Land Act 1958.

AREA OF LAND COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1958* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I, Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1958*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6), shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1958* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 3, 6 and 7 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1958* aforesaid, to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say) :—

PUBLIC HIGHWAY.—SHIRE OF SOUTH BARWON.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1958*, as amended Section 519, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor-in-Council at any time and from time to time upon request of the Council of any municipality by notice in the *Government Gazette* to proclaim any land reserved used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street road highway

thoroughfare bridge square court alley or right-of-way or any street road lane or passage made or laid out or proposed to be made or laid out on land of which a plan delineating that street road lane or passage has been lodged with the Registrar of Titles to be a public highway and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force:

AND WHEREAS the Council of the Shire of South Barwon has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, being a street made or laid out or proposed to be made or laid out on land of which a plan delineating that street has been lodged with the Registrar of Titles, be so declared to be a public highway.

NOW THEREFORE I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the State, do by this Proclamation declare that Grayling-street coloured brown on Plan of Subdivision No. 12752 lodged in the Office of Titles shall be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act.

SHIRE OF ALTONA PLANNING SCHEME.

Altona Shopping Area.

BY virtue of the powers conferred by the Town and Country Planning Act 1961 and of every power enabling it in that behalf, the President, Councillors and Ratepayers of the Shire of Altona (hereinafter referred to as the Responsible Authority) having commenced the preparation of a planning scheme on the 12th day of December, 1957, in accordance with the Town and Country Planning Acts then in force, hereby makes the following Interim Development Order for the purpose of regulating, restricting, restraining or prohibiting the use or development of any land or the erection, construction or carrying out of any building or works on any land within the area described in the Schedule.

1. (b) Any dealing or the registration of any dealing with any land in a subdivision of which a plan has been sealed by the Council of the Shire of Altona and lodged with the Registrar of Titles, pursuant to section 569 of the Local Government Act 1958, before the coming into operation of this Order.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1958* and of any other power thereunto enabling them in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Melton in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors and Ratepayers of the said Shire for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction, make the following By-law (that is to say):

1. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its approval by the Governor in Council and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

2. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the Township of Melton as proclaimed under the Water Acts, and defined as Melton Reticulation Area, and published in *Government Gazette*, dated 4th October, 1961, No. 84, page 3298, and unless exempted by the Council shall apply to every house, building and premises therein.

3. In this By-law, unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter—

"Proprietor" means the proprietor of any premises and includes the owner, the occupier, or any person having the management or control thereof.

"Refuse" includes all wastes (except sewage, manure, and garden refuse) produced or accumulated in or about any house, building or premises.

4. The proprietor of every house, building or premises shall provide, keep and maintain at all times upon his premises a properly constructed receptacle in which he shall from time to time cause to be deposited all refuse produced or accumulated in or about such house, building or premises.

5. Such receptacle shall be constructed of galvanized iron of not less than 24 gauge or other approved material in such a manner as to prevent any absorption by any part of such receptacle of any offensive matter which may be deposited therein, or any escape by leakage or otherwise of any part of the contents of such receptacle.

6. Each such receptacle shall have a capacity of not more than two cubic feet and shall be strongly constructed and provided with properly attached side-lifting handles to make it capable of being easily and conveniently carried by one man.

7. Such receptacle shall be provided with a suitable close-fitting lid with flange overlapping the top of such receptacle, and shall be kept constantly covered (except when such refuse is being deposited therein or discharged therefrom) and a sufficient quantity of some efficient deodorant shall be from time to time introduced therein when necessary to keep such refuse in an inoffensive condition.

8. No person shall place or cause or permit to be placed any slops or liquid waste in such receptacle, nor shall he place or cause or permit to be placed any moist refuse in such receptacle unless such moist refuse has been previously strained and effectually wrapped in waste paper.

9. The proprietor shall cause such receptacle to be kept at all times in good order and sweet condition, and shall coat the inside of such receptacle with tar or other suitable substance when deemed necessary by the Council.

10. The proprietor shall cause, at such hours and on such days as may be appointed by the Council for the removal of refuse, such receptacle to be deposited close to the kerb of the street on which such house, building or premises abut in order that contents of such receptacle may be conveniently removed by the Contractor or person authorized or employed by the contractor or employed in that behalf by the Council.

No person shall place or cause to be placed any such receptacle in or upon any street, lane, or right-of-way except in the case of business premises built on the street alignment where such premises do not abut on a suitable right-of-way or land on which such receptacle could be placed for collection and emptying.

11. The contractor or person authorized or employed by the Council for the removal of such refuse shall be responsible for the complete emptying (without spilling any of the contents) of such receptacle or receptacles directly into a vehicle provided for its reception at such hours and on such days as may be appointed by the Council.

Such contractor or person shall also be responsible for the replacement of such receptacle properly covered with its lid.

12. The contractor or person authorized or employed by the Council for the removal of such refuse shall at least once in each week, or at such greater frequency as may be necessary, collect and remove such refuse in a suitable covered vehicle in such a manner as not to cause nuisance, danger to health, or offensiveness.

13. Such vehicle shall be provided with a cover and kept covered except when refuse is being put into or discharged from such vehicle.

14. Such vehicle shall as far as practicable be rendered watertight by means of an impervious lining or by painting the inside thereof with tar or other suitable and effective means.

15. The contractor or person authorized or employed by the Council for the removal of such refuse shall cause all vehicles used for the reception and removal of such refuse to be properly constructed, kept clean, and thoroughly disinfected with approved disinfectant and maintained in a proper state of repair.

16. If any refuse is authorized to be deposited or disposed of in or on any land, hole, quarry or indentation, such refuse shall be deposited in a regular and orderly manner, and at the conclusion of each day's depositing the contractor or the person or persons authorized or employed by the Council shall bind the surface with clean earth, lime, or other approved material so as not to create any nuisance.

17. If any person or persons commit a breach of any of the provisions of this By-law, he or they shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds, and in the case of a continuing breach a further penalty of not more than Five pounds for every day or part thereof during which such breach is permitted to continue after service by the Council upon him or them of notice in writing requiring him or them to remedy such breach.
