MILK DISTRICT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the *Milk Board Act 1958* and all other powers enabling me in that behalf, do by this my Proclamation declare the municipal district and parts of municipal districts specified hereunder to be a Milk District under the name specified therefor.

THE EAST GIPPSLAND MILK DISTRICT.

To comprise the whole of the municipal district of the City of Sale

and the parts, as specified, of the following municipal districts:—

Shire of Maffra—

All that portion within the Parishes of Tinambra, Maffra, Wa-de-lock, Briagolong, Stratford and Bundalaguah.

Shire of Rosedale—

All that portion within the Parishes of Rosedale and Winnindoo.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this second day of April, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and sixty-three, and in the twelfth year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the *Milk Board Act 1958* and all other powers enabling me in that behalf, do by this my Proclamation declare the municipal districts and parts of municipal districts specified hereunder to be Milk Districts under the names specified therefor.

THE WESTERN MILK DISTRICT.

To comprise the whole of each of the following municipal districts:—

City of Colac,

City of Warrnambool,

Town of Camperdown;

Borough of Port Fairy,

and the parts as specified of the following municipal districts:—

Shire of Hampden—

All that portion within the Parishes of Terang and Glenormiston.

Shire of Mortlake—

All that portion within the Parish of Mortlake.

Shire of Colac—

All that portion of the Parish of Elliminyt bounded by the boundary of the City of Colac, Forrest-street, Harris-road and Dean's Creek-road.

THE EAST GIPPSLAND MILK DISTRICT.

(Extension of Area.)

To the areas previously proclaimed as comprising the East Gippsland Milk District there shall be added the parts as specified of the following municipal district:—

Shire of Bairnsdale—

All that portion within the Parishes of Bairnsdale, Moormung, Coongulmerang, Wuk Wuk, Wy Yung, Sarsfield and Broadlands.
