AREA OF LAND COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1958* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1958*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6), shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1958* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 3 and 6 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1958* aforesaid, to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

LAND USE DETERMINATION.

Plan No. 1044.

IN pursuance of the provisions of section 23, sub-section 1, of the *Soil Conservation and Land Utilization Act 1958* (No. 6372) and after consultation with the Land Utilization Advisory Council, the Soil Conservation Authority has determined land-use for all that area of land within the Upper Barwon Water Supply Catchment delineated and distinctively marked on plan No. 1044; the original of which is lodged at the Head Office of the Soil Conservation Authority. All land within this area shall be used in accordance with the provisions of the particular category of land-use to which each area has been assigned.

The provisions of each of the land-use categories determined for this area are set out hereunder:

1. Land which should be permanently used for forest purposes, where forestry operations should be carried out under the supervision and control of the Forests Commission acting as agent for the Authority.

2. Land which should be permanently used for forest purposes where forestry operations cannot be practised with mechanical means because of excessive slopes and inaccessibility, or where logging can only be carried out by winch, any such forestry operations to be conducted by the Forests Commission.

3. Land which may be used for forest purposes or which, subject to approval by the Authority, may be developed for grazing or agricultural purposes under conditions imposed according to particular circumstances, such conditions to include—

- (a) the degree of clearing permissible,
- (b) the specification of areas where timber shall be retained.

4. Land which carries non-productive timber, scrub, bracken or other protective vegetation cover on which there shall be no change in land-use except with the approval of and under conditions imposed by the Authority.

5. Land which may be used for grazing or for agricultural purposes subject to conditions imposed by the Authority for particular circumstances.

6. Land within 5 chains of the full supply level of the West Barwon Reservoir and within 5 chains of the West Barwon River for 10 chains upstream from full supply level of the reservoir, where no forestry or agricultural operations shall be permitted, and where there shall be no change in land-use except with the approval of and under conditions imposed by the Authority.

7. Land which may be used for residential purposes subject to provisions of other relevant Acts.

8. Land reserved for roads and other public purposes on which any changes from the existing nature and conditions shall be made only after consultation with the Authority.

9. Land within one half-chain, or such greater distance as the Authority may specify from streams, channels and off-takes on which land-use shall be subject to conditions imposed by the Authority, where removal of trees will not be permitted except if considered necessary by the Authority because of interference to the stream flow, but in no circumstances shall permission be given for—

- (a) cropping,
- (b) erection of buildings.

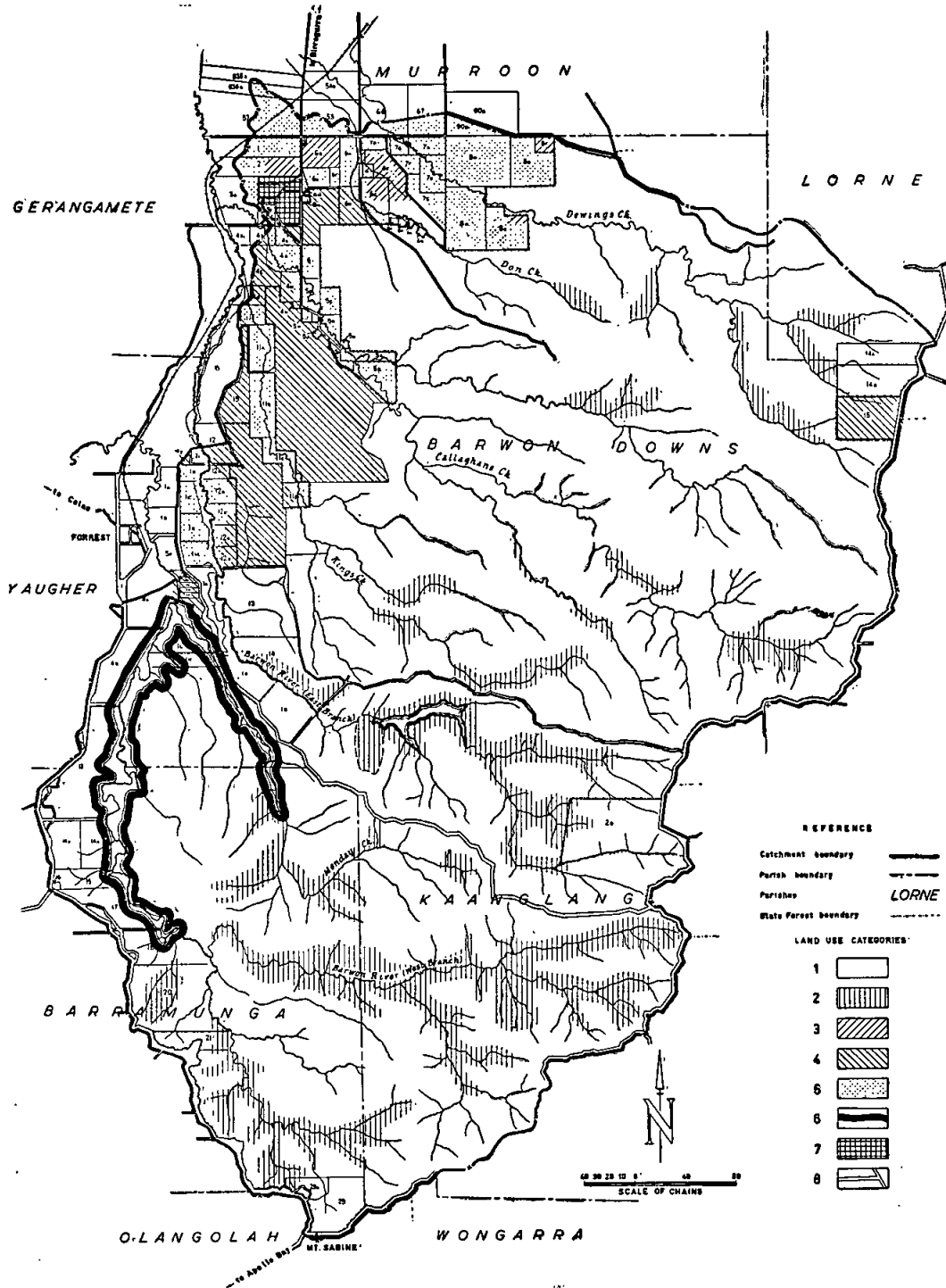

PORTLAND WATERWORKS TRUST.

The charge for water supplied by measure shall be payable, on demand, at the office of the Trust.

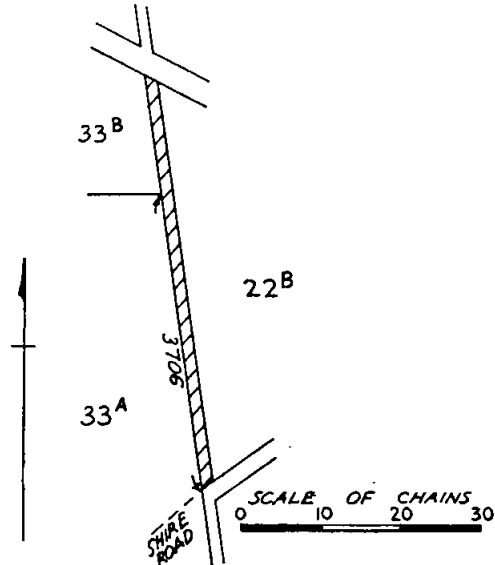

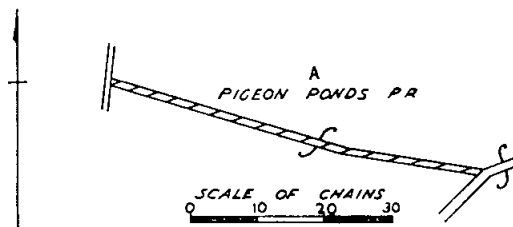

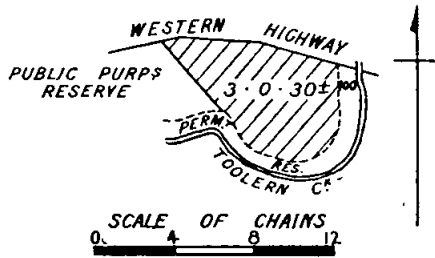

- (a) regulating the keeping of animals and birds;
- (b) fixing the distance from any dwelling within which it shall be lawful to keep any animal or bird;
- (c) regulating the keeping of poultry; and
- (d) providing for the health of residents in the municipal district against the spreading of contagious or infectious diseases and for other purposes.

THE Mayor, Councillors and Citizens of the City of Geelong West, pursuant to the powers conferred by the *Health Act*, the *Local Government Act* and every other power enabling it in that behalf order as follows:—

Part I.

(1) This By-law shall apply and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district except to premises registered as a poultry killing premises and poultry sale-yards when so exempt, in writing, by the Council.

(2) In this By-law unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—

- (a) "animal" shall not include cats but include "specified animals";
- (b) "battery cage" means a wire and mesh metal cage divided into one or more compartments in which poultry is kept;
- (c) "dwelling" shall include a dwelling house and any living room, building, structure, caravan, sleepout or tent used for sleeping, living or cooking;
- (d) "mature bird" means a bird aged more than three (3) months;
- (e) "person" includes the owner or occupier or the person in charge of the premises;
- (f) "pen" shall mean an area enclosed by fences or walls, whether roofed or not, not exceeding 200 square feet;
- (g) "poultry" includes fowls, turkeys, ducks and geese;
- (h) "poultry farm" means any premises in which there is kept at any time a greater number of mature birds than twenty-five (25);
- (i) "residential area" means any area zoned as residential under any Town Planning Act; and
- (j) "specified animal" includes any horse or other beast of draught or burden or any cattle or any sheep or goat.

(3) By-law No. 46 of the City of Geelong West shall be amended by deleting clause 8 therefrom.

(4) By-law No. 51 of the City of Geelong West shall be amended by deleting clause 11 of Part VI. therefrom.

Part II.

(1) No person shall keep or cause or permit or suffer to be kept—

- (a) any animal housed, secured, chained, fastened or in any pen so as to be at a nearer distance than 30 feet from any dwelling;
- (b) more than one specified animal in the yard of or attached to any dwelling the area of which yard is less than 500 square feet;
- (c) more than two specified animals in the yard of or attached to any dwelling the area of which yard is less than 1,000 square feet;
- (d) more than four specified animals in the yard of or attached to any dwelling, the area of which yard is less than 1,500 square feet;
- (e) more than six specified animals in the yard of or attached to any dwelling; and
- (f) more than six animals on any land zoned as residential under the Town and Country Planning Acts without the previous consent, in writing, of the Council having been first had and obtained.

(2) No person shall keep or cause or permit or suffer to be kept any animal or bird in any dwelling in the yard of or attached to any dwelling or on any land whatsoever in such manner as to be offensive or injurious to health or dangerous.

(3) The occupier of the yard of or attached to any dwelling or any other land in which any animal or bird is kept or housed shall cause the place of keeping of such animal or bird to be maintained in a good state of repair, thoroughly cleaned, drained and treated so as to keep such place in a clean, wholesome and sanitary state and condition and free from rats or other vermin.

Part III.

(1) No person shall keep or cause or permit or suffer to be kept on any premises in a residential area a number of fowls greater than twenty-five (25) mature birds.

(2) No person shall keep in any poultry house or similar structure a number of fowls greater than the number produced by dividing the area in square feet of such poultry house or similar structure by four unless confined in an improved battery cage.

(3) No person shall keep or cause or permit or suffer to be kept on any one property in a residential area more than two (2) turkeys, ducks or geese.

(4) No person shall keep any poultry in any premises in a residential area otherwise than in a poultry house or similar structure or enclosure or battery cage unless such poultry house—

- (a) is roofed with galvanized iron fibro cement or other approved material and paved with concrete or other approved impervious material;
- (b) is so constructed as to prevent water from draining on to the floor thereof;
- (c) is so constructed and maintained as to be rat proof;
- (d) is distant at least eighty (80) feet from the boundary of the street or road to which the premises has a frontage;
- (e) is distant at least twenty (20) feet from any other street or road of a greater width than twenty-five (25) feet;
- (f) is distant at least four (4) feet from any other street or road of a lesser width than twenty-five (25) feet or from the boundary of any adjoining allotment of land;
- (g) is distant at least forty (40) feet from any dwelling.

(5) Every battery cage system in which poultry is kept in a residential area shall have a permanent roof and any walls to be constructed of approved materials and having a floor raised at least three (3) inches above the level of the surrounding ground.

Part IV.

These provisions shall apply to all premises on which poultry are kept except those exempted by Part I. (1).

(1) The owner or occupier shall keep the area of land within five (5) feet of any fowl house similar structure, enclosure or battery cage system free from all dry grass, weeds, refuse or other materials capable of harbouring rats or other vermin.

(2) The owner or occupier shall cause the poultry house, similar structure or enclosure or battery cage system to be thoroughly cleaned from time to time as often as may be necessary and shall keep the same in a clean wholesome and sanitary condition at all times and free from rats and other vermin.

(3) No person shall keep or store or cause or permit to be kept or stored on any property where poultry is kept any food for consumption by poultry unless such food is kept or stored in rat-proof receptacles or rat-proof buildings.

(4) Poultry droppings, litter and refuse shall be moved from the premises from time to time or as the Council directs so as not to cause a nuisance or offensive condition.

(5) Any person guilty of any contravention of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds and in the case of any offence continuing after such conviction, to a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds, but so that the total of such penalties shall not exceed One hundred pounds.

A By-law of the City of Melbourne made under Part VII. Division 1 of the *Local Government Act 1958*, and numbered 434 for the adoption of the provisions of Part VI. of the Fifteenth Schedule of the said Act and for other purposes.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1958*, the Council of the City of Melbourne doth order as follows:—

1. By-law No. 126 intituled "A By-law of the City of Melbourne made under Sub-section 1 of section 197 of the

Local Government Act 1903 and numbered 126 for the adoption of the provisions of Part VI. of the Thirteenth Schedule of the said Act" is hereby repealed.

2. The provisions of Part VI. of the Fifteenth Schedule to the *Local Government Act 1958* are hereby adopted viz:—

(1) Every occupier of any hall or other building used for public meetings, or of any building, or any ground in which public amusements are conducted, shall in each year register at the office of the Council such building or ground, together with the situation and description thereof and the purpose being such as aforesaid for which the same is to be kept, and the name of such occupier and every person who causes and every occupier of any such premises who permits any public meeting to be held or any public amusement to be conducted in or on any such premises not being registered for the purpose or without such certificate of registration as hereinafter mentioned having been obtained for the same shall forfeit for every such offence a sum not exceeding Ten pounds.

(2) The Council, upon the written application of any such occupier as aforesaid stating the particulars aforesaid, may if upon inspection by the proper officer the premises have been found to be secure and proper for the purpose stated, and if the Council see fit, cause the premises to be registered in the registry book to be kept for that purpose, and shall thereupon grant to the applicant a certificate of such registration of such premises in the appointed form and the Council may at any time suspend for a stated period the effect of or cancel any such registration, and shall forthwith give notice of such suspension or cancellation to the occupier of the registered premises, and during such suspension or after such cancellation such premises shall be deemed to be unregistered in respect of the purpose mentioned in the certificate of registration, and such certificate shall be of no force or virtue.

(3) The proper officer of the Council may at all reasonable times enter and inspect any such registered premises as aforesaid.

(4) It shall be lawful for the Council from time to time to make Regulations for appointing the times and hours during or at which respectively any such registered building or ground or any public building registered with the Commission of Public Health under the *Health Act 1958* shall be used for the purpose for which it is registered or shall be closed; and every occupier of any such premises who permits the same to be used for such purpose during or at any other time or after any such hour respectively shall for every such offence forfeit a sum not exceeding One hundred pounds.

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the City of Melbourne.

6. Any person guilty of an offence under clause 4 hereof shall be liable to a penalty of not less than Five pounds nor more than Twenty pounds.
7. Any person guilty of a continuing offence against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of not more than £5 for each day on which an offence against this By-law is continued after a conviction or order is imposed or made on or against such person by any court.
8. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.
