MOTOR BOATING ACT 1961.—SECTION 2 (1).

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Part 1. section 2 of the *Motor Boating Act 1961* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, may from time to time appoint a person, board, trust, Commission, body or Council of a municipality to be an Authority for the purposes of the said Act over any Victorian waters:

- (a) a line being the Eastern Boundary of the City of Geelong where such boundary runs into the Barwon River and the prolongation of such boundary; and
- (b) a line being the Western Boundary of the City of Newtown and Chilwell where such boundary runs into the Barwon River and the prolongation of such boundary.

The Lake Charlegrark Foreshore Committee of Management over the waters of Lake Charlegrark in the Shire of Kowree.

The Lake Bringalbart Foreshore Committee of Management over the waters of Lake Bringalbart in the Shire of Kowree.

6. That in respect of the land so included as aforesaid in the metropolis, the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works may make and levy a water rate greater than the rate made and levied in respect of land in the metropolis generally but not in any case exceeding One shilling in the pound.

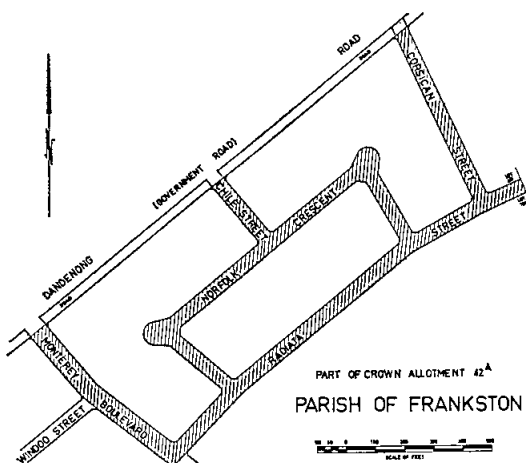
DECLARATION OF PRIVATE STREETS AS PUBLIC HIGHWAYS WITHIN THE SHIRE OF FRANKSTON.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE CORA LYNN RECREATION AND PUBLIC HALL RESERVE.

WHEREAS by section 218 of the *Land Act 1958* the Minister of Lands is empowered to make Regulations as to any land which under the provisions of that Act or of any other Act relating to Crown lands has been reserved for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees: And whereas certain Crown lands in the Parish of Koo-Wee-Rup East and described in a notice published in the *Government Gazette* of the fifth day of July, 1930, were temporarily reserved as a site for Public Recreation and Hall: And whereas such lands (hereinafter called "the Reserve") have not been conveyed to or vested in trustees: And whereas it is expedient that Regulations for the care, protection and management of the Reserve and for other purposes connected therewith should be made: Now therefore, I, James Charles Murray Balfour, Her Majesty's Minister of Lands in and for the State of Victoria, in pursuance of the powers aforesaid, do hereby make the following Regulations for or with respect to the Reserve:—

The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management with power and authority to enforce the following Regulations:—

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public free of charge, except on such days, not exceeding twenty-six (26) in any one year, as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, public meetings, entertainments, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions the fees hereinafter may be charged and taken for admission of every adult; such Reserve being parcelled out into the following divisions:—

- (a) Hall site.
- (b) The remainder of the Reserve.

2. The fees to be charged and taken for admission of each adult to the Public Hall shall be such a sum not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

For the admission of each adult to the remainder of the Reserve on such days as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports or holiday amusements, such a sum not exceeding Ten shillings (10s.).

3. No person shall be allowed to cart any material through or within the Reserve, nor shall any loaded dray, cart, wagon or truck be driven through or within the Reserve without the permission of the Committee of Management first obtained.

4. No person, unless authorized by the Committee of Management, shall ride or drive any animal with or without vehicles upon any part of the Reserve.

5. No person not being a player or official shall trespass on the playing arena during the progress of any football or cricket match, or any sports gathering, nor wilfully obstruct, or interrupt, or in any way interfere with any servant of the Committee of Management in the proper execution of his work or duty.

6. The Committee of Management may let the Reserve on such terms and conditions as it may deem reasonable and consistent with these Regulations, but the maximum fee therefor shall not exceed Fifty pounds (£50) per day.

7. The Committee of Management may set apart any portion of the Reserve for the purpose of any lawful game or sports, and from time to time grant to any club, or association of clubs, upon such terms and conditions, as the Committee of Management may determine, the use of the grounds so set apart.

8. The Committee of Management may from time to time select portions of the Reserve for the parking of cars and vehicles, and the tethering of horses, and no cars, vehicles or horses shall be parked or tethered in any portion of the Reserve other than in the portions set apart for the purpose. A charge of Two shillings (2s.) per day may be made for the admission of any vehicle to the Reserve on such days not exceeding twenty-six (26) in any one year, on which a charge for admission is being made as provided by Clauses 1 and 2 of these Regulations.

9. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

10. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language or conduct.

11. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.

12. No person shall without the permission, in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained, train any horse within the Reserve, or bring into the Reserve any dog unless controlled by a chain or cord.

13. No person or persons shall camp in the Reserve nor erect therein any building or any booth, or any structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

14. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

15. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths, or any structure or erection in the Reserve.

16. No person shall carry on the trade, business, or calling of a bookmaker, except in or on such portions of the Reserve as may be set apart for that purpose, and then only when he shall have complied with the conditions imposed by the Committee of Management.

17. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any fêtes, sports, race-meetings, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20), by way of guarantee, that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure and such Committee, in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy, or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited

by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations, and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

18. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

19. No person shall erect or cause to be erected any building, stand, erection or hoarding, on any part of the Reserve without firstly obtaining the permission of the Committee of Management, in writing, upon such terms and conditions as the Committee of Management may determine from time to time.—(Rs.1860.)

These Regulations are in lieu of those made on the 7th December, 1939, which are hereby revoked.
