

WHEREAS by the Local Government Act 1958, as amended, section 519, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the Government Gazette, to proclaim any land reserved, used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley or right-of-way or any street, road, lane or passage made or laid out or proposed to be made or laid out on any land of which

a plan delineating that street, road, lane or passage has been lodged with the Registrar of Titles, to be a public highway and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in forms. in force:

INTERIM DEVELOPMENT ORDER.

Notice of Approval.


