## PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Apprenticeship Act 1928, the trade of Sheet Metal—First Class Bench Work was, by Proclamation published in the Government Gazette on the 25th day of May, 1938, proclaimed to be an apprenticeship trade only so far as it was carried on in the metropolitan district:

## Public Authorities Marks Act 1958. KORUMBURRA SEWERAGE AUTHORITY.

#### By-law No. 4.

KORUMBURRA SEWERAGE AUTHORITY (declared by Order of the Governor in Council, published in the Government Gazette on the 8th day of May, One thousand nine hundred and sixty-three, page 1466, to be an authority for the purpose of the Public Authorities Marks Act 1958), pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon it by the said Public Authorities Marks Act 1958 and by the Sewerage Districts Act 1958, and pursuant to and in exercise and execution of any other powers and authorities in any wise enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby make and prescribe the following By-law, that is to say:—

- 1. In this By-law, unless the context and subject-matter otherwise indicates—
  - "the said Act" means the Public Authorities Marks
    Act 1958 and all amendments thereof;
  - "the Authority" means the Korumburra Sewerage
  - "the Authority Authority;
    "Stamp" or "Mark" includes a stamp or mark on any article, materials or thing in question or on a seal, tag or label affixed or otherwise attached to or connected with the same or any container thereof:
  - thereof;
    "Works" means any works or operations for or in connexion with the carrying into effect of the purposes or objects of any provisions of the Sewerage Districts Act 1958 or any amendments thereof or of any other Act relating to the Korumburra Sewerage Authority whether the same are constructed, maintained or carried out by the Authority or by any other person on behalf of or under agreement with the Authority or by permission or authority of or under the supervision, direction or control of the Authority. Authority.
- 2. The stamp or mark hereby prescribed and adopted by the Authority under the authority of the said Act shall be the letters "K.S.A." (meaning the Korumburra Sewerage Authority) for indicating that any articles, materials or things referred to in the said Act and in this By-law are duly tested, stamped, marked or authorized by the Authority.
- 3. The said stamp or mark shall be sealed, stamped, marked or impressed or be affixed by tag or label by the Authority alone by its Officers duly authorized for the purpose upon the articles, materials or things to which the said Act applies, set forth or described in the Schedule hereto.
- 4. The articles, materials or things set forth or described in the Schedule hereto shall be tested, stamped, marked or authorized by the Authority before use.
- 5. The use of the said stamp or mark by any person other than a duly authorized officer of the Authority is prohibited.
- The sale or supply by any person to any other person of any of the above-mentioned articles, materials or things which-
  - (a) are stamped or marked otherwise than as hereby prescribed, or
  - (b) are not duly tested, stamped or authorized as hereby prescribed, or
  - (c) comprises a component part not comprised in any such article, material or thing when stamped or marked is hereby prohibited.

- 7. The fees for testing and for stamping or marking shall be—
  - (a) As to each of such articles, materials or things as are set forth in any of the Divisions 1 and 2 of the Schedule hereto, the fee set opposite the same respectively, provided that in all cases there shall be a minimum fee of 1s. for one or more articles tested.
  - (b) As to any of the articles, materials or things described in Division 3 of such Schedule, a fee calculated at the rate of 15s. per hour upon the time occupied in the testing thereof.
- 8. Any person guilty of any contravention of this By-law shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding £50 in respect of any one such contravention, provided however that nothing in this clause contained shall affect the liability of any such person to be prosecuted and punished under any other Act or at common law, but he shall not be liable to be punished twice for the same offence.

#### BEALIBA WATERWORKS TRUST.

## RATING BY-LAW FOR YEAR 1964.

THE Commissioners of the Bealiba Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and excercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make a rate for the supply of water for domestic purposes of One shilling and seven pence in the pound on the annual municipal valuation of the lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Bealiba Urban District.

Provided that in no case shall the amount of rate payable per annum in respect of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) be less than Three pounds and five shillings, and in respect of any land on which there is no building less than Ten shillings.

Such rates are made and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of the said lands and tenements for the year commencing the 1st day of January, 1964, and shall be payable on the 10th day of April, 1964, at the office of the Trust, Dunolly.

The maximum quantity of water to be supplied in any one year, without further charge to any property rated by the Trust, is hereby fixed at the quantity which, at a charge of One shilling and three pence per 1,000 gallons, would produce an amount equal to the amount of rate levied on such property for the said year.

The charge for water supplied by measure to any property rated by the Trust in excess of such maximum quantity, computed as in the last preceding clause, is hereby fixed at One shilling and three pence per 1,000 gallons.

The charge for water supplied by measure to any property not rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at Two shillings per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in cases where water is so supplied is hereby fixed at 32,500 gallons.

The charge for water supplied by measure shall be payable, on demand, at the office of the Trust, Dunolly. Passed this 5th day of March, 1964.



## NOTICE OF DETERMINATION OF LAND-USE.

IN pursuance of the provisions of section 23, sub-section (1), of the Soil Conservation and Land Utilization Act
1958 (No. 6372), the Soil Conservation Authority has determined land-use for all that area of land in the
Parishes of Kerrie, Monegeetta, and Rochford within the boundaries of the Sunbury Water Supply Catchment
delineated and marked on plan No. 1297, the original of which is lodged at the head office of the Soil Conservation
Authority, all land within this area shall be used in accordance with the provisions of the particular category
of land-use to which each area has been assigned. The boundaries of land-use areas shown on plan No. 1297
are intended as a guide to landholders, who should consult the Soil Conservation Authority before making any
changes in land-use.

The provisions of each of the land-use categories are set out hereunder.

- 1. Land which should be permanently used for forest purposes where forestry operations shall be restricted to the minimum required for proper forest maintenance to keep the forest in good condition, under conditions agreed upon by the Soil Conservation Authority and the Forests Commission.
- 2. Land which should be permanently used for forest purposes where logging operations may be carried out under the supervision and control of the Forests Commission acting under conditions agreed upon by the Soil Conservation Authority and the Forests Commission.
- 3. Land which may be managed for forest purposes, or partly for grazing or agricultural purposes, subject to Authority approval, and under conditions imposed for particular circumstances, such conditions to include—
  - (a) the specification of areas which may be cleared and those which shall remain under forest; (b) the specification of areas suitable for cropping and those areas suitable for grazing only.
- 4. Land under scrub, bracken, or other protective vegetative cover on which there shall be no change in land-use except with approval of and under conditions imposed by the Authority.
- 5. Land suitable for grazing or agricultural purposes, subject to conditions imposed by the Authority for particular circumstances, such conditions to include—
  - (a) the specification of areas where cropping may be practised and those areas where grazing only may be practised;
  - (b) the application of conservation practices where necessary.
- 6. Land within a minimum distance of 1 chain from the banks of specified watercourses and springs and a minimum distance of 2 chains from storages and pipe offtakes on which land-use shall be subject to conditions imposed by the Authority, such conditions to include—
  - (a) no cropping or erection of buildings;
  - (b) no removal of trees or vegetation other than noxious weeds except if considered necessary by the Authority because of interference to stream flow, or for construction of stream crossings.
- 7. Land suitable for grazing or agricultural purposes, or for residential or other development purposes as required or under the Gisborne Shire Planning Scheme, subject to conditions imposed by the Authority for particular circumstances and subject to provisions of other relevant Acts.
- 8. Land reserved for roads and other public purposes on which any changes from the existing nature and conditions of land-use shall be made only after consultation with the Soil Conservation Authority, and where forestry operations shall be restricted to the minimum required for proper forest maintenance under conditions agreed upon by the Soil Conservation Authority and the Forests Commission.



- 4. The body shall be taken direct to the Necropolis, or to the New Melbourne Cemetery, as the case may be. Not more than one body shall be carried in the hearse or vehicle at a time. No body shall be retained on the premises of the Contractor. The Contractor shall provide 2 inches of sawdust for the bottom of the coffin; a small block of wood to keep the head of the deceased in position, and sufficient white calico to cover the body. Coffins to be properly lowered into the graves, and the graves filled up again.

In cases of burials of bodies which are, in the opinion of the Department ordering the burial, of a distinctly offensive character, such as of persons drowned and long in the water or such as are in a state of putrefaction from any other cause, or persons who have died from an infectious disease, such bodies shall, on certification of the injectious aisease, such bodies shall, on certification of the officer ordering the burial that such precaution is necessary, be placed for burial in zinc-lined coffins, of timber 1 inch in thickness, hermetically sealed by soldering the lids of same, such coffins to be provided by the Contractor.
- 7. Bodies of deceased persons, with the exception of those provided for under clause 2, must be conveyed to the Necropolis, Springvale, for the burial should the death of such person take place in any sub-district south of the Yarra River, including burials of bodies from the Melbourne City Mortuary, and to the New Melbourne Cemetery, Fawkner, should the death take place in any sub-district north of the Yarra River, excepting bodies buried from the Melbourne City Mortuary. Burials in the Williamstown-Footscray sub-districts shall be made in the Williamstown or Footscray Cemeteries, as the police may direct, excepting bodies buried from the Melbourne City Mortuary. Mortuary.

Provided, however, that the Tender Board may, on application by the Contractor and subject to such conditions as it may determine, authorize the burial of bodies in a cemetery other than those specified.

- 8. The graves to be dug of the proper depth, and in conformity with the Necropolis and respective Cemeteries Regulations.

If for any burial such minister is not available the burial service is to be conducted by the resident chaplain deputed by the denomination, and in cases where no such deputy is appointed by the denomination or where the religious denomination of the deceased is unknown, the services are to be performed by the resident chaplains alternatively, and the Contractor must inform the police of the hour when the funeral service will take place, so that the friends of the deceased may attend at the cemetery if they wish. The Council or Committee of Management approved by the Council may at any time and from time to time close the pool premises or any part thereof for such period or periods as may be deemed necessary for the purpose of cleansing, repairing, rebuilding or reconstructing the same or for any other like purpose.
- 4. The attendant in charge of the pool premises may refuse admission thereto to any person.
- 5. No person shall enter the pool premises unless an attendant or authorized person is present.
- 6. Every person using any swimming pool, shall wear a suitable bathing costume and the Committee or its authorized officer shall be the sole judge of the suitability of any costume.
- 7. No person shall dress or undress or remove any part of his or her bathing costume in any part of the pool premises open to the public view or in or upon any part of the premises, except places specifically reserved for such purpose. such purpose.
- 8. No person shall expectorate on the concourse of the pool or on any lawns or in the dressing rooms, compartments, passages or entrances thereto, or in the vicinity of the kiosk, on the walls or on any sealed surface within the pool premises.
- 9. No person shall spit, spout water or blow his or her nose in any of the pools
- 10. No person shall roll or throw stones or other articles into any of the pools.
- 11. No person shall loiter, misconduct himself or herself or commit a nuisance in the pool premises or bring rubbish, filth or other offensive matter into the said premises or deposit any rubbish therein or leave therein any tins, bottles, broken glass, orange or other peel, papers, cast-off clothes or other litter, except in receptacles provided for such purpose.

No person shall at any time carelessly or negligently break injure or interfere with any lock, tap or fitting used in connexion with the pools nor carelessly, negligently or wilfully damage or injure any furniture or fitting, towel or any other article that may be in or upon the pools or write upon or deface the walls or partitions or any other part of the pool premises.
