I HEREBY give you notice, pursuant to the provisions of section 149 of *The Constitution Act Amendment Act 1958*, that, in connexion with the forthcoming periodical election of Members of the Legislative Council, I intend—

- (a) to issue on Thursday, the 14th May, 1964, the writs for the elections for the respective Electoral Provinces ;
- (b) to name Friday, the 5th June, 1964, as the day of nomination for such elections ;
- (c) to fix Saturday, the 27th June, 1964, as the day for taking the poll in the event of any such election being contested.
