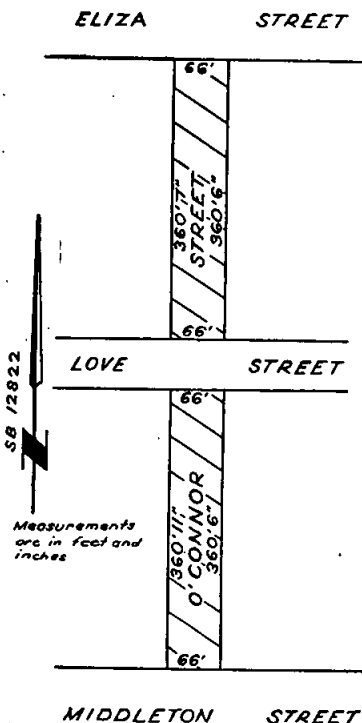

MILK PASTEURIZATION ACT 1953.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 4 of the Milk Pasteurization Act 1953 (No. 6319) it is provided that a day be fixed by Proclamation of the Governor in Council published in the Government Gazette in relation to a prescribed district:

And whereas the following municipal district and portions of municipal districts have been prescribed as districts for the purposes of the said Act:—

- (i) Shire of Knox.
- (ii) Shire of Fern Tree Gully (excluding those portions of the Parishes of Nangana and Woori Yallock within the Shire).
- (iii) All that portion of the Shire of Corio within the boundary formed by commencing at a point being the north-east corner and junction of Avalon-road and Windermere-road; thence southerly by Avalon-road to foreshore of Corio Bay; thence westerly by the foreshore to Plantation-road; thence continuing westerly by Plantation-road to Bacchus Marsh-road; thence northerly by Bacchus Marsh-road to Windermere-road; thence easterly by Windermere-road to point of commencement:

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this my Proclamation fix Tuesday, the 25th day of February, 1964, as the day after which no person shall in the prescribed districts set out above—

- (a) sell or deliver milk except milk pasteurized at licensed pasteurizing premises and bottled and sealed as prescribed; or
- (b) (in the case where the milk is sold and delivered at a shop for immediate consumption by a customer at the shop) sell or deliver milk except milk pasteurized at licensed pasteurizing premises.

Marketing of Primary Products Act 1958 (No. 6304).

DECLARING THAT ONIONS SHALL BECOME THE PROPERTY OF THE ONION MARKETING BOARD FOR A FURTHER PERIOD OF TWO (2) YEARS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of section 17 of the Marketing of Primary Products Act 1958, it is enacted that where a product has been declared a commodity and a board has been appointed in relation thereto, the Governor in Council may by Proclamation—

- (a) provide and declare that the commodity shall forthwith upon the date of publication of the Proclamation or on from and after a later date specified in the Proclamation, be divested from the producers of the commodity and become vested in and be the absolute property of the board as the owner thereof, and that upon any of the commodity coming into existence within a time specified in the same or a subsequent Proclamation it shall by virtue of this Act become vested in and be the absolute property of the Board as the owner thereof; and
- (b) make such further provision as will enable the board effectively to obtain possession of the commodity as such owner and to deal with the same:

And whereas by a Proclamation made on the 9th day of December, 1935, under the provisions of section 7 of the said Act the Governor in Council declared onions to be a commodity under and for the purposes of the said Act: And whereas by an Order made on the 26th March, 1936, the Governor in Council appointed a marketing board in relation to onions and assigned to such board the name of "The Onion Marketing Board": Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation hereby provide and declare that on and from the fifth day of April, One thousand nine hundred and sixty-four, all onions shall subject to and in accordance with the Marketing of Primary Products Act 1958 be divested from the producers of onions and become vested in and be the absolute property of the Onion Marketing Board as the owner thereof and that upon any onions coming into existence within two (2) years from the fifth day of April, One thousand nine hundred and sixty-four they shall by virtue of and subject to and in accordance with the said Act become vested in and be the absolute property of The Onion Marketing Board as the owner thereof: And to enable The Onion Marketing Board as owners of the above-mentioned commodity effectively to obtain possession thereof and to deal with the same I do further provide that all such onions shall subject to and in accordance with the provisions of the said Act be delivered by the producers thereof to The Onion Marketing Board or its authorized agent within such times at such places and in such manner as The Onion Marketing Board by public notice, or in a particular case in writing, directs or as are prescribed by regulations made under the said Act.

NOTICE TO ATTEND FOR RADIOLOGICAL EXAMINATION.

To all persons aged twenty-one years and over enrolled or resident or employed or engaged in the Subdivisions specified hereunder in the Electoral District of Kara Kara.

TAKE notice that you are required to attend at a Department of Health X-ray unit sited in the public street at or as near as possible to the main entrance to the premises specified in this notice, at any time between the hours specified on one of the days specified and during the period specified in respect of those premises; and thereat to submit yourself to radiological examination of the chest for the purpose of ascertaining whether you may be suffering from pulmonary tuberculosis. - Remove any soil, gravel, sand or rock from the bed and banks of any river, stream or watercourse.
- Erect any booth, hut or any other structure.

3. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds and, in the case of any offence which is continued or repeated after a conviction or order of any court in relation to the offence, to a further penalty of not more than Two pounds for each day on which the offence is so continued or repeated.

SUMMARY OF PROVISIONS.

By-law No. 160.—Adoption of 15th Schedule By-law.

A By-law of the City of Essendon made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1958*, and numbered 160 for adopting certain provisions of the 15th Schedule to the said Act and carrying out certain purposes provided for in the said Schedule.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1958*, and of any and every other power it thereunto enabling the Mayor, Councillors and Citizens of the City of Essendon orders as follows:—

1. This By-law shall be known as the Adoption of 15th Schedule By-law.

2. Division 1 of By-law No. 87 of the City of Essendon adopting certain provisions of the 13th Schedule to the *Local Government Act 1928* is hereby repealed.

3. Such of the provisions of the 15th Schedule to the *Local Government Act 1958* as are set out hereunder are hereby adopted, namely:—

Part I.—Streets and Footways.

- (1) Porticos and Projections. (Clauses 1-7 inclusive.)
- (2) Naming Streets and Numbering Houses. (Clauses 8-10-11.)
- (3) Spouts and Drains from Houses. (Clauses 12-14, both inclusive.)
- (4) Crossings over Footways and Channels. (Clauses 15-26, both inclusive.)
- (5) Depositing Building Materials, Excavations, &c. (Clauses 29-37, both inclusive.)
- (6) Lighting, &c., of Obstructions Generally. (Clauses 38 and 39.)
- (7) Houses, &c., Encroaching on Streets, &c. (Clause 40.)
- (8) Obstructions, &c., to Streets, &c., by Cattle, &c. (Clauses 41-45, both inclusive.)
- (9) Undermining Streets. (Clause 46.)
- (10) Miscellaneous. (Clauses 47-49, both inclusive.)

Part IV.—Places of Improvement and Recreation, &c.

- (1) Regulating and prohibiting wire used in fences or other erections on land adjoining any street or road;
- (2) Prohibiting and regulating the growing of trees, shrubs and hedges on private property near street or road junctions and requiring the removal or lopping thereof at the expense of the owner;
- (3) Requiring the reduction in height of fences on private property near street or road junctions at the expense of the owner.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1958*, the Mayor, Councillors and Citizens of the City of Preston order as follows:—

From and after the date of this By-law coming into operation, the following By-law shall be and is hereby repealed.

By-law No. 57 passed by the Council of the City of Preston on the 7th day of July, 1947 and confirmed on the 4th day of August, 1947.

This By-law shall come into operation and have effect immediately upon its publication in the *Victoria Government Gazette*.

1. A fence or other erection on which wire is used erected on land adjoining any street or road shall be maintained in good repair by the owner thereof.

2. No person shall use or permit to be used in or on any fence or other erection on land adjoining any street or road, any wire with spikes or jagged projections.

3. No person shall on private property situate at the junction of streets or roads grow any tree shrub or hedge abutting on such street or road or within 10 feet therefrom or within a distance of 30 feet from the junction.

4. For any wilful act or default contrary to this By-law a penalty shall be imposed not exceeding Twenty pounds.

5. In addition to the penalty provided in clause 4 hereof and any expense recovered by the Council pursuant to clause 9 hereof in the case of a continuing offence a further penalty shall be imposed not exceeding Five pounds for each day on which the offence is continued after a conviction or order by any Court.

6. The owner of private property situate at the junction of streets or roads within fourteen days after the service of a notice from the Council signed by the Town Clerk requiring him so to do shall remove or lop any tree, shrub or hedge (whether planted before or after the coming into operation of this By-law) growing or being thereon and abutting on or within 10 feet of such street or road or within a distance of 30 feet from the junction.

7. The owner of private property situate at the junction of streets or roads within fourteen days of the service of notice from the Council signed by the Town Clerk requiring him so to do shall reduce the height of any portion of a fence within 30 feet from the junction to a height not exceeding 3 ft. 6 in.

8. The expense incurred by the Council pursuant to served on him pursuant to clauses 6 or 7 hereof the Council may remove or lop the trees, shrubs or hedges or reduce the height of the fence to a height not exceeding 3 ft. 6 in. as the case may be which have not been removed, lopped or reduced in compliance with the said notice, and for such purpose may, by its agent or workmen enter into and upon such land.

9. The expenses incurred by the Council pursuant to clause 8 hereof may be recovered by the Council from such owner in a Court of Petty Sessions as a civil debt recoverable summarily.

10. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.

3. Upon conviction for wilful act or default contrary to any of the provisions of this By-law the offender shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.
