**DECLARING THAT CHICORY SHALL BECOME THE
 PROPERTY OF THE CHICORY MARKETING BOARD
 FOR A FURTHER PERIOD OF TWO (2) YEARS.**

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria
 and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia,
 &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of section 17 of the
Marketing of Primary Products Act 1958, it is enacted
 that where a product has been declared a commodity
 and a board has been appointed in relation thereto, the
 Governor in Council may by Proclamation—

- (a) provide and declare that the commodity shall
 forthwith, upon the date of publication of the
 Proclamation or on from and after a later
 date specified in the Proclamation, be divested
 from the producers of the commodity and
 become vested in and be the absolute property
 of the board as the owner thereof, and that
 upon any of the commodity coming into exist-
 ence within a time specified in the same or a
 subsequent Proclamation it shall by virtue of
 this Act become vested in and be the absolute
 property of the board as the owner thereof; and
- (b) make such further provision as will enable the
 board effectively to obtain possession of the com-
 modity as such owner and to deal with the same:

And whereas by a Proclamation made on the 24th day
 of December, 1935, under the provisions of section 7 of
 the said Act the Governor in Council declared chicory
 to be a commodity under and for the purposes of the
 said Act: And whereas by an Order made on the 8th
 April, 1936, the Governor in Council appointed a market-
 ing board in relation to chicory and assigned to such
 board the name of "The Chicory Marketing Board":
 Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria
 in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice
 of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my
 Proclamation hereby provide and declare that on and
 from the ninth day of April, One thousand nine hundred
 and sixty-four, all chicory shall subject to and in accord-
 ance with the *Marketing of Primary Products Act 1958*
 be divested from the producers of chicory and become
 vested in and be the absolute property of The Chicory
 Marketing Board as the owner thereof and that upon any
 chicory coming into existence within two (2) years from
 the ninth day of April, One thousand nine hundred and
 sixty-four, it shall by virtue of and subject to and in
 accordance with the said Act become vested in and be
 the absolute property of The Chicory Marketing Board
 as the owner thereof: And to enable The Chicory Market-
 ing Board as owners of the above-mentioned commodity
 effectively to obtain possession thereof and to deal with
 the same I do further provide that all such chicory shall
 subject to and in accordance with the provisions of the
 said Act be delivered by the producers thereof to The
 Chicory Marketing Board or its authorized agent within
 such times at such places and in such manner as The
 Chicory Marketing Board by public notice or in a particu-
 lar case, in writing, directs or as are prescribed by
 Regulations made under the said Act.

VARIATION OF SUMMER PERIOD IN RESPECT OF SPECIFIED PARTS OF THE COUNTRY AREA OF VICTORIA.

WHEREAS by section 4 of the *Country Fire Authority Act 1958* it is enacted that the Chief Secretary of Victoria, after consultation with the Minister of Forests, may from time to time by Declaration published in the *Government Gazette* declare any period to be the summer period in respect of the country area of Victoria, or any specified part or parts thereof and, without affecting the generality of the foregoing, may declare different periods to be the summer period in respect of different parts of the said country area:

And whereas by the said section it is further enacted that any declaration so published may be revoked, amended or varied by a subsequent declaration so published:

And whereas by declarations issued on the 19th day of November, 1963, and the 10th day of December, 1963, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 20th day of November, and the 11th day of December, 1963, respectively, different summer periods expiring on the 30th day of April, 1964, were declared in respect of different parts of the country area of Victoria, including the parts of the said country area specified in the Schedule hereto:

And whereas it is deemed expedient that the aforesaid declarations should be varied in the manner hereinafter described:

And whereas the Chief Secretary and the Minister of Forests have consulted accordingly:

Now therefore I, the Chief Secretary of Victoria, do by this my Declaration vary the aforesaid declarations by declaring that the summer period in respect of the parts of the country area of Victoria specified in the Schedule hereto shall end at midnight on the 6th day of March, 1964.

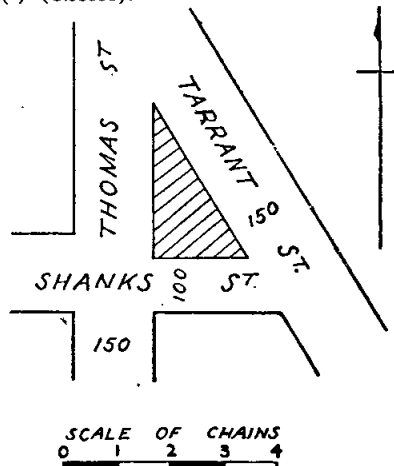

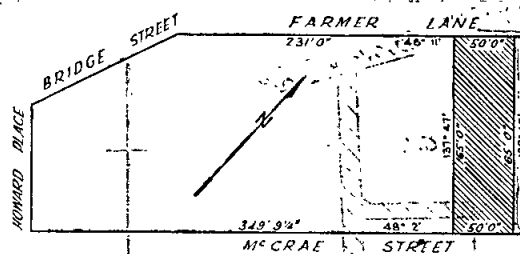

Building.

A By-law of the City of Camberwell made under section 926 of the *Local Government Act 1958* and the Uniform Building Regulations, Victoria, and numbered 131 for determining, applying, dispensing with or regulating certain matters left to be determined, applied, dispensed with or regulated by the Council of the said City or in respect of which powers are conferred or duties are imposed on the Council under the Uniform Building Regulations, Victoria.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1958*, the Uniform Building Regulations, Victoria, and any and every other power it thereunto enabling the Mayor, Councillors and Citizens of the City of Camberwell order as follows:—

1. This By-law shall come into operation and have effect immediately upon its publication in the *Victoria Government Gazette*.

2. This By-law shall from the time of its coming into operation be read and construed as one with By-law No. 115.

3. Clause 2 of By-law No. 115 is hereby amended by including therein after the words "Schedule 'A' and Schedule 'B' hereto" the words "and Schedule 'A' of By-law No. 131".

4. Each of the areas of land in the said municipal district set out and described in Schedule "A" hereto is hereby prescribed as an area of land on which a building or buildings of Class II. Occupancy shall contain in the aggregate not more than the number of flats as set out against the particular area.

5. In this By-law unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—

- (a) "Building of Class II. Occupancy" has the meaning assigned to that expression in chapter 6 of the Uniform Building Regulations, Victoria.
- (b) "Flat" has the meaning assigned thereto in chapter 1 of the said Regulations.
- (c) "Site" shall have the same meaning as in clause 815 of the said Regulations.

SCHEDULE "A".

Land—Through-road, east side, commencing 385 feet north from Toorak-road and having a frontage of 60 feet by a depth of 240 feet and known as No. 7 Through-road and being the land more particularly described in certificate of title, volume 3909, folio 629. Five flats.

CITY OF PRESTON.

BY-LAW No. 75.

A By-law of the City of Preston made under Part VII. of the *Local Government Act 1958* and numbered 75 for:—

- (1) Regulating and prohibiting wire used in fences or other erections on land adjoining any street or road;
- (2) Prohibiting and regulating the growing of trees, shrubs and hedges on private property near street or road junctions and requiring the removal or lopping thereof at the expense of the owner;
- (3) Requiring the reduction in height of fences on private property near street or road junctions at the expense of the owner.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1958*, the Mayor, Councillors and Citizens of the City of Preston order as follows:—

From and after the date of this By-law coming into operation, the following By-law shall be and is hereby repealed.

By-law No. 57 passed by the Council of the City of Preston on the 7th day of July, 1947 and confirmed on the 4th day of August, 1947.

This By-law shall come into operation and have effect immediately upon its publication in the *Victoria Government Gazette*.

1. A fence or other erection on which wire is used erected on land adjoining any street or road shall be maintained in good repair by the owner thereof.

2. No person shall use or permit to be used in or on any fence or other erection on land adjoining any street or road, any wire with spikes or jagged projections.

3. No person shall on private property situate at the junction of streets or roads grow any tree shrub or hedge abutting on such street or road or within 10 feet therefrom or within a distance of 30 feet from the junction.

4. For any wilful act or default contrary to this By-law a penalty shall be imposed not exceeding Twenty pounds.

5. In addition to the penalty provided in clause 4 hereof and any expense recovered by the Council pursuant to clause 9 hereof in the case of a continuing offence a further penalty shall be imposed not exceeding Five pounds for each day on which the offence is continued after a conviction or order by any Court.

6. The owner of private property situate at the junction of streets or roads within fourteen days after the service of a notice from the Council signed by the Town Clerk requiring him so to do shall remove or lop any tree, shrub or hedge (whether planted before or after the coming into operation of this By-law) growing or being thereon and abutting on or within 10 feet of such street or road or within a distance of 30 feet from the junction.

7. The owner of private property situate at the junction of streets or roads within fourteen days after the service of notice from the Council signed by the Town Clerk requiring him so to do shall reduce the height of any portion of a fence within 30 feet from the junction to a height not exceeding 3 ft. 6 in.

8. Upon non-compliance by any owner with any notice served on him pursuant to clauses 6 or 7 hereof the Council may remove or lop the trees, shrubs or hedges or reduce the height of the fence to a height not exceeding

3. ft. 6 in. as the case may be which have not been removed, lopped or reduced in compliance with the said notice; and for such purpose may, by its agent or workmen enter into and upon such land.

9. The expense incurred by the Council pursuant to clause 8 hereof may be recovered by the Council from such owner in a Court of Petty Sessions as a civil debt recoverable summarily.

10. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.

SHIRE OF BRIGHT.

BY-LAW No. 29.

A By-law of the Shire of Bright made under the provisions of the Local Government Acts and under and pursuant to all other powers on that behalf, and numbered 29, for the regulating the use and conduct of the Mount Beauty Swimming Baths.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts and every Act and power enabling it in that behalf, the President, Councillors and Ratepayers of the Shire of Bright order as follows:—

In the construction of this By-law unless the context otherwise required—

“Council” means the Council of the Shire of Bright.

“Lessee” means any person to whom the Council has granted a lease of the Baths or a licence to manage and control of the Baths.

“The Baths” means the Mount Beauty Swimming Baths and includes the pools, dressing rooms, showers, passages, lavation and other facilities within the bounds of such Baths defined by the fences and buildings surrounding the same.

Words importing the masculine gender include the feminine and words importing the singular number only shall include the plural number and words importing the plural number shall include the singular number.

1. The premises will be open to the public during such hours as the Committee of Management shall from time to time by Resolution fix.

2. The Committee of Management may at any time and from time to time close the premises or any part thereof, for such periods as may be necessary for the purposes of cleansing, repairing, rebuilding, or reconstructing the same or for any other like purposes.

3. Every person using the swimming baths shall wear a suitable bathing costume and the committee or its authorized officers shall be the sole judge of the suitability of each costume.

4. No person shall expectorate on the concourse of the Baths or in the entrance, dressing compartment, passages or conveniences thereof or anywhere within the bounds of the Baths.

5. No child under the age of six years shall be permitted to enter into the Baths unless in the opinion of the manager, lessee or attendant in charge, such child is in the care of a responsible person.

6. No boy or girl under the age of ten years who is unable to swim shall use the adult pool without the permission of the attendant in charge unless accompanied by an adult.

7. No person not authorized by the manager or lessee shall climb or attempt to climb over or onto or upon or remain on or upon any fixture, fountain, fence, roof, building, or structures surrounding or appurtenant to the Baths.

8. No person shall damage or remove any placard or notice board within the Baths.

9. No person shall use the Baths whilst in an unclean condition, or suffering from any cutaneous, infectious or contagious disease and such person shall retire from the Baths immediately upon being requested to do so by any attendant on duty at the Baths.

10. No person shall foul or pollute the water in the Baths or showers or wilfully or improperly soil or defile any towel or bathing suit, or any shower closet or urinal or any bathroom, dressing room or other erection or the walls thereof or any other part of the Baths, or any furniture or other article therein.

11. No person shall enter the pool before washing himself in the shower, and every bather after using the latrines shall again wash under the shower without costume before returning to the pool.

12. No person shall at any time carelessly or negligently break or injure or improperly interfere with any lock, tap, or fitting in connexion with the Baths, nor any towel, bathing costume, furniture or any other article supplied for use in the Baths, or write upon or deface the walls or partitions or other parts of the Baths.

13. No person shall interfere with the use and enjoyment of the Baths by any other person and any person so acting or otherwise behaving in an unseemly or improper manner shall immediately leave the Baths when required to do so by the manager, lessee or any attendant in charge of the Baths. One person shall only stand on or dive from each of the diving boards at one time and no person shall prevent any other person from diving from such boards. No one shall use any diving board which the manager, lessee or person in charge deems unsafe.

14. No person shall bring or cause to allow any dog or other animal to remain in the Baths.

15. Bicycles shall be parked only in the area set aside for that purpose.

16. No person shall at any time bring or introduce into the Baths or any part thereof spirituous or other intoxicating liquor.

17. No person shall enter or remain in the premises whilst in a state of intoxication.

18. No person shall enter or attempt to enter any shower convenience occupied by another person.

19. No male over the age of six years shall enter any dressing room, shower, convenience, separate passage or approach thereto reserved for the use of females.

20. No female over the age of six years shall enter any dressing room, showers, convenience, separate passage or approach thereto reserved for the use of males.

21. No person shall use blasphemous, profane, obscene, indecent, offensive or abusive language in the premises.

22. No person shall loiter, misconduct himself, or commit a nuisance, or behave in an unseemly, improper, indecent, offensive, riotous or noisy manner in the premises.

23. No person shall dress or undress or remove any part of his or her bathing costume in any part of the premises open to the public view or in any other part of the premises except places especially reserved for such purposes.

24. No person shall dispose of any cigar, cigarette, pipe ash, or match within the Baths except in the receptacles provided for same.

25. No person shall bring into or deposit in the premises any rubbish, filth, or other offensive matter nor deposit or leave therein any tins, bottles, broken glass, fruit or other peel, papers, cast off or disregarded clothing, or other litter.

26. No person shall use in part of the Baths any soap or other substance or preparation whereby the water in any pool may be discoloured or rendered turbid or unfit for the use of the bathers. Approved soap is permitted in shower recesses and hand basins only.

27. No person shall use or interfere with any ropes, raft or lifebuoy, or other lifesaving appliance in the premises unless in the case of accident or danger to a bather rendering their use necessary for the saving of life.

28. No person shall sell or offer for sale foods or services, in the premises without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

29. Every person not being the holder of a seasonal or monthly ticket shall before entering the premises pay to the authorized attendant the price of payment for entrance as fixed from time to time by the Committee of Management and every person shall, before being furnished with any towel, bathing costume or locker, pay to the authorized attendant the price of payment for the use thereof and the deposit for same as fixed from time to time by the Committee of Management and after use shall return same to the attendant in charge who will return deposits lodged.

30. No family, seasonal or monthly ticket shall be transferable. Any holder of a family ticket, seasonal or monthly ticket who permits any person other than the person or persons entitled to use such ticket to use the same shall immediately forfeit such ticket and all moneys paid thereon together with all the rights and privileges given by such ticket.

31. In the event of the Committee of Management holding or permitting to be held a swimming carnival or other entertainment in the Baths, it shall have the power by Resolution to prohibit bathing in the Baths, whilst such carnival or entertainment is being held, and to fix the prices which shall be charged for admission to such carnival or entertainment. A seasonal ticket shall not admit any person during the time fixed by the Committee of Management as the time for such carnival.

32. No person shall obstruct, hinder or interfere with any attendant, member of the Committee of Management or any officer of the Council in the performance of his duties thereat.

33. No person, club or association shall organize or hold any carnival, aquatic display or other function in the pool area without the consent in writing of the Committee of Management.

34. Neither the Committee of Management of the Shire of Bright, nor any of its officers or employees, shall be responsible for articles lost or stolen from any person whilst within the premises.

35. Any person finding any article in the Baths shall immediately deliver the same to one of the attendants in charge who shall thereupon enter a description of such article and all particulars relating thereto in the book kept for that purpose. The owner of any article registered in such book shall upon furnishing proof to the satisfaction of the manager, lessee or attendant in charge as to his ownership thereof, be entitled to the return of same upon entering his name and address and signing a receipt for such article in the book referred to above.

36. Beach balls, motor tubes or other inflated rubber or plastic articles are not permitted in the adult pool. Toddlers may be permitted to take rubber toys into the paddling pool. No person shall play or practice water polo save at such times and in such teams as shall be approved in writing by the Committee of Management. No other ball games of any kind will be permitted in the Baths.

37. No person shall be in possession of any bottles or glass within the Baths save and except in such part thereof as the Council may set apart for the partaking of refreshments.

38. No person shall enter the Baths unless an attendant or other competent person is in attendance. Solo bathing is prohibited.

39. No person shall spit, spout water or blow their noses in any pool save into the scum gutter.

40. No person shall engage in boisterous or rough play within the Baths.

41. No person over the age of six years shall use the paddling pool except with the authority of the manager lessee or attendant in charge.

42. No unauthorized person shall enter the office, kiosk, or filter house of the Baths.

43. Betting or playing cards or any game of chance for money is strictly prohibited in any portion of the Baths.

44. No person shall bring into the Baths any radio, without the consent first being obtained from the officer in charge.

45. For the purpose of maintaining good order, the manager, lessee or person in charge of the Baths may at any time refuse admission thereto to any person without assigning any reasons for such refusal.

46. The Committee of Management reserve the right by its officers and employees to refuse admission to any persons and to remove any person misconducting himself in any manner whatsoever.

47. Every person who fails to comply with any of the provisions of this By-law shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20).

48. This By-law shall come into effect immediately on its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

49. This By-law shall apply to that part of the municipal district known as the Mount Beauty Swimming Baths situated in subdivisional lot 9 of Crown allotment 6, section 4, Parish of Freeburgh.

Resolution for the making and passing of this By-law was agreed to by the Council of the Shire of Bright on the 24th day of November, 1963, and confirmed on the 12th day of December, 1963.

SHIRE OF ORBOST.

BY-LAW No. 54.

A By-law of the Shire of Orbost, made under the provisions of section 756 of the *Local Government Act 1958*, and under and pursuant to all other powers on that behalf, and numbered 54, for regulating the management and use of Municipal Baths situated within the municipality, for fixing the hours during which such baths shall be available to the public, and for fixing the penalty for any breach of this By-law.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1958*, the President, Councillors and Ratepayers of the Shire of Orbost order as follows:—

1. The baths shall be open to the public during such periods and such hours as the Council shall from time to time by resolution fix.

2. Every person using the swimming baths shall wear a suitable bathing costume, and the Council or its authorized officers shall be the sole judge of the suitability of each costume.

3. No person shall expectorate on the concourse of the baths or in the entrance to the dressing rooms, compartments, passages or conveniences of the baths or anywhere within the bounds of the pool area defined by the fences or building lines.

4. No person shall bring into or cause or allow any dog or other animal to remain in the baths. Bicycles shall be parked only in the racks in the area set aside for the purpose.

5. No person shall dress or undress or remove any part of his or her costume in any part of the baths open to public view.

6. No boy or girl under the age of ten years who is unable to swim shall use the adult baths without the permission of the attendant in charge, unless accompanied by an adult, and no adult non-swimmer will enter the pool beyond his or her depth.

7. No person shall loiter, misconduct himself or herself, or commit a nuisance in the baths, or bring rubbish, filth or other offensive matter into the baths, or deposit any rubbish therein, nor leave therein any tins, bottles, broken glass, orange or other peel, papers, cast-off clothes, or other litter.

8. No person shall climb or jump over fences or walls of the baths, or roll or throw stones in the baths.

9. No person not authorized by the manager or lessee shall climb or attempt to climb over, into or upon, or remain on or upon any fixture, fountain, fence, roof, building or structure surrounding or appurtenant to the baths.

10. No person other than the manager or lessee shall hawk, sell or offer for sale in the baths any goods or articles without the permission of the Shire Secretary.

11. No person shall damage or remove any placard or notice board within the baths.

12. The Council may, by resolution, close the baths, or any part thereof, on any day or days or at any times should it be considered necessary to do so, and may also vary the periods or hours during which the baths shall be open to the public for bathing purposes.

13. In the event of the Council holding or authorizing a swimming carnival or other entertainment in the baths, it shall have power by resolution to prohibit bathing in the baths whilst such carnival or entertainment is being held, and to fix the prices which shall be charged for admission to such carnival or entertainment.

14. No person using the baths, nor any attendant, lessee, officer, servant, or other person employed thereat shall at any time bring or introduce into the baths, or any part thereof, spirituous or other intoxicating liquors.

15. No person shall enter or remain in the baths whilst in a state of intoxication.

16. No person shall use the baths whilst in an uncleanly condition, or suffering from any cutaneous, infectious or contagious disease, and any such person shall retire from the baths upon being requested so to do by any attendant on duty at the baths.

17. No person shall improperly foul or pollute the water in the baths or the shower baths, or wilfully or improperly soil or defile any towel or bathing costume, or any shower, closet or urinal, or any bathroom, dressing room, closet, box or compartment, or any part of the baths, or any furniture or article therein.

18. No person shall enter the pool without first washing himself or herself in the shower bath, and every bather after using the latrines shall again wash under the showers without costume before returning to the pool.

19. Every person not being the holder of seasonal or monthly ticket shall, before entering the baths, pay to the authorized money taker the price of payment for entrance to the baths as determined by the Council, and every person shall, before depositing any valuables, pay to the authorized money taker the price of payment thereof as determined by the Council.

20. No seasonal, monthly or family tickets shall be transferable, and any holder of a seasonal, monthly or family ticket who allows any other person to use the same shall immediately forfeit such ticket and all moneys paid thereon and all the rights and privileges given by such ticket.

21. No person shall at any time carelessly or negligently break or injure or improperly interfere with any lock, tap or fitting in connexion with the baths, nor carelessly, negligently or wilfully damage or injure any furniture or fitting, towel, or other article supplied for use in the baths, or write upon or deface the walls or partitions of any other part of the baths.

22. No person shall at any time while being in or upon the baths use indecent or offensive language, nor behave in an indecent or offensive manner.

23. No person shall occupy the shower baths for an unreasonable time.

24. Any person finding any article in the baths shall immediately thereafter deliver same to one of the attendants in charge, who shall thereupon register a description of same and all particulars relating thereto in the book kept for that purpose, and any owner losing such article from the manager, lessee or attendant in charge upon entering his or her signature and address, and signing a receipt for such article in the book referred to.

25. The Council, manager or lessee will not be responsible for any article lost by or stolen from any person whilst in the baths.

26. No person shall interfere with the use and enjoyment of the baths by any other person, and any person so acting or otherwise behaving in an unseemly or improper manner shall immediately leave the baths when required to do so by any attendant in charge of the baths. Only one person shall stand on or dive from the diving boards at one time, and no person shall prevent any other person from diving from the boards. No one shall use any board if the manager or person in charge deems it dangerous for divers or other swimmers to use the boards at any time.

27. No man or boy shall enter or use any dressing room, shower or convenience which shall be appointed or appropriated for the use of any woman or girl, or any separate passage or approach thereto so appointed or appropriated.

28. No woman or girl shall enter or use any dressing room, shower, or convenience which shall be appointed or appropriated for the use of any man or boy, or any separate passage or approach thereto so appointed or appropriated.

29. No child under the age of six years shall be permitted to the baths unless, in the opinion of the manager, lessee or attendant such child is in the care of a responsible person.

30. For the purpose of maintaining good order, the lessee or manager or person in charge of the baths may refuse admission thereto to any person.

31. No person shall use or interfere with any rope, life-buoy or life-saving appliance in the premises unless in case of accident and danger occurring to a bather rendering their use necessary for the saving of life.

32. No person shall use any soap or other substance or preparation in any place or manner in the premises whereby any water in any swimming pool in the premises may be discoloured or rendered turbid or unfit for the use of bathers. Approved soap is permitted in shower recesses only and at hand basins.

33. Beach balls, motor tubes or other inflated rubber or plastic articles are not permitted in the main pool. Toddlers may be permitted to take rubber toys into the paddling pool. Water polo may only be practised and played at times and by teams approved by Council. No other ball games of any kind will be permitted in pool or pool surrounds.

34. No person shall be in possession of any bottle or glass within the enclosure, except when standing within 6 feet of the kiosk.

35. No person shall enter the baths unless an attendant or other competent person is present. Solo bathing is prohibited.

36. No person shall spit, spout water or blow their noses in the pool.

37. No person shall engage in boisterous or rough play within the baths enclosure or in the dressing rooms or shower rooms.

38. No person shall obstruct, hinder or interfere with the manager, lessee or any person employed at the baths or any officer of the Council or duty lifesaver in the performance of his or her duty thereat.

39. No person over the age of six years shall use the paddling pool.

40. Only members of the Orbest Life-saving Club and authorized officers of the Council will enter the clubroom.

41. No person shall enter the first-aid room unless being treated by an authorized attendant or doctor.

42. No person other than an officer of the Council will enter the plant room or chemical room, storeroom or boiler room. The concourse in front of the plant and chemical rooms will be kept clear at all times.

43. Any person wilfully offending against any part of the provisions of this By-law shall be for every such offence, upon conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20).

44. This By-law shall come into operation and have effect immediately upon its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

The resolution for passing this By-law was agreed to by the Council of the Shire of Orbest on the 8th day of November, 1963, and confirmed by resolution of the Council of the Shire of Orbest on the 13th day of December, 1963.
