AREA OF LAND COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION


ROAD DISCONTINUED.—CITY OF SOUTH MELBOURNE.



- 3. No person, except members of the Committee or its officers or employees duly authorized in that behalf, shall enter any part of the Reserve when a charge for admission is made without payment of the fee chargeable for admission. admission.
- 4. The Committee shall have power to let any portion 4. The Committee shall have power to let any portion of the Reserve to any club, association, or persons for the purpose of holding fetes, entertainments, musical performances, or for the playing of bowls, tennis or other physical recreation, subject to the payment of such fees and on such terms and conditions as it may deem reasonable and consistent with these Regulations, and to authorize any club, association or person to make a charge for admission to the Reserve or such portion of the Reserve as hereinbefore provided.

No club or association of any kind, having for its object physical recreation, or any member or members of any club or association, or any person, shall play, practice or engage in any game or sport within the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained, unless such person is at the time of playing a member of any club or association which is duly authorized to play such game or sport within the Reserve or in such portion of the Reserve at such time, or is a member of a visiting club or association playing against members of any club or association duly authorized as aforesaid.

- (j) post, stick, paint or otherwise affix or mark any advertisement, bill, placard, or other notice therein, or on any structure, erection, rock, tree, fence, or anything in or around the Reserve, or give out or distribute any handbills, placarde, potices, advertisements, books. placards, notices, advertisement pamphlets or papers in the Reserve; advertisements.
- (k) remove, deface, or damage any notice board, structure or fittings in the Reserve;
- (1) throw any stones, earth or sand or other missiles or light any fire or commit any nuisance in the Reserve or in any property therein;
- (m) spit on the paths or in any structure or any part of the Reserve whatsoever;
- (n) leave or deposit or cause to be left or deposited any glass, bottle, paper, fruit, peel, litter or rubbish or refuse of any kind in the Reserve, except in the receptacles provided by the Committee for such purpose;
- (o) ride or drive any animal, bicycle or other vehicle on any path or in any part of the Reserve;
- (p) gamble or bet publicly in any part of the Reserve, and any person infringing this Regulation shall be liable in addition to any other penalty, to expulsion from the Reserve;
- (q) cause or suffer any dog or other animal belonging to him or in his charge to enter or remain in
- 7. No person while in the Reserve shall, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee being first had and obtained-
 - (a) hawk, sell, offer for sale, or advertise for sale, any article of food, drink, goods, wares or merchandise;
 - (b) erect any building, tent, structure, or obstruction, in any part of the Reserve, and then only under such conditions as may be determined by the Committee;
 - (c) bring any intoxicating liquor into the Reserve;
 - (d) solicit or gather money or other thing;
 - (e) take part in any public entertainment of any sort;
 - (f) take part in any public meeting, assembly for public worship, preach, declaim, harangue, or deliver any address or public speaking of any kind:
 - carry, use or discharge any fireworks, firearms, air gun, or other lethal weapon.
- 8. No person shall use the sanitary conveniences or structures in the Reserve or any part of the same, for any purpose other than that for which the same are constructed, and shall then use only such portion of such structure as are specially constructed for the purpose.

- 8. No person shall make or cause to be made any violent outcry, noise, disturbance, or sound, or shall play any musical or noisy instrument, or sing in the Reserve, nor shall any person preach or declaim, harangue, or deliver any address of any kind to members of the public in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- 9. No person shall sell or offer for sale in the Reserve any article of food or drink or any other commodity, or operate any money-making amusement, or erect any tent, booth, stand, building, or other structure without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained
- 10. No person shall camp in the Reserve or assemble in the Reserve for fêtes, picnics, or concerts, or for the purpose of public worship, preaching, or public speaking of and kind, or meetings of a like character, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- 11. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any game or sport within the Reserve on Anzac Day or Good Friday.
- 12. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
- 13. No person except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.
- 14. No person shall remove any trees, timber, saplings, shrubs, or other vegetation, sand, stone, earth, marl, or gravel from the Reserve.
- 15. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any buildings, structures, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish, nor roll nor throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.
- 16. No person shall affix, print, post, paint, or cut or mark any advertisement, sign, picture, bill, placard, notice, words, letters, or figures to or upon any wall or fence in or enclosing the Reserve or to or upon any tree, building, barrier, railing, seat, structure, erection, flagging, or path in the Reserve without the consent of the Committee of Management.
- 17. No person shall in the Reserve wilfully obstruct, disturb, interrupt, or annoy any other person in the proper use of the Reserve, or any part thereof, or wilfully obstruct or interrupt any servant of the Committee of Management in the proper execution of his duty or work.

Further no person shall leave such a fire unattended, without completely extinguishing it.
 - (g) Dig or remove any sand, soil or other material in or from the Reserve.
 - (h) Deposit any rubbish, debris or material of any kind on the Reserve.
 - kind on the Reserve.

 (i) Bring or allow any animal of any kind into the Reserve other than a dog under the immediate control of a person who is legally hunting ducks during the open season and is the holder of a current Game Licence. Any dog except as mentioned aforesaid shall be liable to be destroyed. Any "cattle" as defined by section 3 of the Pounds Act 1988 found trespassing within the Reserve shall be liable to be impounded.

- (j) Carry a firearm of any description or any weapon or instrument capable of discharging a missile, shoot at, or kill, or injure any animal, bird, or other wildlife; provided that, subject to the provisions of the Game Act 1958, the holder of a current Game Licence legally in pursuit of wild ducks during the open season for such ducks may use a shot gun as defined under the Game Act 1958.
- (k) Use within the Reserve any motor boat or powered water craft having an engine with a developed horse-power greater than three horse-power, excepting that boats with a greater horse-power may use such areas within the boundaries which are defined for such purposes.
- (1) Deposit on the Reserve or construct within the Reserve any fence, shed structure or equipment.

 Any fence, shed structure or other equipment located within the Reserve without permission will be dismantled and removed from the Reserve.

No person shall enter or travel over the Reserve with or on any motor car, motor cycle, bicycle, or other vehicle, except on such portions thereof provided for wheeled traffic, and the driver of such motor car, motor cycle, bicycle, or other vehicle shall be guided and directed, and shall abide by any notice, post, or sign, marking or barrier guide which has been marked or erected for the purpose of traffic guidance, control or direction.
- 6. No person shall drive a motor car, motor cycle, bicycle, or other vehicle within the Reserve recklessly, or at a speed or in a manner dangerous to the public, or likely to cause any damage to anything within the

- 7. No person or persons, except as hereunder provided, shall park any motor car, motor cycle, bicycle, or other vehicle within the Reserve.
- 8. Any person having immediate official business within the Reserve may park therein any motor car, motor cycle, bicycle, or other vehicle by which he has entered such Reserve, and then only for such time as such business occupied.
- 9. The Board may permit employees of the Crown using motor cars, motor cycles, bicycles, or other vehicles in course of their duties, or as a means of transport to and from their duties within the Reserve, to park such vehicles therein for such time as such employees may be considered to be on duty, and such vehicles shall only be parked within an area or areas within the Reserve as may be prescribed from time to time, and then so as not to interfere in any way with or obstruct the free passage of any other person or vehicle engaged in lawful business within the Reserve.
- 10. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or seats, or any wall, structure, or property within the Reserve.
- 11. No person in a state of intoxication, or who is disorderly, or is not decorously dressed, shall enter or remain in the Reserve, and no person shall commit therein any nuisance or any indecent or offensive act.
- 12. No person shall remain within the Reserve, or on any property therein, when lawfully directed to leave the same by any bailiff of Crown lands, or member of the Police Force, or authorized officer of the Board.
- 13. No person shall hawk or sell, or offer for sale, within the Reserve any goods, fruit, or merchandise, or anything, or solicit or gather money therein, without the authority, in writing, of the Board.
- 14. No person shall give out, or distribute, any hand-bills, placards, notices, advertisements, books, pamphlets, or papers in the Reserve, or litter the same by scattering or throwing down handbills, placards, notices, advertise-ments, books, pamphlets, or papers.
- 15. No person shall bring in to the Reserve any dog unless securely held by a chain, cord, or leash.
- 16. No person shall bring in or allow to remain in the Reserve any horse, cow, sheep, pig, or goat, and any such animal found wandering therein shall be liable to be impounded or destroyed.
- 17. No person, except on lawful occasions, may enter any enclosed area or any building, garage, or shed, or other structure within the Reserve.
- 18. No person shall make or cause to be made any violent outcry, noise, disturbance, or sound, or shall play upon any musical or noisy instrument, or sing within the Reserve.—(Rs.5285, Rs.3109.)

- 2. No person upon any public highway shall make or cause to be made any violent shout, out-cry, noise, disturbance, or sound such as may be calculated to cause annoyance or obstruction to any other person upon such highway, or in any premises abutting thereon, or adjacent thereto.
- 3. (a) No person shall on any land or premises make or cause to be made any noise materially interfering with the reasonable comfort (having regard to the time at which such noise is made or caused to be made) of any person in any adjacent premises or in any adjacent street or road.
- (b) No person shall use or cause to be used any premises or any part of any premises so that there emanates therefrom any noise materially interfering with the reasonable comfort (having regard to the time at which such noise is made or caused to be made) of any person in any adjacent premises or in any adjacent street or road.
- (c) The owner or occupier of any land or premises permitting any person on such land or premises to contravene the provisions of this clause shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.
- 4. Any wilful contravention of the foregoing clauses by act or omission shall be an offence against this By-law.
- 5. Every person guilty of an offence against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds and in the case of a continuing offence to a penalty of Five pounds for each day on which the offence against this By-law is continued after a conviction or order by
- 6. This By-law shall have force in and apply throughout the municipal district of the municipality of the City of Coburg.
- 7. By-law No. 86 is hereby repealed.


