- A By-law of the Shire of Seymour made under sections 197 (1) (ii), 197 (1) (xiv), 212, 213 (1) and 222 of the Local Government Act 1958 and all other powers it thereunto enabling passed by a special order of the Council of the Shire of Seymour advertised in accordance with the provisions of the Local Government Acts and numbered 53 for the purposes of—
  - (a) requiring the provision of crossings from the roadway to the adjoining property at all points at which access is had from the carriageway to that property;
  - (b) prescribing the form and dimensions of those crossings;
  - (c) providing constructional standards for crossings;
  - (d) providing for the cost of the construction of crossings to be paid by the owners or occupiers of the relevant properties to the Shire;
  - (e) requiring the owners and occupiers of properties to pay the Shire the cost of maintaining and repairing crossings;
  - (f) providing for the replacement of crossings in certain circumstances at the cost of the owners or occupiers of the relevant properties;
  - (g) prohibiting any person from causing or permitting any vehicle to proceed from the carriageway to adjoining property except by a crossing complying with the requirements of this By-law;
- (h) prescribing penalties for breaches of this By-law; and for other purposes.

5. For the purposes of this By-law the width of any crossing is to be measured parallel to the alignment of the ROADWAY.

#### Provision of Vehicular Crossings.

Travel from carriageway to property prohibited except on crossing.

Liability to provide crossing.

- 6. No person shall cause or permit any vehicle (except a pram)-
  - (i) to cross the kerb and channel or the water table of any ROADWAY; or (ii) to proceed from the kerb and channel or water table to any property adjoining the ROADWAY;

except on a crossing that complies with all the requirements of this By-law.

- 7. (a) If any vehicle (except a pram) is taken or intended or proposed to be
  - (i) across the kerb and channel or the water table of any ROADWAY; or (ii) from the kerb and channel or water table to any property adjoining the ROADWAY;

a crossing complying with all the requirements of this By-law must be constructed across the kerb and channel or water table and from the kerb and channel or water table to that property.

(b) The owner and occupier of that property are each liable to provide that crossing in accordance with the requirements of this By-law.

## Location of Crossings.

Minimum distance of crossing from intersection,

- 8. No part of any crossing may be within 25 feet of any part of the junction or intersection of two or more ROADWAYS.
- 9. (a) The owner or occupier of the property to be served by a crossing may request that the crossing be located in a position indicated by him.
- (b) The SHIRE ENGINEER shall consider any request made under CLAUSE 9 (a) but shall in all cases require the crossing to be constructed at that place which in his opinion is most suitable from the road traffic view point.
- (c) If that location is to be at any place other than that requested in CLAUSE 9 (a) the owner or the occupier of the property to be served by that crossing shall be given notice of the proposed location of that crossing.
- (d) An owner or occupier who is given a notice under CLAUSE 9 (c) may appeal to the COUNCIL whose decision upon the location of the crossing shall be final and is not open to any challenge or appeal whatsoever.
- (e) An appeal to the COUNCIL under this CLAUSE must be WRITTEN and must be signed by the appellant and must state the location desired by the appellant.

  (f) An appeal to the COUNCIL under this CLAUSE must be lodged with the SHIRE SECRETARY within three days after the notice required by CLAUSE 9 (e)

## Constructional Standards.

Basic standard.

10. The nature of the construction required in respect of any crossing is determined by reference to the nature of the footpath (if any) across which the crossing would lie.

## Concrete Asphalt and Bitumen Crossings.

Concrete crossings.

- 11. (a) If any crossing is to lie across a footpath which is constructed of asphalt, bitumen, concrete or stone that crossing must be constructed of concrete.
- (b) The COUNCIL may permit a crossing to be constructed of asphalt or bitumen instead of concrete if it is satisfied that the footpath will not be damaged by traffic using this crossing and if the existing crossings in the locality are other than of concrete.

- 12. (a) A concrete crossing must be of 6-in. depth or of such greater depth as the SHIRE ENGINEER determines to be necessary having regard to the particular circumstances and topography of the particular case and the traffic likely to use the crossing.
  - (b) The surface of a concrete crossing must be finished with a wooden float.
- 13. (a) A bitumen crossing must be constructed of gravel or crushed rock to a minimum consolidated depth of 6 inches or to such greater depth as the SHIRE ENGINEER determines to be necessary having regard to the particular circumstances and topography of the particular case and the traffic likely to use the crossing and it must be sealed with a two-coat bituminous seal.
- (b) An asphalt crossing must be constructed to a minimum consolidated depth of 6 inches of premix or such greater depth as the SHIRE ENGINEER determines to be necessary having regard to the particular circumstances and topography of the particular crossing and the traffic likely to use the crossing.
- 14. (a) Subject to this CLAUSE every asphalt, bitumen or concrete crossing must be designed and constructed to run directly from the channel or water table to the relevant property and at right angles to the alignment of the carriageway.
- (b) The COUNCIL may dispense with the requirements of CLAUSE 14 (a) if the SHIRE ENGINEER reports that it is desirable to do so having regard to the particular circumstances and the topography of the particular case and the traffic likely to use the crossing.

#### Gravel or Metal Crossings.

15. If any crossing is to lie across any part of the road reserve that is commonly used as a footpath (other than a footpath constructed of asphalt, bitumen, concrete or stone) that crossing must be constructed of gravel or crushed rock of a minimum consolidated depth of 6 inches or of such greater depth as the SHIRE ENGINEER determines to be necessary having regard to the particular circumstances and the topography of the particular case and the traffic likely to use the crossing.

#### Increased Standards.

16. Notwithstanding that a crossing has been constructed of gravel or crushed rock pursuant to this By-law, the COUNCIL may require that crossing to be reconstructed in concrete if the footpath across which it lies is at any time constructed in asphalt, bitumen, concrete or stone.

Increased standard may be required.

## Design and Specifications.

- 17. (a) Subject to the requirements set out in this By-law the design and specifications in respect of each crossing will be determined by the SHIRE ENGINEER.
- (b) In determining design and specifications the SHIRE ENGINEER will have regard to the particular circumstances and the topography of the particular case and the traffic likely to use the crossing.
- 18. (a) Any asphalt, bitumen or concrete crossing (except a crossing leading to a property used as a service station, a caravan park, a factory or sale-yards or used for the purposes of EXTRACTIVE INDUSTRY) must be 9 feet or 10 feet wide.
- (b) Notwithstanding CLAUSE 18 (a) a crossing referred to in CLAUSE 18 (a) which serves two allotments may be 18 feet or 20 feet wide.
- (c) Any asphalt, bitumen or concrete crossing to a property used as a service station, a caravan park, a factory or sale-yards or used for the purposes of EXTRACTIVE INDUSTRY must be not more than 24 feet wide.
- (d) The COUNCIL may dispense with or vary the requirements of CLAUSE 18 (c) if the SHIRE ENGINEER reports that it is desirable to do so having regard to the particular circumstances and the topography of the particular case and the traffic likely to use the crossing.

#### Crossings Over Channels and Water Tables.

- 19. Except when it is crossing the channel by a culvert a crossing over a kerb and channel must end at the ROADWAY end with 3-ft. radius returns.
  - 20. (a) If a crossing crosses a water table it must do so by a culvert.
- (b) If the COUNCIL decides that the depth of a channel requires any crossing over it to be by a culvert any crossing over that channel must be by culvert.
- (c) Subject to CLAUSE 21 a culvert must be a reinforced concrete pipe or box culvert of size and length as the SHIRE ENGINEER determines to be necessary having regard to the particular circumstances and the topography of the particular site.
- (d) Subject to CLAUSE 21 a culvert shall have a minimum cross-sectional area of 0.75 square feet and a minimum length of 12 feet.
- 21. (a) The COUNCIL will dispense with the requirement of a culvert if it is satisfied that the water table can be crossed by a vehicle without damaging the water table and without placing anything in the water table.
- (b) The COUNCIL may permit a culvert of lesser cross-sectional area than 0.75 square feet if it is satisfied that a culvert of that cross-sectional area would interfere with the proper functioning of the water table or would be unreasonable having regard to the nature of the water table.
- (c) The COUNCIL may permit a culvert to be of greater length than 12 feet, but no culvert may exceed 20 feet in length or be closer than 12 feet to any other culvert.
- (d) The COUNCIL may permit an open invert instead of a culvert, but that invert must be constructed of concrete of 6-in. depth or of such greater depth as the SHIRE ENGINEER determines having regard to the particular circumstances and topography of the particular case and the traffic likely to use the invert.
  - 22. No person may place any matter whatsoever in any channel or water table.
- 23. (a) The minimum distance between any two crossings leading to properties used as service stations, caravan parks, factories or sale-yards or used for the purposes of EXTRACTIVE INDUSTRY is 25 feet.
  - (b) CLAUSE 23 (a) applies even although the crossings lead to different properties.

26. In carrying out any construction, maintenance or repair under this By-law the SHIRE may act by its officer, employees, servants, agents or contractors or any of them.

#### Recovery of Expenses.

- 27. (a) All costs incurred by the SHIRE in respect of any construction, maintenance or repair carried out by it pursuant to this By-law must be paid to the SHIRE by the owner of the premises to which the relevant crossing gives access.
- (b) The costs referred to in CLAUSE 27 (a) will in each case be conclusively estimated by the SHIRE ENGINEER.
- (c) In estimating costs under this CLAUSE the SHIRE ENGINEER will include a reasonable sum to cover administrative costs and overheads.
- (d) The SHIRE SECRETARY will give WRITTEN notice of the amount payable under this CLAUSE to the owner of the premises and that owner must pay the amount so notified to the SHIRE within fourteen days after the notice is given to him under this CLAUSE.
