

 (b) The placing of caravans for sale or hire on any land the use of which for the purposes of the business of selling or hiring caravans is not prohibited by any Planning Scheme made under the Town and Country Planning Act 1961 or any statutory amendment modification or re-enactment thereof By-law or Regulation or in respect of which a permit for such use has been granted under any Interim Development Order made under the Town and Country Planning Act 1961 or any statutory amendment modification or re-enactment thereof.
- (5) No person shall without the prior consent in writing of the Council erect or construct on any land any tent or similar structure.
- (6) This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.
- (7) Any person guilty of a continuing offence contrary to this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of Five pounds for each day on which an offence against this By-law shall be continued after a conviction or order by any Court.
