PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of the State of Victoria intituled the *Justices Act 1958*, it is provided in sub-section (2) of section 24 thereof that the Governor in Council may by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* specify municipal districts for the purpose of section 24 of the said Act: And whereas it is considered desirable that the municipal districts named in the Schedule hereto be so specified: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the said State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this my Proclamation hereby specify for the purpose of the said section 24 of the said Act the municipal districts whose names appear in the said Schedule to take effect as on and from the 10th September, 1962.

MALDON SHIRE COMMON DIMINISHED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Division 12 of Part I. of the *Land Act 1958* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time increase, and, after one month's notice in the *Government Gazette*, diminish, alter, or abolish any common, and may from time to time re-proclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of the said Part of the said Act, and that nothing therein contained shall prevent the exercise of the powers conferred by the said Part of the said Act with respect to the leasing or licensing of any land comprised in any common: And whereas notice of the intention to diminish the Maldon Shire Common has been duly published in the *Government Gazette* for one month:

Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby diminish the Maldon Shire Common by deducting therefrom the portion in the Township of Maldon containing 1 acre 1 rood 30 perches more or less and the portion in the Parish of Maldon containing 4 acres 2 roods 20 perches more or less as indicated by hachure on plan published in the *Government Gazette* of 6th June, 1962.—(Rs. 353).

AMENDMENT OF THE SIXTH SCHEDULE.

PROCLAMATION

BY virtue of the powers conferred by section thirty-nine of the *Poisons Act 1958* and all other powers enabling me in that behalf I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation amend the Sixth Schedule to the *Poisons Act 1958*—

1. By adding to paragraph (1) the following items:—

NORACYMETHADOL-alpha-3-acetoxy-6-methylamino-4, 4-diphenylheptane
METHADONE-Intermediate 4-cyano-2-2-dimethylamino-4, 4-diphenylbutane
PETHIDINE-Intermediate-A 4-cyano-1-methyl-4-phenylpiperidine
PETHIDINE-Intermediate-B 4-phenylpiperidine-4-carboxylic acid ethyl ester
MORAMIDE-Intermediate 2-methyl-3-morpholino-1, 1-diphenylpropanecarboxylic acid;

2. By adding to paragraph 2 of the said Schedule after the words "sulphonamide derivatives", in the item relating to anti-diabetic substances, the words "or diguanide derivatives."

and declare that Division 2 of Part III. of the *Poisons Act 1958* shall apply to the said substances in the same manner as it applies to the substances and preparations already listed in the said Schedule.

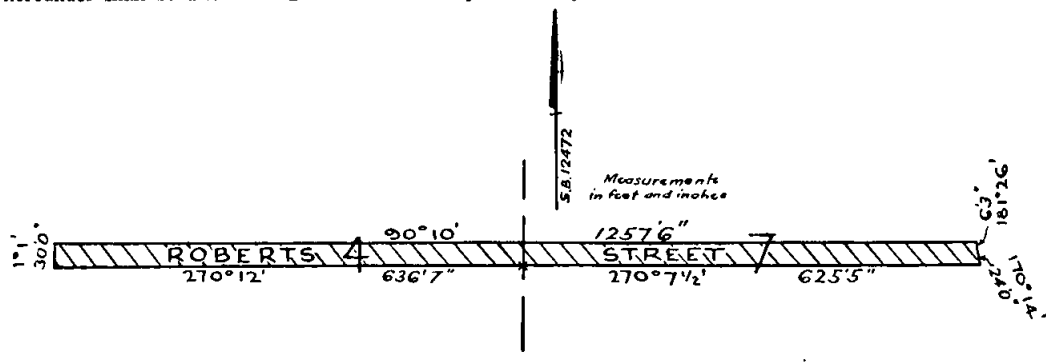

WHEREAS the Parliament of Victoria stands adjourned until such day and hour as may be fixed by the President of the Legislative Council and the Speaker of the Legislative Assembly respectively: Now I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, do by this my Proclamation prorogue the said Parliament of Victoria until Wednesday, the fifth day of September, 1962, and I do hereby fix Wednesday, the fifth day of September, 1962, aforesaid, at the hour of half-past Two o'clock in the afternoon, as the time for the commencement and holding of the next Session of the said Parliament of Victoria, for the despatch of business, in the Parliament Houses, situate in Spring-street, in the City of Melbourne: And the Honourable the Members of the Legislative Council and the Members of the Legislative Assembly are hereby required to give their attendance at the said time and place accordingly.
