Country Fire Authority Act 1958.

EXCISION OF AREAS FROM THE EIGHTH AND THIRTEENTH FIRE CONTROL REGIONS AND CREATION OF THE TWENTY-SIXTH FIRE CONTROL REGION.

PROCLAMATION

By the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation of the Governor in Council issued on the sixteenth day of November, 1954, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the seventeenth day of November, 1954, for the purposes of the *Country Fire Authority Act 1944*, and by Proclamations issued on the sixteenth day of March, 1960, and the seventeenth day of May, 1960, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the twenty-third day of March, 1960, and the eighteenth day of May, 1960, respectively for the purposes of the *Country Fire Authority Act 1958*, certain parts of the country area of Victoria were proclaimed as fire control regions; and certain parts of such fire control regions were proclaimed to be urban fire districts; and the remainder (if any) of each such fire control region (being the area not included in any urban fire district) was proclaimed to be a rural district.

And whereas by section sixteen of the *Country Fire Authority Act 1958* it is (amongst other things) enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time, after consideration of a report submitted by the *Country Fire Authority*, by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*—

- (a) Excise any area from any fire control region;
- (b) Create any new fire control region;
- (c) Abolish any urban fire district;
- (d) Create any new Urban fire district; and
- (e) Amend or alter the boundaries of rural fire districts within any region;

And whereas the *Country Fire Authority* has submitted a report that it is necessary and desirable to excise areas from the Eighth and Thirteenth Fire Control Regions to create the Twenty-sixth Fire Control Region:

Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of

the powers conferred by the *Country Fire Authority Act* and all other powers me thereunto enabling, do by this my Proclamation—

- (a) excise from the Eighth Fire Control Region the municipal districts of the Cities of Chelsea, Dandenong and Springvale, those portions of the municipal district of the City of Waverley not included in the Metropolitan Fire District, and those portions of the municipal districts of the Shires of Berwick, Cranbourne, Frankston and Mornington described in the First Schedule hereto;
- (b) excise from the Thirteenth Fire Control Region those portions of the municipal district of the Shire of Knox described in the Second Schedule hereto;
- (c) create the Twenty-sixth Fire Control Region by incorporating the municipal districts of the Cities of Chelsea, Dandenong and Springvale, those portions of the municipal district of the City of Waverley not included in the Metropolitan Fire District, those portions of the municipal districts of the Shires of Berwick, Cranbourne, Frankston and Mornington described in the First Schedule hereto and those portions of the municipal district of the Shire of Knox described in the Second Schedule hereto;
- (d) abolish the urban fire districts within the Eighth Fire Control Region described in the Third Schedule hereto;
- (e) create the whole of the Twenty-sixth Fire Control Region an urban fire district; and
- (f) abolish the rural fire districts within the Eighth and Thirteenth Fire Control Regions within the areas described in the First and Second Schedules hereto.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

Shire of Berwick, Parishes of Narree Worrان and Eumemmerring, County of Mornington; Commencing at the intersection of Boundary-road and Hallam-road on the northern boundary of the municipality, Parish of Narree Worrان; thence southerly by Hallam-road to the southern boundary of the municipality; thence generally westerly, northerly and easterly by the municipal boundary to the point of commencement.

Shire of Cranbourne, Parishes of Eumemmerring, Lyndhurst and Langwarrin, County of Mornington: Commencing at the north-western angle of Crown allotment 7, section 31, on the northern boundary of the municipality, Parish of Eumemmerring; thence southerly by Hallam-road and Evans-road to Thompsons-road, Parish of Lyndhurst; thence westerly by Thompsons-road to Lyndhurst-road; thence southerly by Lyndhurst-road to Ballarto-road; thence westerly by Ballarto-road to Potts-road, Parish of Langwarrin; thence southely by Potts-road and westerly by Valley-road and West Boundary-road to the western municipal boundary; thence generally northerly and easterly by the municipal boundary to the point of commencement.

Shire of Frankston, Parishes of Lyndhurst and Frankston, County of Mornington; Commencing at the corner of Boundary-road and the Frankston-Dandenong road, being the north-east angle of the municipality, Parish of Lyndhurst; thence generally southerly by the eastern boundary of the municipality to Robinsons-road, Parish of Frankston; thence westerly by Robinsons-road to the Frankston-Hastings road; thence generally southerly and south-westerly by the Frankston-Hastings road and Moorooduc-road to the southern boundary of the municipality; thence south-easterly and north-westerly by the municipal boundary to the foreshore of Port Phillip Bay; thence generally northerly by the foreshore to the northern boundary of the municipality; thence generally easterly by the municipal boundary to the point of commencement.

Shire of Mornington, Parish of Moorooduc, County of Mornington; Commencing at the most easterly angle of Crown allotment 18, no section, Parish of Moorooduc; thence south-westerly by the south-eastern boundary of that allotment to Wooralla-drive; thence southerly by Wooralla-drive to Tower-road; thence westerly by Tower-road to the Nepean Highway; thence south-westerly by the Nepean Highway to Sunnyside-road; thence north-westerly by Sunnyside-road to the foreshore of Port Phillip Bay; thence generally north-easterly by the foreshore to the northern boundary of the municipality; thence south-easterly by the municipal boundary to the point of commencement.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

Shire of Knox, Parish of Narree Worrان, County of Mornington; Commencing at the intersection of Wellington-road and Stud-road; thence generally south-easterly by Bergins-road and a road to the southern boundary of the municipality at the intersection of Boundary-road and Police-road; thence westerly, southerly and north-westerly by the municipal boundary to Wellington-road; thence easterly by Wellington-road to the point of commencement.

THIRD SCHEDULE.

The municipal district of the City of Chelsea.

City of Dandenong, Township of Dandenong, Parishes of Dandenong and Eumemmerring, Counties of Bourke and Mornington: Commencing near the intersection of Heatherton-road and the Dandenong Creek, Parish of Dandenong, at the north-eastern angle of Crown allotment 45; thence generally in a southerly and south-westerly direction by the afore-mentioned creek to a point in line with the southern boundary of Crown allotment 18, Parish of Eumemmerring; thence easterly by a line and the last-mentioned boundary and southerly by the west boundaries of allotments 19 and 20 and a line to the south boundary of the Princes Highway; thence westerly by the Princes Highway, a line and Kirkham-road to the Frankston-road; thence southerly by that road to the south-western angle of Crown allotment 6, section XXV., Parish of Eumemmerring; thence westerly by a line and Williams-road to the Dandenong Creek drain reserve; thence northerly by the drain reserve and Dandenong Creek to a point distant 20 chains south from the north boundary of Crown allotment 65A, Parish of Dandenong; thence westerly by a line and Olive-grove to Chandler's-road; thence northerly by Chandler's-road to the south-western angle of Crown allotment 5; thence easterly by the south boundary of the last-mentioned allotment to Gladstone-road; thence northerly by Gladstone-road to Brady-road; thence easterly by Brady-road to the north-eastern angle of Crown allotment 77; thence southerly by Stud-road to Heatherton-road; thence easterly by Heatherton-road to the point of commencement.

City of Springvale, Parishes of Dandenong and Mordialloc, County of Bourke: Commencing at the south-western angle of Crown allotment 5, Parish of Dandenong; thence southerly by Chandler's-road to Cheltenham-road; thence westerly by Cheltenham-road to the south-western angle of Crown allotment C, section 24; thence north-westerly by Cheltenham-road, Parish of Mordialloc,

to the south-western angle of Crown allotment 2, section XIV.; thence northerly by Boundary-road to Kingston-road; thence easterly by Kingston-road and Heatherton-road to Westall-road; thence northerly by Westall-road to Centre-road; thence easterly by Centre-road, a line, and Police-road to the north-eastern angle of Crown allotment 8, Parish of Dandenong; thence southerly by the east boundary of the last-mentioned allotment to the Princes Highway; thence south-easterly by the Princes Highway to the most westerly angle of Crown allotment 14; thence easterly by the north boundary of the last-mentioned allotment and a line to the point of commencement.

City of Springvale, Parish of Lyndhurst, County of Mornington, Crown allotment 125.

Shire of Berwick, Parish of Eumemmerring, County of Mornington: Commencing at the north-eastern angle of Crown allotment 8, no section, Parish of Eumemmerring; thence southerly by the Belgrave-Hallam road, a line, and the Hallam South-road to the southern boundary of the Shire of Berwick; thence westerly and northerly by the boundary of the Shire of Berwick as defined at page 3845 in the *Government Gazette* published on 23rd November, 1938, to the south-eastern angle of Crown allotment 26; thence westerly to the south-western angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence northerly by a road to the north boundary of the Eastern Railway; thence north-westerly by the Eastern Railway to the most southerly angle of Crown allotment 15, section XXV.; thence northerly by the east boundary of the last-mentioned allotment to the south boundary of the Princes Highway; thence westerly by the south boundary of the Princes Highway to a point in line with the west boundary of Crown allotment 20; thence northerly by a line and the west boundaries of Crown allotments 20 and 19 to the north-western angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence westerly by the south boundary of Crown allotment 18 to the Dandenong Creek; thence generally north-easterly by the Dandenong Creek to the north-western angle of Crown allotment 3; thence easterly by the north boundaries of Crown allotments 3, 6 and 8 to the point of commencement.

Shire of Cranbourne, Parish of Eumemmerring, County of Mornington: Commencing at the north-eastern angle of Crown allotment 15, section XXV., Parish of Eumemmerring; thence southerly by the eastern boundary of the afore-mentioned allotment to the north boundary of the Eastern Railway; thence south-easterly by the Eastern Railway to the west boundary of Crown allotment 26; thence southerly to the south-western angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence easterly to the north-eastern angle of Crown allotment 27A; thence southerly by the east boundary of the last-mentioned allotment and a line to a point being the intersection of this line with a line being the eastern prolongation of the south boundary of Crown allotment 27; thence westerly by a line, the south boundary of Crown allotment 27, a line, and a road to the south-western angle of Crown allotment 6, section XXV.; thence northerly by the Frankston-road to the north-western angle of Crown allotment 1, section XXV.; thence easterly by Kirkham-road, a line, and the Princes Highway to the point of commencement.

Shire of Frankston, Parishes of Lyndhurst and Frankston, County of Mornington: Commencing on the foreshore of Port Phillip Bay at the south-western angle of the Carrum Recreation Reserve, in the Parish of Lyndhurst; thence north-easterly by the southern boundary of that reserve and a line to the east side of Point Nepean-road; thence generally in a northerly direction along the eastern side of that road to its intersection with the western boundary of the railway reserve; thence south-easterly along the western boundary of the railway reserve to the Kananook Creek; thence generally in a southerly and south-easterly direction by the Kananook Creek to the south boundary of Seaford-road; thence easterly, north-easterly, south-easterly and again easterly by the south boundary of Seaford-road across Wells-road to the east side of Dandenong-road; thence south-westerly along the east side of Dandenong-road to the south-west corner of the timber reserve in the Parish of Frankston; thence easterly along the south boundary of the timber reserve to the north-eastern angle of Crown allotment 3A, section A, Parish of Frankston; thence southerly along the eastern boundary of allotment 38 to Skye-road; thence north-westerly along the south side of Skye-road to the north-eastern angle of Crown allotment 1, section VI., Parish of Frankston; thence south-westerly along the eastern boundaries of Crown allotments 1 and 2, section VI., across Cranbourne-road to the north-western angle of Crown allotment 32J, section VI.; thence southerly along the western boundaries of Crown allotments 32J and 32K to the south-western angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence south-easterly along the south boundary of the aforesaid allotment to the north-western angle of allotment 32F; thence southerly

along the western boundary of allotment 32F to the south-eastern angle of allotment 6T; thence westerly and south-westerly along the northern boundary of Crown allotment 31A and a line to the west side of Hastings-road; thence south-easterly along the western boundary of Hastings-road to the south-eastern angle of Crown allotment 3, section IV.; thence north-westerly along the southern boundary of Crown allotment 3 to Foote-street; thence southerly along the east side of Foote-street to its junction with the Sweetwater Creek; thence south-easterly along the Sweetwater Creek to the north-eastern angle of Crown allotment 8, section IV.; thence south-westerly by the boundary between Crown allotments 7 and 8, section IV., to Humphries-road; thence north-westerly along the south-west side of Humphries-road to Point Nepean-road; thence southerly along the east side of Point Nepean-road to the Kackeraboite Creek; thence generally in a north-westerly direction along that creek to the foreshore of Port Phillip Bay; thence generally in a north-easterly and northerly direction by the foreshore to the point of commencement.

PROCLAMATION

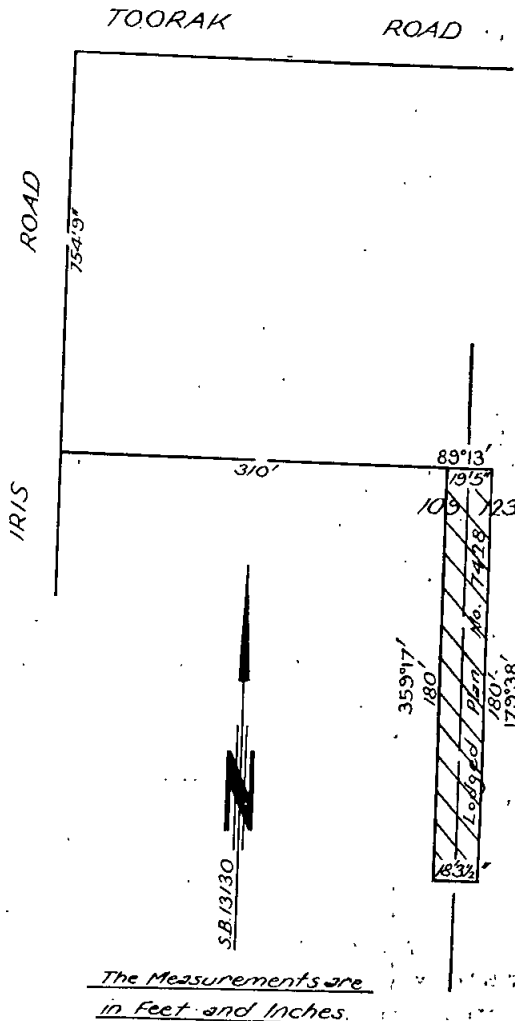

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1958*, as amended, section 519, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time and from time to time upon request of the Council of any municipality by notice in the *Government Gazette* to proclaim any land reserved used or by purchase

or exchange acquired for a street road highway thoroughfare bridge square court alley or right-of-way or any street road lane or passage made or laid out or proposed to be made or laid out on any land of which a plan delineating that street road lane or passage has been lodged with the Registrar of Titles to be a public highway and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force:

And whereas the Council of the City of Camberwell has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, used for a street, be so declared to be a public highway:

Now therefore, I, the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare that all that piece of land shown hatched on the plan hereunder, shall be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act.

ORDER IN COUNCIL PROHIBITING THE KEEPING, GRAZING OR MILKING OF COWS WITHIN A CERTAIN SPECIFIED AREA OF THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF THE CITY OF COBURG.

WHEREAS by section 81 of the *Milk and Dairy Supervision Act 1958* (No. 6317) the Governor in Council is empowered on the application of the Council of any municipal district, whether wholly or partly within a milk area or not, if approved by the Minister, to prohibit any person keeping, grazing or milking cows on any part or parts, or in any part, of such area or district:

And whereas the Council of the Municipal District of the City of Coburg has applied to the Governor in Council to prohibit any person keeping, grazing or milking cows in the following specified area of such municipality, that is to say:—

- (g) Prescribing the distance from any adjoining land or from any street or public place or from any building within which it shall not be lawful to deposit such combustible materials as are specified herein.
- (h) Generally for maintaining the good rule and government of the municipality.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1958* and of any and every other power it thereunto enabling the Mayor Councillors and Citizens of the City of Waverley orders as follows:—

- (1) This By-law shall be known as the Nuisances By-law.
- (2) In this By-law unless the context otherwise requires "Instrument" means any instrument device or thing whatsoever capable of making or being used for making sound or noise and without affecting the generality of the foregoing includes any loudspeaker amplifier broadcasting set wireless receiving set television set gramophone piano player piano model power driven aircraft or other instrument or device.
- (3) No person shall in any public highway cause or permit or suffer to be caused any noise:
 - (a) by shouting calling out or haranguing or singing, or
 - (b) by using operating controlling sounding or playing any instrument.
- (4) No person shall in or upon any land house building or place make or cause or permit or suffer to be made or caused such a volume or amount of sound or noise as to be an annoyance or nuisance to any other person being in or upon any other land house building or place or in or upon any public highway,
 - (a) by shouting calling out haranguing or singing, or
 - (b) by using operating controlling sounding or playing any instrument.
- (5) No person shall in or upon any premises use or operate any instrument or any machinery or plant in such a manner as to cause any objectionable noise at any unreasonable time.
- (6) No person shall spit or expectorate on any footpath.

- (7) No person shall use any street or road for the purpose of washing painting or (save in case of emergency) repairing dismantling or assembling any vehicle.
- (8) No person shall at any time between the hours of eight o'clock in the morning and six o'clock in the afternoon of any day obstruct or annoy passengers along any street or road by raising or discharging dust or causing water to flow upon or across such street or road.
- (9) No person shall permit to run from any land or premises into or upon any street or road any offensive liquid or matter.
- (10) No person shall on any premises owned or occupied by him burn or cause or permit to be burned any substance in such manner or to such an extent as shall cause such quantities of smoke to be emitted from the said premises as will cause a nuisance to any other person upon any other land or upon any public highway.
- (11) No person shall throw place or leave upon any public highway any orange peel banana peel or other vegetable matter.
- (12) No child shall on any footway use any skates truck scooter or other like toy vehicle in such manner as to interfere with the passage of or cause annoyance to persons being lawfully upon such footway.
- (13) No person shall permit or suffer any cattle to graze or wander upon any land not enclosed by a substantial fence.
- (14) The distance from any adjoining land or from any building within which it shall not be lawful to deposit any timber or any wooden or cardboard boxes or cases or any paper hay or straw is hereby prescribed as six feet.
- (15) No person shall deposit any timber or any wooden or cardboard boxes or cases or any paper hay or straw contrary to the provisions of the last preceding clause.
- (16) This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Municipal district.
