AREA OF LAND COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1958* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1958*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6), shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1958* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Class 6 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1958* aforesaid, to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1958*, as amended, section 519, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time and from time to time upon request of the Council of any municipality by notice in the *Government Gazette* to proclaim any land reserved used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street road highway thoroughfare bridge square court alley or right-of-way or any street road lane or passage made or laid out or proposed to be made or laid out on any land of which a plan delineating that street road lane or passage has been lodged with the Registrar of Titles to be a public highway and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force.

And whereas the Council of the Shire of Knox has requested that the streets hereinafter mentioned, being streets roads lanes or passages made or laid out or proposed to be made or laid out on land of which a plan delineating those streets has been lodged with the Registrar of Titles, be so declared to be public highways.

Now therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare that Norwich-street and Penrith-street coloured brown on plan of subdivision No. 53713, lodged in the Office of Titles shall be public highways within the meaning of the said Act.

DETERMINATION No. 117 OF THE POLICE SERVICE BOARD.

THE Police Service Board, in pursuance of the powers in that behalf conferred by the *Police Regulation Act 1958*, hereby makes the following Determination, that is to say:—

1. The Determination No. 107 of the Police Service Board of the 15th November, 1963, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 4th February, 1964, as amended is further amended as follows:—

(a) Paragraph 15 is amended—

(i) by deleting the words “Station Officer” and substituting therefor the word “Officer”;

(ii) by deleting the words “Town Hall” and substituting therefor the words “City Traffic Station”.

(b) Sub-paragraph (a) of paragraph 25 is amended by deleting the words "Town Hall" and substituting therefor the words "City Traffic Station".

(c) By deleting paragraph 34 and substituting the following paragraph—

"34. (a) Whenever a member is authorized by the Chief Commissioner or the Officer in Charge of the District to perform temporarily the duties of a rank or position higher than his own for a period or periods exceeding in the aggregate 28 days in any year, he shall be paid, for the period or periods during which he was performing such higher duties, at a rate not less than the minimum salary and appropriate allowances (if any, but excluding any higher or additional uniform allowance appropriate to the higher rank or position), attached to the higher rank or position.

(b) If the Chief Commissioner or the Officer in Charge of the District, in any particular case, is satisfied that it was not practicable to obtain such authority before the higher duties were performed and that those higher duties were in fact reasonably performed by a member he may authorize payment for the performance of those higher duties.

(c) The Chief Commissioner may prescribe the form on which applications for such authority may be made, and issue any orders necessary to implement the provisions of this paragraph."

2. This Determination shall come into operation on the 1st July, 1965.

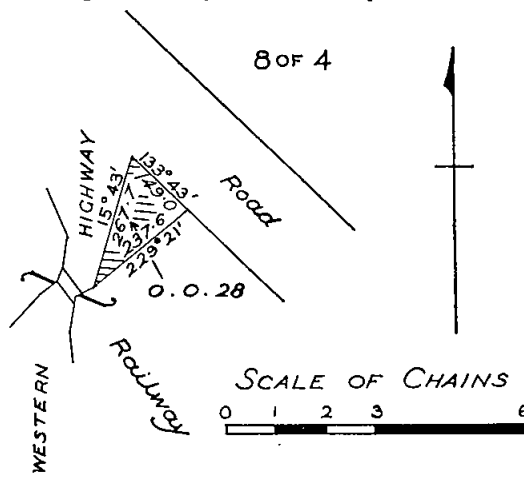

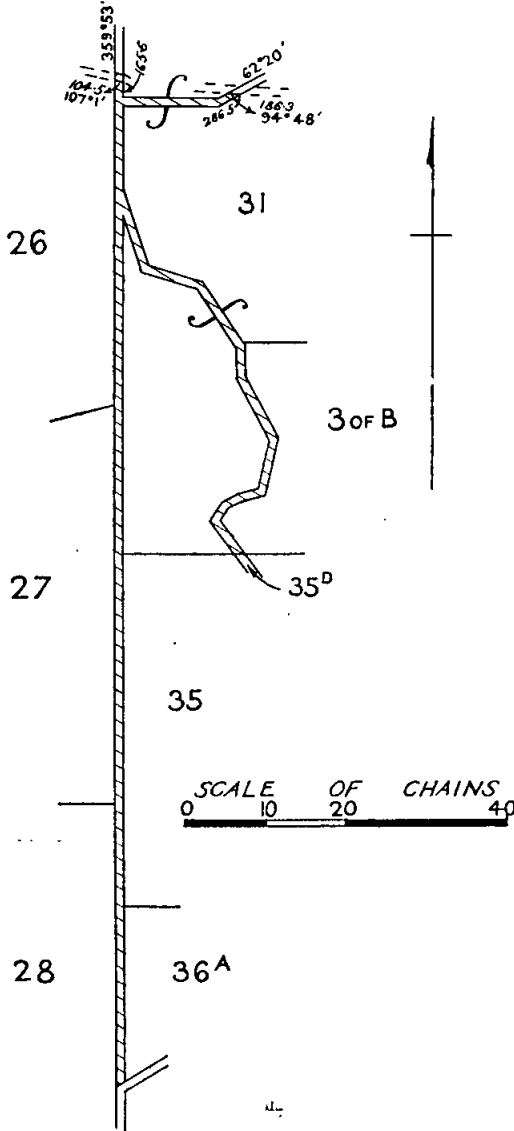

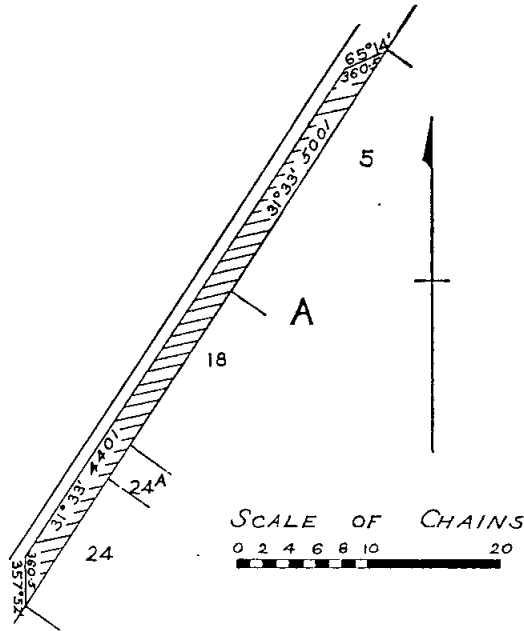

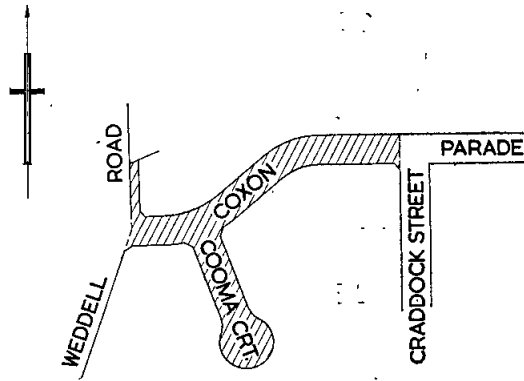

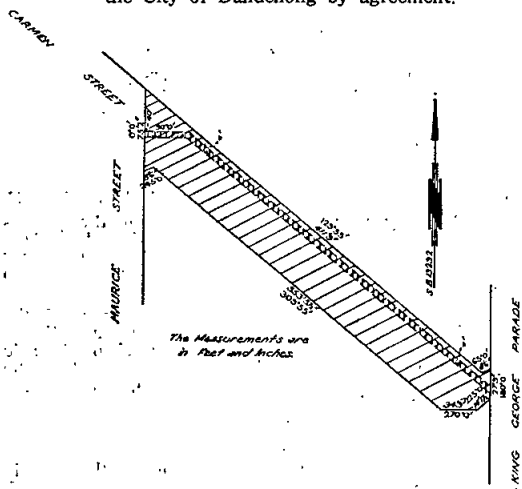
ROAD DISCONTINUED—CITY OF DANDENONG.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE CAMPING AND PUBLIC RECREATION RESERVE, PARISH OF CANABORE.

WHEREAS by section 218 of the *Land Act 1958* the Minister of Lands is empowered to make regulations as to any land which under the provisions of that Act or of any other Act relating to Crown lands has been reserved for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees: And whereas certain Crown lands in the Parish of Canabore and described in a notice published in the *Gazette* of the twenty-eighth day of November, 1962, were temporarily reserved as a site for Camping and Public Recreation: And whereas such lands (hereinafter called "the Reserve") have not been conveyed to or vested in trustees; And whereas it is expedient that regulations for the care, protection and management of the Reserve and for other purposes connected therewith should be made: Now therefore I, James Charles Murray Balfour,

Her Majesty's Minister of Lands in and for the State of Victoria, in pursuance of the powers aforesaid, do hereby make the following Regulations for or with respect to the Reserve:—

The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management with power and authority to enforce the following Regulations:—

1. No person shall climb or jump over any fences or gates in or around the Reserve, post bills thereon, or engrave names on the fences, trees, seats or other improvements therein, or otherwise disfigure injure or destroy the said property or remove any soil therefrom.

2. No person shall deposit, or cause to be deposited any waste paper, bottles, cans, or any other litter on any part of the Reserve, except in the receptacles provided for the purpose.

3. No person shall erect any structure on the Reserve other than a tent or booth, and then only as hereinafter provided.

4. No person shall camp or erect any tent in or upon the Reserve, except in such places as shall from time to time be set apart for such purpose, and then only by obtaining a permit to do so upon such terms and conditions and payment of such fees, as the Committee of Management shall determine.

5. No persons shall erect a booth in the Reserve for the purpose of offering for sale any articles, nor shall any person offer for sale in the Reserve any articles without permission in writing and subject to such conditions or payment of such fees fixed by the Committee of Management.

6. No person shall light fires except in places set apart for that purpose by the Committee of Management and no refuse material shall be burned in the Reserve, except by a representative of the Committee of Management and then only in places set apart for that purpose.

7. No person shall break glass of any kind in the Reserve, or leave thereon anything which shall or may injure any person.

8. No person shall discharge any firearm in or upon the Reserve.

9. No person shall put in or on the Reserve any cattle, goats, pigs, horses, or other animals, or any vehicles without the permission of the Committee of Management first obtained.

10. Any stock camped in the Reserve is put there at the owner's risk and any damage to said property and improvements incurred by stock is said owner's responsibility.

11. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord, without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained.

12. Permission of the Committee of Management must be obtained beforehand for the holding of all organized sports, picnics or functions of any kind in the Reserve.—(Rs.8179.)

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 218 of the *Land Act 1958*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist therefrom may be forthwith apprehended by such Bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "WARRENBAYNE WEST RECREATION RESERVE".

WHEREAS by section 218 of the *Land Act 1958* the Minister of Lands is empowered to make Regulations as to any land which under the provisions of that Act or of any other Act relating to Crown lands has been reserved for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees: And whereas certain Crown lands in the Parish of Warrenbayne and described in a notice published in the *Gazette* of the second day of October, 1963, were temporarily reserved

as a site for Public Recreation: And whereas such lands (hereinafter called "the Reserve") have not been conveyed to or vested in trustees: And whereas it is expedient that Regulations for the care, protection and management of the Reserve and for other purposes connected therewith should be made: Now therefore I, James Charles Murray Balfour, Her Majesty's Minister of Lands in and for the State of Victoria, in pursuance of the powers aforesaid, do hereby make the following Regulations for or with respect to the Reserve:—

The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management with power and authority to enforce the following Regulations.

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be opened to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days, not exceeding 52 in any one year, as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Five shillings may be charged and taken for admission of every adult to the Reserve.

2. No person shall—

- (a) Enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct, or who may behave in a disorderly, unseemly, or offensive manner, or create or take part in any disturbance.
- (b) Enter or remain in the Reserve whilst in a state of intoxication.
- (c) Bring any intoxicating liquor on to the Reserve without the consent of the Committee first obtained.
- (d) Exercise or train any horse or pony on the Reserve, or any part thereof, without the consent of the Committee first obtained.

3. The Committee shall have power to hold entertainments, shows, or performances on the Reserve, and to make a charge for admission thereto as hereinbefore provided.

4. The Committee shall have power to let any portion of the Reserve to any club, association, person or society for the purpose of holding entertainments, performances, shows, or sports, subject to the payment of such fees and on such terms as it may deem to be reasonable and consistent with these Regulations, and to authorize any club, association, society, or person to make a charge for admission thereto as hereinbefore provided in these Regulations.

5. No persons, except the Committee or its officers or employees on duty shall enter any part of the Reserve, on an occasion when a charge is made for admission thereto without first paying the fees chargeable for such admission.

6. No person shall park a motor car, vehicle or motor cycle in the Reserve except at such places as are set apart for the purpose by the Committee who reserve the right to make a parking charge not exceeding Two shillings for each vehicle.

7. No person shall play or engage in any organized sport, game or competition within the Reserve on Sundays, Good Friday, or Anzac Day without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

8. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasion of any sports, fêtes, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee may at any time determine by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee, in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such damage, injury or loss from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations, and by any order given by the Committee.

9. No person shall, in the Reserve, interfere with or break or damage any of the trees, plants or shrubs, or pluck any flowers, or climb, jump or get over or under any of the fences, gates, seats, or other structures therein, or roll or throw stones or other missiles, or leave any bottles, broken glass, paper, fruit peel, or any refuse or rubbish whatever therein or post bills or advertisements on any of the fences, gates, seats or other structures therein.

10. No person shall light a fire in the Reserve without the consent of the Committee.

11. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord, without permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

12. No person shall put in the Reserve, any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

13. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any building or any booth for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

14. No person shall enter the Reserve, or pass over the playing area or oval with any vehicle, or on horseback, without the permission of the Committee first obtained, nor drive or ride amongst or to the danger or annoyance of persons assembled on any part of the Reserve.

15. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve, without permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

16. No person, club or other body shall, without the consent of the Committee first obtained, grade or scrape the ground off or cut any grass growing on any part of the Reserve.

17. No person shall remove any earth, sand, stone, marl, or gravel from the Reserve.—(Rs.8265.)

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE BIRCHIP RECREATION AND SHOWGROUNDS RESERVE.

WHEREAS by section 218 of the *Land Act 1958*, the Minister of Lands is empowered to make Regulations as to any land which under the provisions of that Act or any other Act relating to Crown Lands has been reserved for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees: Now therefore I, James Charles Murray Balfour, Her Majesty's Minister of Lands in and for the State of Victoria, in pursuance of the powers aforesaid, do hereby make the following Regulations for the reserved Crown land shown hachured red on plan marked B./10.6.65 attached to Lands Department correspondence Rs.1922, and known as the Birchip Recreation and Showgrounds Reserve.

The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management with power and authority to enforce the following Regulations:—

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public free of charge from sunrise to sunset, except on such days as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket, football or other matches, shows, sports, fêtes, musical performances, outdoor gatherings or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions an admission fee may be charged; but no person shall be permitted to enter any of the buildings on the Reserve on days on which fees for admission are not being charged without permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

2. No person shall—

- (a) Enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language or conduct, or who may behave in a disorderly, unseemly or offensive manner or create or take part in any disturbance.
- (b) Enter or remain in the Reserve whilst in a state of intoxication.
- (c) Use indecent or offensive language in the Reserve.
- (d) Offer any articles for sale, or bring any intoxicating liquor on to the Reserve, without in either case the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management.
- (e) Obstruct, hinder or interfere with any person under authority from the Committee of Management or employed by them at the Reserve.
- (f) Exercise or train any horse or pony on the Reserve or any part thereof without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

3. The Committee of Management shall have power to hold entertainments, shows or performances in the Reserve, and to make a charge for admission thereto as hereinbefore provided.

4. The Committee of Management shall have power to let any portion of the Reserve to any club, association, person or society for the purpose of holding entertainment, performances, shows or sports, subject to the payment of such fees and on such terms as it may be deemed to be reasonable and consistent with these Regulations, and to authorize any club, association, society or person to make a charge for admission thereto, as provided hereinbefore in these Regulations.

5. No club, association, society or person shall hold any entertainment, performance, show or ceremony in any part of the Reserve without the written authority of the Committee of Management first obtained.

6. No person except the Committee of Management or its officers or employees on duty shall enter any part of the Reserve when a charge is made for admission without first paying the fees chargeable for admission.

7. No person shall park a motor car, vehicle or motor cycle within the Reserve except at such places as are set apart for that purpose by the Committee of Management.

8. No person shall play, practice or engage in any organized games, sports or entertainments of any sort in the Reserve at any time without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

9. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve without permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

10. No person, club or other bodies using the Reserve shall damage any buildings in any part of the Reserve or the fittings thereof, and in the event of such damage occurring during their occupancy thereof such person, club or others shall be responsible for such damage and pay the Committee of Management the cost of making good and repairing same.

11. No person shall in the Reserve interfere with or break or damage any of the trees, plants or shrubs, or pluck any flowers or walk on the beds or borders or climb, jump, get under or over any of the fences, gates, seats or other structures, nor roll or throw stones or other missiles, or leave any bottles, broken glass, paper, orange peel, banana skins or any refuse or rubbish whatever therein or post bills or advertisements on any of the fences, gates, seats or other structures therein.

12. No person shall light a fire in the Reserve except at such places as are set apart for that purpose by the Committee of Management.

13. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs or any other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. The fees to be charged for any agistment shall be fixed by the Committee of Management.

14. No person shall camp in the Reserve or erect therein any building or any other structure, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first being obtained.

15. No person shall sell or offer for sale in the Reserve any article without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first had and obtained, and then only subject to such conditions as such Committee may determine.

16. No person, club or other body shall, without the written consent of the Committee of Management first obtained, grade, cut, burn or scrape any part of the Reserve or any grass growing thereon.

17. No person shall practice, play or engage in any sports including tennis, quoits, hockey or any games or footracing except in the portion of the Reserve set apart for that purpose and then only with the permission of the Committee first obtained, and such permission may be granted subject to such terms and conditions as the Committee may determine.

18. No person shall enter the Reserve or pass over the playing area or oval, with any vehicle or on horseback, without the permission of the Committee first obtained, nor ride or drive amongst or to the danger or annoyance of persons assembled on any part of the Reserve.

19. No person shall remove any earth, sand, stones, marble or gravel from the Reserve.

20. The Committee shall accept no responsibility or liability for any injury or accident that may occur at any time within the Reserve.

21. No person shall erect or display any signs, advertising materials or notices within the Reserve without the permission of the Committee of Management, in writing.

22. No person shall on any portion of the Reserve cause or permit any outcry, sound or noise to be emitted from an amplifier, loud speaker, public address system or like instrument without first obtaining the written permission of the Committee and such permission may be granted subject to such terms, conditions and restrictions as may be imposed by the Committee of Management.

CARAVAN PARK REGULATIONS.

23. The Committee of Management may set apart a portion or portions of the Reserve as and for the purposes of a Caravan Park and may make, fix and collect fees or other charges for entering and use of any such area or the buildings thereon.

24. In the area set aside by the Committee as a Caravan Park, the following Regulations shall apply.

25. In these Regulations, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—

“Camping” includes the parking of a vehicle on the camping site.

“Camping site” means an individual site set apart by the Committee for the parking of vehicles and for the erection of tents.

“Caretaker” shall mean the Manager or Deputy Caretaker appointed by the Committee.

“Occupier” includes each and every person in charge of a vehicle parked on a camping site and the person in charge of any tent thereon.

“Refuse” includes food and all discarded matter.

“Sanitary conveniences” includes urinals, water closets, showers, water taps, gully traps, wash troughs, washing machines, wash coppers, wash basins, refuse bins and receptacles provided by the Committee for depositing therein of refuse.

“Vehicle” includes—

(a) motor cars within the meaning of the *Motor Car Act 1958*; and

(b) caravans and trailers.

Parking of Vehicles.

26. The person in charge of a vehicle and who desires to park the same in the Caravan Park, shall park it on a camping site as directed by the Caretaker or, in his absence, on a vacant camping site in the said park and shall pay to the Caretaker the fees prescribed in accordance with these Regulations.

27. No occupier or other person shall park any vehicle and/or erect any tent or annexe so that any part thereof shall extend beyond the limits of the camping site occupied by him.

Time Limit on Camping.

28. No person other than a person desirous of holidaying in the Caravan Park shall bring a caravan therein and then only for a period of not more than three weeks at any one time save that under exceptional circumstances the Committee may extend the period of time upon receipt of a request, in writing, from the person or persons concerned.

Sub-Letting.

29. No person shall sub-let any vehicle within the Caravan Park without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

Animals.

30. No animals other than dogs shall be permitted in the Caravan Park and then only if confined to camping sites occupied by their owners or persons in charge of such dogs, or on a leash, or within the enclosure set apart for dogs.

31. If, in the opinion of the Caretaker, any dog is causing annoyance or disturbance to persons within the Caravan Park the owner or person for the time being in charge of such animal shall forthwith remove it from the Caravan Park.

Conduct in the Caravan Park.

32. No occupier shall deposit or cause to be deposited refuse in or on any part of the Caravan Park other than in receptacles provided for that purpose by the Committee.

33. Each occupier shall keep the camping site allocated to him clean and tidy.

34. Waste water shall be placed in or directed into receptacles provided by the Committee and under no circumstances shall waste water be deposited on or allowed to overflow on to the grounds of the Caravan Park. Occupiers shall be responsible for the emptying of such receptacles as directed by the Caretaker and then only into gully traps provided for that purpose.

35. The digging of trenches around vehicles or tents is prohibited.

36. No fires shall be lighted in the Caravan Park, except in such places as may be appointed by the Committee.

37. No person shall erect any building or structure in the Caravan Park other than annexes made of canvas or similar material which shall be deemed to be part of a vehicle and any tent or similar structure approved by the Caretaker.

38. No person shall—

(a) mark, write on or deface or in any way damage any building, post, fence, railing, pillar or any other structure or property within the Caravan Park;

(b) affix any bill, sign or notice board to any tree or structure within the Caravan Park without permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

39. No person shall without permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained, operate or use any loud-speaker, amplifier or broadcasting equipment (mechanical or electrical) for broadcasting music, speech or other noises or sound within the Caravan Park.

40. No person shall without permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained and subject to such conditions as the Committee thinks fit within the Caravan Park—

(a) sell or offer for sale any article or commodity whatsoever or distribute any bill or like thing or place any chair, seat or other item for hire;

(b) erect or place therein any building, booth, shed, stand, screen, post, rail, fence, swing or seat or other erection or obstruction of any kind whatsoever, or in any way enclose any part of the Caravan Park;

(c) preach, declaim, harangue or deliver any address of any kind to members of the public;

(d) carry, use or discharge any fireworks, firearms, air gun or other lethal weapons.

41. No person shall spit or expectorate on any path or in any building or erection on the Caravan Park.

42. No person shall remove or displace any board, plate or fitting for the exhibition of any Regulations, neither shall any person remove or displace any notice fixed or set up in the Caravan Park by the Committee.

43. No person shall wilfully obstruct, disturb, interrupt or annoy any officer or employee of the Committee in the proper execution of his work and duty.

44. No person shall wilfully obstruct, disturb or annoy any other person in the proper use of the Caravan Park.

45. No person shall play, practice or engage in any game or sport within the Caravan Park without the consent of the Committee.

46. No male over the age of six years shall enter or use any place, room, convenience or building set apart for the use of females, and no females shall enter or use any place, room, convenience or building set apart for the use of males.

47. No person shall offend against decency as regards dress, language or conduct, or the use of unnecessarily loud talking, or by any unnecessary noise disturbing or otherwise annoying persons in the Caravan Park.

48. No person over the age of fourteen years shall use playground equipment erected within the Caravan Park.

49. No person shall cut, saw, dig, move or displace any tree, bough, live or dead timber, wood or other material which may be in or around the Caravan Park without the consent, in writing, of the Committee.

50. No person shall remove any stone, soil, sand or loam from the Caravan Park without the consent, in writing, of the Committee.

51. No person shall drive any vehicle within the Caravan Park at a greater speed than 5 miles per hour.

Fees.

52. Every occupier shall pay to the Caretaker the respective fees prescribed from time to time by the Committee.

General.

53. Every person holding or purporting to hold any receipt or permission, in writing, issued by the Committee shall, on demand by any members of the Committee or any officer thereof or any member of the Police Force, produce such receipt or permission.

54. Any person who shall offend against any of these Regulations may be requested to leave the Caravan Park forthwith, and his refusal or failure to leave when so requested by the Caretaker or any duly authorized officer of the Committee or any member of the Police Force shall constitute a further offence against these Regulations.—(Rs.1922.)

These Regulations are made in lieu of the Regulations made by the Board of Land and Works on the 20th July, 1939, which are hereby revoked.

- (b) fixing the rates of fees or dues payable to the Council of the said Shire under part XV. of the *Health Act 1958*;
- (c) prescribing the times for selling and for slaughtering animals, and for selling carcasses or meat at the said Abattoirs;
- (d) the feeding, watering and tending, and the preventing of cruelty to and overcrowding of, animals in the said abattoirs; and
- (e) stopping temporarily the manufacture of and the sale of small goods in circumstances in which danger to the consumer is apprehended owing to uncleanness or to the presence of infection on or about the premises where such manufacture or sale is carried on.

IN exercise of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1958*, and of every and any other power it thereunto enabling, the President, Councillors and Ratepayers of the Shire of Bass hereby order as follows:—

1. That BY-LAW NO. 32 is hereby repealed.
 2. In this By-law—
“The Council” means the Council of the SHIRE OF BASS.
“The Meat Inspector” means the meat inspector appointed and/or provided by the Council for the inspection and supervision of any abattoir in the meat area.
“The meat area” means all that area comprised in the Woolamai and Powlett Ridings of the aforementioned Shire.
 3. This BY-LAW shall apply to the meat area as defined in Clause 2 hereof, and such area shall, as to the enforcement of the meat Supervision Regulations therein be under the direction of the Meat Inspector.
 4. This BY-LAW shall come into full force and operation on its approval by the Governor in Council, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.
 5. The times for slaughtering animals in the meat area shall be between the hours of seven o'clock a.m. and four o'clock p.m. on Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays in each week.
- No animal shall be slaughtered in the meat area on Saturdays, Sundays or gazetted holidays, unless with the consent in writing, of the Meat Inspector, to whom at

least twenty four (24) hours notice in writing of intention to slaughter on those days must be given. All expenses incurred by reason of such slaughtering on Saturdays, Sundays, or gazetted public holidays shall be paid by the person obtaining such consent.

6. No animal visibly or known to be affected by any contagious or infectious disease shall be received into any abattoir in the meat area except with the express permission of the Meat Inspector.

7. No person shall remove or permit to be removed from any abattoir in the meat area any carcass, or part of the carcass, of any animal slaughtered thereat until the same has been examined by the Meat Inspector and passed by him as fit for human food and branded by him with the regulation brand, or rendered unfit for human consumption in the manner prescribed by the Meat Supervision Regulations.

8. No sheep shall be removed from any abattoir in the meat area with the head attached.

9. The fees payable to the Council for examining and branding carcasses, parts of carcasses, or meat by or under the direction of the Meat Inspector shall be as follows:—

(a) For examining and branding any carcass of or meat derived from any:—

(a) Bull, Cow, Calf (other than bobby-calf), heifer, ox, or steer 4/6d.

(b) Bobby-calf, goat, kid, lamb, or sheep 6d.

(c) Swine 1/6d.

For any certificate as to an examination made by a Meat Inspector 4/-.

"Bobby Calf" means a calf not more than six (6) weeks old.

In addition to these fees and the expenses referred to in Clause 5 hereof, a fee of two pounds (£2.) shall be paid by any person slaughtering animals on any Saturday, Sunday, or gazetted public holiday with the consent of the Meat Inspector.

The said fees shall be paid by the proprietor of any abattoir carried on in the meat area to the Council, and shall be so paid by the proprietor thereof to the Shire Secretary of the Council at the Office of the Council at Dalyston once at least in every week, and the amount of each such payment shall correspond with and be accompanied by a voucher from the meat inspector.

10. The proprietor of any abattoir in the meat area shall not, nor shall any person having the management or control of any animals in the abattoir:—

(a) Suffer any cruelty to take place towards any animal at any time in the abattoir.

(b) Suffer animals to be overcrowded in the abattoir.

11. Any person who shall, by wilful act or default, contravene any of the provisions of this BY-LAW shall be guilty of an offence, and shall, on conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty Pounds (£20.).
