NOTICE TO ELECTORS ROLLS CLOSE on THURSDAY, 14th MAY, 1964

ENROLMENT IS COMPULSORY

NOTICE is hereby given that the rolls for the above-mentioned Conjoint Election will close on Thursday, 14th May, 1964.

QUALIFICATIONS OF ELECTORS

Every person of the full age of 21 years-

(a) who is a natural-born or naturalized subject of Her Majesty; and

(b) who has resided in Australia for six months and in Victoria for three months and in any subdivision for at least one month immediately preceding the date of such person's claim for enrolment—

shall be entitled in respect of residence in such subdivision to be enrolled as an elector on the roll for the subdivision in which such person resides and for no other subdivision.

ENROLMENT COMPULSORY

Every qualified person who is not already enrolled on the Joint Commonwealth/State roll for the subdivision in which he or she resides, but who has so resided for a period of one month last past, must, within 21 days after becoming entitled to enrolment or transfer of enrolment, send or deliver to the Electoral Registrar for the subdivision a claim card duly filled in, signed and witnessed.

PENALTY FOR FAILURE TO ENROL OR TRANSFER ENROLMENT—Up to £2

Enrolment claim cards are available at all POST OFFICES and ELECTORAL REGISTRARS' OFFICES.

REMEMBER

If you have recently turned 21 years of age, or changed your address, or become naturalized, and you have not, as yet, attended to your enrolment obligations, you should comply with the law immediately.



Survey Co-ordination Act 1958. PROCLAIMED SURVEY AREA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS it is provided by section 12, sub-section 2 (b) of the Survey Co-ordination Act 1958, that upon a report of the Survey-General, in writing, to the effect that there are in existence in any area within Victoria, sufficient permanent works for the establishment of a local traverse for such area, the Governor in Council may proclaim such area to be a "proclaimed survey area" for the purposes of the said Act: Now therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this my Proclamation proclaim approximately 1,540 acres, part of the Township of Sale and part of the Parish of Sale, County of Tanjil, as indicated on plan hereunder, a "proclaimed survey area" for the purposes of the Survey Co-ordination Act 1958 .-(Proclaimed Survey Area No. 12-S.239 (3); S.242 (11); C.O.S. 3214.)

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Proclamation of the Governor in Council made, pursuant to section thirty-four of the Mental Hygiene Act 1928 (No. 3721) and dated the ninth day of June, 1953, all buildings on certain land in the Parish of Keelbundora, County of Bourke shown on a plan annexed to such Proclamation were proclaimed as a mental hospital, to be known as the Mental Hospital, Larundel:

And whereas by Proclamation of the Governor in Council made, pursuant to sub-section (3) of section thirty-eight of the Mental Hygiene Act 1958 (No. 6314) and dated the twenty-sixth day of May, 1959, the Proclamation dated the ninth day of June, 1953, was revoked in so far as it applied to certain buildings then known as Wards F1, F2, F3, M1, M2, M3, and the Male and Female Hospital Block:

And whereas by the same Proclamation dated the twenty-sixth day of May, 1959, and pursuant to section forty-four of the *Mental Hygiene Act* 1958 (No. 6314) the buildings then known as Wards F1, F2, F3, M1, M2, M3 and the Male and Female Hospital Block were Proclaimed and constituted as from the first day of July, 1959, as a receiving house, to be known as the Receiving House, Larundel:

And whereas by the Mental Health Act 1959 (No. 6605) it is provided that unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter any reference in any other Proclamation to a receiving house shall be taken to refer to a psychiatric hospital:

And whereas the Governor in Council may by Proclamation made, pursuant to sub-section (2) of section twenty-four of the *Mental Health Act* 1959 (No. 6605) vary or revoke any Proclamation of a mental hospital or psychiatric hospital:

And whereas the buildings referred to in the Proclamation dated the twenty-sixth day of May, 1959, as the Male and Female Hospital Block are now known as Wards A. B and C:

And whereas the Mental Health Authority now recommends that Wards F4 and M4 of the Mental Hospital, Larundel, should cease to be wards of that mental hospital, and become wards of the Psychiatric Hospital, Larundel:

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation—

- (a) revoke as from the first day of May, 1964, the Proclamation constituting the Mental Hospital, Larundel, in so far only as it applies to certain buildings known for the time being as Wards F4 and M4;
- (b) revoke as from the first day of May, 1964, the Proclamation constituting the Psychiatric Hospital, Larundel; and
- (c) proclaim the buildings known for the time being as Wards A, B, C, F1, F2, F3, F4, M1, M2, M3 and M4, to be a psychiatric hospital, to be known as the Psychiatric Hospital, Larundel.

DISEASES IN RELATION TO PROCESSES OR OCCUPATIONS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Workers Compensation Act 1958, it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council, after consultation by the Minister with the Workers Compensation Board, may by Proclamation published in the Government Gazette specify diseases in relation to processes or occupations for the purposes of section 22 of the said Act and may from time to time in the like manner amend the said Proclamation by the addition thereto of any disease process or occupation:

And whereas a Proclamation specifying diseases in relation to processes or occupations was issued on the twenty-fifth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and fifty-eight and published in the Government Gazette on the second day of July, One thousand nine hundred and fifty-eight:

And whereas the Minister and the Workers Compensation Board have consulted accordingly:

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Workers Compensation Act 1958, and all other powers me thereto enabling do by this my Proclamation add to the Schedule to the aforesaid Proclamation issued on the twenty-fifth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and fifty-eight, the diseases in relation to processes or occupations set out in the Schedule hereunder—

Description of Disease.

Description of Process or Occupation.

Poisoning by benzol, its homologues or its nitro and amido derivates and the sequelae of these poisonings

Any process or occupation involving the production, liberation, utilization of or exposure to benzol, its homologues or its nitro and amido derivates.

PROCLAMATION EXTENDING THE OPERATION OF THE UNIFORM BUILDING REGULATIONS

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS section 928 (2) of the Local Government Act 1958 (as amended), provides—inter alia—that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation published in the Government Gazette, at the request of the council of any municipality (not being a city or town) extend the

operation of the Regulations made under Part XLIX. of the Act to the municipal district of such municipality or any part thereof:

And whereas the Council of the Shire of Hampden has requested that the operation of the said Regulations be extended to parts of the municipal district of the Shire of Hampden:

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, by this, my Proclamation, do hereby extend the operation of the Regulations made under Part XLIX. of the Local Government Act 1958 (as amended), to those parts of the municipal district of the Shire of Hampden described hereunder—

- 1. (1) The whole of the area comprised within the boundaries of the Town of Terang, Parish of Terang.
- (2) All that area being Crown allotments 2, 3 and 4 of section 16 in the Parish of Terang.
- (3) The area comprised within the boundaries of the plan of subdivision lodged in the Office of Titles, and numbered 12516, and being the western portion of Crown allotment 7 of no section in the Parish of Terang.
- (4) The area comprised within the boundaries of the plan of subdivision lodged in the Office of Titles, and numbered 44577, and being the southern portion of Crown allotment 1 of no section in the Parish of Terang.
- (5) All that area being those parts of Crown allotments 5 and 8 of no section in the Parish of Terang, which are bounded on the north-west by a Railway Reserve, on the east by a Government road and on the south-east by the Princes Highway.
- (6) All those areas being those parts of Crown allotments 9 to 15, both inclusive of no section, in the Parish of Terang, having frontage to the Princes Highway, Dow-street, Emeny-street and the Cobden-Terang road, having a depth of 250 links from such frontages.
- (7) All that area being those parts of Crown allotments 18, 19 and 20 of no section in the Parish of Terang, having frontages to the Cobden-Terang road and a Government road bounding the said allotment 18 on the north-west and bounded on the north and north-west by the said roads and on the south by a line 250 links from and bearing parallel to the northern boundaries of the said allotments 19 and 20.
- (8) All that area being that part of Crown allotment 16 of no section, Parish of Terang, having frontages to Government roads bounding the said allotment on the north and south-east and bounded on the north and south-east by the said roads and on the south by a line 250 links from and bearing parallel to the northern boundary of the said allotment.
- to the northern boundary of the said allotment.

 2. All that area commencing at the north-eastern angle of Crown allotment 10e of section 21 in the Parish of Glenormiston; thence north-easterly by a line to the most westerly angle of lot 8 on the plan of subdivision lodged in the Office of Titles, and numbered 11317, being parts of Crown allotments 9 and 7 of section 21 in the said parish; thence north-easterly by a line parallel to the Glenormiston-road, through the said allotments 9 and 7 to its intersection with the eastern boundary of the said allotment 7; thence southerly by the eastern boundary of the said allotment 7 to the north-western boundary of the said allotment 7 to the north-western boundary of the said allotment 11 of section 21 and southerly by the eastern boundary of the said allotment 11 to its south-eastern boundary of the said allotment 11 to its south-eastern angle; thence south-easterly by a line across the McKinnon's Bridge-Noorat road to the north-eastern angle of lot 6 in the plan of subdivision lodged in the Office of Titles, and numbered 6238; thence southerly by the eastern boundary of the said lot 6 to its south-eastern angle and westerly by the southern boundaries of lots 6, 5, 4, 3, 2 and 1 in the said plan of subdivision No. 2638 to the south-western angle of the said lot 1; thence westerly by a line parallel to the Glenormiston-road to its intersection with the eastern boundary of lot 16 on the plan of subdivision lodged in the Office of Titles, and numbered 4050; thence southerly by the eastern

boundaries of lots 16 and 34 on the said plan of subdivision No. 4050 to the south-eastern angle of the said lot 34 and westerly by its southern boundary and the southern boundary of Salisbury-street to its intersection with the eastern boundary of the Terang-Mortlake road; thence north-westerly by a line across the Terang-Mortlake road to the south-eastern angle of Crown allotment 3A of section 22 in the said parish; thence westerly along the southern boundary of the said allotment 3A a distance of 800 links; thence due north by a line across the said allotment 3A, a Government road and Crown allotment 1B of section 24 to its intersection with the northern boundary of the said allotment 1B and easterly by its northern boundary to its north-eastern angle: thence north-westerly by a line across the Terang-Mortlake road to the most westerly angle of Crown allotment 10A of section 21 in the said parish and easterly by the northern boundaries of Crown allotments 10A, 10C, 10D and 10E of the said section 21 to the point of commencement.

- 3. (a) Sections 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 6A, 6B, 7, 8 and 9 and of Crown allotments 15, 20 and 21 of section 30, Township of Derrinallum, Parish of Tooliorook.
- (b) All that area being that part of Crown allotment 56a, Parish of Geelengla, having a frontage to the Hamilton Highway and bounded on the north by the said highway and on the south by a line 500 links from and parallel to the said highway.
- (c) All that area being Crown allotments 55B and 55D and that part of allotment 55A which is bounded on the west by the northern prolongation of the western boundary of Crown allotment 56A, in the Parish of Geelengla.
- (d) Lots 2 to 105 both inclusive on the plan of subdivision lodged in the Office of Titles and numbered 6046, being part of Crown allotment 36B, in the Parish of Dunnawalla.
- 4. (a) Sections 1 to 19, both inclusive, in the Town of Lismore, Parish of Lismore.
- (c) All that area being part of Suburban Crown allotment 17 of section 2, Town of Lismore, Parish of Lismore, having a frontage to the Hamilton Highway and bounded on the north by the said highway, on the east by the eastern boundary of the said allotment 17, on the south by the western prolongation of the southern boundary of the Suburban Crown allotment 19 of section 2, and on the west by the southern prolongation of the western boundary of Suburban Crown allotment 12 of section 2 in the said Town.
- 5. (a) All that part of the Township of Skipton in the Parish of Skipton that is east of the Mount Emu Creek excepting thereat, those portions which are within sections 2A and 2B of the said township.
- (b) All of the lots numbered 2 to 18 both inclusive on the plan of subdivision lodged in the Office of Titles and numbered 22155 and being part of Crown allotment 8B of section 5, Parish of Skipton.

And Order that the said Regulations shall come into operation in the above-mentioned parts of the municipal district of the Shire of Hampden on publication of this Proclamation in the Government Gazette, provided that Parts I. and II. of Chapter 8 thereof shall not be deemed to come into operation till the 22nd June, 1964, except in so far as may be necessary to enable the Council of the said municipality to make By-laws pursuant to the powers conferred by Part III. of the said Chapter, and provided further that no such By-law shall come into operation before the 22nd June, 1964.

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Companies Act 1961. INVESTMENT COMPANIES—SECTION 334.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the provisions of section 334 of an Act of Parliament of the State of Victoria passed in the tenth year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II. intituled the Companies Act 1961, it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may by Proclamation published in the Government Gazette declare to be an investment company any corporation which is engaged primarily in the business of investment in marketable securities for the purpose of revenue and for profit and not for the purpose of exercising control:

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this my Proclamation declare Palladium Investment Limited to be an Investment Company for the purposes of the provisions aforesaid.




