

- (c) During each year of service after his first year he shall be paid an annual allowance of £65.
- (d) In the case of a Police Cadet who was appointed prior to the 25th September, 1964, the first year after date of appointment shall be deemed to have commenced on the 25th September, 1964.
- 2: This Determination shall come into operation upon the 25th September, 1964.

  - 2. No person shall-
    - (a) enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct, or who may behave in a disorderly or offensive manner, or create or take part in any disturbance;
    - (b) enter or remain in the Reserve whilst in a state of intoxication;
    - (c) bring any intoxicating liquor on the Reserve without the consent of the Committee first obtained:
    - (d) exercise or train any horse or pony on the Reserve, or any part thereof, without the consent of the Committee first obtained.
- 3. The Committee shall have the power to hold entertainments, shows or performances on the Reserve, and to make a charge for admission thereto as hereinbefore
- 4. The Committee shall have the power to let any portion of the Reserve to any club, association, person, or society for the purpose of holding entertainments, performances, shows or sports, subject to the payment of such fees and on such terms as it may deem to be reasonable and consistent with these Regulations, and to authorize any club association, society or person, to to authorize any club, association, society, or person, to make a charge for admission thereto as hereinbefore provided in these Regulations.
- 5. No person except the Committee or its officers or employees on duty, shall enter any part of the Reserve on an occasion when a charge is made for admission thereto without first paying the fees chargeable for such admission.
- 6. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.
- 7. No person shall play, practice, or engage in any organized sport or game within the Reserve at any time without permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.
- 8. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasion of any sport, fetes, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee may at any time determine by way of guarantee that due care may be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage or injury or loss from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring, shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee. Committee.
- 9. No person shall in the Reserve interfere with, break 9. No person shall in the Reserve interfere with, break, or damage any of the trees, plants, or shrubs, or pluck any flowers or climb, jump, or get over or under any of the fences, gates, seats, or any other structures therein, or roll or throw stones or other missiles, or leave any bottles, broken glass, paper, fruit peel, or any refuse or rubbish whatever therein, or post bills or advertisements on any of the fences, gates, seats, or other structures therein. therein.
- 10. No persons shall light a fire in the Reserve without the consent of the Committee.
- 11. No persons shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.
- 12. No persons shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any building or any booth for the purpose of offering for sale any article without permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.
- 13. - 17. No persons shall remove any earth, sand, stones, marl, or gravel from the Reserve.
- 18. The Committee shall accept no responsibility or liability for any injury or accident that may occur at any time within the Reserve.—(Rs.8246.)

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 218 of the Land Act 1958, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist therefrom, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE ST. LEONARDS FORESHORE RESERVE.

WHEREAS by section 218 of the Land Act 1958 power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the Land Acts for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Roard of Land and Works in purpose of the power for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works in pursuance of the power conferred aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the portion of the Foreshore of Port Phillip Bay, in the Parish of Paywit at St. Leonards as is indicated by red colour on plan marked P. over 20.1.49 attached to Lands Department correspondence Rs.5116, and known as "St. Leonards Foreshore Reserve" (hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve").

#### REGULATIONS.

### Rescind.

Upon the coming into operation of these Regulations all previous Regulations made by the Board of Land and Works in respect of the Reserve shall be rescinded.

# Ramps, Tracks, Cliffs.

2. No person shall enter or leave the Reserve except by means of the ramps or other openings provided, and no person shall climb the cliffs in the Reserve.

#### Dress, Conduct.

3. No person shall enter or remain on the Reserve whose dress, language or conduct is such as in the opinion of the Committee or its authorized officer, to offend against decency.

# Bathing.

4. No person shall bathe from the Reserve unless wearing a bathing costume which, in the opinion of the Committee or its authorized officer, does not offend against

#### Vehicles.

5. No person shall drive, push, pull or place on the Reserve or park or leave thereon any motor car, motor cycle, bicycle, horse-drawn vehicle, water craft, trailer or other vehicle except in such places as are set aside for such purpose by the Committee, unless such person first obtains the permission, in writing, of the Committee, and no vehicle shall remain stationary within 25 yards of a children's playground.

#### Boats.

- 6. (a) No person shall launch from or bring on to the 6. (a) No person snau launch from or oring on to the Reserve any motor boat, rowing boat, yacht or other water craft except by such means and at such places as may be specified by the Committee.

  (b) Water craft left, wrecked or marooned on the foreshore, may be removed by the Committee, and the cost of such removal shall be borne by the owner.

#### Camping and Parking Fees.

7. The Committee may set aside portions of the Reserve as and for the purpose of camping or parking, and may fix and collect fees or other charges for entering and using any such area.

8. No person shall camp or park any caravan or vehicle, or erect any tent or other structure on any site on any portion of the Reserve except on such portion or portions thereof as may be specially set apart for such purpose by the Committee, and then only with the consent, in writing, of the Committee first obtained and on payment of such fees and subject to such conditions as the Committee may determine.

#### Persons Responsible.

9. The person to whom permission is issued by the Committee or its authorized officer to use a site in a camping area shall be deemed to be the person who erected on such site any structure, tent or shelter thereon or who parked a caravan on such site, and such person shall keep the site thus occupied in such camping area in a clean, sanitary and tidy condition, and before vacating such site shall collect and place in the receptacle provided for the purpose all refuse, litter or garbage from the site.

Production of Permit

#### Production of Permit.

10. Every person holding or purporting to hold any receipt or permission, in writing, issued by the Committee shall, on demand by any member of the Committee or the properly appointed servant of such Committee or any member of the Police Force, or any bailiff of Crown lands, produce such receipt or permission in writing.

#### Cancellation of Site.

11. Any permission issued by the Committee or its authorized officer to a person to use a camping area may be cancelled or withdrawn by the Committee or its authorized officer, and subsequent to such cancellation or withdrawal a proportionate refund of any fees or charges paid in advance may be refunded, and the Committee or its authorized officer, at its or his discretion, may deduct and retain from any such proportionate may deduct and retain from any such proportionate refund such sum as it or he determines will be necessary to clean up and put in order the site in relation to which the permission has been so cancelled or withdrawn.

#### Removal.

12. No person shall neglect or refuse to remove forthwith, any tent, camping structure or vehicle erected or installed on any portion of the Reserve when directed to do so by the Committee or a properly appointed servant of the Committee.

# Bathing-box, Boatshed, Buildings.

13. (a) No person shall erect any bathing-box, shed, boathouse, or any other building, structure or erection or booth on any site on the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained, and such permission may be granted subject to such terms, fees and conditions as may be deemed reasonable and advisable by the Committee consistent with these Regulations.

# Use of Bathing-box, &c.

(b) No person shall use or cause to be used or knowingly permit to be used any such bathing-box, boathouse, shed or any other building, structure or erection or booth for residential purposes.

#### Transfer or Hire.

14. The Committee may, subject to the payment of a fee prescribed by it, allow the transfer of any permit, but no person shall sublet or hire any site or structure without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

### Withdrawal of Permit.

15. The granting, withdrawal, renewal or allowance of the transfer of any permit or the subletting of any site or structure shall at all times be at the absolute discretion of the Committee.

#### Removal for Non-maintenance of Structure

Removal for Non-maintenance of Structure.

16. The Committee shall have full power to order the removal from the Reserve of any bathing-box, boathouse, shed or any other building, structure, or booth which has been placed, erected or established without its consent, or which has not been properly erected or properly painted, or which in its opinion has not been satisfactorily maintained or kept in repair, or in respect of which the term of permission for the use of the site has expired or the permission to use the site for a building or buildings has expired or been withdrawn.

#### Removal for Non-compliance with Conditions

17. If the owner of any bathing-box, boathouse, shed or any other building, structure, or booth erected on any site on the Reserve neglects to pay to the Committee the fee payable in respect thereof, or fails to comply with conditions specified by the Committee in relation to upkeep and maintenance of such bathing-box, boathouse, building, structure, or booth then and in any such case it shall be lawful for the Committee in such manner as it thinks fit to remove and/or dispose of such bathing-box, boathouse, shed or other buildings, structure, or booth, and to recover from the proceeds of such disposal the arrears of rent and the costs and expenses of such removal or disposal or disposal.

#### Notice to Remove.

18. No person shall neglect or refuse to remove any bathing-box, boathouse, shed or other buildings, structure or booth erected or placed by him on any site in or on the Reserve within fourteen (14) days after the Committee has sent by registered post to his last-known address, a notice requiring such person to remove such bathing-box, boathouse, shed or other building, structure, erection or booth. Such notice may be signed by either the Chairman or Secretary for the time being of the said Committee. said Committee.

#### Disposal of.

19. In the event of any such neglect or refusal as mentioned in Regulation 18 hereof continuing after the expiration of the said fourteen (14) days, the Committee may pull down and/or remove and/or dispose of such bathing-box, boathouse, shed or other building, structure, or booth and recover the costs and expenses of such pulling down, removal or disposal from the person so neglecting or refusing to remove the same but without prejudice to proceedings by way of information or breach of these Regulations being taken against such person so neglecting or refusing. or refusing.

#### Deposit.

20. Any person or persons renting or hiring any stand, building, enclosure or any portion of the Reserve on the occasion of any fête, sports or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee may from time to time determine not exceeding Twenty-five pounds, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, or enclosure, or portion of the Reserve and such Committee, in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, enclosure or portion of the Reserve or any thing contained therein or thereon during such occupancy or hiring and may deduct the cost of making good loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee without prejudice to any damage in excess of Twenty-five pounds. And each and every person or persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations, and by any order given by the Committee.

#### Missiles.

21. No person shall carry any firearms or airguns in the Reserve, and no person shall throw, fire, shoot, aim or discharge any firearms, airguns, spearguns, or other explosive substance in the Reserve without permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

#### Fauna.

22. No person shall shoot, trap, maim, injure, kill or destroy any birds or native game in the Reserve.

### Flora, Grass, Trees and Fixtures.

23. No person shall injure, damage or alter in any way whatsoever any trees, shrubs, grass, flora, living or dead timber, or wood or any building, fence, table, seat, post, tap, sign, light or any other structure or thing whatsoever within the Reserve without the permission of the Committee, in writing, first obtained.

### Signs.

24. No person shall erect or display any signs, advertising material or notices within the Reserve without the permission of the Committee in writing.

#### Removal from Reserve.

25. No person shall remove from the Reserves any wood, debris, or bottles without the permission of the Committee first obtained, in writing; provided that nothing in this Regulation shall affect any right which any person would otherwise have to deal with or alter any such property the subject of private ownership.

Soil.

26. No person shall dig or remove from or take on to the Reserve any gravel, stone, shell grit, sand, loam, soil or any part or parts of the land or sea-bed within the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

#### Plantations.

27. No persons except employees of the Committee and authorized officers of the Committee shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees, shrubs or other flora.

#### Fires

- 28. (1) No person shall, in the Reserve-
  - (a) light or use fires except in fire-places provided by the Committee, or except by special permission or direction of the Committee;
  - (b) break glass of any kind; or
- (c) deposit or leave any bottle, glass, tin can, orange peel, waste paper, fish, fish offal, garbage, obstacles or litter of any kind, except in a receptacle provided for that purpose by the Committee.
- (2). No person shall bring on to the Reserve any waste paper, fish offal, garbage, obstacles or litter of any kind.

#### Nuisance.

29. No person shall commit or create or knowingly permit or allow to continue any public or private nuisance or any annoyance to the public in the Reserves, whether such nuisance or annoyance takes place in a public or private building, tent, or other structure, or in any enclosed or unenclosed space in the Reserves.

#### Noise.

30. No person shall on portion of the Reserve cause or permit any outcry, sound or noise to be emitted from an amplifier, loud-speaker, public address system or like instrument without first obtaining the written permission of the Committee, and such permission may be granted subject to such terms, conditions and restrictions as may be imposed by the Committee.

### Public Address.

31. No person shall take part in any public entertainment, public address or public meeting of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

#### Sport.

32. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any organized game or sport within the Reserve unless by consent of the Committee.

#### Conveniences

33. All persons using any conveniences provided on the Reserve by the Committee shall, on demand, pay to such Committee such fee as shall from time to time be indicated.

#### Use of Facilities.

- 34. No person shall use any electric installation or the water closets, urinals or taps in the Reserve or any portion of such water closets, urinals, or taps for any purpose other than that for which the same are constructed.
- 35. No person other than those duly authorized to camp on the Reserve shall use any of the laundry facilities provided thereon, and no person other than a person authorized to camp or who is picnicking on or using the Reserve for swimming purposes shall use the shower facilities thereon.

#### Playgrounds.

36. No person above the age of fourteen years shall use or play with any of the swings, fixtures, or other equipment erected or provided in any children's playground.

#### Sale or Hire.

37. No person shall offer for sale or for hire or distribute by way of gift any article or vehicle within the Reserve or within any structure thereon without the permission of the Committee, in writing, first obtained.

# Cattle.

38. No person shall bring into the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

Dogs.

- 39. (1) No person shall, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee first obtained, cause or suffer or knowingly permit any dog belonging to him or in his charge—
  - (a) to enter or remain in the Reserve unless such dog be and continue to be under proper control on a chain, cord, or leash, and unless such dog be effectively restrained from causing annoyance to any person or from damaging or interfering in any way with the property of the Committee; or
  - (b) to be brought into the Reserve for training or exercising for coursing or for any other purposes of sport.
- (2) Any dog found in the Reserve otherwise than in accordance with sub-regulation (1) of this Regulation may be seized and/or destroyed by the Committee, and the owner or any person having the custody of any dog so found shall be liable to pay compensation to the said Committee for any damage done to the property of the said Committee by such dog.
- 40. Every person who shall fail to comply with, or commit any breach of, these Regulations or any conditions determined by the Committee may be removed from the Reserve or from any place therein or directed forthwith to leave the Reserve or the said place by any member of the Committee or any properly appointed servant of the Committee or any member of the Police Force or any bailiff of Crown Lands, and every person who shall fail to comply forthwith with any such direction shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations.—(Rs.5116)

WHEREAS by section 218 of the Land Act 1958 power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the Land Acts for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works in pursuance of the power conferred aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the Crown land in the Parish of Gracedale reserved for Public purposes, and shown hachured on plan marked G/3.8.1964, attached to Lands Department correspondence Rs.3939, and known as the "Sir Colin MacKenzie Sanctuary".

The Reserve has been placed under the control of a

The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management with power and authority to enforce these regulations.

#### REGULATIONS.

- 1. In these Regulations "Committee" means the Committee of Management, "Sanctuary" means the Public Purposes Reserve known as the "Sir Colin MacKenzie Sanctuary", "Person" means anyone who is not a member of the Committee of Management or an officer or employee of such Committee of Management, and "Animal" includes mammal, bird, reptile, amphibian, fish and insect. and insect.
- 2. The Sanctuary shall be open for the admission of the public daily, from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. except on Saturdays, Sundays and Public Holidays, when the closing time will be extended to 7 p.m.
- 3. No person shall enter or attempt to enter the Sanctuary or any part thereof except through the entrance provided for the purpose, nor shall any person evade or attempt to evade payment of an entrance fee not exceeding 5s. per adult and 2s. 6d. per child. A sum not exceeding 3s. may be levied by the Committee for each motor car or cycle or other vehicle using its car parks.
- 4. No person shall remain in any part of the Sanctuary when the Sanctuary is not open to the public.
- 5. No person shall give, or offer to any animal in the Sanctuary, or place in, or throw into any cage or enclosure, any substance or thing likely to injure or cause harm to any animal.
- 6. No person shall carry or throw any stick or other missile at any animal in the Sanctuary, or in any way interfere with. bait or tease any such animal, or fire or discharge firearm, airgun or fireworks in the Sanctuary.
- 7. No person shall leave in the Sanctuary (except in receptacles provided for the purpose) litter of any kind.
- 8. No person shall light a fire in the Sanctuary, except in places provided for that express purpose. On any day when the Country Fire Authority pursuant to the Country Fire Authority Act 1958, has caused to be broadcast or published a warning of the likelihood of the occurrence of weather conditions conducive to the spread of fires in the whole or any specified part of the State of Victoria, no person shall light a fire anywhere in the Sanctuary, or do any act which shall cause or be likely to cause, a fire anywhere in the Sanctuary. fire anywhere in the Sanctuary.
- 9. No person shall post any bill or other matter on Sanctuary property, or play cricket, football or any other game within the Sanctuary.
- 10. No person shall, while in the Sanctuary, cut, pluck, injure, destroy or remove any tree, shrub, bush or flower growing therein, stand upon or climb over any of the fences, climb trees or disfigure any Sanctuary property.
- 11. No person, except by permission of the Committee, shall enter any enclosure which is not provided with a self-closing gate.
- 12. No person shall, while he is in the Sanctuary, obstruct, interfere with, or annoy any officer or employee of the Committee.
- 13. No person shall cause or allow any dog or other imal to enter the Sanctuary. Unattended animals found animal to enter the Sanctuary. Unattend-within the Sanctuary shall be destroyed.
- 14. No person shall, without the authority of the Committee, deliver any public address of any kind within the Sanctuary.
- 15. No person shall, without the authority of the Committee, sell, or offer to sell, or let for hire, any article, or distribute hand bills or advertisements or solicit money within the Sanctuary; nor shall any person play or operate any musical instrument, tape recorder, radio, television receiver, or broadcast equipment within the Sanctuary without the permission of the Committee.

- 16. No person shall injure, deface, interfere with or remove any building, seat, notice, post, railing or barrier, or other thing which may from time to time be erected by the Committee.
- 17. No person shall, whilst he is in the Sanctuary, be in a state of intoxication, gamble, brawl, fight or make use of any abusive, indecent, insulting, obscene or threatening language or gesture, or act in an indecent, disorderly or offensive manner, or obstruct, interfere with, or annoy any other person lawfully in the Sanctuary.
- 18. No person shall interfere with, destroy or remove any nest or egg within the Sanctuary.
- 19. No person shall enter enclosed plantations of trees or shrubs, nor shall any person without lawful excuse, enter any area enclosed for special purposes.
- 20. No person shall park any motor car or cycle or other vehicle within the Sanctuary, except in such areas as are set apart for the purpose, and any person using such an area shall obey any order regarding parking given by any officer or employee of the Committee.
- 21. No person shall camp in, or occupy, any buildings of the Sanctuary without the permission of the Committee.
- 22. No person shall wade or bathe in any stream or dam within the Sanctuary.
- 23. No person shall take photographs, or make drawings, or paintings for commercial purposes without the permission of the Committee, and under such terms and conditions as laid down by the Committee.
- 24. No child under the age of ten years shall enter the Sanctuary unless accompanied by, and in the charge of, an adult. No parties of children may enter the Sanctuary at concession rates unless accompanied by, and in the constant charge of adults, in the ratio of not less than one adult to twenty children. Parties of school children shall not be allowed to enter the Sanctuary at concession rates, unless previous arrangements have been made in advance, and permission obtained from the Committee.
- 25. No person shall put into the Sanctuary any cattle, horses, sheep or other animals within the meaning of the Pounds Act. The Committee shall have full authority and power to impound any such animals found trespassing in the Sanctuary, and shall be taken to be the "occupier" of the Sanctuary (with all the power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any laws for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle.

These regulations are made in lieu of all previous regulations in respect of the said land which are hereby revoked.—Rs.3939.

OFFERS, endorsed "Offer for Wattle Bark, lot\_\_\_\_," and addressed to the Secretary, Forests Commission, Melbourne, will be received at this office up to Twelve noon on Wednesday, 4th November, 1964, for the right to strip and remove wattle bark on and from the following areas. The general conditions hereunder will apply in every case where not expressly stated to the contrary, and special conditions will also apply where provided. Full particulars may be obtained from the officer in charge in each case, or on application to the Commission.

#### GENERAL CONDITIONS.

- 1. No offer will necessarily be accepted.
- 2. The deposit specified in Schedule must accompany each offer.
- 3. The licensee shall do everything within his power to strip and remove all bark available on the area upon which he is licensed to operate.

- 4. Stripping shall be commenced within six weeks from date of acceptance of offer unless otherwise authorized by the Commission.
- 5. No stripping shall be commenced until the applicant has lodged the deposit specified and is in possession of the requisite licence.
- 6. Notification, in writing, that stripping operations have been commenced must be forwarded to the officer in charge within 48 hours from date thereof.
- 7. No tree shall be felled or stripped on any area which the officer in charge directs is not to be operated upon, and no particular tree specially marked by him to remain standing shall be felled or stripped.
- 8. In the event of stripping being permitted on any area regarded as a tourist resort all tops must be lopped, stacked, and burned under the direction of and in accordance with the written conditions specified by the officer in charge.
- 9. No tree shall be felled so as to fall into any water-course or to obstruct any road or track.
- 10. Except with the permission of the officer in charge, no tree of less than 5 inches diameter shall be stripped when of the black or feather-leaved variety, or less than 2½ inches in diameter when of the broad-leaved species, unless otherwise stated in the licence. Wherever a size limit is stated it shall be at a height of 2 feet from the ground.
- 11. All stripping must cease by 31st March following the date of issue of licence unless otherwise authorized, in writing, by the officer in charge.
- 12. Bark must be properly bundled, securely tied, and stacked in heaps of not less than 10 cwt. in clear places only, and the licensee must take such precautions as the officer in charge may direct to safeguard such bark from loss by fire.
- 13. No bark shall be removed without the permission of the officer in charge, and it must be carted from the forest and weighed not later than one month from the date of stripping the bark unless otherwise authorized by the officer in charge.
- 14. The whole of the work shall be done under the supervision and to the satisfaction of the officer in charge and at a rate satisfactory to the Commission.
- 15. All bark must be weighed at the weighbridge stipulated in the licence, or at such other weighbridge as may be approved by the officer in charge, and in all cases at the expense of the licensee. Duplicate weighbridge tickets must be provided and, if so directed by him, the bark must be weighed in the presence of the officer in charge.
- 16. Prior to removal of the bark satisfactory arrangements must be made with the Commission for payment of royalty. The licensee shall pay such royalty at the rate tendered on weights as disclosed by the weighbridge dockets.
- 17. Camps must be pitched and fires lighted only in such places as shall be determined by the officer in charge, and the licensee shall, on demand of the officer, instantly dismiss from his employ any person or persons who shall carelessly use, leave, or light any fire otherwise than in accordance with the Forests Acts and Regulations.

  - (b) "Frontage" means the boundary line between a property and the street upon which such property abuts and where the property abuts on more than one street then the boundary line between the property and the street to which any building may be erected thereon fronts. fronts:
  - (c) "Private Property" means a property in the one ownership or occupation or in joint ownership or occupation;
  - (d) Words or expressions used in this By-law shall have the same meaning as the same words or expressions when used in the Local Govern-ment Act 1958.
- 2. No person shall leave standing or permit or suffer to be left standing any caravan on any street or road within the municipal district.
- 3. No person shall place or permit or suffer to be placed 3. No person shall place or permit or suffer to be placed more than one caravan on any private property but where any private property is owned or occupied by more than one owner or occupier each such owner or occupier may place one caravan on such private property provided that each caravan placed on any private property shall not be so placed within a distance of twenty-five feet from the frontage of such property or within a distance of five feet from any other boundary thereof.

Provided however that notwithstanding anything here-Provided however that notwithstanding anything here-inbefore in this clause contained the Council may subject to such conditions as it may deem fit permit more than one caravan to be placed on any private property and within lesser distances from the frontage of such private property or any other boundary than those hereinbefore prescribed if the owner or occupier thereof is engaged in the business of selling or hiring caravans on such private property.

4. No person shall place or permit or suffer any caravan to be placed on any private property or permit or suffer any caravan to continue to be placed on any

private property for the purposes of accommodation of any person or persons unless a permit, in writing, shall have been first obtained from the Council authorizing the use of any such caravan for the purposes of accommoda-tion of any person or persons for such period and upon such conditions (if any) as the Council may specify in such permit.

- 5. Every person who is guilty of an offence against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of not less than £5 or more than £20 for each offence and to a further penalty of not more than £5 for each day on which such offence against this By-law is continued after a conviction or order of any Court or order of any Court.
- 6. This By-law shall apply to and have the force of law throughout the whole of the Municipal District of the City of Malvern.

- IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts, and of any and every other Act or power it thereunto enabling, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Bacchus Marsh order as follows:
- 1. By-law No. 43 and By-law No. 46 of the Shire of Bacchus Marsh, for prescribing residential and business areas and for other purposes, are hereby repealed.
- 2. In this By-law, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter-

  - subject-matter—

    "Extractive industry" means and includes mining and quarrying and the extraction from any land and the treatment thereon of sand, gravel, clay, turf, soil, rock, stone or similar substances.

    "Rural industry" means and includes the businesses or industries of grazing, dairying, pig farming, poultry farming, bee keeping, viticulture, horticulture, fruit growing, vegetable growing, or the growing of crops of any kind, but does not include the sale of any goods or chattels by retail.
  - retail.

    "Rural industry dwelling" means any dwelling erected on land used for the purposes of a rural industry, an extractive industry, or the milling of timber, but only if such dwelling is used solely for occupation by the owner of the industry carried on on such land or by employees employed by him in connexion with such industry.
- 3. The areas described in the First and Second Schedules hereto are hereby prescribed as residential areas.
- 4. No person shall, in any such residential areas as are described in the First Schedule hereto, use any land or erect or adapt for use or use any building for the purposes of any class of trade, industry, manufacture, business, or public amusement other than a rural industry. For the purposes of this clause the term "rural industry shall not include pig farming.
- 5. No person shall in any such residential area as is described in the Second Schedule hereto use any land or erect or adapt for use or use any building for the purposes of any extractive industry or for pig farming or milling timber
- The areas described in the Third, Fourth, Fifth and Sixth Schedules hereto are hereby prescribed as business
- areas.

  7. No person shall within any such business areas as are described in the Third Schedule hereto use any land or erect or adapt for use or use any building or portion of a building for the purposes of any extractive industry or of the trades or businesses of pig farming or milling timber.

- 8. No person shall within any such business area as is described in the Fourth Schedule hereto use any land or erect or adapt for use or use any building or portion of a building for the purposes of a dwelling or for the purposes of any extractive industry, or for the purposes of retail trade or business.
- 9. No person shall within any such business areas as are described in the Fifth Schedule hereto use any land or erect or adapt for use any building or portion of a building for the purpose of a dwelling or for the purposes of any class of trade, industry, manufacture, business or public amusement other than for the purposes of retail trade or business or for a dwelling used solely for occupation by the owner of such retail trade or business or by employees employed by him in connexion with such trade or business.
- employed by him in connexion with such trade or business.

  10. No person shall within any such business area as is described in the Sixth Schedule hereto use any land or erect or adapt for use or use any building or portion of a building for the purposes of a dwelling (other than a rural industry dwelling) or for the purposes of any class of trade, industry, manufacture, business or public amusement other than a rural industry, an extractive industry or the trade or business of milling timber. Provided always that nothing in this clause contained shall preclude any person who is carrying on a rural industry on any land from selling by retail any of the produce of such industry from any building erected on such land if such building is situated at a distance of not less than 100 feet from any street or road.

  11. No person shall on, from, or after the 1st day of
- 11. No person shall on, from, or after the 1st day of December, 1959—
  - (a) erect or use on any land within the municipal district of the Shire of Bacchus Marsh any tent or other temporary structure or building for the sale of goods therein or therefrom; or

No person shall sell any goods from any stall, motor car, truck, barrow, or any other vehicle, box, basket, crate, bag, or other receptacle standing or placed on vacant land (not being Crown land or land under the care and management of the municipality or a public place within the meaning of section 3 of the Public Offences Act 1928) within the municipal district of the Shire of Racchus Marsh Bacchus Marsh.
- 13. No person shall sell any goods from any stall, motor, car, truck, cart, barrow, box, basket, crate, bag, or other vehicle or receptacle standing or placed on any street, road or public place within the municipal district of the Shire of Bacchus Marsh.
- 14. Any person guilty of an offence against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of not more than £10 for each day on which such offence against this By-law is continued after notice has been given to the offender by the Council of the commission of the offence.
- 15. Any person guilty of a continuing offence against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of not more than £15 for each day on which an offence against this By-law is continued after conviction or order of any court.

- 3. Every person who keeps cattle on or along any road in the Shire during any period from seven o'clock in the evening until six o'clock in the morning following shall before doing so notify the herdsman of the Shire of his intention of so keeping such cattle.
- Intention of so keeping such cattle.

  4. Every person who drives cattle from any point not within the Shire of Wangaratta on to or along any road in the Shire shall, prior to so doing, notify the Council's herdsman of his intention to do so and shall state the number and kind of cattle, the names and addresses of the owner and drover of such cattle, the starting point and time of the journey within the Shire, the destination and route to be traversed. Every person who fails to notify all or any of these particulars shall be guilty of an offence.
