Gas Regulation Act 1958.
EMERGENCY POWERS TO HAVE EFFECT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 34 of the *Gas Regulation Act 1958*, it is amongst other things enacted that whenever it appears to the Governor in Council that from any cause the available supply of gas is or is likely to become less than is sufficient for the reasonable requirements of the community, the Governor in Council may from time to time exercise all or any of the powers conferred on him by or under the said section and may from time to time by Proclamation declare that on and after the date of the publication of such Proclamation, or a later date specified therein, the provisions of section 34 of the said Act shall have effect:

And whereas the Gas and Fuel Corporation of Victoria has reported to the Chief Secretary that a state of emergency has arisen which renders it impossible for the said company to provide a normal supply of gas:

And whereas as a consequence it appears to the Governor in Council that the available supply of gas is less than is sufficient for the reasonable requirements of the community in the areas supplied by the said Corporation except the areas of Altona-Seaholme, Kyneton and Castlemaine:

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 34 of the said Act, do by this my Proclamation declare that on and after the date of the publication of this my Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* the provisions of section 34 of the *Gas Regulation Act 1958* shall have effect.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this twenty-seventh day of May, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and sixty-four, and in the thirteenth year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II.
