PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Division 12 of Part I. of the *Land Act 1958* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time increase, and, after one month's notice in the *Government Gazette*, diminish, alter, or abolish any common, and may from time to time re-proclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of the said Part of the said Act, and that nothing therein contained shall prevent the exercise of the powers conferred by the said Part of the said Act with respect to the leasing or licensing of any land comprised in any common: And whereas notice of the intention to diminish the Beaufort, Raglan, Charlton and Eurambeen United Goldfield and Farmers' Common has been duly published in the *Government Gazette* for one month:

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby diminish the Beaufort, Raglan, Charlton and Eurambeen United Goldfield and Farmers' Common by deducting therefrom the portion in the Parish of Beaufort containing 366 acres as defined by description published in the *Government Gazette* of 15th April, 1964.—(C.65814.)

RULES OF THE COUNCIL OF LEGAL EDUCATION.

RULES RELATING TO THE QUALIFICATION AND ADMISSION OF CANDIDATE.

The 14th Day of April, 1964.

IN pursuance of the authority in this behalf conferred upon the Council of Legal Education by the *Legal Profession Practice Act 1958*, the said Council hereby alters its Rules made the seventeenth day of October, 1962, and amended the third day of April, 1963, the twenty-third day of October, 1963 and the twenty-fifth day of November, 1963, as follows:—

1. By repealing Rule 27 and substituting therefor the following new Rule:—

"27. Service under articles shall be dispensed with where any person—

(a) has completed a period of eight years service in the offices of the Supreme Court, or of the Registry of the High Court of Australia, or of the Attorney-General, Solicitor-General, Crown Solicitor, Public Trustee, Public Solicitor, or Registrar of Titles for Victoria, or of the Attorney-General, Solicitor-General, or Crown Solicitor for the Commonwealth or any Deputy Crown Solicitor for the Commonwealth, or in the offices of the Commonwealth Industrial Court or the Registry of the Bankruptcy Court, or partly in one and partly in another; and

(b) obtains from the Council of the Institute a certificate that the said Council is satisfied that during the last four years of the period aforesaid his duties, and the work performed by him, have been such as to require a knowledge of the law, and to give a training in the practice of the law which may reasonably be accepted in lieu of service under articles."

2. By repealing the last sentence of Rule 37 and substituting therefor the following sentences:—

"Notwithstanding anything in this Rule, the Crown Solicitor for Victoria may have five articulated clerks serving articles of clerkship with him at any one time and the Deputy Crown Solicitor for the Commonwealth in Victoria may have five articulated clerks serving articles of clerkship with him at any one time. In ascertaining the number of articulated clerks for the purposes of this Rule—

(a) an articulated clerk who is absent from service under articles on war service as defined in Rule 28; and

(b) a clerk entering into supplementary articles in consequence of any such absence— shall not be counted."

3. By repealing Rule 53 and substituting therefor the following new Rules:—

"53. Upon application being made to it, the Board may, by unanimous decision of those present either absolutely or where the circumstances so require conditionally upon compliance with conditions imposed by it, dispense with compliance by the applicant with any provision relating to his case contained in these Rules if it appears that compliance with any such provision is then impossible or would occasion undue hardship and that the failure to comply with it has not substantially diminished or, if conditions imposed by the Board are complied with, will not substantially diminish, the value of the training and qualifications required by these Rules

53A. The Faculty, in the case of candidates enrolled at the University, or the Legal Education Committee, in the case of candidates seeking to qualify in the manner provided for by Rule 21 or Rule 24, may either absolutely or where the circumstances so require conditionally upon compliance with conditions imposed by it, exempt a candidate from passing any subject which

he would, save for the operation of sub-rule (2) of Rule 20, have passed or be exempted under Rule 19 from passing, or be deemed under Rule 19 to have passed, if it appears that the value of the qualifications required by these Rules will not be substantially diminished if such exemption is granted, or is granted subject to compliance with any conditions imposed, as the case may be."

4. By deleting the word "Board" from proviso (ii) to Rule 19 and from sub-rule (2) of Rule 20 and from the proviso to Rule 23 and substituting therefor the word "Faculty".

5. By inserting in Rule 24 after the words "'the Faculty'" the words "wherever appearing".

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "BONANG CAMPING RESERVE", PARISH OF BIDWELL.

WHEREAS by section 218 of the *Land Act 1958* power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the Land Acts for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works in pursuance of the power conferred aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land in the Parish of Bidwell temporarily reserved by Order in Council dated the 29th October, 1963, as a site for Public Purposes (Camping) in the Parish of Bidwell hereinafter referred to as the Reserve.

The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management (hereinafter referred to as the "Committee") with power and authority to enforce these Regulations.

REGULATIONS.

1. No person offending against decency as regards dress, language or conduct shall remain in the Reserve.
2. No person shall climb or jump over any fences or gates in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, seats or other improvements therein, or otherwise disfigure, injure or destroy the said fences, seats or other improvements, or remove any soil therefrom.
3. No person shall deposit, or cause to be deposited wastepaper, bottles or any other litter on any part of the Reserve, except in the receptacles provided for the purpose.
4. No person shall erect any structure on the Reserve other than a tent or booth, and then only as hereinafter provided.
5. No person shall camp, or erect any tent, in or upon the Reserve, except in such places as shall from time to time be set apart for such purposes, and then only by obtaining a permit to do so upon such terms and conditions, and the payment of such fees, as the Committee of Management shall determine.
6. No person shall erect a booth in the Reserve for the purpose of offering for sale any articles, nor shall any person offer for sale in the Reserve any articles without the permission, in writing, and subject to such conditions and payment of such fees fixed by the Committee of Management.
7. All persons using the conveniences provided by the Committee of Management on the Reserve, shall pay such charges (if any) for the use of same as shall from time to time be fixed by the Committee of Management.
8. No person shall light fires, except in places set apart for that purpose by the Committee of Management and no refuse material shall be burned in the Reserve, except by a representative of the Committee of Management, and then only in places set apart for the purpose.
9. No person shall break glass of any kind in the Reserve, or leave thereon anything which shall or may injure any person.
10. No person shall discharge any gun, pistol, rifle, airgun or any firearm in or upon the Reserve.
11. No person shall put in or on the Reserve any cattle, goats, pigs, horses, or other animals, or any vehicles, without the permission of the Committee of Management first obtained.
12. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

13. Permission of the Committee of Management must be obtained beforehand for the holding of all organized sports, picnics or functions of any kind in the Reserve.—(Rs.8245.)

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "MELTON RECREATION RESERVE".

WHEREAS by section 218 of the *Land Act 1958* power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the *Land Acts* for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works in pursuance of the power conferred aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land in the Township of Melton temporarily reserved by Order in Council dated the 24th September, 1907, as a site for Public Recreation, and known as the "Melton Recreation Reserve" (hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve").

The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management (hereinafter referred to as the "Committee") with power and authority to enforce these Regulations.

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days, not exceeding 52 in any one year, as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Ten shillings may be charged and taken for admission of every adult to the Reserve.

2. No person shall—

- (a) enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language or conduct, or who may behave in a disorderly, unseemly, or offensive manner, or create or take part in any disturbance;
- (b) enter or remain in the Reserve whilst in a state of intoxication;
- (c) bring any intoxicating liquor on the Reserve without the consent of the Committee first obtained;
- (d) exercise or train any horse or pony on the Reserve, or any part thereof, without the consent of the Committee first obtained.

3. The Committee shall have the power to hold entertainments shows or performances on the Reserve, and to make a charge for admission thereto as hereinbefore provided.

4. The Committee shall have power to let any portion of the Reserve to any club, association, person or society for the purpose of holding entertainments, performances, shows or sports, subject to the payment of such fees and on such terms as it may deem to be reasonable and consistent with these Regulations, and to authorize any club, association, society or person to make a charge for admission thereto as hereinbefore provided in these Regulations.

5. No person, except the Committee its officers or employees on duty, shall enter any part of the Reserve on an occasion when a charge is made for admission thereto without first paying the fees chargeable for such admission.

6. No person shall park a motor car, vehicle or motor cycle in the Reserve except at such places as are set apart for the purpose by the Committee, who reserve the right to make a parking charge not exceeding Three shillings for each vehicle.

7. No person shall play or engage in any organized sport, game or competition within the Reserve on Sundays, Good Friday, or Anzac Day without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

8. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission of the Committee first obtained, in writing.

9. No person shall play, practise or engage in any organized game or sport within the Reserve at any time without permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

10. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection or enclosure on the occasion of any sport, fêtes or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee may at any time determine by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken on such stand, building, erection or enclosure, and such Committee in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such damage, injury or loss from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee.

11. No person shall, in the Reserve, interfere with or break or damage any of the trees, plants or shrubs, or pluck any flowers, or climb, jump or get over or under any of the fences, gates, seats, or any other structures therein, or roll or throw stones or other missiles, or leave any bottles, broken glass, paper, orange peel, banana skins, or refuse or rubbish whatsoever therein, or post bills, or advertisements on any of the fences, gates, seats or other structures therein.

12. No person shall light a fire in the Reserve without the consent of the Committee, and then only in an approved fire-place or other facility provided.

13. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs or other animals without permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

14. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by a chain, or cord without permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

15. No person shall camp in the Reserve nor erect therein any building, or any booth for the purpose of offering for sale any article without permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

16. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any sport, including tennis, cricket, quoits, hockey or any other games or foot racing, except in the portions of the Reserve set apart for that purpose, and then only with the permission of the Committee first obtained, and such permission may be granted subject to such terms and conditions as the Committee may determine.

17. No person shall enter the Reserve, or pass over the playing area or oval with any vehicle or on horseback without the permission of the Committee first obtained, nor ride or drive amongst or to the danger or annoyance of persons assembled on any part of the Reserve.

18. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve without permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

19. No person, club, or any other body shall, without the consent of the Committee first obtained, grade or scrape the ground off or cut or burn any grass growing on any part of the Reserve.

20. No person shall remove any earth, sand, stone, marl, or gravel from the Reserve.

These Regulations are made in lieu of all previous Regulations in respect of the said land, which are hereby revoked.—(Rs.609.)

1. By-law No. 137 of the City of Springvale (formerly the Shire of Springvale and Noble Park) is hereby repealed.

2. In this By-law unless inconsistent with or repugnant to the context—

"Council" means the Council of the City of Springvale;

"Derelict motor car" means any derelict motor car which has been left standing in any street or road for a period exceeding seven days;

"Motor car" has the same meaning as in the Motor Car Act 1958;

"Unregistered motor car" means any motor car which is not registered under the provisions of the Motor Car Act 1958.

3. No person shall leave any derelict or unregistered motor car standing on any street or road.

4. (1) The proper officer of the Council appointed for the purpose may cause any derelict or unregistered motor car left standing in any street or road to be removed to a place set aside by the Council for that purpose.

(2) The Council shall cause notice of such removal to be published as soon as practicable in a newspaper generally circulating in the municipal district in the form or to the effect in the First Schedule hereto.

(3) If any motor car removed as aforesaid is not claimed by the owner thereof within 21 days of the publication of the notice referred to in sub-clause (2) hereof the Council shall dispose of the same by selling it by public auction or private treaty.

(4) Notwithstanding anything contained in sub-clause (3) hereof any motor car removed as aforesaid having registration numbers affixed to it shall not be sold unless a notice in the form or to the effect in the Second Schedule hereto has been served on the person recorded as the last owner of such motor car at the address recorded by the Motor Registration Branch of the Victoria Police Force and the time mentioned in such notice has expired.

(5) The proceeds of any such sale shall be applied by the Council—

- Firstly, in payment of all charges imposed under this By-law;
- Secondly, in payment of the residue (if any) to the owner of such motor car; and
- Thirdly, if the owner of such motor car cannot be found within three months of the date of the sale in payment of the residue into the municipal fund of the Council.

(6) In the event of the Council being unable to sell any motor car removed as aforesaid within two months after the date of removal the Council may dispose of the same as it thinks fit.

(7) The owner of any motor car removed as aforesaid shall be entitled to the release of the same at any time prior to the sale or disposal upon payment of all charges owing thereon under this By-law.

5. The following charges are hereby imposed for the removal and disposal of derelict or unregistered motor cars:—

- (a) For the removal thereof, the sum of Sixty shillings for each mile or part thereof necessarily travelled from the place of standing to the place set aside by the Council under clause 4 (1) hereof; and
- (b) For the disposal thereof, the sum of Ten shillings for each week such motor car is held in the yard of the Council plus the cost of the publication of all notices and advertisements and any other out-of-pocket expenses necessarily incurred by the Council.

6. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the City of Springvale.

Refuse and Rubbish By-law.

A By-law of the City of Waverley made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1958* and section 93 of the *Health Act 1958* and numbered 88 for:—

- (a) Prohibiting the deposit or leaving of refuse or rubbish on streets, roads, lanes or passages, or on any land.
- (b) The provision, use and control of receptacles for the deposit and collection of refuse and rubbish and prescribing the size and shape of and the materials to be used in the construction of such receptacles.
- (c) Imposing upon the occupier of any premises the duties of the cleansing of footways and pavements adjoining such premises.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1958* and the *Health Act 1958* and of any and every other power it thereunto enabling, the Mayor, Councillors and Citizens of the City of Waverley order as follows:—

1. This By-law shall be known as the Refuse and Rubbish By-law.

2. By-law No. 63 of the City of Waverley relating to refuse and rubbish is hereby repealed.

3. No person shall deposit or leave any refuse or rubbish on any street, road, lane or passage.

4. No person shall deposit or leave any refuse or rubbish on any land (other than land set apart for the purpose by the Council) unless the same is deposited in such a receptacle and in such manner as is hereinafter provided.

5. (a) The Council may by notice in writing under the hand of the Town Clerk or Health Inspector, require the owner or occupier of any land to remove or destroy (within the time limited in such notice) all refuse or rubbish on such land (other than refuse or rubbish the removal of which the Council has undertaken or contracted for under section 48 of the *Health Act 1958*).

(b) Any owner or occupier to whom any such notice shall have been given shall comply with the terms thereof within the time therein limited.

6. The occupier of every premises shall provide and at all times keep at such premises a receptacle constructed in accordance with the provisions of the next succeeding clause hereof, for the deposit and collection of refuse and rubbish, or so many of such receptacles as may be necessary to contain all refuse and rubbish from such premises and shall cause all such refuse and rubbish to be placed in such receptacle or receptacles with the least possible delay.

7. No such receptacle shall exceed 3 cubic feet in volume and every such receptacle shall be constructed of galvanized iron properly riveted and soldered so as to be watertight, or of strong and impervious plastic material and shall be fitted with handles for convenience in lifting or moving and emptying the same and shall be provided with a close fitting metal or plastic cover so constructed and fitted as to exclude the entry or rats, mice, flies and other vermin and insects.

8. All refuse or rubbish likely to become offensive shall be wrapped in paper before being placed in any such receptacle.

9. The occupier of every premises shall on the day on which the Council notifies him that refuse and rubbish shall be collected from such premises, place the receptacle or receptacles provided by him as aforesaid immediately inside a gate of such premises leading to a street upon which such premises front adjoin or abut.

10. No person shall place or cause, or permit to be placed, any slops or liquid waste in such receptacle, nor shall deposit any moist refuse in such receptacle unless such moist refuse has been previously strained and effectually wrapped in paper.

11. The occupier of every premises shall cause every such receptacle on his premises to be kept at all times clean and disinfected and properly covered with such close fitting cover provided as aforesaid.

12. The occupier of every premises shall cleanse and at all times keep clean the footway and pavement adjoining such premises.

13. Any person guilty of any wilful act or default contrary to clause 3 or clause 4 of this By-law shall for a first offence be liable to a penalty of not more than £20 and for any second or subsequent offence contrary thereto be liable to a penalty of not less than £50 not more than £100.

14. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Municipal District.

Amending By-law No. 7.—Fees Payable at Abattoirs.

A By-law of the Borough of Kyabram, made under the provisions of the *Local Government Act* and the *Health Act*, and numbered 18, for the purpose of amending the By-law of the said Borough of Kyabram, No. 7.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1958* and the *Health Act 1958*, and of any and every other power it hereunto enabling, the Mayor, Councillors and Burgesses of the Borough of Kyabram order as follows:—

1. That clause 9 of By-law No. 7 be repealed and the following clause be inserted in lieu thereof:—

9. (i) The fees payable to the Council for the services specified herein carried out by or under the direction of the meat inspector shall be as follows:—

For the use of a public abattoir for slaughtering any—

- (a) Bull, cow, calf (other than bobby calf), heifer, ox or steer—Six shillings.
- (b) Bobby calf, goat, kid, lamb or sheep—One shilling and three pence.
- (c) Head of swine—Two shillings and six pence.
