Council may from time to time direct or approve.

(b) The owners or occupiers of buildings in which there are two or more separate dwellings shall, on the front door of each such separate dwelling or in such other conspicuous position as the Council determines mark with such numbers for the purpose of distinguishing the same as the Council may from time to time direct or approve.

(c) Such owners or occupiers shall renew the numbers or names of such houses, buildings or separate dwellings as often as they are obliterated or defaced.

(d) If any owner or occupier of any such house, building or separate dwelling neglects for one week after notice to him from the Council to mark such house, building or separate dwelling with such number or name as the Council may direct or approve or to renew the number or name thereof as aforesaid he shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Forty shillings, and the Council may cause such number or name to be so marked or renewed and recover the expense thereof from the owner or occupier of such house, building or separate dwelling before any justice, and where such expense is paid by or recovered from the occupier he may deduct the same from any rent payable by him to the owner.

4. At every meeting of the Council the first business thereof shall be—

(a) if a copy of the minutes of the preceding meeting shall have been delivered to each councillor at least two days before such meeting the putting a question for the confirmation of such minutes;

(b) if a copy of the minutes of such preceding meeting have not been so delivered the reading and putting a question for the confirmation of such minutes;

and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings, and the said minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting shall then be signed as by this act required.

5. The mover of every original proposition at any Council meeting, but not of any amendment shall (if he has not spoken on any amendment proposed to such original proposition) have a right of reply to be exercised at the conclusion of the debate (including debate on any such amendment), but save as aforesaid no Councillor shall be allowed to speak more than once on the same question unless permission be given to explain or unless for the purpose of calling the attention of the Chair to a point of order. For the purpose of this clause a proposition shall be deemed to be an original proposition even although any amendment thereto has been carried.

6. Every petition presented to the Council shall be in writing (other than in pencil), typing or printing, and shall contain the prayer of the petitioners at the end thereof, and shall be signed by at least one petitioner on every sheet on which it is written.

7. The corporate seal shall not be affixed to any document unless the Town Clerk or Acting Town Clerk is present.

8. Any one or more of the rules or Regulations in clauses 4, 5, 6 and 7 of this By-law or in those provisions of Part XI. of the said Fifteenth Schedule hereby adopted (including clauses 49 and 50 of Part XI. of the said Fifteenth Schedule) may be suspended for a particular purpose on notice of motion duly given or (without notice of motion) by a unanimous vote of the whole of the Councillors present at the meeting.

9. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.
