AREA OF LAND COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c. WHEREAS by the Land Act 1958 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette, at any time diminish or increase the area of lands comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division I, section 5, of the said Land Act 1958, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6), shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the Land Act 1958 aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Class 7 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the Land Act 1958 aforesaid, to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—



By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Local Government Act 1958, as amended, Section 519, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Government Gazette to proclaim any land reserved used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street road highway thoroughfare bridge square court alley or right-of-way or any street road lane or passage made or laid out or proposed to be made or laid out on any land of which a plan delineating that street road lane or passage has been lodged with the Registrar of Titles to be a public highway and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force.

AND WHEREAS the Council of the Shire of Berwick has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, used for a street, be so declared to be a public highway.

NOW THEREFORE I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare that Langmore Lane, Berwick, shown hatched on the plan hereunder, shall be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act.



- (a) Preserving Public Decency.
- (b) Regulating the conduct of persons using or being upon or in pleasure grounds or places of public resort or public recreation.
- (c) Imposing collecting and receiving charges or entrance fees for clubs, associations or persons using or entering in any such grounds or places.
- (d) Controlling, managing and preserving public reserves
- (e) Preserving good order and decency in any build-ing belonging to the Municipality or under the control and management of the Council and preventing damage to such building.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1958, and of any and every other power it thereunto enabling the Mayor, Councillors and Citizens of the City of Waverley order as follows:—

- 1. This By-law shall be known as the Municipal Buildings Reserves and Playgrounds By-law.
- 2. By-law No. 65 for controlling and managing public reserves is hereby repealed.
 - 3. (a) In this By-law:-
 - "Children's Playground" means and includes each and all of the lands described in the 1st Schedule
 - hereto.

 "Consent" means the consent in writing of the Council under the hand of the Town Clerk.
 - "Municipal Building" means and includes any building belonging to the Municipality or under the control and management of the Council.

 "Reserve" means and includes each and all of the lands described in the 2nd Schedule hereto.
- (b) All of the lands referred to in the 1st and 2nd Schedules hereto have been purchased, rented or otherwise provided by the Council or been granted or given by some person for the providing of pleasure grounds or places of public resort or public recreation.

- 4. Each reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset on any day except such days not exceeding 50 in any one calendar year) as the Council may (in regard to any reserve or part thereof) by resolution set aside for the conduct or playing of sport, fetes or holiday amusements. On any such day so set aside there may be charged and taken a sum not exceeding £1 for the admission of each adult and 5s, for each child not over the age of fourteen years to such reserve. No person shall, without the prior consent in writing of the Council, enter into or remain in any reserve between the hours of sunset or sunrise on any day,
- 5. Save on any day and in any reserve or part thereof when and which the Council has set aside for the conduct or playing of sport, fetes or holiday amusements no person shall obstruct or interfere with the lawful use by any other person of any reserve.
- 6. Each children's playground shall be open to children, not over the age of fourteen years, from sunrise to sunset on any day and no person shall enter into or remain in any children's playground between the hours of sunset and sunrise on any day.
- 7. No person other than the Mayor, Town Clerk, Deputy Town Clerk, City Engineer and Deputy City Engineer of the City of Waverley shall enter any portion of a reserve when a charge is made for admission thereto without first having paid the fee charged.
- 8. No person shall engage in any organized game or sport or shall practice the game of golf in any reserve without prior consent nor save in accordance with any conditions contained in such consent.
- 9. No person, club or other body shall in any reserve engage in any sport on Sundays without prior consent and save in accordance with any conditions contained in such consent.
- 10. Consent may be given by the Council for playing of sport on reserves on Sundays on application, but such sport shall only take place between the hours of 1 p.m. and 6 p.m.
- 11. No person desirous of entering any reserve and watching any such Sunday sport shall be charged any
- 12. If any person or persons organizing any such Sunday sport intend asking for a donation from the person who may wish to enter any reserve to watch any such sport, no specific sum of money shall be set as a donation.
- 13. Any person or persons who decline to make a donation to watch any such Sunday sport shall not be debarred by any person, persons, officials or gatekeepers from entering any reserve where such Sunday sport is being played.
- 14. No person, club or other body shall in any reserve engage in any sport on Christmas Day or Good Friday.
- 15. No person shall without prior consent take part in any public meeting or entertainment.
 - 16. No person shall cut, maim or otherwise damage:-
 - (a) Any building on any reserve or children's play-ground or the furniture, fittings or equipment grouna thereon.
 - (b) Any municipal building or the furniture or fittings \cdot thereon.
- 17. No person other than an officer or servant of the Council shall break, damage or interfere with any tree, plant or shrub or pluck any flowers in any reserve or walk on or enter upon any flower beds or borders therein or climb, jump or get over or upon or in any way damage any fence, gate, seat or structure therein.
- 18. No person shall roll or throw stones or other missiles in any reserve or children's playground or (save in receptacles placed therein by the Council for that purpose) place or leave therein any bottles, broken glass, orange or banana peel, or any refuse or rubbish what-
- 19. No person shall attach, fix or paint any bill, device, poster, sign or advertisement on any of the buildings, fences, seats or other structures in any reserve or children's playground or on any municipal building.
- 20. No person shall without prior consent light any fire in any reserve or children's playground save in a fire-place provided by the Council.
- 21. No person shall shoot, snare, molest, injure or in any way interfere with any bird or animal in any reserve.
- 22. No person shall sell or offer for sale any food, drink or other commodity in any reserve or children's playground or operate therein any money-making amusement without prior consent.

- 23. No person shall fly model aeroplanes or gliders in or over any of the reserves or children's playgrounds.
- 24. No person shall without prior consent in writing of the Council consume, sell or offer for sale any alcoholic liquor in any reserve or children's playground.
- 25. No person other than an officer or employee of the Council shall enter upon any area in a reserve set apart for the propagation of plants or for use as a nursery or shall remove any pot plant shrub or flower from any
- 26. No person shall bet publicly or carry on the business of a bookmaker in any reserve or children's playground.
- 27. No person other than an officer or servant of the Council shall ride or drive any horse or any motor car, motor cycle or other vehicle or any bicycle into or upon any reserve or children's playground save into such areas as are provided by the Council for the parking of motor
- 28. No person shall bring into or upon any reserve or children's playground any dog unless controlled at all times by a chain or leash.
- 29. Otherwise than is provided in the last preceding clause, no person shall permit or suffer any animal owned by him or of which he is in charge to be in or upon any reserve or children's playground.
- 30. No person shall in any reserve, children's play-ground or municipal building behave in a disorderly manner or create or take part in any disturbance or use indecent or abusive language or cause any nuisance and no person shall enter into or remain in any reserve, children's playground or municipal building whilst in an intoxicated or drunken condition.
- 31. Subject as is hereinafter provided no person above the age of fourteen years shall use any of the equipment in any children's playground.


