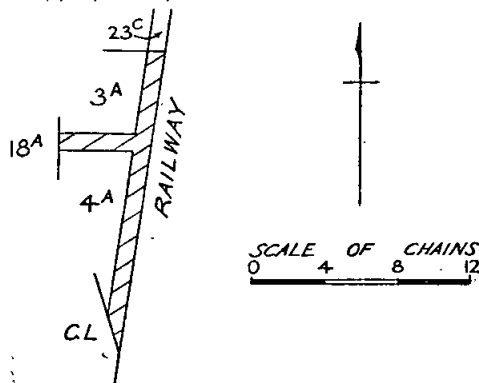

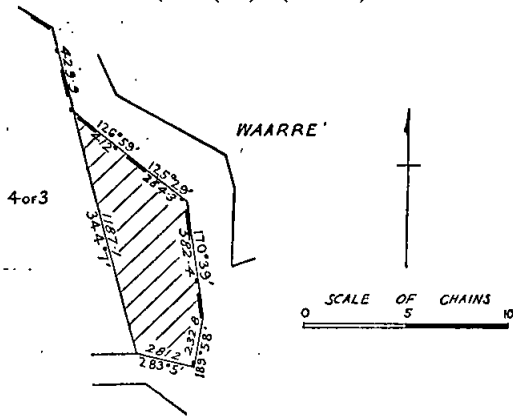

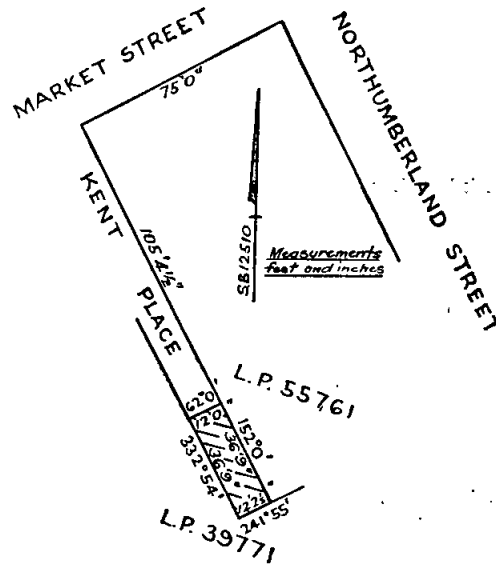
ROAD DISCONTINUED.—CITY OF SOUTH MELBOURNE.

MAIN ROAD IN THE SHIRE OF OXLEY.

WHEREAS:

I. Section 114 of the *Country Roads Act 1958* (herein called "the Act") provides (*inter alia*) in—

- (a) sub-section (1) thereof that the powers conferred upon municipal councils by Division 14 of Part XIX. of the *Local Government Act 1958* shall so far as applicable be conferred upon the Country Roads Board (herein called "the Board") so far as relates to the declaration of the alignment the widening and opening up of main roads and that the provisions of the said Division shall with certain modifications extend and apply accordingly;
- (b) sub-section (2) thereof that no main road shall be widened or opened up pursuant to the said section unless the Governor in Council has by Order published in the *Government Gazette* approved such widening or opening up.

II. The Board has—

- (a) in exercise of the powers conferred upon it by the said section 114 and for the purpose of widening the Wangaratta-Whitfield road in the Shire of Oxley (declared by the Board pursuant to the Act or some corresponding previous enactment to be a main road which declaration was confirmed by an Order of the Governor in Council published in the *Government Gazette* of the 5th October, 1932, at page 2256 thereof) by Resolution dated the 30th day of April, 1962, fixed a new alignment for the west side of the said Wangaratta-Whitfield road;
- (b) in accordance with the provisions of section 19 of the Act caused to be prepared a map plan and estimate showing—
- (i) the points between which and the lands on and through which the said widening is proposed to be made; and
- (ii) the cost of acquiring the land.

III. The Governor in Council is satisfied that there are funds legally available for acquiring the said land.

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria with the advice of the Executive Council thereof by this Order approves for the purposes of sections 20 and 114 of the Act—

- (a) the widening of the said Wangaratta-Whitfield road so as to include therein the land described in the Schedule hereto; and

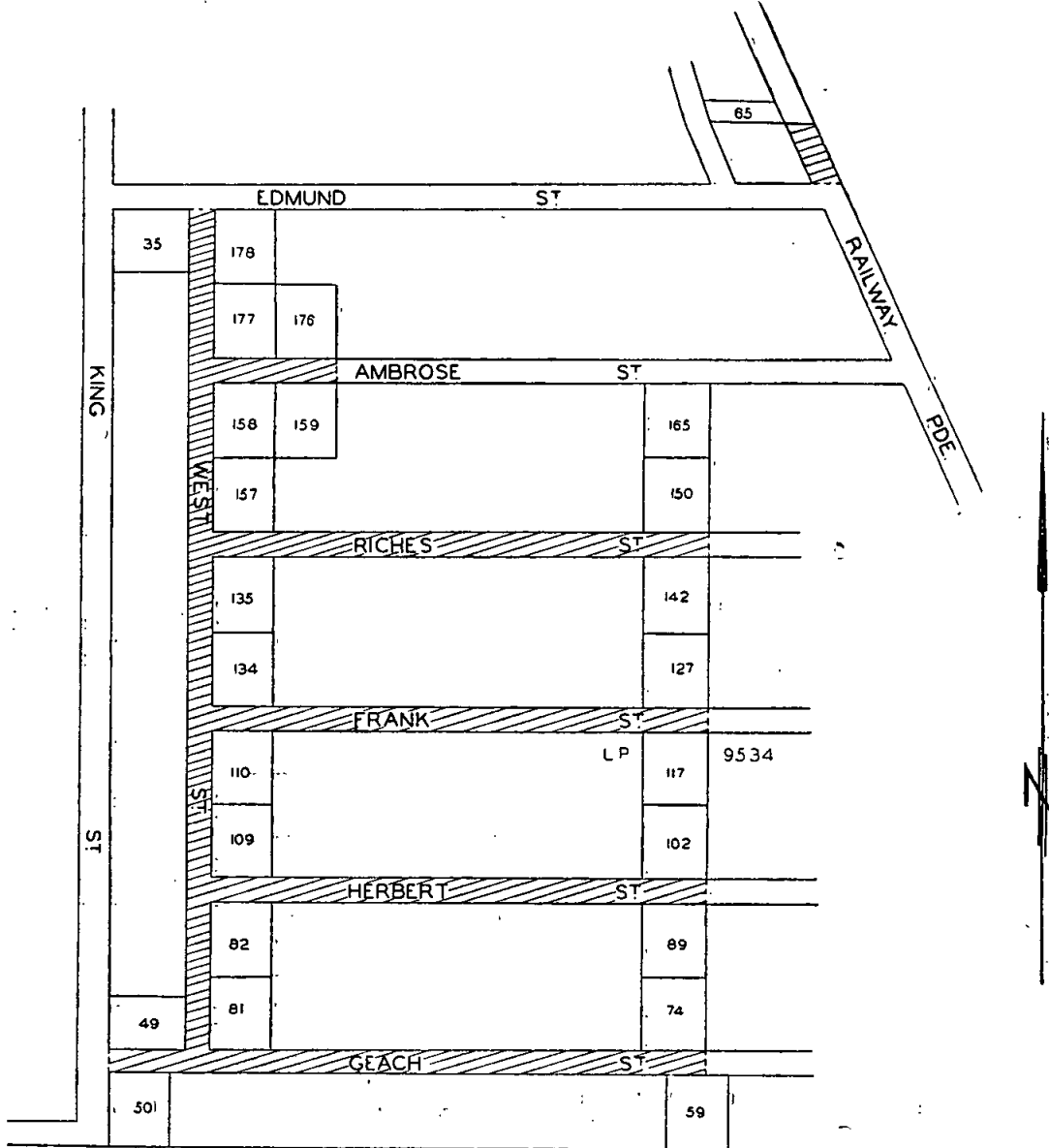

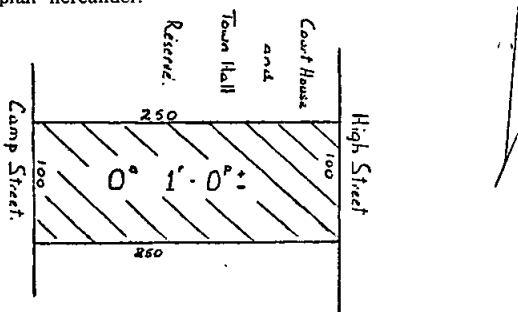

REGULATIONS.

- No unauthorized person shall interfere with, move, damage, or destroy any shrub, tree, plant, grass, flowers, or any property or enter on any flower beds or borders or light fires within the Reserves.
- No person shall throw stones or missiles of any kind within the Reserves.
- No person shall discharge firearms within the Reserves without the permission, in writing, of the Psychiatrist Superintendent or Secretary of the Hospital.
- No unauthorized person shall climb on any portion of any building, bulstrade, fence, or property in the Reserves or jump over any fence or ledge thereon.
- No person shall, without the permission of the Psychiatrist Superintendent or Secretary of the Hospital, affix any placard, bill, notice, or marking of any kind on any building, structure, tree, constructed surface, or anything within the Reserves nor shall any person without a like permission interfere with any such placard, bill, notice, or marking.
- No person shall enter or travel over the Reserves with or on any bicycle or vehicles or any kind of animal, except on such portions thereof provided for wheeled traffic, and the driver of any such vehicle or the driver or rider of any such bicycle or animal shall be guided and directed and shall abide by any notice, post, or sign marking, or barrier guide which has been marked or erected for the purpose of traffic guidance, control or direction.

7. No person shall ride or drive a bicycle, motor cycle, motor car, or other motor driven vehicle, or any other type of vehicle within the Reserves, recklessly, or at a speed or in a manner which is dangerous to the public, or to the members of the staff of the Hospitals or to the inmates thereof, having regard to all the circumstances of the case, including the nature, condition, and use of the Reserves and to the amount of traffic, wheeled, vehicular, or pedestrian which actually is at the time or which might reasonably be expected to be in the Reserves.

8. No person shall park any bicycle, motor cycle or vehicle of any kind in such manner as to interfere in any way with or obstruct the free passage of any other person or vehicles within the Reserves.

9. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or seats or any wall, structure or property within the Reserves.

10. No person in the state of intoxication or who is disorderly or is not decorously dressed shall enter or remain in the Reserves and no person shall commit therein any nuisance or any indecent or offensive act.

11. No person shall remain in the Reserves or any property therein when lawfully directed to leave the same by a bailiff of Crown lands, or member of the Police Force, or any members of the staff of the Hospitals authorized in that behalf by the Psychiatrist Superintendent or Secretary thereof.

12. No person shall camp in the Reserve or erect therein any building or booth for the purpose of offering for sale any article.

13. No person shall hawk or sell or offer for sale within the Reserves any goods, fruit, or merchandise, or anything, or solicit or gather money therein without the authority, in writing, of the Medical Superintendent of such Hospital.

14. No person shall give out or distribute any handbills, placards, notices, advertisements, books, pamphlets, or papers in the Reserves or litter the same by scattering or throwing down handbills, placards, notices, advertisements, books, pamphlets or papers.

15. No person shall bring into the Reserves any dog unless securely held and controlled by a chair or cord or leash.

16. No person shall bring in or allow to remain in the Reserves any horse, cow, sheep, pig or goat. Any such animal found wandering therein shall be liable to be impounded or destroyed.

17. No person except on lawful occasions may enter any enclosed area or any building, garage, or shed, or other structure within the Reserves.

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 218 of the *Land Act 1958*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist therefrom, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "CRIB POINT FORESHORE RESERVE".

WHEREAS by section 218 of the *Land Act 1958* power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the Land Acts for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the power conferred aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land in the Parish of Bittern temporarily reserved by Orders in Council of the 10th November, 1927, and the 23rd September, 1958, as a site for Public purposes and known as the "Crib Point Foreshore Reserve" (hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve").

The Reserve has been placed under control of a Committee of Management (hereinafter referred to as the "Committee") with power and authority to enforce these Regulations.

REGULATIONS.

1. Upon the coming into operation of these Regulations, all previous Regulations made by the Board of Land and Works in respect of the reserve shall be rescinded.

2. Definition: "Reserve" includes the beaches, contiguous with the Foreshore Reserve.

3. No person shall enter or remain on the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language or conduct.

4. (a) Every person bathing or sunbathing from or on the Reserve shall be decently attired.

(b) No person shall remain in or on the Reserve if in the opinion of the Beach Inspector he or she is not decently attired.

5. The Committee may at any time which it considers desirable appoint any suitable person or persons as Beach Inspectors for the purpose of these Regulations and may remove such person or persons as and when it thinks fit. Beach Inspectors shall be appointed in writing signed by the Chairman and the Secretary of the Committee.

6. No person shall enter or leave the Reserve except by means of the roads, paths or other carriageways provided and no person shall climb the cliffs in the Reserve.

7. No person shall damage or in any way interfere with the trees, shrubs, marram grass, or flowers, in the Reserve.

8. No person shall in any way injure any buildings, fences or seats in the Reserve.

9. No person shall deposit or cause to be deposited or leave wastepaper, bottles, tins, broken glass, garbage or litter of any kind on any part of the Reserve except in the appropriate receptacles provided for the purpose.

10. No person shall remove from the Reserve any gravel, stone, shellgrit, sand, loam, or seaweed without written permission first obtained from the Secretary of the Committee.

11. No person shall cut, sow, dig, move or displace any tree, bough, live or dead timber, wood or other material which may be in or around the Reserve without written permission first obtained from the Secretary of the committee.

12. No person shall commit a nuisance in any public or private bathing-box, toilet, boatshed or other building or erection on the Reserve.

13. No person shall carry or discharge any firearm, air-gun or other lethal weapon in the Reserve.

14. No person shall shoot trap or destroy any birds or native game within the Reserve.

15. No person shall bring into the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats or other animal without the written permission first obtained from the Secretary of the Committee.

16. (a) No person, without the consent in writing of the Committee, shall cause or suffer or knowingly permit any dog belonging to him, or in his charge, to enter or remain on the "Foreshore Reserve" unless such dog be and continues to be under proper control on a chain, cord or leash, and be effectively restrained from causing annoyance to any person, or from damaging or interfering in any way with the property of the said Committee. No person shall bring on to the "Foreshore Reserve" any dog for training or exercising for coursing or other purposes of sport.

(b) And dog found in the Reserve, except as provided in these Regulations, shall be liable to be seized, and the owner or any person having the custody of any dog so found shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations and may be required to make compensation for any damage done to the property of the said Committee by such dog.

17. No person shall light or cause to be lighted any fire or burn any material in the Reserve without the written consent of the Secretary or the Ranger first obtained.

18. No person shall erect any bathing-box, boathouse, shed, kiosk or any other building, structure or erection or booth on any site on the Reserve without the permission in writing of the Committee first obtained and such permission may be granted subject to such terms, fees and conditions as may be deemed reasonable and advisable by the Committee consistent with these Regulations but no person shall use or cause to be used or knowingly permit to be used any such bathing-box, boathouse, shed or other building, structure or erection or booth for residential purposes.

19. The Committee may, subject to the payment of a fee prescribed by it, allow the transfer of any permit, but no person shall sublet any site or structure without the permission in writing of the Committee first obtained.

20. The granting, withdrawal, renewal, or allowance of the transfer of any permit or subletting of any site or structure shall at all times be at the absolute discretion of the Committee.

21. The Committee shall have full power to order the removal from the Reserve of any bathing-box, boathouse, shed or other building, structure, erection or booth which has been placed, erected, or established without its consent, or which has not been properly erected or properly painted or which in its opinion has not been satisfactorily maintained or kept in repair or in respect of which the term of permission for the use of the site has expired or the permission to use the site for a building or buildings has expired or been withdrawn.

22. No person shall neglect or refuse to remove any bathing-box, boathouse, shed or other building, structure, erection, or booth erected or placed by him on any site in or on the Reserve within fourteen (14) days after the Committee has sent by registered post to his last-known address, a notice requiring such person to remove such bathing-box, boathouse, shed or any other building, structure, erection or booth. Such notice may be signed by either the Chairman or Secretary for the time being of the said Committee.

23. In the event of any such neglect or refusal as above mentioned continuing after the expiration of the said fourteen (14) days the Committee may remove such bathing-box, boathouse, shed or any other building, structure, erection or booth and recover the cost and/or expense of such removal from the person so neglecting or refusing to remove the same but without prejudice to proceedings by way of information for breach of these Regulations being taken against such person so neglecting or refusing.

Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection or enclosure, on the occasions of any fêtes, carnivals, regattas, sports or holiday amusements, may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee may at any time determine not exceeding £50, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection or enclosure, and such Committee, in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection or enclosure or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee.

25. No person shall offer for sale any article within the Reserve or within any structure thereon without the written permission of the Secretary for the Committee first obtained.

26. No person shall drive or ride any animal or motor vehicle within the Reserve in a manner likely to cause injury to any person.

27. (a) No person shall drive on to the Reserve or park thereon any motor car or motor cycle or other vehicle except at such places as are set apart for this purpose by the Committee.

(b) No person shall drive a motor car, motor cycle, bicycle or other vehicle on the sands of the beach without permission in writing of the Committee first obtained.

(c) No person shall drive any motor car, motor cycle, or other vehicle on the Reserve at a speed greater than 15 miles per hour.

28. No person shall park or leave any motor car, motor cycle, or other vehicle on any part of the Reserve except in an area set apart for the purpose by the Committee.

29. The Committee may set apart any portion or portions of the Reserve as a place for parking vehicles.

30. The Committee may fix such fees not exceeding, motor cycles Two shillings (2s.), motor cars Four shillings (4s.), buses Fifteen shillings (15s.) per day, season tickets Twenty shillings (20s.), as it thinks fit as fees for parking of vehicles in any place set apart within the Reserve for the parking of vehicles. This fee may be collected on entry to the Reserve or at any other place in the Reserve appointed by the Committee.

31. Every person who parks a vehicle in the place set apart for the parking of vehicles shall pay to the Committee or its authorized representatives on demand such fee as has been fixed by the Committee pursuant to these Regulations as the fee for parking in such place.

32. Every person bringing a vehicle into the Reserve shall obey the reasonable direction of the Committee or its authorized representatives in relation to the driving or parking of such vehicles within the Reserve.

33. No person shall play any game or throw any object which in the opinion of the Beach Inspector or Ranger may constitute a danger or nuisance to any other person using the beach area.

34. No person shall play, practise or engage in any organized game or sport within the Reserve unless by consent of the Committee.

35. No person shall bring in or on the Reserve or use any diving stand made of iron or other metal or materials.

36. All persons using the conveniences provided by the Committee on the Reserve shall pay such charges for the use of the same as shall from time to time be made by the Committee.

37. No assemblies for fêtes, carnivals, regattas, concerts, or for the purpose of public worship, preaching or public speaking of any kind, or meetings of a like character, shall take place on the Reserve without the permission in writing of the Committee first obtained.

38. Every person holding or purporting to hold any receipt or permission in writing issued by the Committee shall, on demand by any member of the Committee, or the properly appointed servant of such Committee or any member of the Police Force, or any bailiff of Crown lands, produce such receipt or permission in writing.

39. The Committee may set apart portion of the Reserve as and for the purposes of a children's playground.

40. No person shall drive or park a motor vehicle of any kind within twenty-five (25) yards of the children's playground.

41. No person above the age of fourteen (14) years shall use or play with any of the swings, fixtures or other equipment erected or provided in the children's playground.

42. No person shall leave or deposit any fish or fish offal on the Reserve.

43. No person shall moor and/or use any boat on the Reserve without the permission of the Committee in writing, first obtained.

44. No person shall on any portion of the Reserve cause or permit any outcry, sound or noise to be emitted from any amplifier, loudspeaker, public address system or like instrument without first obtaining the written permission of the committee and such permission may be granted subject to such terms, conditions and restrictions as may be imposed by the Committee.

45. No person shall camp or erect any tent or other structure on any site or portion of the Reserve except on such site or portion as may be especially set apart for the purpose and then only with the consent in writing of the Committee or its appointed officer and on payment of such fees (in advance) and subject to such conditions as the Committee may determine.

46. Any person erecting any structure, tent or shelter or parking a caravan in any camping area shall abide by any directions as may be given by the Committee or its duly appointed officer.

47. No person, other than a person desirous of holidaying on any area set apart for camping in the Reserve, shall bring a caravan therein or erect a tent thereon and then only for a period of not more than 26 weeks at any one time nor shall any person sublet such caravan, tent or camping site.

48. The person to whom permission is issued by the Committee or its authorized officer to use a site in a camping area shall be deemed to be the person who erected on such site any structure, tent or shelter or who parked a caravan pursuant to such permission and such person shall keep the site thus occupied in such camping area in a clean, sanitary and tidy condition and before vacating such site shall collect and place in the receptacle provided for the purpose all refuse, litter or garbage from the site.

49. Any permission issued by the Committee or its authorized officer to a person for use of a camping area or for any other purpose may be cancelled or withdrawn by such Committee or its authorized officer and subsequent to such cancellation or withdrawal a proportionate refund of any fees or charges paid in advance shall be refunded and such Committee or its authorized officer at its or his discretion may deduct and retain from any such proportionate refund a sum as it or he determines will be necessary to clear up and put in order the site vacated.—(Rs.3572.)

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall in accordance with the provisions of section 218 of the *Land Act 1958*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force does not desist therefrom, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "VICTORIA PARK" RESERVE.

WHEREAS by section 218 of the *Land Act 1958* power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the Land Acts for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the power conferred aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land in the Township of Shepparton, Parish of Shepparton, permanently reserved by Orders in Council dated 3rd October, 1932, 21st January, 1937, and the remaining portion of the land permanently reserved by Order in Council dated 16th August, 1937, as a site for a Public Park, and known as "Victoria Park", Shepparton, hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve". The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management hereinafter referred to as the "Committee".

REGULATIONS.

1. Upon the coming into operation of these Regulations, the Regulations made by the Board of Land and Works in respect of the Reserve on the 18th of October, 1961, shall be rescinded.

2. The Reserve shall be open to the public free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding 24 in any one year), as the Reserve may be set apart for fêtes, regattas, carnivals, or sports, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Four shillings may be charged for the admission of each adult person and a sum not exceeding Two shillings may be charged for each juvenile person to the Reserve. Provided that any person desirous of occupying a caravan site in the Reserve shall pay such fees set out in the permit referred to in clause 42 hereof.

3. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language or conduct.

4. No person shall while in an uncleanly condition or suffering from any cutaneous, infectious or contagious disease enter or remain in the Reserve.

5. No person shall climb on any of the buildings, fences or gates in the Reserve or in any manner deface, damage, or interfere with any buildings, fences, gates, structures, fixtures, fittings, equipment, posts, trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve.

6. No person shall enter plots or enclosures set aside as plantations for trees, flowers, plants or shrubs, nor shall any person trespass or walk upon or over any flower bed or shrubbery except with the permission of the Committee.

7. No person shall damage or unlawfully remove or interfere with or dig or cut away any embankment, road, path, wall or earth-work, or any part thereof, in the Reserve.

8. No person shall unlawfully remove, damage or interfere with any lifebuoy or other life-saving device, apparatus, equipment or the structures, erections or fittings for the housing or holding of any lifebuoy, life-saving device, apparatus or equipment.

9. No person unless authorized by the rules of a sporting club or body shall enter upon any building, erection or enclosure now or hereafter set aside by the Committee for the exclusive use of such sporting club or body unless with the permission of the Committee.

10. No person shall destroy any bird, water fowl, or fauna in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained. Provided that nothing herein contained shall be construed as prohibiting persons duly licensed for the purpose from fishing in the lake in the Reserve.

11. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, nor shall any persons being in charge of a dog allow such dog to remain in the Reserve. All dogs found in the Reserve shall be liable to be seized by the police or by any employee or honorary inspector of the Committee and dealt with as prescribed by the Dog Act 1958.

12. No person shall light any fire or allow a fire to be lit or allow a fire to remain alight in the Reserve except in such places approved by the Committee.

13. No person shall throw, deposit, put or leave any bottle, glass, carton, packet, paper, vegetable matter or other waste, rubbish or refuse in the swimming pool or any other part of the Reserve except in receptacles provided for the purpose of holding rubbish.

14. No person shall wilfully, carelessly or negligently foul or pollute the water in the swimming pool or in any other part of the Reserve.

15. No person shall expectorate in the Reserve nor spout water from the mouth nor blow the nose whilst in the swimming pool in the Reserve.

16. No person shall immerse, rinse or wash any garment or wearing apparel (including nursery napkins) or cloth fabric of any description in the swimming pool provided that this clause does not apply to any garment while such garment is being worn by a bather.

17. No person shall use soap or any other form of detergent in the swimming pool.

18. No person shall enter or attempt to enter any shower recess or convenience occupied by any other person save with the consent of such other person.

19. No male over the age of four years shall enter any dressing room, shower, convenience, or approach thereto reserved for the use of females.

20. No female shall enter any dressing room, shower, convenience or approach thereto reserved for the use of males.

21. No person shall enter upon any of the stagings, landings, platforms, steps or diving boards at the swimming pool save for the purpose of entering or leaving the water or officiating in connexion with races or aquatic sports.

22. No person shall throw stones, sticks or missiles of any kind in the Reserve. Neither shall any person play cricket or other ball game in the Reserve to the danger of other persons in the Reserve; nor play any ball game in the swimming pool in the Reserve or on the sandy beach, lawn areas or land adjacent to such swimming pool except with the permission of the Committee.

23. No person shall drive any motor vehicle nor ride any motor-cycle or bicycle in the Reserve at a speed or in a manner dangerous to the public and in no case shall such speed exceed 10 miles per hour.

24. No person shall bring into or drive any semi-trailer or commercial truck in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee, provided that this clause does not apply to those motor vehicles known as utilities.

25. No person shall park any motor vehicle (including motor-cycles) in any part of the Reserve in such manner as may cause obstruction to other traffic.

26. No person shall drive any motor vehicle nor ride any motor-cycle or bicycle in the Reserve except on the roadways or tracks constructed for vehicular traffic.

27. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals, or permit the same to enter without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained, and any moneys received by the Committee for agistment shall be expended in maintenance and improvement of the Reserve and an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

28. The Committee shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve and shall be deemed to be the occupier of the Reserve with all power incidental to that status, within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle. For the purposes of this clause "cattle" shall mean cattle as defined by section 3 of the Pounds Act 1958.

29. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any kind in the Reserve, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

30. No person shall play, practice, or engage in any organized sport including rowing, swimming, tennis, football, cricket, footracing or any other games, except in portions of the Reserve set apart for that purpose and subject to such terms and conditions as the Committee may determine.

31. No person shall bring into, have in his possession, or consume in the Reserve any intoxicating liquor except with the permission of the Committee.

32. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve whilst in a state of intoxication.

33. No person shall obstruct, disturb, interrupt or annoy any officer or employee or honorary inspector of the Committee in the proper execution of his work and duty.

34. Every person or club using the buildings, rooms, erections or areas provided or erected in the Reserve may be charged such fees and rents for the use thereof as the Committee may from time to time consider reasonable and as shall be consistent with these Regulations. The moneys received in fees and rents shall be expended on the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve and a statement thereof shall be forwarded annually to the Board of Land and Works.

35. Persons renting or hiring any site, watercourse, stand, building, erection or enclosure on the occasions of any fêtes, games, sports or holiday amusements, may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee may determine not exceeding fifty pounds (£50) by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such site, watercourse, stand, building, erection or enclosure and such Committee in its absolute discretion may make good any damage or injury sustained by such site, watercourse, stand, building, erection or enclosure or anything contained therein during such occupancy or hiring and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee. All persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any orders given by the Committee.

36. No person shall publicly address any assembly within the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

37. Any person committing in any part of the Reserve or in any of the buildings, structures or erections for the time being thereon, any of the following offences shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations:—

- (a) Crossing or trespassing on any playing ground, bathing area or watercourse during any sports or during practice by any person or member of any sports club, for the time being occupying the Reserve, or any portion thereof, with the consent of the Committee.
- (b) Behaving improperly or riotously.
- (c) Improperly interfering with or interrupting any sports or holiday amusement or any practice thereat.
- (d) Obtaining admission to any part of the Reserve when not entitled to such admission under these Regulations.

38. Any person, club or society having obtained permission of the Committee to use any dressing shed, pavilion or other structure, watercourse, or enclosure shall maintain and leave the same in a clean and tidy condition. No room fitted with lock and key shall be left unlocked after use.

39. No person shall force open any locked gate or door to any enclosure, room, or building in the Reserve, nor shall any person use any key to open any lock on such gates or doors unless authorized so to do by the Committee.

40. Should any person receive from any member, officer or employee of the Committee any key or keys for the unlocking of any doors or gates in the Reserve, he shall return such key or keys in good order and condition.

41. All keys shall be returned to the caretaker of the Reserve or to the Town Clerk of the City of Shepparton before sunset of the day on which such keys were received, unless otherwise allowed or directed by the Committee.

42. (a) No person shall erect or place in the Reserve any tent, building, shelter, booth or other structure nor bring into the Reserve any motor car, caravan, or other vehicle for the purpose of living therein, and no person shall camp in any tent, building, shelter, structure, motor car, caravan, or other vehicle without the permission, in writing (hereinafter referred to as a "permit"), of the Committee first obtained.

(b) Every person who has obtained a permit or for whom a permit has been issued shall comply with all the conditions prescribed in such permit.

(c) Every permit shall lapse and be deemed null and void on a date specified in such permit, provided that no permit shall be current or effective for a greater period than four weeks from date of issue.

(d) The Committee has the right to—

- (i) refuse the issue of any permit;
- (ii) cancel any permit at any time.

Control of Vessels and Other Purposes.

43. Save for purposes associated with boat usage and water skiing no person shall swim, bathe or enter the water anywhere in the Reserve save for the area set aside as the swimming pool.

44. Where appearing in these Regulations, the word "vessel" shall be deemed to include any boat, yacht, canoe, rowing boat or water craft of whatsoever kind.

45. No person shall launch or take from the water any vessel save from the launching ramps provided.

46. No person in charge of a vessel shall travel in any direction other than clockwise.

47. No person shall navigate or use a vessel or manipulate any water ski, surfboard or similar device carelessly, recklessly or negligently or at such speed or in such manner as will cause annoyance or nuisance or is dangerous to or is likely to cause injury by its wash or otherwise to any person or damage to any property including the banks of the lake.

48. No person shall—

- (a) Navigate or use a mechanically powered vessel;
- (b) Use or manipulate any water ski, surfboard or similar device at a speed greater than 5 miles per hour in any prohibited area as indicated by signs.

49. No person in charge of a vessel overtaking or approaching another vessel which is towing a person on water skis or similar device shall approach within 60 feet of the water skier from any direction whatsoever. For the purposes of this Regulation the position of the water skier shall be deemed to be immediately astern of the towing vessel.

50. No person shall navigate or use a vessel between sunset and sunrise unless there is attached thereto a light with an effective range of not less than 100 feet visible in the direction towards such vessel is travelling, and a red lighted lamp or reflector attached to the rear thereof. Subject to due compliance with the foregoing navigation or use of vessels between the said times is permissible.

51. Any person in charge of a vessel shall make a 360 degree turn to starboard—

- (a) when a skier or skiers or surfboard rider falls, or
- (b) after returning a skier or skiers or surfboard rider to pick up point or other place.

52. All persons in the Reserve shall abide by these Regulations, and by any order consistent therewith given by any authorized officer of the Committee.—(Rs.1081.)

or any municipal council, or the governing body of any corporation, to be a Committee of Management of any specified Crown land reserved either temporarily or permanently for any of the purposes set out in section 14 of the *Land Act 1958*, and not conveyed to or vested in trustees: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works doth hereby appoint the under-mentioned persons to be members of the Committee of Management of the Reserves named:—

"BARMAH RACECOURSE RESERVE."

John Stephen Lawford, Terence O'Brien Tinkler, William Edmund Maloney, Bernard Joseph Maloney and Horace Edward Maloney as a Committee of Management for a period of three (3) years ending the 28th day of August, 1966 of the land temporarily reserved by Orders in Council dated 12th June, 1888, and 7th December, 1891, as sites for a Racecourse and other purposes of Public Recreation in the Parish of Barmah, and known as the "Barmah Racecourse Reserve".—(Corres. If any such owner or occupier shall within the time limited by such notice fail to comply with the requirements thereof, the Council may take such measures as may be reasonably necessary to destroy such noxious weeds at the expense of such owner or occupier and may recover the cost thereof from such owner or occupier as a civil debt recoverable summarily.
