Forests Act 1958 (No. 6254).

VARIATION OF PROCLAMATION RELATING TO THE PROHIBITED PERIOD.

WHEREAS by section 3 of the Forests Act 1958 it is enacted that the Minister of Forests may from time to time by notice published in the Government Gazette declare any period to be a prohibited period in respect of any fire protected area (other than a State forest or national park) and without affecting the generality of the foregoing, may from time to time by notice so published declare different prohibited periods in respect of different parts of the fire protected area (other than a State forest or national park):

And whereas by the said section, it is further enacted that any declaration so published may subsequently be revoked, amended or varied by the Minister of Forests by notice so published:

And whereas by Proclamations issued on the 20th November, 1962, and published in the Government Gazette on the 21st November, 1962, a prohibited period expiring on the 30th April, 1963, was proclaimed in respect of portion of the fire protected area (other than State forests or national parks); including the areas specified in the Schedule hereto:



REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "LAKE DANAHER RESERVE".

WHEREAS by section 218 of the Land Act 1958 power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the Land Acts for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works in pursuance of the power conferred aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land in the Parish of Kinabulla temporarily reserved by Order in Council dated the 23rd May, 1961, as a site for Public Purposes and known as the "Lake Danaher Reserve".

REGULATIONS.

- 1. In these Regulations unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter:—
 - "Committee" means the persons, council or body appointed by the Governor in Council, or the Board of Land and Works, to be the Committee of Management of the Reserve hereinafter referred to.
 - "Organization" means any group collection or association (whether temporary or not) of persons and/or bodies (whether corporate or not) acting together for a purpose.
 - "Organized Event" means any affair, enterprise or action undertaken by any organization as herein defined in furtherance of any purpose of such organization and (without limiting the generality of this definition) includes any gathering of persons intended, planned or brought about by any such organization for any purpose of such organization.
 - "Reserve" means the land referred to in the preamble to these Regulations.
- Upon the coming into operation of these Regulations, all previous Regulations made by the Board of Land and Works in respect of the Reserve shall be rescinded.
- 3. The Reserve shall be open to the public at all times and no charge shall be made for admission thereto, except on such days (not exceeding 52 in any one year) as the same or any portion thereof may be set apart by the Committee for sports, carnivals, regattas, fêtes or holiday amusements of any kind on any of which days a sum not exceeding Ten shillings may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve, or to the portion thereof at that time set apart for the purposes aforesaid.
- 4. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may in any respect offend against decency as regards dress, language or conduct.
- 5. No person shall leave or deposit or cause to be left or deposited on or in any part of the Reserve any broken glass or crockery or any tins, bottles, cartons, waste paper or other litter or rubbish or any food scraps or other garbage, except in receptacles provided by the Committee for that purpose and marked "Rubbish".
- 6. No person shall, on any part of the grounds of the Reserve without the consent, in writing, of the Committee first had and obtained play, practice, or engage in any game or sport, and then only on such part or parts of the said grounds as may be stipulated by the Committee for the purpose. Provided always that no such consent shall be deemed to authorize anything which may be a danger, inconvenience or annoyance to any other person or persons in the Reserve.
- 7. No person shall throw or project in or across any part of the Reserve any stone or other hard object or missile.
- 8. No person whilst in the Reserve shall commit any nuisance or behave in such manner as to cause any danger, inconvenience or annoyance to any other person or persons in the Reserve.
- 9. No person shall without the consent, in writing, of the Committee first had and obtained operate, or use in, or bring into the Reserve or any part thereof, any loud-speaker, amplifier or broadcasting or public address equipment (whether mechanical or electrical) for broadcasting music, speech or other noises or sounds on the Reserve or any part thereof; provided always that nothing in this Regulation contained shall be deemed to prohibit the bona fide and reasonable use by officials of any sporting body lawfully using the Reserve or any part thereof of any such equipment for the purpose of conducting sporting events,

- 10. No person shall clean fish in any part of the Reserve or fish at any point within the Reserve at, on or within 100 yards of any pier, jetty or swimming pool.
- 11. No person whilst in the Reserve shall without the consent, in writing, of the Committee first had and obtained carry, use or discharge any firearm, air gun or other lethal weapon or carry, use, explode or light any fireworks or explosives. Provided always that nothing in this Regulation contained shall be deemed to prohibit the bona fide use by officials of any sporting body lawfully using the Reserve or any part thereof of any starter's pistol or starting gun in the conduct of sporting events.
- 12. No person whilst in the Reserve shall without the consent, in writing, of the Committee first had and obtained sell or offer for sale or hire any goods, wares, merchandise, produce or other articles.
- 13. No person shall without the consent, in writing, of the Committee first had and obtained camp in any part of the Reserve and then only in such part of the Reserve as may be stipulated by the Committee for the purpose.
- 14. No person shall without the consent, in writing, of the Committee first had and obtained light any fire in any part of the grounds of the Reserve and then only in such place in the Reserve as may be stipulated by the Committee for the purpose.
- 15. No person shall without the consent, in writing, of the Committee first had and obtained erect or install any booth, stall or shelter or any pier, jetty, landing or ramp or any other structure whatsoever and then only in such manner and in such places as may be stipulated by the Committee.
- 16. No person shall without the consent, in writing, of the Committee first had and obtained bring into the grounds of the Reserve or any part thereof any motor vehicle or horse-drawn vehicle, and then only into such part or parts of the said grounds and for such purpose or purposes only as may be stipulated by the Committee.
- 17. No person shall ride or propel any bicycle or motor cycle in, along, across or through the grounds of the Reserve or any part thereof: Provided always that bicycles may be parked in such racks, stands or areas as may be set apart by the Committee for such purposes and to enable the same to be so parked or taken out of the Reserve after having been so parked but for no other purpose may be propelled by hand from the nearest point of access by land to the grounds of the Reserve to the places where they are so parked or from such place where they are so parked or from such place to the nearest point of egress by land from the said grounds (as the case may be) without contravening this Regulation.
- 18. (a) No person shall bring or cause to be brought into the grounds of the Reserve or any part thereof any horse, cattle, dog sheep, plg, goat or other animal, goose, duck, fowl or other poultry, nor shall any person suffer to be brought or to be in or upon the Reserve or any part thereof any horse, cattle, dog, sheep, pig, goat or other animal, goose, duck, fowl or other poultry belonging to him or in his charge.
- (b) The owner of any horse, cattle, dog, sheep, pig, goat or other animal or of any goose, duck, fowl, or other poultry found wandering in any part of the Reserve shall be guilty of an offence under these Regulation, and in addition to any other penalty or penalties be liable to make compensation to the Committee for any damage done by such animal or poultry to the Reserve, or any part thereof or anything therein, and any or all such horses, cattle, dogs, sheep, pigs, goats, or other animals, and any or all such geese, ducks, fowls, or other poultry may be impounded or dealt with by the Committee, or by any of its officers or by any of its servants thereunto authorized by it as by any law, for the time being in force provided.
- (c) Notwithstanding anything in this Regulation contained, the Committee in its own discretion may at any time depasture or authorize the depasturing of livestock on any part or parts of the grounds of the Reserve, and may charge agistment fees therefor.
- (d) This Regulation shall not apply to any horse whilst harnessed to any horse-drawn vehicle entering the grounds of the Reserves or any part thereof under the authority of the Committee pursuant to Regulation 16 of these Regulations.
- 19. No person or organization or person or persons acting on behalf of any organization shall without the consent, in writing, of the Committee first had and obtained and without first paying to the Committee such fees therefor as the Committee may demand, enter or remain in the grounds of the Reserves with or in or from any part of the said grounds set up, conduct or

operate, or take an part in the setting up conduct or operation of any side-show or any device, machine or equipment of, or in the nature of a merry-go-round, swinging-boat, oceanwave, miniature railway, shooting gallery, water-boat, or any other device, machine or equipment (whether of the same or similar nature or not) usually run by professional side-show proprietors for the amusement of the public for reward.

20. No person whilst in the Reserve shall-

- 20. No person whilst in the Reserve shall—

 Remove or displace or deface or otherwise damage in any way whatsoever any notice or sign, or any board, tablet, or plate or any support or fastening or fitting used or constructed or adapted to be used for the exhibition of any notice, sign or placard and fixed or set up by the Committee, or any buoy flag or marker lawfully fixed or set up by any Club or other body;
 climb, jump over, or swing on any of the trees, gates, barriers, railings, or fences, or any of the said buoys, flags, or markers in or around the Reserve or any part thereof;
 paint, fix, write, cut, carve, or in any way inscribe or engrave letters, figures, or marks upon or otherwise disfigure any tree, wall, seat, fence, building, pier, jetty, or other structure in the Reserve.

 post, stick, or otherwise affix to anything in the Reserve.
- (iv) post, stick, or otherwise affix to anything in the Reserve any advertisement, bill, placard, or
- other notice; (v) spit or expectorate on any path or lawn or other
- (v) spit or expectorate on any path or lawn or other area in the Reserve;
 (vi) enter any plot or other area within the grounds of the Reserve for the time being enclosed for the planting or protection of the trees, shrubs, or grass, or go upon any cultivated area, or garden bed within the said grounds or pick or break any flower or shrub or tree therein;
 (vii) without the consent, in writing, of the Committee first had and obtained dig or otherwise make or excavate any hole in any part of the grounds of the Reserves or interfere in any way with the surface of the grounds thereof.
 21 No presence or exception the laborative description chall be critical to use
- 21. No person or organization shall be entitled to use any part of the grounds of the Reserve for the purpose of conducting any organized event unless such person or organization or the person or persons acting on behalf of such organization shall first deposit with the Committee in cash (in addition to any fees for user which may be payable) the deposit moneys hereinafter mentioned to be applied as hominator provided that is to say the payable. applied as hereinafter provided, that is to say:-
 - (a) In the case of the use of any part of the grounds of the Reserve without the use of any building, stand, booth, stall, ramp, pier, jetty, or other structure within the Reserve being the property of the Committee or appertaining to the Reserves such sum (if any) not exceeding Twenty-five pounds as the Committee may demand; or
 - (b) in the case of the use of any part of the grounds of the Reserve and also of any building, stand, booth, stall, ramp, pier, jetty, or other structure as aforesaid such sum (if any) not exceeding Fifty pounds as the Committee may demand.

The deposit moneys so paid shall upon such person or organization (as the case may be) vacating the Reserve by applied by the Committee first in or towards satisby applied by the Committee first in or towards satisfaction of the cost of restoration of or compensation for any damage whatsoever done to or suffered by the property of the Committee or appertaining to the Reserve during the conduct of any such organized event by whomsoever and whatsoever done, and also in satisfaction of the cost of cleaning up any rubbish or litter resulting from such use, and the balance (if any) thereof shall then be refunded to the payer or payers of the said deposit moneys. The determination as to whether or not any such damage has in fact been done or suffered and of the amount or value of the said restoration or compensation, shall be in the sole, absolute and conclusive discretion of the Committee, and all persons and all organizations and the persons by or on whose behalf any such deposit moneys shall have been paid shall be deemed to have expressly agreed to the provisions of this Regulation. Regulation.

22. No person or organization shall be entitled to use any part of the grounds of the Reserve for the purpose of conducting any organized event unless such person or organization or the person or persons acting on behalf of such organization shall first pay to the Committee for user such fee (if any) not exceeding the sum of Ten pounds as may be demanded by the Committee.

23. Where any person or organization seeking to use any part of the grounds of the Reserve, for the purpose of conducting any organized event seeks to make any profit in so doing, such person or organization shall also be liable to pay to the Committee for user in addition to such fee (if any) as may have been demanded by the Committee pursuant to the last preceding Regulations. such fee (if any) as may have been demanded by the Committee pursuant to the last preceding Regulations, such percentage not exceeding 50 per centum of the net profits (if any) earned in the conduct of such organized event as may be demanded by the Committee. In such case the Committee may require any such person or organization prior to the commencement or during the conduct of any such organized event at the option of the Committee to lodge with the Committee either such guarantee for the due payment of any such percentage or such reasonable sum as security for the due payment of any such percentage as the Committee may determine and no person or organization shall be entitled to use and no person or organization shall be entitled to use or to proceed with the use of any part of the Reserves or to conduct or to proceed with the conduct of any organized event therein while any of the said requirements which may have been made by the Committee hereto shall remain in any respect unsatisfied.

24. Nothing herein contained shall render unlawful any act, matter, or thing lawfully done or omitted to be done by any person, club, or other organization, or any member of any such club or organization under or by virtue of the terms of any existing licence or agreement lawfully given or made by the Committee to or with any such person, club or other organization.

25. Every person, club or other organization.

25. Every person who shall commit any breach of any of these Regulations may be removed from the Reserves or from any place therein or directed forthwith to leave the Reserves or the said place by any officer or any employee of the Committee thereunto authorized by the Committee or by any member of the Police Force, and every such person who shall fail to comply forthwith with any such direction shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations.—(Rs.8037.)

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 218 of the Land Act 1958, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist therefrom, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "MORGAN'S MILL BEACH RECREATION RESERVE".

WHEREAS by section 218 of the Land Act 1958 power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the Land Acts for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the power conferred aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the reserved Crown lands shown bordered by red colour on plan U/25.9.1962, attached to the Lands Department correspondence Rs.8135, and known as "Morgan's Mill Beach Recreation Reserve" (hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve").

The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management (hereinafter referred to as the "Committee") with power and authority to enforce these Regulations.

REGULATIONS.

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset and such other hours as may be approved by the Committee who may appoint a Park Supervisor to supervise the use and occupancy of the Reserve. The Committee may make and take a charge for the admission to the Reserve and for use of facilities therein in respect of each person or each vehicle or each person and each vehicle (person to mean for the purpose of this Regulation, a person apparently over the age of sixteen years). Such charge may be made and taken by the hours, by the day or by the week or otherwise

periodically at the discretion of the Committee. periodically at the discretion of the Committee. No person whose period of admission has expired shall remain any longer in the Reserve. Any person may be refused re-admission to the Reserve who has previously been lawfully required by any officer or employee of the Committee to leave the Reserve or has been removed from the Reserve for a break of any of these Resultations. from the Reserve for a breach of any of these Regulations.

- 2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language or conduct, or who may be a nuisance or annoyance to other persons in the Reserve.
- 3. No person shall climb upon the buildings, trees, gates or fences in or around the Reserve or stick bills thereon or in any manner damage or injure the same.
- 4. No person shall in any manner interfere with or 4. No person shall in any manner interiere with or remove any buildings, fences, gates, seats, culverts, steps, electrical and other fittings and equipment, water pipes, water taps, drains, drainage pipes, water showers, enclosures, structures, posts, trees, shrubs, flowers or fittings in the Pagarya. fittings in the Reserve.
- 5. No person other than officers and/or employees of the Committee shall enter any areas within the Reserve set aside as enclosed plantations or beds for trees, flowers, plants or shrubs, nor shall any person trespass or walk upon or over any flower-bed or shrubbery within these
- 6. No person shall damage or unlawfully remove or interfere with or dig or cut away any earth, soil, embankment, road or earthwork or any part thereof in the Reserve.
- 7. No male person over the age of twelve years shall stand, sit, remain or loiter within 20 feet of the buildings set apart for the exclusive use of females in the Reserve.
- 8. No male person over the age of seven years shall enter or use any place, room or building in the Reserve set apart for the use of females, and no female person shall enter or use any place, room or building in the Reserve set apart for the use of males.
- 9. (1) No person, without the consent, in writing, of 9. (1) No person, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee, shall cause or suffer or knowingly permit any dog belonging to him, or in his charge, to enter or remain in the Reserve, unless such dog be and continues to be under proper control on a chain, cord or leash, and be effectively restrained from causing annoyance to any person or from damaging or interfering in any way with the property of the said Committee, or bring into the Reserve any dog for training or exercising for coursing or other nurroses of sport coursing or other purposes of sport.
- (2) Any dog found in the Reserve except as provided in these Regulations shall be liable to be seized and/or destroyed by the Committee, and the owner or any person having custody of any dog so found shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations, and may be required to make compensation for any damage done to the property of the said Committee by such dog.
- 10. No person shall light any fire within the Reserve except in the fireplace provided for the purpose unless under the authority of or with the permission of the Committee.
- 11. No person shall leave or deposit any glass, paper or rubbish in the Reserve except in receptacles provided for the purpose of holding rubbish and garbage.
- 12. No person shall roll or throw bottles, stones, sticks or missiles of any kind in the Reserve.
- 13. The Committee reserves the right to refuse permission to any person to camp in the Reserve.
- 14. No person shall organize or take part in public entertainment of any kind in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.
- 15. No person shall spit on paths or any structure or erection in the Reserve.
- 16. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve.
- 17. No person shall play, practice or engage in any organized sport, including tennis, football, cricket, foot racing or any other games, except in such portions of the Reserve as may be set apart for that purpose, and subject to such terms and conditions as the Committee may determine.
- 18. No person shall obstruct, disturb, interrupt or annoy any officer or employee of the Committee in the proper execution of his work and duty.
- 19. No person shall ride any cycle within the Reserve or bring into the Reserve or drive therein any motor car, horse, carriage, cart or other vehicle, except in such parts of the Reserve as may be set apart by the Committee and except for lawful entry or exit, and then only at a slow pace and without danger to anyone.

- 20. Any person may be required by the Committee to and berson may be required by the Committee of deposit any sum not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20) by way of guarantee that while in the Reserve that person shall not injure or destroy any part of the Reserve or any structures or erections thereon, and the Committee, in its absolute discretion, may make good any destruction in injury coursed by the person and may deduct the or injury caused by that person and may deduct the cost of making good such destruction or injury from the sum of money so deposited. A person having camped at the Reserve shall fill in and make good any tent pole or tent peg holes in respect of his camp.
- 21. No person shall publicly address any assembly or assemble with any other person or persons for the purpose of hearing any public address within the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.
- 22. Any person committing in any part of the Reserve or in any of the vehicles for the time being therein or in any buildings, structures or erections for the time being thereon, any of the following offences shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations and, without prejudice to any other penalty, may be expelled (forcibly if necessary) from the Reserve by any officer of the Committee with or without assistance, and any vehicle brought by such person into the Reserve may be driven or towed away or otherwise removed therefrom by any such officer. No action or other proceedings shall lie or be taken against any such officer or assistant for or in respect of anything done or omitted in exercise or purported exercise of his powers and duties hereunder.

The offences in this Regulation referred to-

- (a) Assault.
- (b) Being drunk.
- (c) Using profane, indecent or obscene language.
 (d) Using any threatening or abusive or insulting words.
- (e) Behaving riotously or in a disorderly manner
- (f) Interfering with or interrupting any lawful use of any part of the Reserve by any other person.
- (g) Obtaining admission to or remaining in any part of the Reserve when not entitled to such admission or to remain therein under these Regulations.
- 23. Any person using any dressing shed, pavilion, building or other structure in the Reserve shall leave the same in a clean and tidy condition. No water tap or shower shall be left running, nor shall any room or enclosure normally locked be left unlocked after use.
- 24. No person shall force open any locked gate or door in any enclosure, room or building in the Reserve, nor shall any person use any key to open any lock on such gates or doors unless authorized to do so by the Committee or the Reserve Supervisor.
- 60. Should any person receive from any member, officer or other employee of the Committee any key or keys for the unlocking of any doors or gates in the Reserve, he shall pay a deposit of Ten shillings for each key, and after use he shall return such key or keys in good condition, in default of which the deposit may be forfeited.
- 26. All keys shall be returned to the Reserve Supervisor or to some other officer of the Committee on the same day as they are received, unless otherwise directed or permitted by the Committee.—(Rs.8135.)

Printed forms of tender and the conditions of contract may, in all cases, be obtained from the Secretary to the Tender Board, Macarthur-street, Melbourne, by whom also any information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

Security will be required either in Commonwealth Treasury bonds, or approved bank guarantee, fixed deposit receipt, Savings Bank deposit book, or non-negotiable cheque in favour of the Secretary to the Tender Board, as the tenderer may elect.

The security must be completed and the contract signed within ten days of acceptance of the tender, falling which the service may be again advertised, or another tender accepted.

Preference will be given by the Tender Board to tenders for articles manufactured within the Commonwealth, provided the quality of such articles is satisfactory and the prices tendered are considered reasonable.

The lowest or any tender will not necessarily be accepted. In the event of tenderers withdrawing or attempting to withdraw their tenders before notification of acceptance of same, or failing to take up their accepted tenders within the prescribed period after notification of acceptance, they may be disqualified from tendering or holding any future contracts for Government supplies for a period of twelve months, such disqualification to date

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from the notification of acceptance of tender. It is also stipulated that, if a tenderer be a member of a firm and such firm be interested in the contract, the tender shall be in the name of the firm and not in that of the individual, and that, for a breach of this condition, the tender will be declared informal.

Tenders, enclosed in a separate envelope, and having the words "Tender for at "(as the case may be) written thereon, must be deposited in the Tender-box at the Tender Board Office, Macarthur-street, Melbourne, or if sent by post, postage must be prepaid, and the tenders addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Tender Board Offices, Macarthur-street, Melbourne, C.2, which office they must reach not later than by first post on the date of closing of tenders.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

- 1. All the articles are to be of the best quality of the several kinds, in the best conditions, and in conformity with the Health Acts, and to be delivered in sound packages, free from all charges for cartage, freight, &c. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply.
- 2. As the exact quantity of any article which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated in the Schedule, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same as ordered.

The Government reserves the right to purchase otherwise than from the contractor any of the articles specified in the Schedule in the event of emergency due to the war.

- Supplies for country districts for which no local contract may have been taken, or for which the contract has been terminated, may be ordered under the Melbourne contract.
- 4. The Melbourne District will include places within a radius of 12 miles from the Elizabeth-street Post Office with the exception of places for which separate contracts are provided; the Mont Park District will include the Mental Hospitals, Janefield Colony, the Sanatorium, Gresswell, and Pleasant View, Preston; the Ararat, Ballarat, Beechworth, Bendigo, Castlemaine, Geelong and Sunbury Districts will include Mental Hospitals, Penal Institutions and Teachers' Hostels at any of those places. Delivery must be made at the places, institutions, &c., named in the Schedules, or as directed by the officer ordering the supply.
- 5. Packages suitable for transport of goods supplied must be provided by the contractor free of expense, and the value of these packages, whether in bulk or otherwise, is to be included in the rate tendered, except butter boxes and soap boxes (not including fancy soaps), jam jars, flour, meal, and potato bags, which will remain the property of the contractor, and only the actual net weight or quantity received will be paid for; the empties to be removed from the place of delivery at the contractor's expense.
- · 6. The meat supplied under these conditions must, if practicable, be slaughtered at abattoirs which are under authorized inspection and supervision. Any infringement of this condition will subject the contractor, on report from the Tender Board to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds, as the treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from the contractor's account, or from the security money.
- 7. The supplies coming under the head of Rations and Medical Comforts are to be delivered direct to the establishment entitled thereto on the written order of the officer in charge. All other supplies will be ordered by the head of the Department concerned or any officer authorized by him, and shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply.
- 8. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted, and shall return the order to the contractor, who shall render his account as soon as possible after the delivery of the supplies, accompanied by the receipted delivery order. The rates or quantities quoted in the orders cannot be exceeded.
- 9. Where railway facilities are available, the contractor shall use the Railways for the transport of the goods. When a contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail, except for Commonwealth Departments, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note at the same time handing in the triplicate and quadruplicate of the form as an authority for the Railways to act as agent for, and charge the freight to, the Stores and Trans-

- port Office. He shall as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver at the Tender Board Offices the original, the duplicate to be forwarded to the consignees and the quintuplicate retained by himself. Should the goods thus forwarded be rejected, the contractor must bear the cost of replacing such goods, for which services the departmental consignment note is not to be used. Any infringement of this condition may subject the contractor to such mulct as the Tender Board may recommend under clause 18 of these conditions.
- 10. Orders must receive prompt execution; in the event of the goods not being delivered at the time mentioned in the order or within such other time as the officer ordering the supply may specify for delivery, it will be competent for such officer, or the head of the Department to whom the goods are to be supplied, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, to purchase the supplies, or any like supplies that are suitable for the service, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.
- 11. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the conditions.
- 12. If the officer in charge of stores be not satisfied as to the quantity or quality of the stores, or if, after taking delivery of any stores or material, he shall discover any deficiency or defect therein, he may return such deficient or defective stores or material to the contractor, and shall report the same to the head of his department and to the Tender Board.
- 13. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the supplies as to the quality, the same is to be decided, in cases where the article is not of a perishable nature, by a Board of Survey composed of persons named by the Treasurer of the State for the time being; and the decision of the Board is to be considered final. In the event of the decision being against the contractor, the survey fees and expenses (if any) will be deducted as in clause 10.
- 14. In cases where the article is of a perishable nature, or when from some other cause injury would be sustained either by the person to whom the rations or stores are due or by the contractor in waiting for a Board to survey, the head of the Department or officer authorized to take delivery will have power to reject such article or articles as are, obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing, and that the contractor must take back the rejected article and supply good in its stead; failing which it, or any like supply suitable for the Service, will be obtained by the officer requiring it as in clause 10. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies so rejected or returned.
- 15. If the Board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor; failing which it, or any like supply suitable for the Service, will be procured by the officer required it, and the expense charged as in clause 10.
- 16. In the case of supplies for Mental Hospitals, it will be competent for a Board of Survey, consisting of the medical superintendent (or, in his absence, of the medical officer) and any two officers named by him, to examine and reject any supplies that may be objected to. It must be distinctly understood, however, that the contractor will have a right of appeal to the Treasurer of the State for the time being, such appeal to be made in writing within 24 hours of the rejection; but, pending such appeal, he must at once supply others of approved quality; failing which, the supplies required, or any like supplies suitable for the Service, may be obtained by the officer concerned, and the expense charged as in clause 10.
- 17. In the case of supplies for Mental Hospitals, it will also be competent for two or more of the official visitors, in conjunction with the medical superintendent, to reject any supplies that they may consider not in accordance with contract; and in such cases the reference to a Board of Survey will not be deemed to be necessary.
- 18. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds, as the said Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted as in clause 10. Notwithstanding anything contained to the contrary in section 152 of the Customs Act 1901-36, it is hereby expressly provided that upon any alteration of the duty collected affecting the goods included in this contract, the contract price shall not be altered, and the contract may be terminated at the option of either party by two months' notice in writing from the first day of the calendar month next ensuing, and within the period for which the contract is made. The contract for the unaffected items shall remain in full force and effect.  (4) Crossings Over Footways and Channels.—Clauses 15-16, both inclusive.

- (7) Houses, &c., Encroaching on Streets, &c.-Clause
- 40.
 (8) Obstructions, &c., to Streets, &c., by Cattle, &c.—Clauses 41–45, both inclusive.
 (9) Undermining Streets.—Clause 46.
 (10) Miscellaneous.—Clauses 47–49, both inclusive.
- Part II.—Waterworks, Drains, &c.—Clause 6.

- (c) Such owners or occupiers shall renew the numbers of such houses, buildings or separate dwellings as often as they are obliterated or defaced.
- (d) If any owner or occupier of any such house, (d) If any owner or occupier of any such house, building or separate dwelling neglects for one week after notice to him from the Council to mark such house, building or separate dwelling with such number as the Council may direct or approve, or to renew the number thereof as aforesaid, he shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Forty shillings, and the Council may cause such number to be so marked or renewed and recover the expense thereof from the owner or occupier of such house, building or separate dwelling before any Justice, and where such expense is paid by or recovered from the occupier he may deduct the same from any rent payable by him to the owner. the owner.

BY-LAW No. 116. Proceedings of Council By-law.

A By-law of the City of Box Hill made under section 197 of the Local Government Act 1958, and numbered 116 for adopting certain provisions of the 15th Schedule to the Act and carrying out certain purposes provided for in the said Schedule.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act* 1958, and of any and every other power it thereunto enabling the Mayor, Councillors and Citizens of the City of Box Hill orders as follows:—

- 1. This By-law shall be known as the Proceedings of Council By-law.
- 2. Such of the clauses of Part XI. of the 15th Schedule to the *Local Government Act* 1958, entitled "Regulation of Proceedings of Council officers, &c." as are set out hereunder are hereby adopted, namely:

Clauses 4.5 both inclusive, Clauses 8-30 both inclusive, Clauses 32-39 both inclusive, Clauses 41 to 44 both inclusive, Clauses 46 to 51 both inclusive, Clause 53.

- 3. (1) The Council may confirm the minutes of an ordinary or special meeting at that meeting.
- (2) Unless the minutes of any meeting are confirmed at the meeting to which those minutes relate the same shall be confirmed at the next meeting of the Council.
- 4. At every meeting of the Council when the minutes of the preceding meeting have not been confirmed under the last preceding clause the first business thereof shall
 - (a) If a copy of the minutes of the preceding meeting shall have been delivered to each Councillor at least forty-eight hours before such meeting the putting a question for the confirmation of
 - such minutes;
 (b) If a copy of the minutes of such preceding meet ing has not been so delivered, the reading and putting a question for the confirmation of such minutes.

No discussion shall be permitted on such minutes except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings, and the said minutes shall then be signed as by law required.

- 5. (1) After the confirmation of the minutes as provided for in clause 4 hereof and the signing thereof as by law required, the business of an ordinary meeting shall be as follows or as near thereto as may be practicable, but for the greater convenience of the Council at any particular meeting thereof it may be altered by resolution to that effect:—
 - (i) Resumption of debate on motions or orders of
 - the day lapsed at previous meeting.

 (ii) Reading the summary of correspondence referred to in clause 6 hereof and considering and ordering thereon.
 - (iii) Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.(iv) Presentation of reports and the authorizing of

 - (v) Ordinary business not elsewhere included.
 (vi) Orders of the day, including subjects continued from proceedings of former meetings.
 (vii) Extraordinary business not elsewhere included.
 - (viii) Other motions of which previous notice has been
 - given.
 - (ix) Notices of motion.
- (2) The order of business at a special meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice
- 6. The Town Clerk shall prepare and shall place before each meeting of the Council a summary of correspondence received since the last preceding meeting of the Council.
- 7. All notices of motion (where notice of motion is required by law to be given) shall be dated and numbered and given by the intending mover to the Town Clerk at the close of the meeting of Council, or at such time before the next meeting of the Council as will permit the Town Clerk to give notice thereof in the manner and in the time required for special meetings, and such clerk shall enter the same in the notice of motion book in the order in which they may be received. in which they may be received.
- 8. (1) A motion moved at a meeting of the Council need not be reduced into writing by the mover unless the Chairman of the meeting so directs.
- (2) The Town Clerk shall cause to be recorded in the rough minutes all motions moved and seconded at a meeting of the Council.
- 9. (1) It shall not be necessary to keep minutes of the proceedings of any Committee.
- (2) All reports of Committees shall contain a recommendation to the Council on the matters considered.
- 10. The mover of every original proposition at any Council meeting but not of any amendment shall (if he has not spoken on any amendment proposed to such original proposition) have a right of reply to be exercised original proposition) have a right of reply to be exercised at the conclusion of the debate (including debate on any such amendment), but save as aforesaid no Councillors shall be allowed to speak more than once on the same question unless permission be given to explain or unless for the purpose of calling the attention of the Chair to a point of order. For the purposes of this clause a proposition shall be deemed to be an original proposition even although any amendment thereto has been carried.
- 11. Every petition presented to the Council shall be in writing (other than in pencil), typing or printing, and shall contain the prayer of the petitioners at the end thereof, and shall be signed by at least one petitioner on every sheet on which it is written.
- 12. (1) Subject as is hereinafter provided, plans and specifications for any public work shall be laid before the Council at least six days prior to the same being considered and ordered upon, and be open for inspection by any ratepayer during that time.
