

### PUBLIC HIGHWAY.—CITY OF MORDIALLOC.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia

WHEREAS by the Local Government Act 1958 (as amended), section 519, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon request of the council of any imunicipality, by notice in the Government Gazette, to proclaim any land reserved, used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley or right-of-way or any street, road, lane or passage made or laid out or proposed to be made or laid out on any land of which a plan delineating that street, road, lane or passage has been lodged with the Registrar of Titles, to be a public highway and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force:

And whereas the Council of the City of Mordialloc has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, used for a street, be so declared to be a public highway.

Now therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare that Bradshaw-street, coloured brown on plan of subdivision No. 11012, lodged in the Office of Titles shall be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act.

And whereas the Council of the City of Nunawading has been proclaimed the Authority under the said Act in respect of Blackburn Lake:

And whereas the City of Nunawading has recommended the prohibition of the use of the waters of the Blackburn Lake for motor boating:

Now therefore I, 'the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Motor Boating Act 1961 do by this my Proclamation prohibit the use of the waters of the Blackburn Lake for motor boating.

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Motor Boating Act 1961 do by this my Proclamation prohibit the use of the waters of Lake Weeroona by all boats except racing shells and needal hoats pedal boats.





- IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts and of any and every other power it thereunto enabling, the Mayor, Councillors and Citizens of the City of Springvale order as follows:—
