WHEREAS by the Local Government Act 1958, as amended, section 519, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time and from time to time upon request of the Council of any municipality by notice in the Government Gazette to proclaim any land reserved used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street road highway thoroughfare bridge square court alley or right-of-way or any street road lane or passage made or laid out or proposed to be made or laid out on any land of which a plan delineating that street road lane or passage has been lodged with the Registrar of Titles to be a public highway and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force:

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE KAFFIR HILL RESERVE, FOSTER.

WHEREAS by Section 218 of the Land Act 1958 power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the Land Acts for any public purpose whatsoever and

which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works in pursuance of the power conferred aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land in the Township of Foster temporarily reserved by Order in Council dated the 5th May, 1964, as a site for Public Park and known as the Kaffiir Hill Reserve, (hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve").

The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management (hereinafter referred to as the "Committee") with power and authority to enforce these regulations.

#### REGULATIONS.

- 1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding 26 in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Four shillings (4s.) may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.
- No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
- 3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, flowers, or other property in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein without the permission of the Committee first obtained.
- 4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein, nor throw or break up any glass or bottles therein.
- 5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals, without the permission in writing, of the Committee first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
- No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord.
- 7. No person shall erect within the Reserve any dwelling, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, or vend or dispose of in the Reserve fruit, provision, refreshments of any kind, or other articles of any description without the consent, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.
- No person shall play, practice, or engage in any game or sport within the Reserve without the consent of the Committee.
- No person, except workmen or labourers employed on the Reserve, shall enter any plots which may be en-closed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.
- No persons shall carry or discharge any firearms in the Reserve except for military purposes.
- 11. No person shall make any holes or in any way interfere with the surface of the Reserve.
- 12. Any person or society using the Reserve for fêtes or other special purposes shall hand over to the Committee such sum or sums as it may determine, the whole of which shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve.
- 13. The Committee may impose and charge an annual fee, not exceeding Five pounds five shillings (£5 5s.) to any person, society, or club using portion of the Reserve for any purpose, and may in addition require such person, society, or club to deposit a sum, not exceeding Ten pounds (£10), by way of guarantee against damage caused during their occupancy of same.
- 14. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection or enclosure on the occasion of any fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee may at the time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds (£10), by way of guarantee that due care will be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee in its absolute discretion are undergood any damage or injury sustained by such or enclosure, and such Committee in its absolute discretion may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee.
- 15. No person shall remove or displace any board, plate, or fitting for the exhibition of any Regulation or any notice fixed or set up in the Reserve by the Committee.

- 16. No person shall spit or expectorate on any path or in any building or erections on the Reserve.
- 17. Every person or club using the tracks, pitches, courts, yards, seats, buildings, rooms, erections, enclosures and conveniences provided for and erected in the Reserve may be charged such fees and rents for the use thereof as the Committee may from time to time determine, provided always that the moneys received in fees and rents shall be expended on the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve.
- 18. No assemblies for concerts or for the purpose of public worship, preaching, or public speaking of any kind shall take place in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.
- 19. No male person, other than a boy under the age of seven (7) years, shall enter or use any playground, oval, place, room, or building set apart for the use of females, and no females shall enter or use any playground, place, room, or building set apart for the use of males.
- 20. No person, other than the players and officials connected with any game and any competitor and official at any sports gathering, shall intrude upon any playground or oval during the course of such games and sports.
- 21. No person shall enter the Reserve or pass over the playing area or oval with any vehicle or on horseback without the permission of the Committee first obtained, nor drive or ride amongst or to the danger or annoyance of persons assembled on any part of the ground.

- 22. No person shall wilfully obstruct, disturb, interrupt, or annoy any officer or employee of the Committee in the proper execution of his work and duty.
- 23. No person shall park motor cars or other vehicles within the Reserve, excepting at such places as are set apart by the Committee for that purpose, and the Committee may charge and take a fee, not exceeding One shilling (1s.) per motor car or other vehicle per day, for use of such area.
- $24.\ No$  person shall drive any vehicle within the Reserve at a greater speed than 15 miles per hour.

- (ii) The employer of any person who under the direction, authority or with the consent of such employer contravenes in any manner the foregoing provisions of this clause shall be guilty of an offence hereunder.
- (i) Every application for a permit shall be made on a prescribed form obtainable from the Municipal Offices.
  - (ii) Each application shall be lodged seven clear days prior to the Council meeting to which such application for permission is made.

(iii) Every application shall show-

- (a) the precise location on any street or footway in which it is intended to place any item set out in Clause 1 (i) of this By-law,
  (b) the size of any placard, board, sign, price card, invitation, together with the writing thereon or other thing by way of advertisement
- the size of the lettering and wording on each placard board, sign, price card, invi-tation or other thing by way of advertisement.
- a copy of all writing, figures, symbols or hieroglyphi,
- a description of any such chattel or article whatsoever on which or in association with which any of the things referred to in this By-law is displayed,
- the date and hours on and between which it is intended to place any of the items referred to in Clause 1 (i) (a), (b) and (c) of this By-law,
- (g) the purpose of placing any such item on any such street or footway,
- (h) the name and address of the person who will be responsible for placing and removing any such items on or from any street or footway,
- (j) any other matter which the Council may require.
- (iv) The Council may grant a permit subject to such conditions as are named by the Council at the time of granting such permit or it may refuse to grant a permit.
- This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Municipal District of the Shire of Doncaster and Templestowe.
- 4. Any person who places any such item on any street or footway contrary to this By-law and every person who is guilty of any wilful act or default contrary to any condition of any permit granted under this By-law shall be liable on conviction to a penalty of not less than £5 and not exceeding £20 for each and every offence and in the case of a continuing offence to a further penalty of not more than £5 for each day or part of day during which such offence is continued.

  - (a) drive such cattle in a direct route as far as practicable having regard to the point of the commencement of the driving of such cattle and their destination;
  - where the route mentioned in paragraph ( $\alpha$ ) of this clause is of a greater distance than the respective distances hereinafter mentioned, drive such cattle a distance of not less than 6 miles each day in the case of sheep and of not less than 10 miles each day in the case of other cattle.

And any person who contravenes any of the foregoing provisions of this clause shall be guilty of an offence.

- 5. Every person who drives any cattle from any point not within the said Shire, into, onto, or along any street or road within the Shire shall prior to so doing give notice to the Secretary of the Shire for the time being of his intention so to do and shall simultaneously therewith furnish to the said Secretary the particulars following, that is to say:—
  - (i) The number and kind of such cattle;
  - (ii) the names and addresses of the drover or drovers of such cattle:
  - (iii) the intended point of entry into the Shire;
  - the route proposed to be traversed with such cattle if within the Shire and the destination of such cattle and, if such destination be not within the Shire, the intended point of exit from the said Shire

Every person who, having failed to give notice as afore-said or having failed to furnish all or any of the aforesaid particulars, drives any cattle into, onto, or along any street or road within the Shire shall be guilty of an offence.

- 1. This By-law shall come into force and operation on its approval by the Governor in Council and immediately after its publication in the Government Gazette.
- 2. This By-law shall apply and have operation throughout the townships of Fish Creek, Foster, Toora, Port Franklin, Welshpool and Port Welshpool, the boundaries thereof conforming to the descriptions contained in the Interim Development Order made by the Council on 9th August, 1962 and approved by the Governor in Council on 16th October, 1962, pursuant to the powers conferred by the Town and Country Planning Act 1961.
- 3. In this By-law unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter—"proprietor" means the proprietor of any premises and includes the owner, the occupier or any person having the management or control thereof. "Refuse" includes all waste (except sewage and manure) the property of produced or accumulated in or about any house, building or premises.
- 4. The proprietor of every house, building or premises shall provide, keep and maintain upon his premises at all times a properly constructed receptacle in which he shall from time to time cause to be deposited all refuse produced or accumulated in or about such house, building
- 5. Such receptacle shall be constructed of galvanized iron of not less than 24 gauge or other approved material, in such a manner as to prevent any absorption by any part of such receptacle of any offensive matter which may be deposited therein or any escape by leakage or otherwise of any part of contents of such receptacle.
- 6. Each receptacle shall have a capacity of not more than three cubic feet and shall be strongly constructed and provided with properly attached side lifting handles to make it capable of being easily and conveniently carried by one man.
- 7. Such receptacle shall be provided with a suitable close fitting lid with a flange overlapping the top of such receptacle and shall be constantly covered (except when refuse is being deposited therein or discharged therefrom) and a sufficient quantity of some efficient deodorant shall be from time to time introduced therein when necessary, to keep such refuse in an inoffensive condition.
- 8. No person shall place, or cause, or permit to be placed any slops or liquid waste in such receptacle unless such moist refuse has been previously strained and effectually wrapped in waste paper.
- 9. No person shall place or permit to be placed any briquette dust or ashes in any receptacle unless the briquette dust or ashes are cold or have been effectively quenched with water in such quantity as to reduce the briquette dust to a stiff paste and such stiff paste or cold ash shall be effectively wrapped in paper.
- 10. The proprietor shall cause such receptacle to be kept at all times in good order and sweet condition and shall coat the inside of such receptacle with tar or other suitable substance when deemed necessary by the Council.
- 11. The proprietor shall cause at such house and on such days as may be appointed by the Council for the removal of refuse, such receptacle to be deposited close to the street, lane, right-of-way or passage on which such house, building or premises abut in order that the contents of such receptacle may be conveniently removed by the contractor or person authorised or employed in that behalf by the Council. 11. The proprietor shall cause at such house and on such
- 12. If any person or persons commit a breach of this By-law he or they shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty of not more than £20, and in the case of a continuing offence a further daily penalty of not more than £50.
