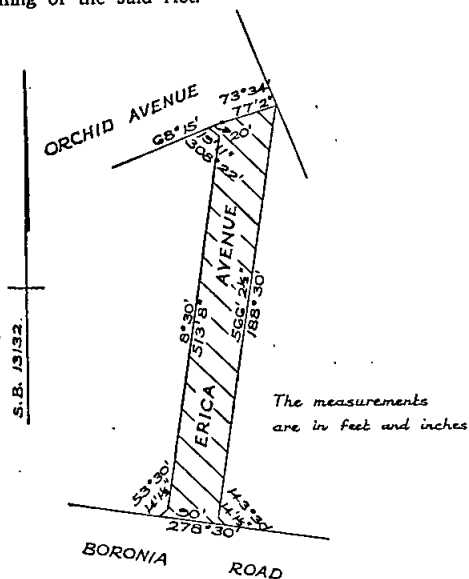
PROCLAMATION

By the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Local Government Act 1958, as amended, section 519, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time and from time to time upon request of the Council of any municipality by notice in the Government Gazette to proclaim any land reserved used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street road highway thoroughfare bridge square court alley or right-of-way or any street road lane or passage made or laid out or proposed to be made or laid out on land of which a plan delineating that street road lane or passage has been lodged with the Registrar of Titles to be a public highway and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force:

And whereas the Council of the Shire of Knox has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, being a street made or laid out or proposed to be made or laid out on land of which a plan delineating that street has been lodged with the Registrar of Titles, be so declared to be a public highway.

Now therefore, I, the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare that Erica-avenue shown hatched on the plan hereunder shall be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act.

PROCLAMATION

By the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Division 12 of Part I, of the Land Act 1958 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time increase, and, after one month's notice in the Government Gazette, diminish, alter, or abolish any common, and may from time to time re-proclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of the said Part of the said Act, and that nothing therein contained shall prevent the exercise of the powers conferred by the said part of the said Act with respect to the leasing or licensing of any land comprised in any common: And whereas notice of the intention to diminish the Maldon Shire Common has been duly published in the Government Gazette for one month:

Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby diminish the Maldon Shire Common by deducting therefrom the portion in the Township of Maldon containing 10 acres 1 rood 20 perches more or less, as indicated by hachure on plan published in the Government Gazette of the 8th January, 1965.—(Rs.353.)

INTRODUCTION INTO VICTORIA OF MEAT FROM THE
NORTHERN TERRITORY OF AUSTRALIA.

WHEREAS it is provided by section 88 of the Health Act 1958 that the Governor in Council may from time to time make such Orders as may seem necessary for (amongst other things) prohibiting or regulating the introduction into Victoria from any part of a country (in which any disease in animals is known to exist) of the meat of any animals likely to propagate amongst men or other animals any infectious or contagious disease:

And whereas the disease known as tuberculosis in buffaloes and other animals is known to exist in the Northern Territory of Australia:

And whereas the introduction of raw meat from the said Northern Territory into Victoria is likely to propagate infectious disease amongst men or other animals:

Now therefore the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of Victoria by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof by this Order prohibits the introduction into Victoria of raw meat from the Northern Territory of Australia except in those cases where the meat is intended for human consumption; and directs that where any such meat is introduced into Victoria the following requirements shall be complied with:—

(1) The meat shall be packed in sealed cartons plainly marked with the stamp of the Administration of the said Northern Territory together with—

- (a) the name and location of the abattoir in the said Northern Territory at which the meat was produced;
- (b) the name of the processor;
- (c) the nature of the contents of the package;
- (d) the date of packing;

(2) The meat shall be taken forthwith on its arrival in Victoria to a meat inspection depot approved by the Minister for the purpose of inspecting imported meat.

(3) The importer of the meat shall furnish to the senior inspector appointed to such meat inspection depot a certificate of a duly qualified Stock Inspector and Inspector of Abattoirs of the Administration of the said Northern Territory that the meat so packed has been obtained from carcasses inspected with viscera and found free of disease and fit for human consumption.

(4) The said senior inspector shall retain all such certificates received by him until the thirty-first day of December next following and shall then forward them with his Annual Report to the Secretary of the Commission of Public Health.

The areas set out and described in the Second Schedule hereto are hereby prescribed as areas in which a building of Class II or Class III occupancy shall not be constructed to contain more than two stories including the ground story and no person shall in any such areas construct a building of Class II or Class III occupancy to contain more than two stories including the ground story.

3. After clause 3 of the said By-law the following new clause 3A shall be inserted:—

Limit of Number of Flats.

3A. The areas set out and described in the Second Schedule hereto are hereby prescribed as areas in which buildings of Class II occupancy shall not be constructed on any one site to contain in the aggregate more than four flats and no person shall in any such areas on any one site construct buildings of Class II occupancy to contain in the aggregate more than four flats. Site for the purposes of this clause is defined as the total area of land enclosed by its title boundaries.
