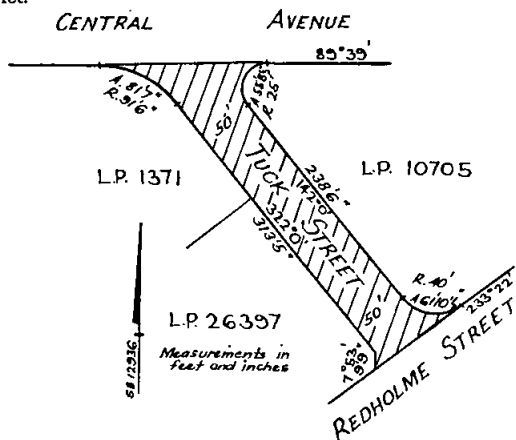

MILK PASTEURIZATION ACT 1958.

PROCLAMATION

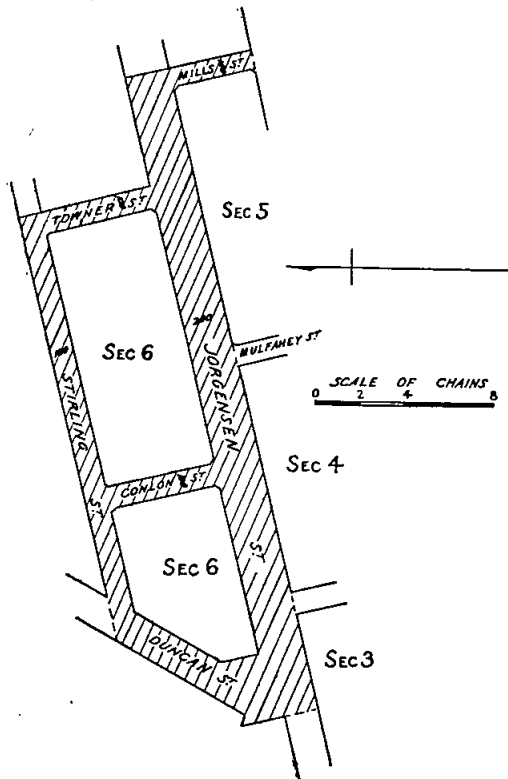

RATING BY-LAW No. 7.

INTERIM DEVELOPMENT ORDER.

WHEREAS by the *Town and Country Planning Act 1961* it is provided that a responsible authority may, with the approval of the Governor in Council, make an Interim Development Order regulating, restricting, restraining or prohibiting the use or development of any land or the erection, construction or carrying out of any buildings or works on any land within any area to which the scheme relates:

And whereas the Council of the Shire of Fern Tree Gully, on the 7th day of June, 1954, commenced the preparation of a planning scheme for the whole of the Shire of Fern Tree Gully as then constituted:

And whereas, pursuant to section 16 of the *Local Government Act 1958*, the Shire of Knox was constituted on the 16th November, 1963, by the severance of portion of the Shire of Fern Tree Gully:

And whereas by an Order made pursuant to section 51 of the *Town and Country Planning Act 1961*, the Governor in Council, on the 17th day of December, 1963, ordered that the said scheme be divided into two parts and that the Council of the Shire of Knox and the Council of the Shire of Fern Tree Gully be separately authorized to continue the preparation of the said scheme as divided and that each be deemed always to have been the responsible authority in relation to that part of the scheme within their respective municipal districts:

Now therefore, by virtue of the powers conferred by the *Town and Country Planning Act 1961*, and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Fern Tree Gully (hereinafter referred to as the Responsible Authority) hereby, with the approval of the Governor in Council given pursuant to section 17 of the said Act, makes the following Interim Development Order for the purpose or regulating, restricting, restraining or prohibiting the use or development of any land or the erection, construction or carrying out of any buildings or works, that is to say:—

1. Except in accordance with the provisions of a permit issued by the Responsible Authority, no person shall—

- (a) use, subdivide or otherwise develop any land or erect, construct or carry out any buildings or works on any land within the area described in the First Schedule hereto; or
- (b) fell, destroy or uproot any living indigenous species of trees on any land described in the Second Schedule hereto.

2. Nothing in this Interim Development Order shall prevent—

- (a) the continuance of the use of any land or of any existing building or works for the purposes for which the land or building or works was or were being lawfully used immediately before the coming into operation of this Order;
- (b) any dealing, or the registration of any dealing with any land in any subdivision of which a plan has been sealed by the Council of the Shire of Fern Tree Gully, and lodged with the Registrar of Titles, pursuant to section 569 of the *Local Government Act 1958*, before the coming into operation of this Order; or
- (c) the destruction and removal of any plant proclaimed by the Governor in Council as a noxious weed by virtue of the provisions of sub-section (2) of section 3 of Act No. 6409.

3. Every application for a permit under the provisions of this Order shall be made on the prescribed form, copies of which may be obtained from the office of the Responsible Authority at the municipal offices of the Shire of Fern Tree Gully.

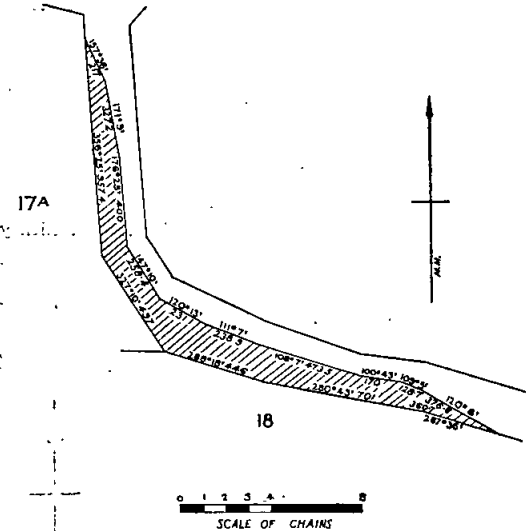

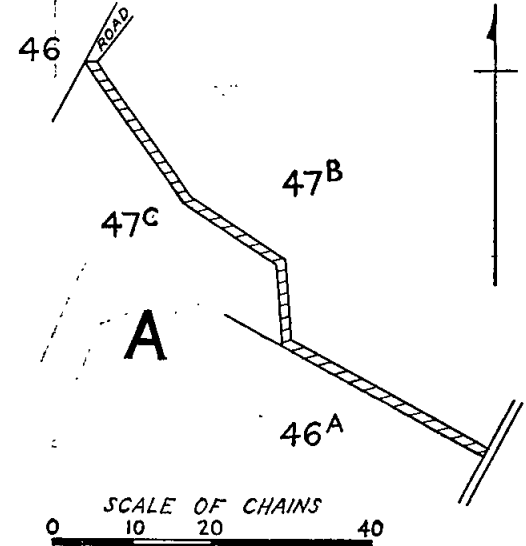

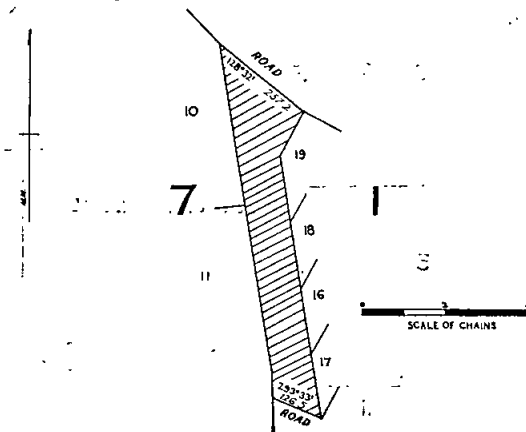

BY-LAW NO. 117.

Camping and Caravan By-law.

A By-law of the City of Box Hill made under sections 97 and 198 of the *Local Government Act 1958* and numbered 117 for prohibiting or regulating camping on roads, prohibiting or regulating the leaving, standing of caravans on streets or roads and the placing of caravans on private property, prohibiting, regulating and restricting the use of caravan or camping parks or sites and regulating, restricting, restraining or prohibiting the erection of buildings or erections.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1958* and of any and every other

power it thereunto enabling the Mayor, Councillors and Citizens of the City of Box Hill order as follows:—

1. This By-law may be known as the Camping and Caravan By-law.
2. No person shall camp on any road.
3. No person shall leave standing any caravan on any street or road for any period exceeding 24 hours.
4. Subject as is hereinafter provided no person shall without the prior consent, in writing, of the Council, place any caravan on any private property which is not a camping area in respect of which a current permit issued by the Council under the *Camping Regulations 1958* or

any amendment or alteration thereof is in existence provided always that nothing in this clause shall prevent—

- (a) The placing by the owner of any land of not more than one caravan belonging to him on such land where such caravan is not without the prior consent, in writing, of the Council used by any person for the purpose of sleeping or living therein.
- (b) The placing of caravans for sale or hire on any land the use of which for the purposes of the business of selling or hiring caravans is not prohibited by any Planning Scheme made under the *Town and Country Planning Act 1961* or any statutory amendment, modification, or re-enactment thereof, By-law or Regulation or in respect of which a permit for such use has been granted under any Interim Development Order made under the *Town and Country Planning Act 1961* or any statutory amendment, modification or re-enactment thereof.

5. No person shall, without the prior consent, in writing, of the Council, erect or construct on any land any tent or similar structure.

6. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.

7. Any person guilty of a continuing offence contrary to this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of Five pounds for each day on which an offence against this By-law shall be continued after a conviction or order by any court.

A By-law of the City of Broadmeadows made under the provisions of sections 197 (1) (ii), 197 (1) (xlv), 212, 213 and 222 of the *Local Government Act 1958* as amended and all other powers it enabling thereto and numbered 43 for and with respect to—

- (a) carrying out the purposes provided for in Division (4) of Part 1 of the Fifteenth Schedule to the *Local Government Act 1958* as amended, and
- (b) prescribing penalties for breaches of this By-law.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon by the *Local Government Act 1958* as amended and in pursuance of all other powers it thereunto enabling the Mayor, Councillors and Citizens of the City of Broadmeadows hereby order as follows:—

1. This By-law shall come into operation on the day after its publication in the *Government Gazette* of the State of Victoria.

2. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the City of Broadmeadows.

3. In this By-law unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter—

- (a) "City Engineer" means the person for the time being holding the office of City Engineer of the City of Broadmeadows and includes any person from time to time acting as City Engineer.
- (b) "Council" means the Council of the City of Broadmeadows.
- (c) "Crossing" means a crossing for the passage of animals and vehicles over any footway or channel of any street or road from land adjoining or abutting on such footway to such street or road.
- (d) "Surveyor" means the Building Surveyor or any competent person appointed by the Council to carry out the duties of Building Surveyor under the *Uniform Building Regulations, Victoria*.

4. Notwithstanding the provisions of Division (4) of Part 1 of the Fifteenth Schedule to the *Local Government Act 1958* as amended no person shall make or commence

to make a crossing pursuant to paragraph 16 of the said Division (4) unless he is the holder of a written permit from the Council authorizing the making of such crossing or without first having paid the fee payable in respect thereof as hereinafter provided.

5. Before any person makes or commences to make such crossing he shall submit to the Surveyor or the City Engineer together with the notice and specification referred to in paragraph 16 of the said Division (4) an application, in writing, signed by such person for a permit authorizing the making of such crossing.

6. (1) The Surveyor or City Engineer shall examine such application, notice and specification submitted and if—

- (a) The crossing will if constructed in accordance with such notice and specification comply with the provisions of all Acts, By-laws and Regulations administered by the Council and applying on the date of submission thereof, and
- (b) the fee hereinafter prescribed as payable in respect of the permit for which application is made has been paid to the Council

the Council or its proper officer shall within seven clear days from the giving of such notice grant to the applicant a written permit for the making of such crossing.

(2) If the application for a permit is not granted the Council shall state, in writing, its reasons for refusal and may in its discretion refund the whole or portion of the fee paid therefor.

7. With every application for a permit in respect of the making of a crossing there shall be paid to the Council a fee of One pound ten shillings.

8. Any person doing or causing to be done an act forbidden to be done or failing to do an act directed to be done by this By-law and any person who in the execution of any work for which a permit is required fails to comply with the standards prescribed under the said Division (4) shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.

9. Any person who is guilty of an offence against this By-law shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds.

CITY OF FOOTSCRAY.

BY-LAW No. 274.

A By-law of the City of Footscray, numbered 274, made under section 197 of the Local Government Acts, for prescribing areas within the municipal district as business areas and prohibiting or regulating within the whole or any part of such business areas the use of any land or the erection (including adaptation for use) or the use of any building or portion of a building for the purposes of a dwelling or for the purposes of certain classes of trades, industries, manufactures, businesses or public amusements.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts and of every power it thereunto enabling the Mayor, Councillors and Citizens of the City of Footscray with the approval of the Governor in Council order as follows:—

The areas within the municipal district specified in the First Schedule hereto shall be and are hereby prescribed as business areas within which is prohibited the erection (including adaptation for use) or the use of any building or portion of a building for the purposes of a dwelling or for the purposes of any trade, industry, manufacture, business or public amusement other than any trade or business prescribed in the Second Schedule hereto.

2. That Schedule A of By-law No. 74 be amended by excising therefrom the said land described in the First Schedule hereto.

THE FIRST SCHEDULE.

1. All that piece of land being Crown allotment 1 and part of Crown allotment 2, Crown portion 8, section XVI, Parish of Cut-paw-paw, County of Bourke, and bounded by a line commencing at a point on the southern building line of Barkly-street and the western boundary of the said Crown allotment 2; and thence by this said western boundary of Crown allotment 2 bearing south 0 deg. 36 min. east distance 992 ft. 7½ in. to the northern building line of Cross-street; thence by the said building line of Cross-street bearing north 89 deg. 08 min. east distance 539 ft. 10½ in.; thence by the north-western building line of Geelong-road, bearing north 48 deg. 06 min. east distance 162 ft. 4½ in.; thence by the western building line of Gordon-street bearing north 0 deg. 44 min. west distance 678 ft. 1½ in.; thence by a line bearing south 89 deg. 24 min. west distance 305 ft. 6 in.; thence by a line bearing north 0 deg. 44 min. west distance 201 feet; and thence by the southern building line of Barkly-street bearing south 89 deg. 24 min. west distant 354 ft. 6 in. to the point of commencement.

CITY OF HORSHAM.

4. To require the reduction to a height not exceeding 3 ft. 6 in. of any portion of a fence within 30 feet of the junction of any streets or roads.

5. To authorize the Council, at the expense of the owner (the amount of which expenses may be recovered by the Council in a Court of Petty Sessions as a civil debt recoverable summarily):—

(a) To remove or lop trees, shrubs or hedges growing or being on private property so situate which are not removed or lopped as required by or under this By-law.

(b) To reduce in height any portion of a fence which is not reduced in height as required by or under this By-law.

- (e) requiring the payment of expenses by persons failing to execute work directed by this By-law to be executed;
- (f) suppressing nuisances;
- (g) imposing penalties for breaches of this By-law; and for other purposes.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the Local Government Acts and in pursuance of all other powers it thereunto enabling, the Mayor, Councillors and Citizens of the City of Sunshine hereby orders as follows:—

Short Title.

1. This By-law is the Derelict and Unregistered Cars By-law.

Commencement of By-law and Area of its Operation.

2. This By-law operates:
 - (a) from the day after—
 - (i) this By-law; or
 - (ii) notice of its making,
 is published in the *Government Gazette*;
 - (b) throughout the City.

3. In this By-law unless the contrary appears:

- (a) the under-mentioned words and phrases bear the following meaning:—
 - (i) "City" means the municipal district of the City of Sunshine;
 - (ii) "Clause" means a clause of this By-law;
 - (iii) "Council" means Council of the City;
 - (iv) "Offence" means any wilful act or default contrary to this By-law;

(v) "Proper Officer" means an officer appointed by the Council or by its Town Clerk or City Engineer to do the relevant act matter or thing under this By-law;

(b) words of:

- (i) singular meaning include the plural;
- (ii) masculine gender include the feminine, and vice versa.

Prohibition.

4. No person shall leave a derelict or unregistered motor car standing on any highway, street, road, lane, pathway, right-of-way or any other place.

Car Removal.

5. (a) The owner of any motor car left contrary to clause 4 shall remove it within 72 hours after it is so left.

(b) If a motor car is left contrary to clause 4 the Proper Officer or any agent appointed by the Council may remove it to the Council depot.

Redemption.

6. (a) If a motor car is removed under clause 5 (b) the Proper Officer shall by written notice to its owner give him 21 days within which to redeem it.

(b) If the owner is not located by reasonable efforts within 28 days after the motor car is removed to the Council depot the Proper Officer shall publish a newspaper advertisement giving the owner 21 days from the date the advertisement is published within which to redeem the motor car.

7. (a) A motor car shall be redeemed by payment to the Council of an amount of 2s. 6d. for each mile the motor car was towed or driven from and between the place it was left to the Council depot, together with the payment of any other expenses incurred by the Council in connexion with the motor car.

(b) The sum payable under clause 7 (a) is additional to any penalty for an offence.

Sale.

8. (a) If a motor car removed to the Council depot is not redeemed within 21 days after the notice is served or the advertisement is published under clause 6 it may be sold by the Council by public auction or by tender.

(b) The proceeds of a sale under this clause shall be applied in satisfaction or reduction of:

- (i) The sum or sums payable under clauses 6 (b) or 7 (a);
- (ii) any other sum or sums disbursed by the Council in connexion with the motor car or sale thereof;
- (iii) a further sum of £10.

(c) Any balance of the proceeds of sale shall be held by the Council in trust for a period of twelve months and if not claimed by the former owner of the motor car within that time may be paid into the Municipal Fund.

Penalties.

9. The penalties for offences are:—

Offence.	Penalty.
First offence	Maximum £20.
Second (or more) similar offence	Maximum £20. Minimum £5.

Continuing offence—for each day on which the offence is continued after a conviction or order by any court Maximum £5 a day.

The proprietor shall mark such receptacle with the number of the house, shop, factory or building of which he is the proprietor or within which he resides and, where he is the occupant of a flat, shall also mark such receptacle with the number or distinguishing name of such flat. The proprietor shall renew the number, numbers or name marked on such receptacle as often as they are obliterated or defaced; and if any proprietor neglects for one week after notice to him from the Council to mark such receptacle with its number or numbers or distinguishing name or to renew the number, numbers or name thereof as aforesaid, he shall commit an offence against this By-law.

Hoardings By-law.

A By-law of the Shire of Croydon made under the provision of section 198 of the *Local Government Act 1958*, and numbered 9, for—

(a) regulating restraining or prohibiting the erection or construction of hoardings;

(b) regulating restricting or preventing the exhibition of advertisements in such places and in such manner or by such means as to affect injuriously the amenities of a public park or pleasure promenade or to disfigure the natural beauty of the landscape;

(c) regulating and controlling all advertisements attached or fixed or painted on any hoardings or on any buildings or any fence rock cliff or tree and regulating and controlling the erection or use of coloured lights and signs in the vicinity of traffic control lights or signs or of street intersections;

(d) authorizing the Council to pull down demolish and remove hoardings or any part thereof erected or constructed contrary to this By-law or not pulled down demolished or removed as required by or under this By-law and to sell the materials and apply the proceeds in reimbursing the expenses for pulling down demolishing and removing such hoardings or such part thereof and in paying into the Municipal Fund any fees or penalties due by the owner thereof; and

(e) appointing fees which may be charged and received by the Council for any act done or to be done by any of its officers under this By-law and for any permit or licence to be issued by the Council.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1958* and of any and every other power it thereunto enabling, the President, Councillors and Ratepayers of the Shire of Croydon orders as follows:—

1. In this By-law unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—

“Council” means the Council of the Shire of Croydon.

“Proper Officer” means the Building Surveyor to the Council or his deputy or any other person authorized, in writing, by the Council to carry out the provisions of this By-law.

2. No person shall erect or construct any hoarding unless—

(a) a written permit has been issued by the Council or its Proper Officer authorizing such erection or construction; and

(b) the fees in respect thereof specified in the First Schedule hereto have first been paid to the Council.

3. Every application for a permit to erect or construct a hoarding shall be accompanied by—
- (a) the written consent of the owner of the land on which the hoarding is to be erected or constructed to the lodging of such application;
 - (b) properly prepared plans and specifications for the erection or construction thereof; and
 - (c) a block plan drawn in ink to a scale of not less than one inch to forty feet showing the boundaries and dimensions of the allotment of land on which the hoarding is to be erected or constructed, whether such allotment is at the intersection of two streets and if not the position of the allotment in relation to the nearest street corner and the position and dimensions of the proposed hoarding in relation to the boundaries of the allotment, and in the case of a hoarding consisting of an illuminated sign a sketch showing the wording of the sign, the colours of the proposed illuminations and whether the illuminations will be constant or intermittent.
4. No person shall erect any hoarding not attached to a building within a distance from the building line of any street or road equal to the greatest height of such hoarding or with the lowest part of any such hoarding other than the main supports thereof less than three feet from the level of the land on which it is erected.
5. No person shall erect any hoarding—
- (a) covering any window or architectural projection in any building;
 - (b) over or in front of any dwelling-house;
 - (c) so that any part of the same is less than eight feet over the level of any footpath over which it may be erected; or
 - (d) exceeding twenty feet in height or having a face area exceeding 30 square feet without the written permission of the Council.
6. No hoarding consisting of an illuminated sign shall be erected or constructed attached to the wall of any building unless—
- (a) it is attached so as not to cover any portion of any window or architectural projection in such wall;
 - (b) it does not overhang or extend over any footpath at a less height than twelve feet unless it is also attached to a veranda;
 - (c) it is attached to a metal frame or box secured firmly to such wall;
 - (d) it or any part thereof does not project over any footpath if the face area exceeds 30 square feet; and
 - (e) it is terminated at least two feet six inches from the edge of any kerblin in front of such building.
7. No hoarding consisting of an illuminated sign shall be erected or constructed attached to any veranda without the written permission of the proper officer and unless—
- (a) any part of the same is not less than eight feet above the level of any footpath over which it may be erected;
 - (b) it is rigidly supported from the frame work of any such veranda by steel supports; and
 - (c) it is terminated at least two feet six inches from the edge of the kerblin in front of the building to which such veranda is attached.
8. (1) Nothing in this By-law shall preclude the erection of a hoarding consisting of an illuminated sign or sky sign erected on or supported by a pole, steel tower or similar structure.
- (2) Any such sign may be erected subject to its location and design being approved in writing by the Council.
9. No person shall erect any hoarding exceeding five square feet in any area within the municipal district, zoned from time to time under any Interim Development Order or Planning Scheme of the Council, as Residential, without the consent in writing of the Council.
- (a) Notwithstanding the previous clause, any estate agent may erect a sign not exceeding 30 square feet, advertising the property on which it is erected, for sale or auction, such sign to be removed fourteen days after exchange of contracts of sale.
10. No person shall erect or use on any public highway any matter or thing which purports to be or is an imitation of or is similar to any major or minor traffic control item or interferes with the effectiveness of or prevents any person from clearly distinguishing any major or minor traffic control item.
11. (1) Every permit to erect or construct a hoarding issued by the Council shall be issued on the express condition that any such hoarding shall be maintained at all times in good order and condition.
- (2) If the Council or the Proper Officer is of the opinion that any hoarding erected pursuant to a permit issued under this By-law is in a ruinous dilapidated or dangerous condition the Council may cause the Proper Officer to serve or the Proper Officer may serve a notice in writing on the owner or occupier of the premises on which the hoarding is erected or to which the hoarding is attached requiring such owner or occupier to bring the same into conformity with the requirements of this By-law or demolish the same.
- (3) Any person failing to comply with the requirements of any such notice within the time specified therein shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.
12. (1) No person shall attach affix or paint on any hoarding or on any building or on any fence rock cliff or tree any advertisement which is unsightly or which is obscene indecent or defamatory.
- (2) The Council may remove or obliterate or delete any advertisement attached or fixed or painted on any hoarding or on any building or any fence rock cliff or tree contrary to sub-clause (1) hereof and recover from the person responsible therefor the cost of so doing as a civil debt recoverable in any Court or competent jurisdiction.
13. No person shall exhibit an advertisement in such place or in such manner or by such means as to affect injuriously the amenities of a public park or pleasure promenade or to disfigure the natural beauty of the landscape.
14. (1) Where any hoarding is erected or constructed contrary to this By-law and the owner fails to comply with a written notice by the Council signed by the Proper Officer to make any such hoarding comply with the provisions of this By-law within the time specified in such notice then the Council is hereby authorized to—
- (a) enter upon the subject land or premises and pull down demolish or remove any such hoarding;
 - (b) sell the material therefrom and apply the proceeds in reimbursing the expenses of such pulling down demolishing and removing; and
 - (c) pay into the Municipal Fund any fees or penalties due by such owner.
- (2) If the proceeds of any such sale are insufficient to meet the costs of the Council of such pulling down and removal then the amount of such costs still outstanding may be recoverable by the Council from such owner as a civil debt recoverable in any Court of competent jurisdiction.
15. (1) In the event of any owner of premises being prevented by the occupier thereof from complying with any notice served on such owner under the provisions of this By-law such owner shall notify the Proper Officer accordingly.
- (2) The Proper Officer may then serve a notice on the occupier of such premises requiring the occupier to allow the owner to comply with the provisions of the notice served on such owner within a time specified therein.
- (3) If the occupier fails to allow the owner to comply with the requirements of the first-mentioned notice within the time stipulated in the notice referred to in sub-clause (2) hereof then he shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.
16. Every person guilty of a wilful act of default contrary to provisions of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of not less than Five pounds nor more than Twenty pounds and to a further penalty of not more than Five pounds for each day on which an offence is continued after a conviction or order of any court.
17. This By-law (except clause 9 hereof which shall apply to and have operation throughout the said residential areas only) shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the Shire of Croydon.
