DJERRIWARRH RESERVOIR WATER SUPPLY CATCHMENT.

PROCLAMATION

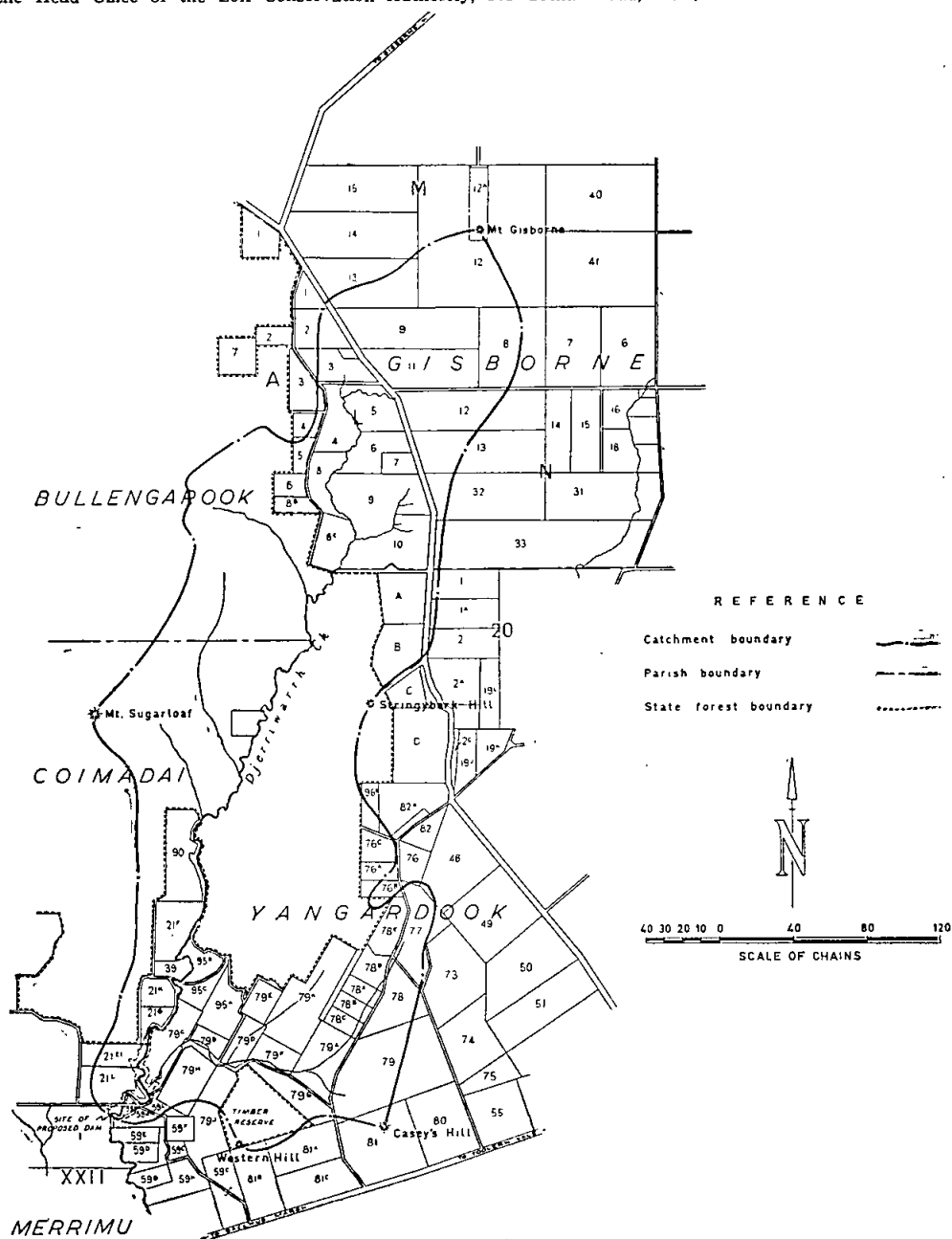
By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State and in pursuance of the provisions contained in section 22 of the *Soil Conservation and Land Utilization Act 1958* (No. 6372), do by this Proclamation define the water supply catchment area to be known as the Djerriwarrh Reservoir Water Supply Catchment.

Commencing at the western end of the Djerriwarrh Dam on the Djerriwarrh Creek, in Crown allotment 1, section XXII, Parish of Merrimu; thence north-westerly across the north-eastern corner of the said allotment to the road reserve on the boundary between the Parishes of Merrimu and Coimadai; thence generally northerly in the Parish of Coimadai through Crown allotments 21L, 21M and the State Forest to Mt. Sugarloaf; thence in a generally north-easterly direction through the said parish into the Parish of Bullengarook; thence turning northerly, north-easterly and south-easterly through the State Forest in the said parish into Crown allotment 5, section A; thence northerly through Crown allotments 4, 3, section A, into the Parish of Gisborne; thence continuing in the said parish through Crown allotments 3, 2, and 1, section L; thence north-easterly through Crown

allotments 13, 14, 12 and 12A, section M, to Mt. Gisborne; thence in a generally southerly direction through Crown allotments 12A, 13, and 8, section M, and 12, 13, 32 and 33, section N, into the Parish of Yangardook; thence continuing in the said parish through Crown allotments 1, 1A, and 2, section 20; thence south-westerly through Crown allotment B into the State Forest to Stringybark Hill; thence southerly through the State Forest into Crown allotments 96B, 82A, 76C, 76A, 76B, back into the State Forest, turning north-easterly into Crown allotments 76B, 77 and 76; thence southerly through Crown allotments 48, 77, 78, 79, and 81 to Casey's Hill; thence in a generally westerly direction through Crown allotments 81, 79, 79G, Timber Reserve, 81A, 81B, and again into the said Timber Reserve to Western Hill; thence north-westerly through the said Timber Reserve to Crown allotment 79J; thence in a generally westerly direction through Crown allotments 79J, 79H, 59L, and 59K, Parish of Yangardook, and across the Djerriwarrh Dam to the point of commencement.

The area described is more particularly defined on plan No. 116 hereunder, the original of which is lodged at the Head Office of the Soil Conservation Authority, 378 Cotham-road, Kew.

4. For making and levying such rates within the said area, the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipality in the municipal district in which such lands and tenements are situate, shall be deemed and taken to be the valuation of such lands and tenements respectively; but if any such lands and tenements are not included in a valuation in force for the municipality in whose district they are situate, or if there is no such valuation, the net annual value thereof may for all the purposes for such rates, be determined in accordance with the provisions of the Local Government Act by the Council of such municipality on the written application of the Trust as provided for in such case by the Water Acts.

DECLARATION OF THE WIDENING OF CALDER HIGHWAY IN THE SHIRE OF KYNETON.

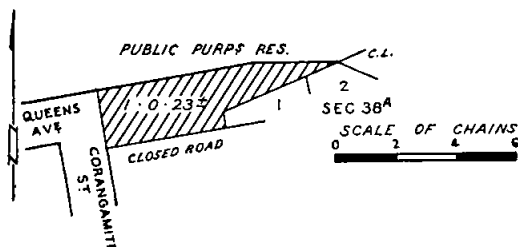

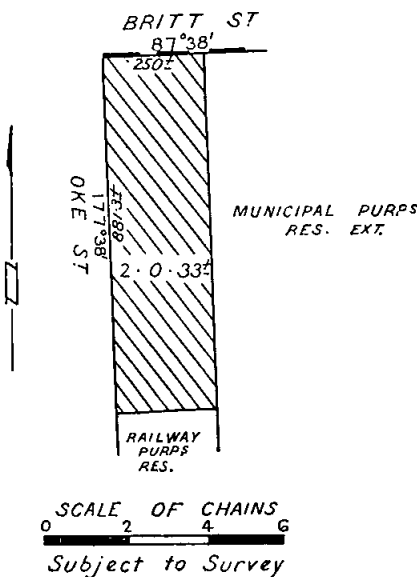

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "MOUNT ROUSE PUBLIC PARK".

WHEREAS by section 218 of the *Land Act* 1958, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the *Land Acts* for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore

the Board of Land and Works in pursuance of the power conferred aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land permanently reserved by Order in Council dated the 19th August, 1872, as a site for a Public Park in the Parish of Purdeet and known as the "Mount Rouse Public Park" (hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve").

The Regulations made by the Board on 9th September, 1932, in respect of the Reserve are hereby rescinded.

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge, except on such days (not more than twelve in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Seven shillings and six pence may be charged and taken for admission of every adult person to the Reserve.

2. No person, except workmen employed by the Committee of Management, shall enter any plots in the Reserve which may be enclosed for plantations of trees or shrubs, or any other purpose, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

3. No person shall commit a nuisance on any part of the Reserve, or on any part of a building in the Reserve.

4. No person shall climb or jump over any gates or fences in or around the Reserve, or in any way disfigure or injure or remove any gates, fences, or other improvements therein; nor roll or throw any stones or any missiles of any kind therein; or cause any annoyance to any member of the public using the Reserve.

5. No person shall damage the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein, except at sites which may be set apart for the purpose by the Committee of Management.

6. No person shall have or deposit, or cause to be left or deposited, any rubbish in the Reserve, except in such places as may from time to time be set apart by the Committee of Management for the purpose.

7. No person shall put or cause to be put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, or other animals, without the written consent of the Committee of Management.

8. No cattle, horses, or sheep with any contagious disease shall be allowed to depasture in the Reserve.

9. No person shall drive or bring any carriage or vehicle of whatsoever nature into the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first had and obtained.

The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management, with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.—(Rs.521.)

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 218 of the *Land Act* 1958, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist therefrom, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "STREAMS RECREATION RESERVE".

WHEREAS by section 218 of the *Land Act* 1958, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the *Land Acts* for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now

therefore the Board of Land and Works in pursuance of the power conferred aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council dated the 8th May, 1962, as a site for Public Recreation in the Parish of Monbulk, and known as "Streams Recreation Reserve." (hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve").

The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management (hereinafter referred to as the "Committee"), with power and authority to enforce these Regulations.

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days, not exceeding 52 in any one year, as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Five shillings may be charged and taken for admission of every adult to the Reserve.

2. No person shall—

- (a) enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language or conduct, or who may behave in a disorderly, unseemly or offensive manner, or create or take part in any disturbance;
- (b) enter or remain in the Reserve whilst in a state of intoxication;
- (c) bring any intoxicating liquor on the Reserve without the consent of the Committee first obtained;
- (d) exercise or train any horse or pony on the Reserve, or any part thereof without the consent of the Committee first obtained.

3. The Committee shall have the power to hold entertainments, shows or performances on the Reserve, and to make a charge for admission thereto as hereinbefore provided.

4. The Committee shall have power to let any portion of the Reserve to any club, association, person or society for the purpose of holding entertainments, performances, shows or sports, subject to the payment of such fees and on such terms as it may deem to be reasonable and consistent with these Regulations, and to authorize any club, association, society or person, to make a charge for admission thereto as hereinbefore provided in these Regulations.

5. No person, except the Committee or its officers or employees on duty, shall enter any part of the Reserve on an occasion when a charge is made for admission thereto without first paying the fees chargeable for such admission.

6. No person shall park a motor car, vehicle or motor cycle in the Reserve, except at such places as are set apart for the purpose by the Committee, who reserve the right to make a parking charge not exceeding Two shillings for each vehicle.

7. No person shall play or engage in any organized sport, game or competition within the Reserve on Sundays, Good Friday or Anzac Day without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

8. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

9. No person shall play, practise or engage in any organized game or sport within the Reserve at any time without permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

10. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection or enclosure on the occasion of any sport, fêtes or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee may at any time determine by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of any stand, building, erection or enclosure, and such Committee, in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection or enclosure or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such damage, injury or loss from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee.

11. No person shall, in the Reserve, interfere with or break or damage any of the trees, plants or shrubs, or pluck any flowers, or climb, jump, or get over or under any of the fences, gates, seats, or any other structures

therein, or roll or throw stones or other missiles, or leave any bottles, broken glass, paper, orange peel, banana skins, or any refuse or rubbish whatever therein, or post bills or advertisements on any of the fences, gates, seats or other structures therein.

12. No person shall light a fire in the Reserve, except in fireplaces provided for that purpose.

13. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

14. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord, without permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

15. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any building or any booth for the purpose of offering for sale any article without permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

16. No person shall play, practice, or engage in any sport, including tennis, cricket, quoits, hockey or any other games or foot-racing, except in the portions of the Reserve set apart for that purpose, and then only with the permission of the Committee first obtained, and such permission may be granted subject to such terms and conditions as the Committee may determine.

17. No person shall enter the Reserve, or pass over the playing area or oval, with any vehicle, or on horseback without the permission of the Committee first obtained, nor ride or drive amongst or to the danger or annoyance of persons assembled on any part of the Reserve.

18. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve without permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

19. No person, club or other body shall, without the consent of the Committee first obtained, grade or scrape the ground off or cut or burn any grass growing on any part of the Reserve.

20. No person shall remove any earth, sand, stone, marl or gravel from the Reserve.

Tenderers must specify the kind or kinds of firewood offered.

Tenders not complying with the terms of advertisement will not be entertained.

No security will be required.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contracts satisfactorily, will be ineligible to again hold contracts for Government supplies.

Tenders must be enclosed in an envelope, marked "Tender for Firewood at _____," as the case may be, and deposited in the Tender Box, Tender Board Offices, Macarthur-street, Melbourne, C.2; or, if sent by post, they must be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Tender Board Offices, Macarthur-street, Melbourne, C.2.

The lowest or any tender will not necessarily be accepted.

Acceptance of tenders will be notified in the *Government Gazette* and by letter to successful tenderers.

* Firewood sold by weight in this district. † Portion may be required in 1-ft. billets and, if additional charge, amount should be shown.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. As the exact quantity of firewood which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. All the firewood supplied under these contracts must be split out of large timber, must be perfectly sound, dry, and of the kind or kinds specified in the tender; neither burnt wood, heartwood, small branches, nor outside pieces of bark will be received. The billets must be not less than 4 inches nor more than 6 inches in diameter, and the long wood to be not less than 9 inches nor more than 18 inches in diameter. Delivery to be made on the written order of the authorized officer of the Department requiring the supply. The cord of firewood consists of 128 cubic feet when stacked. If the firewood be obtained from a State Forest Timber Reserve, or ordinary Crown lands, persons cutting or removing same must be provided with a licence or permit from the Forests Commission.

3. Orders will be issued as required.

4. The contractor will be bound to place the firewood in stacks for measurement in such places as may be directed by the officer receiving the supply. The stacks are to be for 1 foot and 2 foot wood, 2 feet wide and 4 feet high, for 5 foot and 6 foot wood, 5 feet and 6 feet wide respectively and 5 feet high, with space between each stack for measuring; and the billets (or lengths) are all to lie the same way, viz., crossways of the stacks in the form of a cord, and are to be laid as closely and solidly as possible in the stack, and to the satisfaction of the officer receiving the supply. In the event of any inconvenience being caused, either through delay in delivery or of stacking the wood, or failure to stack the wood in the places directed, the Department concerned will purchase elsewhere or re-stack that delivered, at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense incurred thereby will be deducted, provided that the contractor shall be given 48 hours' notice before purchases are made or the wood re-stacked at his risk.

5. The officer receiving the supply shall have full power to reject any wood which he may consider not in accordance with the contract, notice of which will be given to the contractor in writing, stating the reason. The contractor may, however, claim a survey; but in that case he must, within 48 hours after objection is made, give notice thereof in writing to the officer rejecting the wood.

6. The board of survey will be composed of persons appointed by the Tender Board, and the decision of the board of survey is to be considered as final.

7. If the board of survey shall decide that the supply is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor; failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense incurred thereby, if any, will be deducted from the contractor's account.

8. Accounts for firewood shall be rendered to the Department receiving the supply immediately upon completion of the order, which must be attached to the account. Payment will be made through the Treasury, Melbourne.

9. In the event of any irregularity on the part of the contractor being repeated, it will be competent for the Government, in case such irregularity should be established to the satisfaction of the Tender Board, to cancel the contract forthwith.

10. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government.

11. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract.

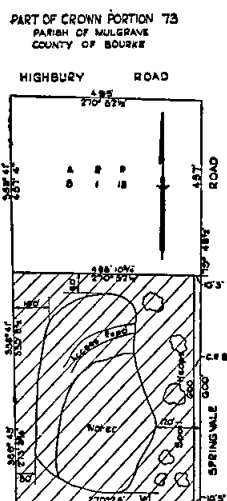

6. This By-law shall have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the Shire of Phillip Island.
