MOTOR BOATING ACT 1961.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Part 1, section 4, of the *Motor Boating Act 1961*, it is enacted that the Governor in Council by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, may, on the recommendation of any authority having control over any Victorian waters set aside, prohibit or restrict the use of any specified part or parts of any waters under the control of any authority for any class of boating and may by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, revoke, amend or vary any such Proclamation: And whereas the State Electricity Commission of Victoria has been proclaimed as an authority under this Act:

And whereas by Proclamation on the fourteenth day of April, 1964, certain prohibitions and restrictions on the use of waters under the control of the said State Electricity Commission of Victoria for boating or similar activities were proclaimed:

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State and on the recommendation of the State Electricity Commission of Victoria do hereby amend the said Proclamation as follows:—

In place of the prohibitions and restrictions thereby proclaimed in clause 3 of the said Proclamation there shall be substituted the following, namely:—

(1) The use of the waters of the Hazelwood Cooling Pond for any class of boating or by any motor boat is prohibited on any waters being part of—

- (i) the outlet pond, outlet channel and outlet bank;
- (ii) the inlet pond, inlet bank and inlet structure;

(iii) the south-eastern bay to the south-east of a line joining a beacon near the south end of the outlet bank to a beacon at the old entry point of Fraser's-road, distant approximately 700 feet in a northerly direction from its junction with Switchback-road.

(2) The use of the waters of the Hazelwood Cooling Pond by any boat towing any water ski or other device which is used or intended for the support of anything of a weight exceeding 56 lbs. or of a person, or has either a total rating or a total capacity of its propelling machinery in excess of eight horsepower is prohibited—except as to use while travelling in an anti-clockwise direction on the waters of the main pond bounded as follows, viz.:—

On the north by the inlet bank and inlet structure; on the east by the outlet bank; on the south by a line joining a beacon on the outlet bank situated approximately 2,800 feet in a southerly direction from the south-east corner of the inlet pond with a beacon on the Eel Hole Creek Dam situated approximately 1,600 feet in a south-westerly direction from the spillway structure; and on the north-west by the Eel Hole Creek Dam and the natural shore line.

(3) The use of the waters of the said Hazelwood Cooling Pond by all classes of boats, other than those referred to in clause 2 above for any purpose whatsoever shall be limited to the waters of the main pond bounded as follows, viz.:—

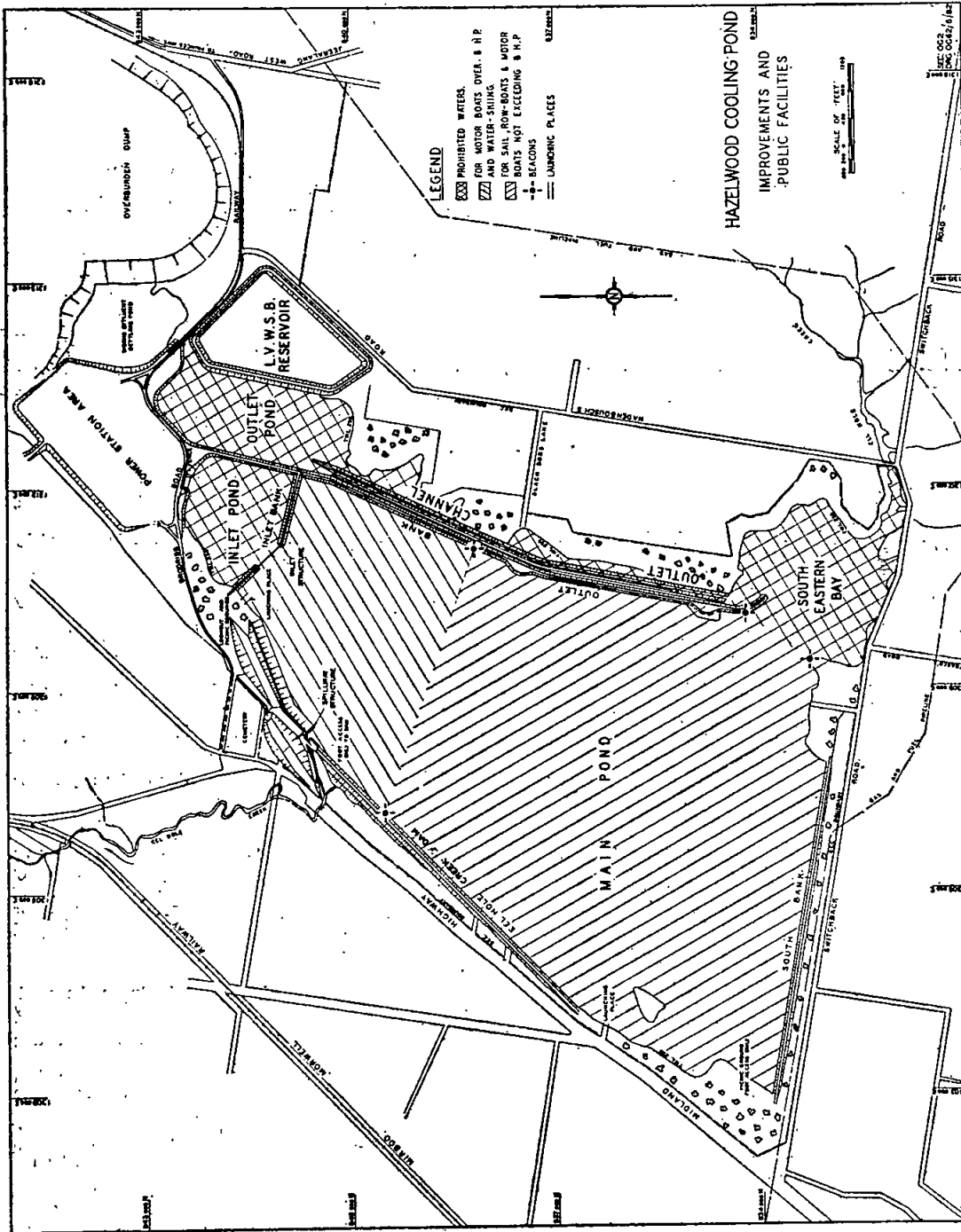
On the north by a line joining a beacon on the outlet bank 2,800 feet in a southerly direction from the south-east corner of the inlet pond with a beacon on the Eel Hole Creek Dam 1,600 feet in a south-westerly direction from the spillway structure; on the north-west by the Eel Hole Creek Dam and the natural shore line; on the south by the south bank and the natural shore line; on the south-east by a line joining a beacon near the south end of the outlet bank to a beacon at the old entry of Fraser's-road distant approximately 700 feet in a northerly direction from its junction with Switchback-road; and on the east by the outlet bank.

(4) No boat shall be launched on or removed from any of these waters except at locations specially designated for the purpose by notice bearing the signature of the officer of the State Electricity Commission of Victoria holding the position of General Superintendent or of some other officer of the State Electricity Commission of Victoria signed with his authority. For the purposes of this clause "General Superintendent" means the General Superintendent, Latrobe Valley.

(5) No person shall, after he has been instructed by an authorized person to remove the boat from the water, continue to operate or be in or use a boat on any waters of the Hazelwood Cooling Pond, except for the purpose and in the course of removing the boat from those waters. For the purposes of the clause "authorized person" means a person appointed pursuant to the provisions of section 32 (1) (c) of the Motor Boating Act 1961.

(6) The waters defined in clauses 1, 2 and 3 of this Proclamation are those delineated on Map No. OG62/6/82a in the Schedule hereunder.

BY-LAW No. 3.

THE Terang Sewerage Authority (declared by Order of the Governor-in-Council published in the *Government Gazette* on the twenty-seventh day of November One thousand nine hundred and sixty-three page 3522 to be an authority for the purpose of the *Public Authorities Marks Act 1958*) pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon it by the said *Public Authorities Marks Act 1958* and by the *Sewerage Districts Act 1958* and pursuant to and in exercise and execution of any other powers and authorities in any wise enabling it in that behalf DOETH HEREBY MAKE AND PRESCRIBE the following By-law that is to say:—

- IN this By-law, unless the context and subject matter otherwise indicates:
 - "the said Act" means the *Public Authorities Marks Act 1958* and all amendments thereof;
 - "the Authority" means the Terang Sewerage Authority,
 - "Stamp" or "Mark" includes a stamp or mark on any article, materials or thing in question or on a seal, tag or label affixed or otherwise attached to or connected with the same or any container thereof;
 - "Works" means any works or operations for or in connexion with the carrying into effect of the purposes or objects of any provisions of the *Sewerage Districts Act 1958* or any amendments thereof or of any other Act relating to the Terang Sewerage Authority whether the same are constructed maintained or carried out by the Authority or by any other person on behalf of or under agreement with the Authority or by permission or authority of or under the supervision direction or control of the Authority.
- THE stamp or mark hereby prescribed and adopted by the Authority under the authority of the said Act shall be the letters "TERSA" (meaning the Terang Sewerage Authority) for indicating that any articles materials or things referred to in the said Act and in this By-law are duly tested stamped marked or authorized by the Authority.
- THE said stamp or mark shall be sealed stamped or impressed or be affixed by tag or label by the Authority alone by its Officers duly authorized for the purpose upon the articles materials or things to which the said Act applies set forth or described in the Schedule hereto.
- THE articles materials or things set forth or described in the Schedule hereto shall be tested stamped marked or authorized by the Authority before use.
- THE use of the said stamp or mark by any person other than a duly authorized officer of the Authority is prohibited.
- THE sale or supply by any person to any other person of any of the above-mentioned articles materials or things which—
 - are stamped or marked otherwise than as hereby prescribed, or
 - are not duly tested stamped marked or authorized as hereby prescribed, or
 - comprises a component part not comprised in any such article material or thing when stamped or marked, is hereby prohibited.
- THE fees for testing and for stamping or marking shall be—
 - As to each of such articles materials or things as are set forth in any of the Divisions 1 and 2 of the Schedule hereto, the fee set opposite the same respectively, provided that in all cases there shall be a minimum fee of 1/- for one or more articles tested.
 - As to any of the articles materials or things described in Division 3 of such Schedule, a fee calculated at the rate of 15/- per hour upon the time occupied in the testing thereof.
- ANY person guilty of any contravention of this By-law shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding £50 in respect of any one such contravention provided however that nothing in this clause contained shall affect the liability of any such person to be prosecuted and punished under any other Act or at Common Law but he shall not be liable to be punished twice for the same offence.

IN Pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1958*, and of any and every other power it thereunto enabling, the President, Councillors and Ratepayers of the Shire of Gordon order as follows:—

1. The Council by notice in writing signed by the Shire Secretary may order—

(a) the owner of private property situate at the junction of any streets or roads to remove or lop to a height, determined by the Council and stated in the said notice, any tree, shrub or hedge (whether planted before or after the passing of this By-law) from or on such private property where any such tree, shrub or hedge abuts on or is within ten feet of any such streets or roads or is within a distance of thirty feet from the junction of any streets or roads.

(b) the owner of any portion of a fence within thirty feet of the junction of any streets or roads to reduce such portion of a fence to a height not exceeding three feet six inches.

2. Where any such tree, shrub or hedge shall not be so removed or lopped or such portion of a fence shall not be so reduced in height in manner and within the time stated in the notice hereinbefore prescribed,

the Council, at the expense of the owner of such private property or of such portion of fence, as the case may be, may—

- (a) remove or lop any such tree, shrub or hedge;
 - (b) reduce in height any such portion of fence, provided such removal, lopping or reduction in height is consistent with the order of the Council contained in the said notice.
3. The expense hereinbefore referred to in clause 2 of this By-law may be recovered by the Council in a Court of Petty Sessions as a civil debt recoverable summarily.
 4. Any such owner offending against the provisions of this By-law shall for any wilful act or default contrary thereto be guilty of an offence and on conviction therefor shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty Pounds, in addition to any expense which may be recoverable from him as aforesaid.
 5. In addition to the penalty provided in clause 4 hereof and any expense recovered by the Council pursuant to clause 3, in the case of a continuing offence a further penalty shall be imposed not exceeding Five Pounds for each day on which the offence is continued after a conviction or order by any Court.
 6. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole municipal district of the Shire of Gordon and shall come into operation on the day after the day of its publication in the *Victoria Government Gazette*.
