COUNTRY ROADS BOARD.

BY-LAW NO. 11 REGULATING PEDESTRIANS AND BICYCLISTS ON THE FRANKSTON BY-PASS ROAD.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Country Roads Act 1958*, the Country Roads Board hereby makes the following By-laws (that is to say):—

1. These By-laws may be cited as the "Frankston By-pass Road By-laws 1962" and shall come into operation upon the date of publication thereof in the *Government Gazette*.

2. In these By-laws unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter:—

"Board" means the Country Roads Board.

"Bicycle" means any device having two wheels in tandem capable of being propelled by a person riding thereon.

"Bicyclist" means any person in charge of a bicycle whether that bicycle is being ridden wheeled carried or moved in any other way.

"Pedestrian" means any person on foot or on a toy vehicle or in a perambulator.

3. (1) Except as hereinafter provided in sub-sections 2 or 3 of this By-law the Frankston by-pass road shall not be used by any pedestrian.

(2) A pedestrian may enter or remain upon the Frankston by-pass road if—

(a) he receives the prior written consent of the Board to use that road; and

(b) he complies with all the conditions that may be set forth by the Board when granting that consent with respect to the permitted points of entry on to and exit from such road, the route to be followed and any limitation as to the period of time or the times of day when that consent shall apply;

(c) he is engaged on road construction and maintenance works on the by-pass road.

(3) A pedestrian may enter or remain upon the Frankston by-pass road for the purpose of crossing the by-pass road by the shortest and most direct route between points of access for the time being authorized by the Board at each side of the by-pass road at Raymond-street. This clause does not imply exemption from any of the requirements normally required of a person when upon or in the vicinity of any carriageway.

4. (1) Except as hereinafter provided in this By-law the Frankston by-pass road shall not be used by any bicyclist.

(2) A bicycle may be carried on the Frankston by-pass road if it is conveyed in or on a vehicle that is permitted to use that road.

(3) A bicyclist may enter or remain upon the Frankston by-pass road if—

(a) he receives the prior written consent of the Board to use that road; and

(b) he complies with all the conditions that may be set forth by the Board when granting that consent with respect to the permitted points of entry on to and exit from such road, the route to be followed and any limitation as to the period of time or the times of day when that consent shall apply.

(4) Every person who uses the Frankston by-pass road in contravention of or without complying with the provisions or any condition made by the Board pursuant to the provisions of By-law 3 or of By-law 4 of these By-laws shall be guilty of an offence against these By-laws and shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Fifty pounds.

NOTICE OF FIXING NEW ALIGNMENTS OF DANDENONG-FRANKSTON ROAD IN THE CITY OF SPRINGVALE AND THE SHIRES OF CRANBOURNE AND FRANKSTON.

The charge for water supplied to any property not rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at Two shillings per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in cases where water is so supplied is hereby fixed at 1,000 gallons.

The charge for water supplied by measure shall be payable on demand, at the office of the Trust in Chiltern.

- (a) (1) Where the Authority designs the work and has same carried out for the owner, a charge shall be made equal to 10 per centum (10 per cent.) on the capital cost of the work for designing, specifying, letting contract, and supervising all details in connexion with such work.
- (2) Consent for additions to and/or amendments of approved plans or to work previously approved will be made only on application of the owner or his authorized agent, and on payment of a fee of One pound (£1).
- (b) When the Authority designs the work for the owner and the owner then carries out his own work—
- (1) For plan of design, a fee of Four pounds (£4), plus Ten shillings (10s.) for each fitting.
- (2) For making and/or examining any alterations or additions to a plan previously issued or approved by the Engineer, a fee of One pound (£1) shall be made by the Authority for each fitting or drain altered or added.
- (3) For inspecting drains and testing by the Authority's inspector, a fee of Two pounds (£2) plus One pound (£1) for each additional inspection necessary owing to faulty work.
- (4) For inspecting plumbing by the Authority's inspector, a fee of Two pounds (£2) for each ten (10) fittings in the installation plus One pound (£1) for each additional inspection necessary owing to faulty work.

The house connexion will not be passed until the installation, together with the amendments ordered, have been completed to the Engineer's satisfaction.

(c) Where an owner designs and carries out his own work—

- (1) For the supply of a block plan, a fee of Ten shillings (10s.).
For tenements exceeding 4,000 square feet in ground floor area and/or properties exceeding 2 acres in extent, an additional fee of Ten shillings (10s.) shall be charged for each additional 4,000 square feet, or part thereof, and/or for each additional 2 acres, or part thereof.
- (2) The owner shall submit for examination a properly drawn design on tracing cloth or good quality paper and a type-written specification. The design and specification shall be supplied to the Authority in triplicate. The work shall not proceed until the owner's design and specification have been approved by the Engineer and the third copy returned to him with the official endorsement.
- (3) For the examination of the owner's plan of design and specification, a fee of Two pounds (£2) for each plan of from one to five fittings, plus Ten shillings (10s.) for every fitting over five.
- (4) For examining any alterations or additions to a plan previously issued or approved by the Engineer, a fee of Ten shillings (10s.) shall be made to the Authority for each fitting or drain altered or added.
- (5) For inspecting drains and testing by the Authority's inspector, a fee of Two pounds (£2) plus One pound (£1) for each additional inspection necessary owing to faulty work.
- (6) For inspecting plumbing by the Authority's inspector, a fee of Two pounds (£2) for each ten (10) fittings or part of ten fittings in the installation plus One pound (£1) for each additional inspection necessary owing to faulty work.
- (7) For the final inspection of the Authority's Engineer and charting work on the Authority's plans, a fee of Two pounds (£2) for each ten fittings or part of ten fittings in the installation plus One pound (£1) for each additional inspection necessary owing to faulty work.
- (8) The Engineer may during construction of the work order the owner to carry out such additions and/or amendments as may be necessary for the satisfactory completion of the work. (d) Where an owner has elected one or other of the methods set out in sub-sections (a), (b), or (c) above, but subsequently desires to adopt another of such methods he may do so provided that no contract has been let for the work and that he pays to the Authority the following fees, which shall be additional to fees which will become due in respect of the newly-adopted method:—

- (1) Where the change is from the method set out in sub-section (a), a fee of £10 shall be charged.
- (2) Where the change is from the method set out in the sub-section (b), the fees prescribed in sub-section (b) (1) and (b) (2).
- (3) Where the change is from the method set out in sub-section (c) the fees prescribed in sub-sections (c) (1), (c) (3) and (c) (4).

2. Section 9 of By-law No. 1 is hereby repealed.

ROAD DISCONTINUED—CITY OF FOOTSCRAY.

ORDER APPROVING THE WIDENING OF AN EXISTING MAIN ROAD IN THE SHIRE OF DONCASTER AND TEMPLESTOWE.

WHEREAS:

I. Section 114 of the *Country Roads Act* 1958 (herein called "the Act") provides (*inter alia*) in—

- (a) sub-section (1) thereof that the powers conferred upon municipal councils by Division 14 of Part XIX of the *Local Government Act* 1958 shall so far as applicable be conferred upon the Country Roads Board (herein called "the Board") so far as relates to the declaration of the alignment the widening and opening up of main roads and that the provisions of the said Division shall with certain modifications extend and apply accordingly;

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "TALLANGATTA SHOW-GROUNDS AND RECREATION RESERVE."

WHEREAS by section 218 of the *Land Act 1958* power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the Land Acts for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works in pursuance of the power conferred aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land in the Parish of Beethang temporarily reserved by Order in Council dated the 14th November, 1961, as a site for Showgrounds and Public Recreation, known as the "Tallangatta Showgrounds and Recreation Reserve" hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve."

The Reserve has been placed under control of a Committee of Management with full power and authority to enforce these Regulations.

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public for cricket or football matches, agricultural shows, fêtes, sports, or holiday or other amusements, on any of which occasions a charge not exceeding Thirty shillings may be made for the admission of each adult to the Reserve.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein, except in the fireplaces provided for the purpose.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.

5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord without the permission of the Committee of Management first obtained, in writing.

7. No person shall camp in the Reserve, except in the part or parts thereof which are set apart for such purposes by the Committee of Management, and then only on the payment of such fee and subject to such conditions as are determined by such Committee.

8. (a) No person shall erect therein any building, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

(b) No person or organization shall erect any building therein for any purpose whatsoever without first obtaining, in writing, the permission of the Committee of Management.

9. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

10. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.

11. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any cricket or football matches, agricultural shows, fêtes, sports, or holiday or other amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Fifty pounds (£50) by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee, in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

12. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

13. No person shall bring into the Reserve or use or carry therein any firearm or offensive weapon.

14. No person shall leave or deposit any glass, paper, litter, or rubbish in the Reserve, except in a place provided for the purpose and indicated by notice-board.

15. Any person committing on any part of the Reserve or in any of the rooms, buildings, structures, erections, or enclosures for the time being thereon any of the following offences shall be guilty of breach of these Regulations:—

(a) Assaulting or threatening any person or persons.

(b) Being under the influence of liquor.

(c) Entering, crossing, being on, or trespassing on any playing-ground area, enclosure, or course, or building, room, or structure, or any part thereof, whilst any sport, game, competition, race, entertainment, or amusement is being played, conducted, or carried on, or at any time between the commencement and conclusion of such event without the consent of the Committee of Management.

(d) Using profane, indecent, obscene, or unseemly language.

(e) Using threatening, abusive, offensive, or insulting words.

(f) Behaving improperly, offensively, or riotously.

(g) Interfering with or interrupting any game, sports, competition, entertainment, or amusement or practice thereat.

(h) Obtaining or attempting to obtain admission to any part of the Reserve when not entitled to admission under these Regulations.

16. No person shall—

(a) remain in the Reserve who behaves in a disorderly, unseemly, or offensive manner, or creates or takes part in any disturbance;

(b) enter or remain in the Reserve whilst in a state of intoxication;

(c) bring any intoxicating liquor on to the Reserve without the consent of the Committee of Management first obtained.

17. No person shall on any portion of the Reserve cause or permit any outcry, sound, or noise to be emitted from an amplifier, loud speaker, public address system, or like instrument without first obtaining the written permission of the Committee of Management, and such permission may be granted subject to such terms, conditions, and restrictions as may be imposed by the Committee of Management.

18. No person shall carry on the business or calling of a bookmaker, except in and upon such portions of the Reserve as may be set aside for that purpose, and then only when he shall—

(a) have obtained the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management on payment of a fee not to exceed Five pounds (£5) for any meeting or sporting event held in the Reserve; and

(b) that during the time he shall be in or upon the Reserve carrying on the business or calling of a bookmaker he shall wear a ticket or have a bag, either of which shall be visible to the public and shall have thereon his name.—(Rs.8090.)

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "BONEGILLA CAMPING RESERVE".

WHEREAS by section 218 of the *Land Act 1958* power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the Land Acts for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees,

and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works in pursuance of the power conferred aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the reserved Crown land in the Parish of Bonegilla shown bordered red on plan B/10-8-62 attached to Lands Department correspondence Rs.4742, and known as the "Bonegilla Camping Reserve" (hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve").

The Reserve has been placed under control of the Council of the Shire of Wodonga, as a Committee of Management, with full power and authority to enforce these Regulations.

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public free of charge from sunrise to sunset, except on such days (not exceeding 26 in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports or holiday amusements on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Two shillings may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.
2. No person shall—
 - (a) enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language or conduct and for maintaining good order in the Reserve, the Committee of Management or its employees may refuse any person admission to the Reserve or any structure therein;
 - (b) climb or jump over the gates, fences, seats, tables, signboards, building equipment, notices, fittings or other improvements in or around the Reserve, nor stick therein or thereon any bills or in any way injure, damage, deface, write or paint on or otherwise mark any rocks, gates, fences, seats, tables, buildings, equipment, notices, signboards, or other improvements, structure or fittings therein or thereon, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein; or
 - (c) remove or displace any board, plate or fitting or written or printed notice for the exhibition of any Regulations or notice fixed or set up by the Committee of Management in the Reserve.
3. Every person shall exercise reasonable and proper care in the use of any portion of the Reserve, dressing rooms, conveniences or appurtenances therein.
4. No person shall, without the consent of the Committee of Management light any fire in the Reserve, except in the place set apart by the Committee or as indicated by the Curator for the purpose. No such fire shall be left burning or unattended, and before lighting such fire such person shall make provision for extinguishing the same either by water or loose earth. Every person whilst in the Reserve shall take special precautions against the risk of fire.
5. No person shall play, practise or engage in any game or sport in the Reserve at any time without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained, and then only subject to such conditions as the Committee thinks fit.
6. All fees prescribed herein shall be paid to the Curator or other authorized officer on demand.
7. No person shall camp in the Reserve except in such places as shall from time to time be set apart, and then only with the permission, in writing, of the Committee, and subject to the supervision of the Curator.
8. Charges for camping are to be as set by the Committee of Management from time to time.
9. Camp sites whilst being occupied by a camp party must be kept in a clean, sanitary and tidy condition, and before a camp party leaves the Reserve such party shall collect and place in the receptacles provided for the purpose all refuse, litter or garbage produced at the camp site allotted to each party.
10. No person shall bathe or prepare to bathe in the Reserve unless clad in a bathing costume which meets with the approval of the Committee of Management.
11. No person above the age of twelve years shall enter or play on swings or other appliances erected on any children's playground; but parents and other attendants shall be at liberty to enter playground to watch the children who are in their charge.
12. The swings and other appliances erected in the children's playground shall not be used by the same child or children for a longer period than five minutes, if any other child or children shall be waiting for them.
13. No child shall use any of the swings or other appliances in the children's playground except for the purpose for which they are respectively provided.
14. No person shall ride or drive any bicycle or tricycle in any part of the children's playground, or bring any animal into same.
15. Every person in the children's playground shall obey the directions of any duly authorized officer of the said Committee of Management in respect of his or her conduct therein.
16. No fête, concert, carnival or aquatic display shall be held in the Reserve without the consent of the Committee of Management, nor shall fees for admission to the Reserve on days on which fêtes, concerts, carnivals or aquatic displays are held be charged without the consent of such Committee of Management.
17. No assemblies for the purpose of public worship, preaching, or public speaking of any kind, or meetings of a like character, shall take place on the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
18. No person shall offer for sale within the Reserve or deliver therein any article or commodity without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management being first obtained.
19. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or any structure or erections in the Reserve.
20. No unauthorized person shall interfere with, damage in any way, destroy, or have in his possession in the Reserve or take away therefrom any animal, bird, bird's egg, or any live or dead or dressed timber or any vegetation, tree, shrub, fern, plants or flowers.
21. No person shall bring into or have in his possession or discharge in the Reserve, any rifle or firearm of like nature or sporting gun or airgun without first obtaining the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management.
22. No person shall permit or suffer any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, or other animals belonging to him or under his care or control to be at large in the Reserve, or to graze or wander over or upon the same without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained, and upon payment of such fees as may be fixed.
23. The Committee of Management shall have full authority and power to impound any cattle trespassing on the Reserve and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle.
24. No person, except workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs, nor shall any person without lawful excuse enter any area enclosed for a special purpose.
25. No person shall drive any motor car or other vehicle of any kind or ride any bicycle, motor cycle, or horse, except on a road or parking area made for the purpose in the Reserve, and then only as near as practicable to the left-hand side of such road.
26. All persons using the conveniences provided by the Committee of Management shall pay such charges for the use of same as shall be fixed from time to time by the said Committee.
27. Any dog found at large in the Reserve may be destroyed if, in the opinion of the Curator, such dog is a nuisance to stock in the Reserve, or causes or commits any nuisance in or damage to the Reserve or persons in the Reserve.
28. No person shall park any motor car, cycle, or other vehicle, or tether any horse within the Reserve, excepting at such areas as are set apart by the Committee of Management for the purpose, and any person using any such area shall obey any order given by the said Committee, the Curator or other employee of such Committee, and pay on demand a fee not exceeding One shilling per day for entrance to or use of such parking area.
29. No persons shall drive any motor car or other vehicle, or ride any bicycle, motor cycle, or horse within the Reserve or in any parking area or along any road therein recklessly, or at a speed or in a manner which is dangerous to the public having regard to all the circumstances of the case including the nature, condition and use of the road, parking area or Reserve, and to the amount of traffic which actually is at the time or which might reasonably be expected to be on any such road, parking area, or in the Reserve.
30. The Committee of Management shall not be responsible for any accident arising from the use of the swings or other appliances in the children's playground, nor from any cause howsoever arising within the Reserve.
31. The Regulations made by the Board on the 26th of September, 1941, are hereby rescinded.

WHEREAS by section 218 of the *Land Act 1958* power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the *Land Acts* for any public purpose whatsoever, and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore, the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the power conferred aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land in the Town of St. Arnaud temporarily reserved by Order in Council dated the 7th February, 1961, as a site for Tourist Camping purposes (hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve"). The Reserve has been placed under the control of the Council of the Town of St. Arnaud as a Committee of Management with full power and authority to enforce these Regulations.

REGULATIONS.

1. No person offending against decency as regards dress, language or conduct shall remain in the Reserve.
2. No person shall climb or jump over any fences or gates in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, seats or other improvements therein, or otherwise disfigure, injure or destroy the said fences, seats or other improvements, or remove any soil therefrom.
3. No person shall deposit, or cause to be deposited waste-paper, bottles or any other litter on any part of the Reserve, except in the receptacles provided for the purpose.
4. No person shall erect any structure on the Reserve other than a tent or booth, and then only as hereinafter provided.
5. 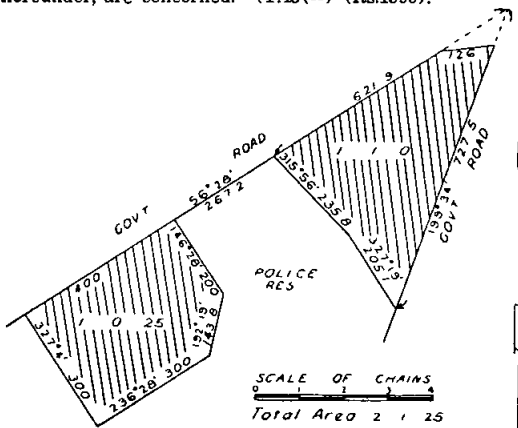

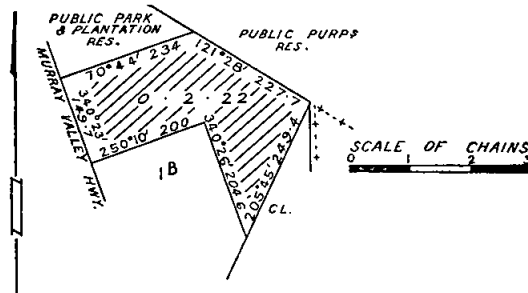

2. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the City of Broadmeadows.

3. In this By-law unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—

"City" means the City of Broadmeadows.

"Council" means the Mayor Councillors and Citizens of the City of Broadmeadows.

"Drive" includes ride or lead.

"Driver" means the person in charge of or having the control of a vehicle or horse.

"Footway" includes every footpath lane or other place within the city habitually used by pedestrians and not by vehicles.

"Horse" includes any draught animal or beast of burden.

"Motor Car" has the same meaning as in the *Motor Car Act 1958*.

"Officer" means any officer appointed by the Council pursuant to section 158 of the *Local Government Acts* for the purpose of assisting in the execution of the said Acts who is authorized in writing by the Council to prosecute any person offending against the provisions of the said Acts or any regulation or by-law made thereunder.

"Street" includes every highway road court alley lane passage carriageway thoroughfare or other public place within the City other than a footway.

"Vehicle" includes any conveyance drawn or propelled by human animal mechanical electrical or other power and includes a motor car.

Singular includes plural.

4. Every person in the City shall at all times observe and comply with any reasonable order or direction of any officer of the Council in respect of all or any of the following matters namely—

(a) Approaching or departing from any footway or street;

- (b) the manner of taking up or setting down passengers or loading or unloading goods in any footway or street; and
 (c) the regulation of pedestrian and other traffic in any footway or street—

and in particular but without in any way limiting the generality of the foregoing—

- (i) every such person shall upon any officer of the Council holding up his hand or giving an order or direction stop for so long or proceed in such manner or direction as such officer deems necessary to allow free space between any persons and vehicles or for cross traffic or for any other like purpose.
 (ii) the driver of a vehicle upon any street shall at the request or signal by hand of any officer of the Council cause such vehicle to stop and remain stationary so long as such officer may reasonably require,
 (iii) every such person shall if any horse or vehicle in his charge is causing or likely to cause an obstruction to any traffic upon any street and if he is directed to remove such horse or vehicle remove the same either from the vicinity or to some adjacent part of that or some neighbouring street as is indicated by the officer, and
 (iv) every such person shall, if in charge of any vehicle upon any street in the vicinity of which vehicle there shall or may in the opinion of any officer of the Council be caused a concourse of vehicles or other congestion of traffic, obey any direction of such officer as to the order and place any such vehicle may stand and, if he is directed by such officer to remove such vehicle, remove the same either from the vicinity or to some adjacent part of that or some neighbouring street as indicated by such officer.

5. No person shall ride or lead any horse or other animal or drive or impel any vehicle upon any footway provided however that a bicycle or motor bicycle may be taken across any footway directly to or from any premises abutting thereon.

6. No person shall obstruct any street or footway by standing or loitering therein or thereon whether for the purpose of selling or offering for sale any goods or otherwise.

7. Any person who commits a breach of any provision of this By-law shall when requested by any officer of the Council state his name and place of abode to such officer.

8. Any person who fails to do anything directed to be done or does anything forbidden to be done by this By-law shall be guilty of a wilful act or default contrary to this By-law.

9. Any person who is guilty of a wilful act or default contrary to this By-law shall be liable on conviction for a first offence to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds and not less than Two pounds and on conviction for a second offence to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds and not less than Five pounds and on conviction to a third or any subsequent offence to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds and not less than Ten pounds.

10. This By-law shall be read and construed so as not to exceed the power of the Council to make it to the intent that where any provision hereof would but for this clause have been construed as being in excess of such power it shall nevertheless be a valid enactment to the extent to which it is not in excess of such power.
