
PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS by the Local Government Act 1958, as amended, section 519, it is amongst other thing enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon request of the Council of any municipality, by notice in the Government Gazette, to proclaim any land reserved, used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley or right-of-way or any street, road, lane or passage made or laid out or proposed to be made or laid out on land of which a plan delineating that street, road, lane or passage has been lodged with the Registrar of Titles, to be a public highway and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force:

And whereas the Council of the Shire of South Gippsland has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, used for a street, be so declared to be a public highway.

Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare that all that piece of land shown hatched on the plan hereunder shall be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act.







RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE GROVEDALE PUBLIC CEMETERY.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Cemeteries Act 1958 (No. 6217), the Trustees of the Grovedale Public Cemetery make the following Rules and Regulations (that is to say):

- 1. These Rules and Regulations shall come into force immediately after their publication in the Government
- 2. All fees and charges shall be paid when applications are made or orders are given.
- 3. Any person desiring ground for a private grave shall apply to the Trustees therefor, who, if the application is approved and the prescribed fees are paid, will issue a burial right (Schedule B) which shall give the holder and his representatives the exclusive right of burial or interment in the portion of ground allotted thereby as a family or private burial place, and the right on obtaining the permission of the Trustees, as hereafter mentioned, to erect and maintain any monument, cenotaph, tablet, or other erection therein.
- 4. Any person desiring to construct a vault, tombstone, or other erection shall apply to the Trustees for permission to do so, and submit a plan or drawing with a copy of any proposed inscription or epitaph, and no such erection shall be made without the written approval of the Trustees, and upon payment of the prescribed fee.
- 5. No interment shall be permitted until an application has been made, the particulars required in the form Schedule A given, an order obtained, and a certificate from a Coroner, Justice of the Peace, or Registrar of Deaths has been delivered to the Secretary.
- 6. Application for an order for interment shall be made at least eight working hours before the time fixed for the burial.
- 7. No coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground unless it contains the body of a child under twelve years, when it shall be not less than 3 feet below the ordinary level of the ground, and a layer of earth at least six inches thick shall be left undisturbed above and around any coffin previously buried in the same
- 8. The hours of burial shall be: On week-days, September to April inclusive, 10 a.m. to 6 p.m.; May to August inclusive, 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. No interment shall be allowed on Sunday except when it is certified, in writing, by the Officer of Health of the district, or by a Police Magistrate, or Justice of the Peace that for sanitary reasons it is necessary that the burial take place on that days and on payment of a special fee as previided. day; and on payment of a special fee as provided.
- 9. No re-interment or removal from another cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there can be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the Coroner, Justice of the Peace, or Registrar of Death, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.
- 10. No private grave shall be reopened or any interment permitted therein without the consent, in writing, of the person entitled to give the same.

11. No person employed by the Trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever in the discharge of his duty, nor shall he be allowed to be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than that for which he received payment or for which he has special authority from the Trustees.

12. The cemetery shall, unless otherwise ordered, be open to the public from 7 a.m. to sunset daily throughout the year.

13. No person shall be permitted to pluck any flower, or take any tree, shrub, or plant from the cemetery, unless with the previous authority of the Trustees.

14. No smoking shall be allowed nor any firearms discharged within the cemetery.

15. No dogs shall be allowed in the cemetery.

16. No trees shall be planted on a grave without the permission of Trustees.

17. All material in the completion of any stone or other work shall be fully prepared before being taken to the cemetery. Stones, refuse and rubbish remaining after the work is completed shall be removed at once by the person employed on the work.

18. If it is proposed to allow two interments in the one grave, each adult grave shall be dug 7 feet deep.

- (e) throw or discharge any missile likely to cause danger or annoyance to any person in the area, or damage to any building, gate, fence, seat, tree, shrub or other improvement therein;
- (f) play or practice any game, throw any ball, or let off fireworks within the area.
- 4. Within the area no person shall-
 - (a) park any vehicle except on a road or parking bay set aside for that purpose;
 - (b) park any vehicle in any place whatsoever where the proper officer has directed such person not to park such vehicle;
 - (c) park any vehicle on any lawn, garden or pathway;
- (d) drive any vehicle over or along any lawn, garden or pathway.
