By the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Land Act 1958 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, Section 5, of the said Land Act 1958, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6), shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the Land Act 1958 aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Class 6 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the Land Act 1958 aforesaid, to the extent of the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

MILK PASTEURIZATION ACT 1958.

PROCLAMATION

(b) Commencing at a point where the Gorge-road, crosses the Plenty River; thence generally westerly by the Gorge-road to the intersection of the Epping-Morang road and the main Whittlesea-road; thence continuing westerly along the Epping-Morang road to Darebin Creek; thence northerly by the Darebin Creek to Cemetery-lane; thence westerly by Cemetery-lane (crossing the Epping-road) to Miller-street; thence southerly by Miller-street to Cooper-street; then westerly by Cooper-street to the Shire boundary; thence southerly, easterly and and generally northerly by the Shire boundary to the point of commencement.





VIOLET TOWN WATERWORKS TRUST.

By-LAW No. 1.

A By-Law of the Violet Town Waterworks Trust made under Section 332 of the Water Act 1958 and numbered 1 for the protection of the water and every part of the works on land owned by the Violet Town Waterworks Trust and known as the Honeysuckle Reservoir from trespass nuisance and injury.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Act 1958 the Chairman, Commissioners and Ratepayers of the Violet Town Waterworks Trust, hereinafter called the Trust, order as follows in respect of the Honeysuckle Reservoir situate on parts of Crown allotments 63B, 75 and 65 Parish of Boho, County of Delatite hereinafter called the Reservoir.

- No person shall enter the Reservoir without the written permission of the Trust first obtained.
- 2. No person shall deposit any excreta or urine on any part of the Reservoir except in sanitary conveniences set aside for that purpose.
- 3. No person shall deposit or cause to be deposited any waste paper, tins, bottles, broken glass or any other refuse on any part of the Reservoir.
- $4.\ \mbox{No}$ person shall, whilst in the Reservoir, without the consent of the Trust first obtained.
 - (a) shoot, snare or destroy, or have in his possession any game, bird or fish.
 - (b) gather, pick up, cut, pluck, dig up, remove or have in his possession or take away therefrom any live or dead timber, or the whole or part of any tree, bush, shrub, flower, grass, fern or any other vegetation.
 - (c) ringbark or strip or remove bark from any tree bush or shrub.
- No person shall damage or remove or interfere with any beaching or embankment or dig or remove any soil or other material in or from the Reservoir.
- 6. No person shall damage, displace or interfere with any boundary fence, gate, lock, pipe, valve or fitting or any notice board or notice fixed or set up by the Trust.
- 7. No person in charge of any dog shall allow such dog to enter the Reservoir.
- 8. No person shall put into the Reservoir any cattle, sheep, goats, pigs or other animals.
- 9. The Trust shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reservoir. For the purpose of this clause "cattle" shall mean cattle as defined by Section 3 of the Pound Act 1958.
- 10. No person shall obstruct, disturb, interrupt or annoy any officer or employee of the Trust in the proper execution of his work and duty.
- 11. No fires shall be lighted in any portion of the Reservoir except with the written consent of the Trust.
- $12.\ No$ person shall camp on any portion of the Reservoir.
- 13. No person shall swim or wade or otherwise enter into or contaminate in any way, any portion of the water in the Reservoir or in any creek or watercourse leading thereto.
- 14. Any person offending against this By-Law shall when requested to do so by any officer duly appointed by the Trust, give his correct name and address, and carry out any instructions given by such officer to remedy such offence.

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with this By-Law shall for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty Pounds (£20).

A Regulation of the City of Brighton numbered 23 made under Section One of Part IV. of the Fifteenth Schedule to the Local Government Act 1958 (in force in the City of Brighton by virtue of a By-law of the above-named City of Brighton numbered 136) for repealing Regulation No. 22 of the City of Brighton and amending Regulation No. 21 of the City of Brighton (dealing with the management and control of Libraries belonging to the Municipality of Brighton) and for the proper management and control of Libraries belonging to the Municipality of Brighton or under the control or management of the Council of the City of Brighton.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts and every other power enabling it in that behalf the Mayor, Councillors and Citizens of the City of Brighton make the following Regulations:—

- 1. Regulation No. 22 of the City of Brighton is hereby repealed.
 - 2. Regulation 21 shall be amended as follows:-
 - A. Clause 4 thereof is hereby repealed and the following clause is substituted therefor—
 - 4. Subject to the completing and signing of the appropriate form or forms the following persons shall be eligible to borrow books from the Library:-
 - (a) Any resident of the Municipality.
 - (b) Any non-resident of the Municipality who is employed in the Municipality or who attends an educational establishment in the Municipality on the recommendation duly signed by his employer or the principal of the establishment as the case may be.

 (c) Any other person living close to the boundaries of the Municipality provided that their application is endorsed by the Librarian and signed by a resident ratepayer of the Municipality and for enrolment in the adult library a subscription of £3 or \$6.00 per annum is paid or pro rata for the number of months of membership required. Provided that the minimum subscription shall be 10s. or \$1.00.

Unless an extension is granted, a Reader who retains a book beyond fourteen days shall be allowed at least three days grace excluding Sundays to return the book, but if the book is not returned by then, he shall be notified that it is overdue. The Reader shall pay a charge in respect of each overdue notice sent. The charge shall be 1s. or 10 cents for each book for adults and 6d. or 5 cents for each book for children. If the book is not returned after the dispatch of the third notice, and has been overdue for four weeks, the Librarian shall take any action he deems necessary to recover the book or the cost of its replacement, and may refer the matter for legal action.
