

PROCLAMATION EXTENDING THE OPERATION OF THE UNIFORM BUILDING REGULATIONS.

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS Section 916A of the Local Government Act 1958, as amended, provides—inter alia—that the Government Gazette, at the request of the Council of any municipality (not being a city or town) extend the operation of the Regulations made under Part XLIX. of the Act to the municipal district of such municipality or any part thereof.

AND WHEREAS by Proclamation published in the Government Gazette on the 11th June, 1957, the operation of the Uniform Building Regulations was extended to part of the municipal district of the Shire of Mansfield and the Council of the said Shire has requested that the operation of the said Regulations be extended to a further part of the municipal district of the said municipality:

NOW THEREFORE, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, by this my Proclamation, do hereby extend the operation of the Regulations made under Part XLIX. of the Local Government Act 1958, as amended, to that part of the municipal district of the Shire of Mansfield which is subject to the provisions of the Eildon Reservoir Planning Scheme 1959, the boundaries of which are described in the Interim Development Order published in the Government Gazette on the 21st March, 1962, at pages 828 and 829 excepting that portion of the Parish of Jamieson described hereunder:

Commencing at a point on the Goulburn River where the south-east boundary of allotment 3 of Section A abuts thereon; bounded thence north-easterly by the said allotment and a line to the south-west angle of allotment 1 of Section C; thence south-easterly and northerly by allotment 10A of section C to a point in line with the north side of the road forming the south boundaries of sections 17 and 16; thence south-easterly by a line and the north side of the said road, southerly by the east side of the road forming the western boundaries of sections 14 and 13, and westerly by the south side of the road forming the north boundaries of allotments 10c and 10p of Section H, and south-westerly and southerly by the west boundary of the last mentioned allotment and a line to the north boundary of allotment 2 of section 5; thence westerly by that allotment, allotment 1 and a line bearing N. 77 deg. 5 min. W. to the Goulburn River aforesaid; and thence northerly by that river to the point of commencement, and Order that the said Regulations shall come into

northerly by that river to the point of commencement, and Order that the said Regulations shall come into operation in the abovementioned portion of the municipal district of the Shire of Mansfield on publication of this Proclamation in the Government Gazette, provided that Parts I and II of Chapter 8 thereof shall not be deemed to come into operation till the 17th May, 1965, except in so far as may be necessary to enable the Council of the said municipality to make By-laws, pursuant to the powers conferred by Part III of the said Chapter, and provided further than no such By-law shall come into operation before the 17th May, 1965.

(a) By adding at the end of Schedule Three the following item:—

"Any compound preparation or admixture of the substances specified in this Schedule unless otherwise provided for in this or any other Schedule."

(b) By adding at the end of Schedule Four and Schedule Eight respectively the following item:—

"Any active principle, any natural or synthetic derivative, any salt and any compound of the substances specified in this Schedule and any preparation or admixture of such substances, active principles, derivatives, salts or compounds unless otherwise provided for in this or any other Schedule."

NOW THEREFORE, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State do by this Proclamation amend certain of the said Schedules as follows:—

- In Schedule Two and Schedule Four respectively in the item relating to ETHOHEPTAZINE CITRATE for the expression "5 per centum" there shall be substituted the expression "1 per centum".
- 2. In Schedule Five for the item-

"DIMETHANO-NAPHTHALENE (DIELDRIN) and all substitution and/or addition products of and all substances containing more than 2 per centum of Dimethano-Naphthalene or any substitution and/or addition products. Substances containing 2 per centum or less exempt except for warning label."

there shall be substituted the following item:-

"DIMETHANO-NAPHTHALENE and all substitution and/or addition products of Dimethano-Naphthalene, such as Aldrin and Dieldrin."

In Schedule Six for the item— "NITRIC ACID as such."

there shall be substituted the following item:—
"NITRIC ACID and substances containing more than 3.5 per centum of Nitric Acid."

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation proclaim the trades set out hereunder as carried on in the whole of the State of Victoria outside and excepting the Metropolitan District, to be apprenticeship trades, viz.:—

- (a) Cabinet Making
- (b) Wood Carving
- (c) Wood Turning
- (d) Chair and Couch Making
- (e) Polishing (Furniture)
- (f) Upholstering
- (g) Machining (Furniture)

Town and Country Planning Act 1958. CITY OF MALVERN.

INTERIM DEVELOPMENT ORDER.

BY virtue of the powers conferred by the Town and Country Planning Act 1958 and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, the Council of the the City of Malvern (hereinafter referred to as the Responsible Authority) having commenced the preparation of a planning scheme in accordance with the said Act, hereby makes the following Interim Development Order for the purpose of regulating, restricting, restraining or prohibiting the use or development of any land or the erection, construction or carrying out of any buildings or works on any land within the area described or shown on the map as the Schedule hereto:—

1. After the coming into operation of this Interim Devel-

1. After the coming into operation of this Interim Devel-

1. After the coming into operation of this Interim Development Order no person shall use or develop any land or erect, construct or carry out any buildings or works on any land within the area included in the Schedule, except in accordance with the provisions of a permit issued by the Responsible Authority.

2. Any application for a permit to use or develop any land or to erect, construct or carry out any buildings or works, shall be accompanied by a sketch plan or copy of Certificate of Title of the land and a description of the proposed use or development, and type of construction of any buildings or works proposed to be erected, constructed or carried out and such other particulars relating to the application as the Responsible Authority may require. require.

Security will be required either in Commonwealth Treasury bonds, or approved bank guarantee, fixed deposit receipt, Savings Bank deposit book, or non-negotiable cheque in favour of the Secretary to the Tender Board, as the tenderer may elect.

The security must be completed and the contract signed within five days of acceptance of the tender, failing which the service may be again advertised, or another tender accepted.

The lowest or any tender will not necessarily be accepted.

In the event of tenderers withdrawing or attempting to withdraw their tenders before notification of acceptance of same, or failing to take up their accepted tenders within the prescribed period after notification of acceptance, they may be disqualified from tendering or holding any future contracts for Government supplies for a period of twelve months, such disqualification to date from the notification of acceptance of tender. #### CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

Conditions of Contract.

1. Except where definite quantities are specified the Government will not be bound to order from the contractor all the articles enumerated in the schedule, but only those articles, and such quantities of those articles, as it may be found necessary to order. Should the Government, however, require a larger supply of any article than the estimated quantity stated in the schedule, the contractor will nevertheless be bound to supply the same at contract rates. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce the order for same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted and return the order to the contractor, who will attach it to his claim for payment.

He shall as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver the original at the Tender Board Offices, the duplicate to be forwarded to the consignee in accordance with clause 16, and the quintuplicate to be retained by himself. (In the case of Commonwealth Departments, however, the Commonwealth consignment note only, which accompanies the order, must be used.) 20. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in section 152 of the Customs Act 1901-36, it is hereby expressly provided that upon any alteration of the duty collected affecting the goods included in this contract, the contract price shall not be altered, and the contract may be terminated at the option of either party by two months' notice, in writing, from the first day of the calendar month next ensuing and within the period for which the contract is made. The contract for the unaffected items shall remain in full force and effect. Any notice to be served is made. The contract for the unaffected terms shan remain in full force and effect. Any notice to be served under this condition shall be deemed to have been duly served if sent to the contractor in a registered letter to his last-known place of business or abode.

The foregoing provision shall not apply where the contract is for definite quantities of imported goods to be delivered at stated times, as stipulated in the schedule, and any alteration in the duty of Customs or Telegraphic Transfer rate of exchange affecting the goods included in such contract shall be to the accounts of the Government; adjustments to be based on the F.O.B. and C.I.F. prices of the goods, respectively, and the Telegraphic Transfer rate ruling at the time of delivery of the goods.

21. Under no circumstances, other than those mentioned in clause 20, will the contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract, the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited and, in addition, the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

If within fourteen days after such publication such motor car shall be claimed by any person producing to the Council proof to its satisfaction that he is the owner thereof and the appropriate charge prescribed by this By-Law shall be paid in respect thereof such motor car shall be released to the person claiming it.
- 6. (a) Where any such motor car shall not be released within fourteen days after publication of such notice as aforesaid the Council may after the expiration of twenty-one days after the expiration of such notice cause the same to be sold either by public auction or private contract.
- (b) The proceeds of such sale shall be applied firstly in payment of the appropriate charge for the removal thereof and the residue (if any) shall be payable to any person producing to the Council proof to its satisfaction that he is the owner of such motor car.
- (c) If within three months after the date of such sale no person shall have claimed such residue and produced such proof as aforesaid to the Council such residue shall be paid into the Municipal Fund.
- 7. If the Council shall be unable to sell such motor car within fourteen days from the expiration of such twenty-one days the same may be disposed of by the Council in such manner as it may think fit.
