## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

**WHEREAS** by an Act of the Parliament of the State of Victoria passed in the eleventh year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II. intituled the *Sale of Land Act 1962* (No. 6975), it is amongst other things enacted that the said Act shall come into operation on a day to be fixed by Proclamation of the Governor in Council published in the *Government Gazette*, and any such Proclamation may fix different days for the coming into operation of different sections of the Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this my Proclamation fix Friday, the first day of March, One thousand nine hundred and sixty-three, as the day upon which sections 23, 24 and 25, being Part II. of the *Sale of Land Act 1962* (No. 6975), shall come into operation.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this twelfth day of February, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and sixty-three, and in the twelfth year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II.

**PROCLAMATION OF STATES AND TERRITORIES FOR THE PURPOSES OF DIVISION 5 OF PART IV. OF THE COMPANIES ACT 1961**

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

**WHEREAS** sub-section (1) of section 76 of the *Companies Act 1961* provides *inter alia*, that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation, proclaim a State or

Territory of the Commonwealth to be proclaimed State or Territory for the purposes of Division 5 of Part IV. of the *Companies Act 1961*.

And whereas the State of Tasmania is a State in which the law relating to interests other than shares, debentures, &c., is similar to the law in force in Victoria.

Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, by this, my Proclamation, do hereby declare the State of Tasmania to be a proclaimed State for the purposes of the said Division 5 of Part IV. of the *Companies Act 1961*.

## VARIATION OF SUMMER PERIOD IN RESPECT OF SPECIFIED PARTS OF THE COUNTRY AREA OF VICTORIA.

WHEREAS by section 4 of the *Country Fire Authority Act 1958* it is enacted that the Chief Secretary of Victoria, after consultation with the Minister of Forests, may from time to time by declaration published in the *Government Gazette* declare any period to be the summer period in respect of the country area of Victoria, or any specified part or parts thereof and, without affecting the generality of the foregoing, may declare different periods to be the summer period in respect of different parts of the said country area:

And whereas by the said section it is further enacted that any declaration so published may be revoked, amended, or varied by a subsequent declaration so published:

And whereas by declaration issued on the 20th day of November, 1962, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 21st day of November, 1962, different summer periods expiring on the 15th day of April, 1963, were declared in respect of different parts of the country area of Victoria, including the parts of the said country area specified in the Schedule hereto:

And whereas it is deemed expedient that the aforesaid declaration should be varied in the manner hereinafter described:

And whereas the Chief Secretary and the Minister of Forests have consulted accordingly:

Now therefore, I, the Chief Secretary of Victoria, do by this my declaration vary the aforesaid declaration by declaring that the summer period in respect of the parts of the Country area of Victoria specified in the Schedule hereto shall end at midnight on the 15th day of February, 1963.

## SCHEDULE.

Those portions of the Eighteenth Fire Control Region comprised by the municipal districts of the Shire of Walpeup and those portions of the Shire of Swan Hill which lie north from the under-mentioned boundary that is to say:—Commencing at the south-eastern angle of Crown allotment 31, no section, Parish of Kulwin; thence easterly by a road and a line to a point on the west bank of the River Murray distant approximately 5,500 links easterly from the most eastern angle of Crown allotment 79, no section, Parish of Plangil.

NOTICE OF APPROVAL FOR GENERAL USE OF SCAFFOLDING,  
SCAFFOLDING COMPONENTS OR SCAFFOLDING GEAR.

PURSUANT to the provisions of clause 208 (b) of the Scaffolding Regulations 1962, notice is hereby given of the approval for general use, subject to the requirements of the said Regulations and the conditions specified herein, of the under-mentioned scaffolding, scaffolding components or scaffolding gear:—

## APPROVAL No. G.1.

*Petersen Brackets.**Conditions of Approval.*

(a) Each bracket (other than a corner bracket) shall be a three feet (3') length of one and eleven-sixteenths inches ( $1\frac{11}{16}$ ") O.D. 8 gauge steel tube welded to an open mild steel bracket which fits around and fastens to a four inches by one and a half inches ( $4" \times 1\frac{1}{2}"$ ) timber wall stud.

(b) Brackets shall not be used at any height greater than six feet (6') above the ground.

(c) Brackets shall not be spaced at a greater distance apart longitudinally than six feet (6').

(d) Heat treated quarter inch ( $\frac{1}{4}"$ ) mild steel chain manufactured to B.S. 590-1949 shall be used in corner brackets.

(e) The words and figures "Registered design No. 37935" shall appear on each bracket in such a manner as to be readily recognized.

(f) Brackets shall be used only as light-duty scaffolding.

(g) No platform shall be more than two planks wide.

(b) Except where water is supplied for industrial purposes, the charge for water supplied by measure to any property rated by the Trust in excess of such maximum quantity, computed as in the last preceding clause, is hereby fixed at Two shillings per 1,000 gallons up to 20,000 gallons, and at One shilling and six pence per 1,000 gallons in excess of that quantity.

(c) The charge for water supplied for industrial purposes in excess of such maximum quantity, computed as in clause 3a, is hereby fixed at Nine pence per 1,000 gallons.

(d) The charge for water supplied for buildings in course of erection shall be Twenty shillings per cent., on amount of the contract for brickwork, stone or plastering or should a meter be installed, the charge shall be Two shillings per 1,000 gallons.

(e) The charge for water supplied by measure shall be payable, on demand, at the office of the Trust.

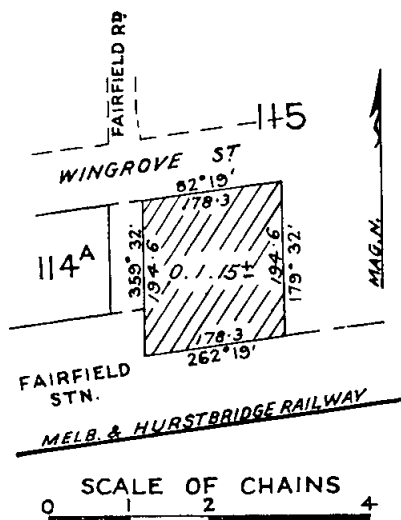

#### ORDER APPROVING THE MAKING OF A BY-PASS IN THE CITY OF DANDENONG.

##### WHEREAS:

I. Section 114 of the *Country Roads Act 1958* (herein called "the Act") provides (*inter alia*) in—

- (a) sub-section (1) thereof that the powers conferred upon municipal councils by Division 14 of Part XIX. of the *Local Government Act 1958* shall so far as applicable be conferred upon the Country Roads Board (herein called "the Board") so far as relates to the declaration of the alignment the widening and opening up of by-pass roads and that the provisions of the said Division shall with certain modifications extend and apply accordingly;
- (b) sub-section (2) thereof that no by-pass road shall be widened or opened up pursuant to the said section unless the Governor in Council has by Order published in the *Government Gazette* approved such widening or opening up.

II. Section 101 of the Act provides (*inter alia*) that for the purposes of Part VII. of the Act sections 19 to 21 of the Act shall so far as applicable and with such adaptations as are necessary extend and apply with respect to by-pass roads.

##### III. The Board has—

- (a) in exercise of the powers conferred upon it by the said section 114 and for the purpose of opening up a by-pass road in the City of Dandenong under the name "Scoresby By-pass Road" by Resolution dated the 19th day of March, 1962, fixed an alignment for each side of the said road;
- (b) in accordance with the provisions of section 19 of the Act caused to be prepared a map plan and estimate showing—
- (i) the points between which and the lands on and through which the said road is proposed to be made; and
  - (ii) the cost of acquiring the land.

IV. The Governor in Council is satisfied that there are funds legally available for acquiring the said land.

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria with the advice of the Executive Council thereof by this Order approves, for the purposes of section 20 (as applied by the said section 101) and of section 114 of the Act, the acquisition of the said land (being the land described in the Schedule hereto) and the making of the said road.

1. In this By-law, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—

(a) the words "the Council" wherever appearing shall mean the Council of the Shire of Wannon.

(b) the words "derelict motor car" wherever appearing shall mean any derelict motor car which has remained standing in any street or road for a period exceeding seven days.

2. No person shall leave any derelict or unregistered motor car standing in any street or road.

3. Any officer of the Council authorized by it in that behalf may cause any derelict or unregistered motor car left standing in any street or road to be removed by any reasonable means he may think fit to some place provided by the Council for such purpose.

4. As soon as reasonably may be after any such motor car shall be removed, the Council shall cause to be published in a newspaper circulating in the municipal district a notice in the form or to the effect of the notice in the Schedule hereto.

5. If within fourteen days after the date of publication of such notice any person shall produce to the Shire Secretary proof to the satisfaction of the Shire Secretary that he is the owner of the motor car, the same shall be released to such person upon payment of the appropriate charge prescribed by this By-law and the cost of the publication of the notice as aforesaid.

6. (a) Where any motor car shall not be released within fourteen days after the date of publication of the notice aforesaid, the Council may at any time after the expiration of 21 days from such last-mentioned date sell such motor car by public auction or private contract upon such terms and conditions as it shall think fit.

(b) The proceeds of such sale shall be applied firstly in payment of the appropriate charge for the removal of the motor car and the cost of publication of the notice and the residue (if any) shall be payable to any person producing to the Shire Secretary proof to the satisfaction of the Shire Secretary that he was the owner of such motor car immediately before the sale.
