# PUBLIC HIGHWAYS.—CITY OF BOX HILL.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Local Government Act 1958, as amended, section 519, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time and from time to time upon request of the council of any municipality by notice in the Government Gazette to proclaim any land reserved used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street road highway thoroughfare bridge square court alley or right-of-way or any street road lane or passage made or laid out on land of which a plan delineating that street road lane or passage has been lodged with the registrar of Titles to be a public highway and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force:



The Council of the Shire of Wodonga in respect of all Victorian Waters of the Hume Reservoir contained within the boundaries of the Shire of Wodonga.

The Council of the Shire of Beechworth in respect of all waters contained within the boundaries of the Shire of Beechworth.

The Council of the Shire of Kerang in respect of the waters of Lake Meering and Lake Charm.




