

Soil Conservation and Land Utilization Act 1958. TRAWALLA CREEK WATER SUPPLY CATCHMENT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c.

I THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State and in pursuance of the provisions contained in section 22 of the Soil Conservation and Land Utilization Act 1958, do by this Proclamation define the water supply catchment area to be known as the Trawalla Creek Water Supply Catchment.


The catchment is all that land included within the following boundary:-

Commencing at the junction of Trawalla and Mount Emu Creeks, which is the junction of the Parishes of Livingstone, Beaufort, and Langi-kal-kal, and following the watershed of Trawalla Creek through the Parishes of Beaufort and Raglan to the Great Dividing Range; thence following the said watershed along the Great Dividing Range which forms part of the common boundaries of the Parishes of Amphitheatre and Raglan, and Amphitheatre and Langi-kal-kal, to where the said watershed leaves the Great Dividing Range; thence following the said watershed along the common boundary of the Parishes of Lexton and Langi-kal-kal, then through the Parishes of Langi-kal-kal, Livingstone and Langi-kal-kal again, to the point of commencement.

Railway line

This area is more particularly defined on plan No. 1264 hereunder, the original of which is lodged at the Head Office of the Soil Conservation Authority, 378 Cotham-road, Kew, E.4.

The use of land within this catchment is subject to determination by the Soil Conservation Authority acting under the provisions of section 23 (1) (a) of the Soil Conservation and Land Utilization Act 1958 (No. 6372).



REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE KOORANGIE WILDLIFE RESERVE (LAKE BAEL BAEL, THE MARSH AND YASSOM SWAMP).

WHEREAS by section 218 of the Land Act 1958, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the Land Acts for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the power conferred aforesaid, doth hereby make the following regulations in respect of the reserved Crown lands in the Parishes of Koorangie and Bael Bael which are indicated by red colour on plan marked B/24.162 attached to Lands Department correspondence Rs.8109, and known as the "Koorangie Wildlife Reserve" (hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve").

REGULATIONS.

1. The Director of Fisheries and Wildlife or his authorized officers are empowered to have carried out such works and improvements considered necessary for the improvement and management of wildlife and wildlife habitat and for the control of the public within the Reserve

2. Without the consent of the Director of Fisheries and Wildlife or his authorized officers no person shall-

- (a) Interfere with the flow of any water into or out of the Reserve.
- (b) Interfere with or damage or destroy any tracks, signs, buildings, water control structures, earthen banks, wildlife shelter belts or any improvements constructed within the Reserve.
- (c) Carry any poison, traps or snares within the Reserve.
- (d) Poison, trap, snare, catch, or otherwise destroy, interfere with or disturb any bird or other animal or take away any skin, egg, feathers or nest or part thereof in or from the Reserve, provided that subject to the provisions of the Game Act 1958 the holders of current Game Licences may take and kill wild ducks during the open season for such ducks.
- (e) Pluck, cut, dig, pick up, damage or otherwise interfere with or have in his or her possession the whole or any part of any shrubs, flowers, grasses, trees or plants of any kind within the Reserve.
- Reserve.

 (f) Light or maintain any fire within the Reserve except in a properly constructed fire place which is more than 25 feet from the nearest dead timber and with the surrounding ground cleared of all inflammable material for at least 10 feet. Further no person shall leave such a fire unattended, without completely extinguishing it.
- (g) Dig or remove any sand, soil or other material in or from the Reserve.
- (h) Deposit any rubbish, debris or material of any kind on the Reserve.

- (i) Bring or allow any animal of any kind into the Reserve other than a dog under the immediate control of a person who is legally hunting ducks during the open season and is the holder of a current Game Licence. Any dog except as mentioned aforesaid shall be liable to be destroyed. Any "cattle" as defined by section 3 of the Pounds Act 1958 found trespassing within the Reserve shall be liable to be impounded.
- (j) Carry any firearms, shoot at or kill or injure any animal or bird, except the holder of a current Game Licence legally in pursuit of wild ducks during the open season.
- (k) Use within the Reserve any motor boat or powered water craft having an engine with a developed H.P. greater than three horse power.
- (1) Erect any fence, shed or wooden structure within the Reserve. Any fence, shed or wooden structure erected without permission within the Reserve will be dismantled and removed from the Reserve.—(Rs.8109), (Rs.6040), (Rs.6039.)

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 218 of the Land Act 1958, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist therefrom, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "HALL'S GAP PICNIC RESERVE.
